Like all other people I am stricken with grief over the attempted assination of Senator Kennedy.

I feel strongly that emphasis on this event and others is being place improperly. True, stricter gun control laws are needed, but I feel the problem is much deeper. Many people are saying that the American people are sick, sick people. I strongly believe that these assinations and attempted assinations over the years are Communist inspired. This maybe a false analogy but what better way is there to make the US appear chaotic at home as well as in our foreign affairs - especially Vietnam. When other nations see these things happening they must think that the United States is incapable of running its domestic affairs, thus causing many to lose faith in democracy itself.

This will confirm the oral request of the Attorney General that your Bureau conduct an investigation into the above-captioned matter.

The Civil Rights Act of 1968, 18 U.S.C. 245(b)(l)(A), makes it a federal crime willfully to injure any person because he is or has been "qualifying or campaigning as a candidate for elective office ... in any primary, special or general election."

Section 11(b) of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 42 U.S.C. 1973i(b), provides that 'No person, whether acting under color of law or otherwise, shall intimidate, threaten, or coerce... any person... for urging... any person to vote or attempt to vote in any primary, special or general election.' Sections 12(a), (c) of the Voting Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973j(a), (c), make it a federal crime to deprive any person of any right secured by Section 11(b) of the Act or to conspire to interfere with any right secured by Section 11(b) of the Act.

Senator Robert F. Hennedy while campaigning for the presidency in Los Angeles, California, was shot early today by an unidentified person who is reportedly in the custody of the Los Angeles Police Department.

Please conduct a full investigation of all aspects of this matter, including any indications that the shooting was the product of a conspiracy.

Please provide daily progress reports to the Attorney General and 1 mg
