In view of recent developments in this matter in Canada, and to conserve manpower urgently needed for other matters in the WDC area, WFO is postponing further review of records at the Passport Office, USDS.

It is to be noted that WFO has completed about one-third (about 750,000 applications) of the project to date. WFO has maintained notes of work completed in the review of passport applications and is in position to reinstitute such review without duplication at any time completion of work might be deemed necessary. On 5/9/68, WFO received information that RAY, as ERIC S. GALT, as early as December, 1967, was inquiring as to procedures to enter Rhodesia. In view of this, WFO recommended that plans be effected with the Passport Office, United States Department of State, to arrange for a systematic review of all passport applications received since RAY's prison escape in April, 1967.

This project was commenced and over 700,000 of a total of about 2,100,000 applications were reviewed before the project was halted on 6/4/68, as a result of investigative developments from a similar project in Canada.

As many as 36 Agents a day were used in this review which in some instances consisted of round-the-clock work. Miss FRANCE'S G. KNIGHT, Director, Passport Office, and Mr. ROBERT D. JOHNSON, Deputy Director, Passport Office, were most cooperative in arranging for this review.

Miss KNIGHT unhesitatingly made available the full facilities of the Passport Office and Mr. JOHNSON made arrangements for passport employees to be on duty in order that WFO's search could be continued during other than normal working hours. He also arranged for Agent personnel to use the garage facilities of the Passport Office in view of the absence of public transportation available to Agent personnel arriving for work or departing from work at the Passport Office at midnight.

It is recommended that the Director send a letter to Miss KNIGHT expressing appreciation for her warm and whole-

### Study King Talk For New Clues

By ROBERT S. ALLEN and PAUL SCOTT

The Federal Bureau of Investigation's massive probe of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King is taking a possibly sensational turn.

With James Earl Ray, the suspected assassin, apparently either outside the U.S. or now dead, FBI agents have increased their surveillance of several American Communists known to have been closely associated with King, including one who wrote speeches for him in the past.

This new development was triggered by evidence gathered by the more than 1,000 agents who have worked on the mysterious King shooting and by several "tips" and letters sent to the

One of the most interesting of nese "tips" came from an these alert TV viewer and concerns the now famous "Mountain Top" speech King made on April 3, the night before his slaying, showing a premonition of his impending death.

"If the speech was truly made In Memphis on April 3 as reported," the letter pointed out, "then how can one account for King stating his age as 36 (instead of .39) and why does he speak of demonstrating in Alabame twice during the speech?"

After, checking out the time and location of King's final speech, several of the crack FBI agents assigned to the case decided to begin seeking answers to a number of their own questions, including:

"If King had personally written that speech, why would he make mistakes like those contained in it - especially the one involving his age?'

"If the speech was written by someone other than King, who was the author and when was it written?"

The answers to these questions are considered highly important to the investigation, since, if another person was concerned in the preparation of that speech, the writer might be able to shed new light on it - especially those mistakes.

if King had received Also, help with the speech, the passages dealing with the civil rights leader's premonition of death would probably have been fully discussed. King's request to the Detroit police department for protection when he visited that city a few weeks before his

death indicated he feared for his life then.

Information gathered by the FBI on King, prior to his assassination, showed that a secret member of the Communist Party's executive committee was one of King's closest advisers and speech writers.

This ghost writer for King prepared many of his most famous speeches, according to testimony given by FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover during a closed doors meeting of a House Appropriations subcommittee.

Since Ray during his trips prior to King's assassination visited the same city in which this ghost writer lives, the FBI is now investigating to determine if the two met covertly.

Recent evidence fathered by FBI agents in one of the most massive probes in the nation's history has forced serious investigation of these possibilities:

• That somebody close King or within his own organization tipped off his assassin as to the civil rights leader's route on the day of his slaying.

• That Ray was hired directly by certain black nationalists who paid him with money made available by foreign sources.

• That an international Com-munist "assassin squad" was involved in the slaying.

Because of Ray's mysterious trips to Mexico and Canada shortly before the assassination, the entire U.S. intelligence operation, ranging from the Central Intelligence Agency to the Defense Intelligence Agency, has been pressed into the hunt for King's killer.

One CIA report indicated that Ray, who is linked to the murder weapon by fingerprints and ballistic data, may have visited Cuba during his Mexican trip, according to information furnished by a Mexican airline official.

.The FBI assumption is that, if there was a conspiracy to kill King, those involved made arrangements to spirit their hired killer out of the U. S. to Cuba via either Mexico or Can-

Probably the greatest irony of the probe of King's assassination is that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, one of the civil rights leader's severest critics when he was alive, is doing everything in his power to solve the case.

