

Saidallah Sirhan advised INS that he needs the certificates in applying for a Jordanian passport for travel to Jordan, however, he plans to return to the United States at some future time to apply for United States citizenship.

INS did not have information as to when Saidallah Sirhan is departing from the United States, where he will reside in Jordan or when he will return to the United States.

INS indicated that they were planning to issue the above certificate.


The details of the Sirhan Sirhan case are extremely important to me, and I can think of no better vehicle than the United States Congress and Senate to obtain the answers to questions I am outlining below:

- How much taxpayer's money has been spent on Sirhan to date exclusive of the \$900,000 spent on his trial in Los Angeles;
- The amount of federal funds being used to subsidize his family due to the cruelty imposed upon them by the press;
- 3) Why the legal intanglements posed by Sirhan's lawyers cannot be brought up and answered immediately so the death penalty can be imposed either in San Quentin or another appropriate institution.

In summary, I'd like to know the exact expense incurred by the government to date, what the future holds, when we can expect some action and exactly what the United States government plans to do with the man who has been accused of the assasination of Robert F. Kennedy.

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




