

The files of the Passport Office, Department of State, reviewed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on September 23, 1970 and October 1, 1970, disclosed that Charles Luke McKissack filed application for a new passport at Los Angeles, California, on September 18, 1970, certifying in a statement on September 17, 1970, that his previous passport, revoked recently at John F. Kennedy Airport in New York City, had been lost, probably in Manhattan. He stated that it apparently fell out of his jacket pocket.

In this application, McKissack, born on October 16, 1937 at Thomasville, Georgia, stated that he planned to depart by air about October 1, 1970, for two weeks pleasure travel to Morocco, Tunisia, Kenya and "Tanzania (?)." He stated that he had made one trip abroad in the previous twelve months and expected to take another trip abroad within the next two years. He gave his permanent residence as 3201 Nichols Cyn. Road, Los Angeles, California, and his mailing address as 6430 Sunset Boulevard, Suite 521, Hollywood, California. In the event of death or accident, he requested that Nancy McKissack, his wife, be notified at his permanent residence. He listed his occupation as attorney.

Passport A-1803981 was issued to McKissack at Los Angeles on September 29, 1970, valid for five years' travel to all countries except Cuba, Mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

A review of McKissack's passport file also disclosed the additional information antedating the foregoing development.

By memorandum dated September 11, 1970, Mr. Fred Smith, Deputy Administrator of the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs (SCA), Department of State, informed the Passport Office that on September 8, 1970, he had received instructions to prevent the departure of Adel Bishara Sirhan and his mother as well as Charles Luke McKissack and Michael Allen McCowan. Mr. Smith requested Immigration and Naturalization Service to impose departure controls on Sirhan and his mother under the provisions of Section 46.3 (j), Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and to revoke the United States passports of McKissack and McCowan under the provisions of Section 51.70 (b) (4), CFR. Immigration and Naturalization Service officers physically carried out these instructions at John F. Kennedy Airport in New York City. On September 10, 1970, attorneys for the American Civil Liberties Union, acting on behalf of the four individuals mentioned above, brought action in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York for a temporary restraining order. This request was denied on September 11, 1970, and on the same day the United States Court of Appeals affirmed the denial. On September 15, 1970, a motion for a preliminary injunction was to be made but no action was expected on that for some time.