He said that RAE had a child by THORNTON and that both were known at Herby's Restaurant, Alabama Avenue, S.E., WCC. STANSELL said that he judged THORNTON'S age as mid-thirties, approximately five eight to ten, stocky build, with black hair that appeared to be dyed. He said THORNTON did not appear to have a job and he was seen so often about the apartment complex, that his sudden disappearance on 1/31/68 aroused his suspicions concerning THORNTON. He said that THORNTON was known to the proprietor of Herby's Restaurant.

On 4/24/68 HERB AIKEN, proprietor of Herby's Restaurant advised that MARGARET RAE had a child by GARY THORNTON with whom he was acquainted. He said that THORNTON was in the U.S. Air Force until about one year ago and that he was stationed at Bolling Air Force Base. AIKEN and his waitresses, all of whom know

THORNTON as a former customer, stated he is definitely not identical to JAMES EARL RAY. They further agreed that THORNTON is in his early twenties, that he is at least six feet three or more in height and very thin. HERB AIKEN stated that his part-time bar tender, Master Sargeant LEE AYERS, of Bolling AFB was also an associate of THORNTONS.

On 4/24/68 M/Sgt. AYERS advised that THORNTON was definitely not identical to RAY, adding that THORNTON was stationed at Bolling AFB until about one year ago. AYERS stated that he believed that THORNTON was about twenty two years of age and six feet four inches tall. He stated he did not know the whereabouts of THORNTON and that he had seen a photo of JAMES EARL RAY and that THORNTON in no way, resembles RAY.

On May 3, 1968, Mr. WILLIAM O. WOOD, 1801 Calvert Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., who is employed as a library assistant, District of Columbia Public Library, Central Branch, 8th and K Streets, N. W., was interviewed at his place of employment by SAs ROBERT W. DAWSON and ROGER D. ASHLAND. Mr. WOOD advised that on April 18, 1968, at approximately 6:20 p.m. he was in the 1800 block of Columbia Road, N. W., when he observed an individual he believed to fit the public description. of the murderer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. He described this individual as a white male, 30 to 35 years of age, five feet, eleven inches, 175-180 pounds, slender build, light to medium brown hair thinning and medium complexion. This individual was neatly dressed in a dark blue of black suit and carried, a thin black portfolio-type brief case. Mr. WOOD stated this individual looked excited or scared and uncertain of himself. He stated this individuals facial characteristics looked like the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, as shown on a Federal Bureau of Investigation identification order.

RAY was wearing a suit, except that this individual looked six or eight years older. Mr. WOOD stated that he observed this mans activities and that the man went to the Promenade Apartment building located at 1884 Columbia Road, N. W. Mr. WOOD stated he has not seen the individual since that date although he has been on the look-out for him.

On May 3, 1968, Mrs. KATHERINE HAGEN, Resident Manager, Promenade Apartments, 1884 Columbia Road, N. W., advised SAs DAWSON and ASHLAND that she did not recognize photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and that she did not know anyone residing at the Promenade Apartments who resembled the photographs of RAY.

JOHN ACORD, Chairman, American-Southern Africa Council, 800 Fourth Street, South West said his secretary, GLORIA WAIKER sent a reply to ERIC S. GALT in connection with the inquiry in December, 1967 from GALT about Rhodesia which had been received by the American-Southern Africa Council. ACORD said the form letter would have shown appreciation for GALT's interest in Rhodesia and would have enclosed literature about Rhodesia. The letter would have suggested GALT write to the Department of Information, Salisbury, Rhodesia for information about immigration to Rhodesia.

ACORD said a valid passport is all that is required to visit Rhodesia. A visa is not needed by a tourist. Immigration to Rhodesia would require complete documentation.

ACORD said the American-Southern Africa Council has 15,000 members in the United States. The members pay dues and contribute for special projects. The organization also obtains money from the sale of products made in Rhodesia such as radios and electronic items. The American-Southern Africa Council conducts public relations on behalf of Rhodesia and other Southern Africa nations. A Newsletter is distributed and other promotional material prepared. ACORD addêd he also lectures on Rhodesia and South Africa and organizes tours to South Africa.

Mr. TOWSEY advised that JOHN ACORD had visited Rhodesian Information Office earlier on May 9, 1968, and had given Mr. JOHN HOOPER of that office a copy of a letter dated December 28, 1967, from ERIC S. GALT, 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California, in which GALT had expressed an interest in travel to Rhodesia and asked to be furnished with information on that subject. He said that ACORD had told HOOPER that he, ACORD, had come across the letter in the files of his Office, the American-Southern Africa Council on this date.

