Sir:

America is the land of justice. So we are taught in school and so it is written on almost every state or federal building. It is broadcast on Voice of America, and the public trials of Sirhan Sirhan and Earl Ray make a comedy out of the efforts to give these murderers fair and unbiased hearings. Yet when a clique of corrupt lawyers are charged by an ordinary citizen of gross negligence and breach of trust, those same upholders of America's justice can turn the trial into a kangaroo court without fear of exposure or punishment. And when that citizen pleads for his Constitutional right of a fair trial to the state governor, the governor turns his back: "It is beyond my jurisdiction," he blandly replies. What are we to believe? Is justice endowed to only those in the public eye or those who can buy it? Of course there will always be cases of men taking advantage of others, but will the government simply shelter them, providing a haven for the unjust rather than for the just? Within whose jurisdiction does it lie to clean America of corruption?

The lawyers mentioned above control not only a whole city, but also spread their power over the entire state, so that it seems impossible for even the governor to dare break their clique. Therefore, they can manipulate the law to suit their callous ambitions, irregardless of the lives of those involved. In effect, then, they are legal murderers and legal thieves who can carry on their activities under the protection of the government. Mr. President, I can give you the case which exposes the entire scandal, a case which conclusively proves them guilty of gross negligence, undue influence, breach of trust, collusion, fraud, and perjury. By breaking their power, innocent people throughout the state can be safeguarded, and the example will be set to other such men that justice cannot be denied to the people of the United States.

Or will you also turn your back? No, I believe you are truly a sincere man whose interests lie in helping the American people, in setting aright the crumbling judicial system, in restoring the original ideals of justice and equality to America--in other words, a man with the courage to do what he knows is right, no matter what the personal risks. I beg you to act, for there is no one but you with the power to do so.

Gentlemen:

On 3 February 1969, Metromedia News  
in Washington reported as follows:

"Federal agents investigating the murder of Senator Robert Kennedy have uncovered some evidence which hints at conspiracy...

When the accused assassin, Sirhan Sirhan, was apprehended, police discovered that keys in his pocket fit a car parked a block from the hotel... The car belonged to a kitchen worker at the hotel at which Kennedy was shot... Reliable sources also report that the Secret Service had a file on this kitchen worker, and had it been the president who was in the hotel, the Secret Service would have detained the man before the President ever came to town. While the Secret Service had no file on Sirhan Sirhan before the Kennedy murder...they did apparently consider this kitchen worker in question at least a threat to presidents."

I would like to know what investigations were conducted by federal agents, and what reports of that work are available.