Mr. TOWSEY stated that his interest in this matter was to offer on behalf of his Government all assistance possible, however, he asked that a formal request be made to his Government for such assistance. He stated that a written or oral request in any form would be honored.

Mr. TOWSEY requested that any request made of his Government and any information or assistance furnished by his Government not be made public in view of implications of exploiting the existing situation of his Government and of possibly expanding hostility toward his Government.

At 4:45 pm , 6/1/68, Detective CHASE, Intelligence Division, MPD (Phone 175-2684), telephonically advised the writer that he had just received a phone call from STEVE ISAACS (sp), City Editor for the Washington Post (Phone 223-6000 Ext. 426). CHASE advised that ISAACS reported that he had a female reporter who covered a meeting this afternoon where RALPH ABERNATHY from the Poor People's Campaign was supposed to speak. For some reason, Mr. ABERNATHY was relaced by Mr. (ANDY?) YOUNG. This female reporter mentioned to ISAACS that there was a "red neck" in the crowd who closely resembled ERIC STARVO GALT (JAMES EARL RAY). This reporter noticed that this "red neck" left abruptly when it was learned that ABERNATHY would not speak. ISAACS then indicated that has another reporter covering this meeting who also thought that this "red neck" resembled GALT,

CHASE advised ISAACS that he was going to notify the FBI immediately which he did. CHASE also mentioned that ISAACS would be expecting a call from the FBI.

An individual who identified himself as EDWARD FATH, an employee in the Editorial Photo Section of "The Evening Star" newspaper, with residence at Broad Run Farms, Sterling, Virginia, called WFO at 5:36pm, 6/3/68, and advised as follows:

At approximately 8:30pm, and again during the morning of 6/3/68, he observed an individual entering a residence in the northwest section of WDC who he believes is ident with JAMES EARL RAY, the individual wanted in connection with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Mr. FATH said he has studied a recent "Life" magazine article about JAMES EARL RAY, and today he looked at photographs of RAY in the files of his newspaper. Based on these he has concluded the above-described individual appears ident with RAY.

Mr. FATH said he would be willing to furnish complete details in personal interview with a SA of the FBI. He suggested contact at his office.

The following interviews were conducted at Washington, D. C., on April 8, 1968, by Special Agents JOSEPH C. KELLY and SIDNEY H. ROCHE:

Dr. DAVID MARK ROSENBAUM, Expert, National Resources Analysis Center, Systems Evaluation Division, Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation building, 550 17th Street, Northwest, advised that he is acquainted with one RUSSELL YOUNG, Executive Assistant to the Vice President, Government Communications Division, American Telephone and Telegraph Company, and while in company with Mr. YOUNG sometime during the first, several days of April, 1968, YOUNG remarked to ROSENBAUM that Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING was possibly going to be killed in Memphis, Tennessee.

Dr. ROSENBAUM said that since the statement had been proven true, in as much as Dr. KING was killed, he felt that he should notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation of this information. He added that he could not suggest the source of YOUNG's information, and that he intended to call Mr. YOUNG and advise him that he had furnished the information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mr. WILLIAM RUSSELL YOUNG, Executive Assistant to the Vice President, Government Communications Division, American Telephone and Telegraph Corporation, Room 1104, 1730 K Street, Northwest, telephone 392-5196, stated that he commented earlier in the month of April, 1968, while in the presence of one Dr. DAVID ROSENBAUM, that in view of the feelings and opinions expressed by the Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, he predicted that someone would kill

On April 13, 1968, Sergeant BERNARD F. KELLY, Homicide Squad, Metropolitan Police Department, telephonically advised SA JAMES J. MC CLOSKEY that JAMES K. BROWN, a cab driver, was in his office and had some information concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

JAMES K. BROWN, 4811 Quarles Street, N.E., Apartment 1, telephone 397-2910, furn shed the following information to SA MC CLOSKEY on April 13, 1968.

He drives Taxicab Number 264 for the Mellow Cab Company and normally drives between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 or 2 a.m. He stated that he did not know if the following information is significant; however, after reading the local newspapers and noting that a suspect in the Dr. KING assassination was in the Merchant Marines, he decided he should relate his experience.

On Thursday evening, April 11, 1968, at about 6:30 p.m., he picked up three fares at the Greyhound Bus Depot. Two of the passengers were Megro males and the third was a white male. After delivering the two Negro males to their destination, he proceeded to the 1800 block of 23rd Street, S.E., as requested by the white male, who was described as follows:
