PRESS WITH RESPECT TO THE QUESTION OF FBI JURISDICTION
EXCEPT THAT THE FBI IS RENDERING ASSISTANCE AS INDICATED ABOVE.

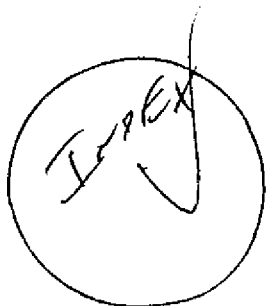
On 6/5/68, Captain Robert Krahling, U.S. Capitol Police advised that on 6/5/68, at about 10:10 AM, a man called to Senator Kennedy's office (Robert F) and told the lady who answered in Kennedy's office that he lived in Southeast Washington, D.C. and that his name is CHARLES MAYHELD (PH) DAVIS. Davis said that Senator Kennedy had helped Davis and other convicts get out of jail and that he, Davis, and others were going to get guns "so sit tight".

The above was listened to by Sergeant Wayland Fallin, U.S. Capitol Police, who believes that Davis' voice sounded like it might that of a Negro.

The above was furnished to the MPD by the US Capitol Police.

The current D.C. telephone directory shows nothing identifiable with Charles Mayheld Davis.

This individual stated that Senator Kennedy had helped him and other convicts get out of jail and that he, Davis, and other convicts were going to get guns "so all right."

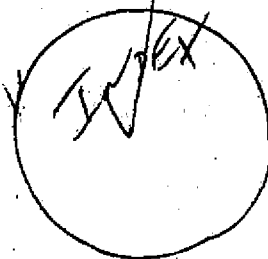

The Government agency referred to in LHM is the United States Capitol Police, and the information in attached LHM was given to SA ^{HILMER} ~~ELMER~~ H. KREBS by Captain ROBERT KRAHLING of that organization.

Statements in attached LHM were overheard by Sergeant WAYLAND FALLIN, U.S. Capitol Police who believes that DAVIS' voice sounded like that of a Negro.

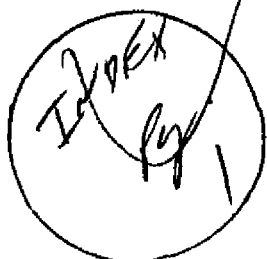

MR. CLAUDE HAINES, 12 W. Custis, Alexandria, Va. advised that he was listening to the news at 4:00am this date. Sandra Vanocur interviewed a girl from Oberlin, Ohio concerning the shooting of Robert F. Kennedy. This girl said on the interview that shortly after the shooting a woman ran by her shouting "We've shot him. We've shot him." When the girl from Oberlin, Ohio asked who was shot, the woman replied, "Kennedy." The girl described the older woman as wearing a polkadotted dress, dark shoes.

Mr. Haines stated he called to advise of this information since he had not seen the replay on T.V. again whereas he had seen replays of all of the other events that took place. He wondered why.

Circumstances of escape:

Applicant lived in the New City of Jerusalem till 1948 when the Palestine conflict started. As the Jordanian and Israeli troops were fighting each other for the occupation of the City he fled under bombardment and took refuge in the Old City.

Elements of hardship:

Applicant lost his home and belongings in Palestine as a result of the Arab/Israeli conflict. In Jordan he was unable to continue his studies and had to leave his school and look for employment in order to earn his living. But owing to lack of work in Jordan he has been unable to find a decent job and could not therefore resettle in a normal life. His desire is to join his parents, sisters and brothers who immigrated to USA in 1956 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1953.

Elements of persecution:

Applicant fled from the New City of Jerusalem for fear of persecution by the Jews because of race and religion. He cannot return to his home in Israel even if he wanted to and can claim no compensation for what he has lost there.

Although he is not likely to be persecuted in Jordan yet he may not be able to resettle in Jordan and will be dependent of UNRWA's assistance for many years to come.

Effect on welfare of U.S. if applicant admitted:

Mr. Sirhan is a well educated, ambitious young man who can speak enough English to make himself understood. Although he has no proper skill yet he should be able to find some employment in an Office or a Factory with which he could earn his living and become self-supporting.

His parents, brothers and sisters immigrated to USA in 1956 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1953 and are eager to have him join them.

We strongly recommend that this young man be given the chance to join his parents under the present Public Law as otherwise he will have to wait for many many years before his turn on the Israeli quota is reached.

A CWS assurance was provided for him under RRA 1953 but this was received too late to allow the US Consul process the case under that Act.

Kennedy Is Shot Critically After Calif. Win, Suspect Held

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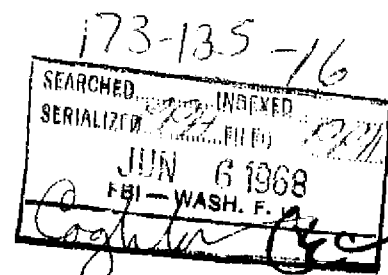

Struck in Head, Hip; During Celebration; 3 Others Wounded

From News Dispatches

LOS ANGELES, June 5 (Wednesday)—Robert F. Kennedy, brother of the assassinated President John F. Kennedy, was shot early today minutes after he claimed his victory in the California primary.

He was pronounced in critical condition at Central Receiving Hospital from three wounds—two in the head and one in the hip.

At 4 a.m. (EDT) he was given the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church. Later Kennedy was transferred to Good Samaritan Hospital.

The shooting at the Ambassador Hotel turned the Kennedy victory celebration into a scene of horror and pandemonium.

Kennedy was reportedly conscious and talking after being struck by the series of shots. Almost immediately after the shooting a young man of Latin appearance in dungarees was seen being taken into custody.

The shots were fired about 3:20 a.m. EDT. At least three other men were reported wounded, Paul Schrade of the Steelworkers Union, ABC unit manager William Wiesel and Irwin Stroll, 17, of Los Angeles.

Priest Offers a Rosary

A priest, near the scene of the shooting, said he approached the fallen Senator. "I gave him the rosary and he clenched it tightly and I was pushed away. There was blood on his head."

Kennedy's wife, Ethel, expecting her 11th child, knelt by her husband before he was taken to the hospital. Her face was masked with shock.

The California victor had just left the ballroom of the Ambassador and was walking along a service corridor outside the kitchen. There was a normal crush of reporters, photographers and spectators.

At least five shots were fired, according to eyewitnesses, by a man who had been standing by a service cart.

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After he was struck, Kennedy lay in a pool of blood while efforts were made to find a doctor. His brother-in-law, Stephen Smith, stood on the podium of the ballroom shouting for a doctor.

A bus boy reported that Kennedy gasped at one point. "Is everybody okay? Is everybody okay?"

Negro Olympic star Rafer Johnson and Los Angeles Ram tackle Roosevelt Grier, both of whom had been campaigning with Kennedy, reportedly seized the assailant. An accomplice was reportedly also taken into custody.

Joe La Hive, a member of Kennedy's headquarters staff, said he and another aide participated in the capture.

"We both looked at Bobby and then we both grabbed the gunman and threw him up on a table. The guy grabbed his gun and handed it to Rafer Johnson and we turned the guy over to police," said La Hive.

David Jayne, an ABC producer in Los Angeles, said he "heard several loud noises like popping firecrackers" and he dived to the ground. When he looked up Kennedy had fallen in front of him.

Emergency Treatment

One physician on the scene was quoted as saying that the Senator was going to be all right. But Kennedy was reported to be unconscious at the Central Receiving Hospital, where last rites were administered.

The assailant was described as an olive-skinned man of about 25. One witness said that he heard the gunman "shout something about saving the country."

There was an interval of about 60 seconds between the first shot and the later burst of gunfire. It was the ensuing flurry that finally awakened the victory celebrants to what had happened.

Emergency treatment was given to Kennedy at the Central Receiving Hospital, where doctors administered shots and intravenous fluid. It was while he was there that Father Thomas Teacha from St. Basil's Church was called in to administer the last rites.

Less than a half hour later the New York Senator was taken to Good Samaritan for surgery. Kennedy press aide Frank Mankiewicz described the Senator as in "stable condition" there.

"He was breathing well. He had a good heart beat," the aide said.

The shooting and ensuing bedlam was reported on live television. It was an irony reminiscent of the murder of his brother's assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald. The scene on the screen registered the same atmosphere of hysteria, disarray and mute shock.

There were cries of "Kill him! Lynch him!" as some in the crowd tried to grapple for the assailant. Kennedy's bodyguard, William Barry, and Grier shielded the suspect from the crowd.

The news of the shooting spread quickly through Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy's election headquarters at the Beverly Hilton Hotel and threw a pall over a noisy crowd there.

McCarthy was awakened and went immediately to the ballroom of his hotel. He asked that the crowd there join him in a moment of silent prayer.

President Johnson was advised of the shooting immediately, but the White House withheld comment. A spokesman for Gov. Ronald Reagan said the California Chief Executive deplored the shooting and offered "whatever assistance that we can make available" to help apprehend the assailants.

The Senator's brother, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, telephoned the family home in Hyannis, Mass., from California and reported the shooting. The Senator's parents, and wife, were awakened.

ANNA B. WILLIAMS, WF of White Plains, Charles County, Maryland upon hearing early broadcast 6/5/68 of caption made report to sheriff's office, Charles County, Maryland of a remark made to her, and her 19 year old daughter 5/16/68 by one STUART JOHNSON, an attorney in Washington, D. C. that "if BORIS KENNEDY wins the nomination he will be killed before November."

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter, FRANCES B. WILLIAMS - 19, interviewed 6/5/68 by way of background related as follows:

Both Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter have been extremely interested in current political campaign, both are strong supporters of Senator EUGENE MC CARTHY.

In May, 1968 Mrs. WILLIAMS went to Charleston, West Virginia to help campaign for MC CARTHY in the 5/14/68 Primary. About 2 A.M. of 5/16/68 she was at the MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters and took a phone call from a STUART JOHNSON, whom she did not know. JOHNSON sounded as though he was intoxicated and commented that he had been fired by the National Headquarters for MC CARTHY in Washington, D.C. Mrs. WILLIAMS then ascertained from a worker at the MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters that STUART JOHNSON had been sent out by the National

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MC CARTHY Campaign Committee in Washington, D. C. to prepare ground work for the MC CARTHY Campaign in West Virginia.

Mrs. WILLIAMS returned to her home on or about May 16, 1968. She had a feeling there was some unexplained friction in the MC CARTHY Campaign, so she called Attorney JOHNSON for an appointment in order to discuss this matter. An appointment was made for 3:00 P.M. 5/16/68 in Attorney STUART JOHNSON's office, 910 17th Street N.W., Washington, D. C.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter met with Attorney JOHNSON in his private office. They discussed for about one half hour the political campaign in general. JOHNSON acknowledged he had been discharged from the MC CARTHY National Campaign Committee in Washington due to a personality conflict, but that he was still for MC CARTHY, and was now working with another pro- MC CARTHY group (not further identified) in Washington, D.C., and that he was going to California 5/21/68 to campaign for MC CARTHY.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter stated that during the meeting with Attorney JOHNSON, the latter did not discuss Senator ROBERT KENNEDY personally nor did he make any derogatory remarks about the Senator. However, Attorney JOHNSON did say there was a lot of hatred for KENNEDY throughout the nation, and stated "If BOBBY KENNEDY wins the nomination he will be killed before November."

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter stated that Attorney JOHNSON did not elaborate on the statement, but made it sound as though it was a matter of fact and a foregone conclusion that KENNEDY would be killed.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that following the conference in Attorney JOHNSON's office, the latter escorted Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter to MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters in Washington where he introduced them to a number of party workers.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that she can furnish no additional information and can not explain the specific significance behind JOHNSON's statement.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter described STUART JOHNSON as a white male, age about 45, 5'11" - 6'0", slender build, graying hair, wore reading glasses.

As there does not appear to be any connection with captioned matter, this is submitted for information of Bureau, Los Angeles and WFO.

This place is run by a woman who appears to be Arabian. According to SELF, he has definitely seen the alleged assailant of Robert F. Kennedy, in this establishment. He made his identification on the basis of a picture he had seen in this evening's news.

Mr. Hughes wanted to have an agent talk to SELF. Mr. Hughes can be reached tomorrow at 526-4474.



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Suspect Held After Critically Wounding Candidate

Kennedy Under Surgery

LOS ANGELES, June 5 (UPI) — Sen. Robert F. Kennedy was shot and critically wounded early today by a gunman who mingled with the crowd at his victory celebration after the California primary election.

Four other persons also were wounded in the shooting.

About two hours later, a team of neurosurgeons prepared to operate on the 42-year-old senator to remove a bullet from his brain.

Sen. Kennedy was taken to surgery on the ninth floor of the grey-stoned hospital at 3:12 a.m. (6:12 in Washington). His brother, Sen. Edward Kennedy arrived at Los Angeles international airport a few minutes earlier and boarded a helicopter for a flight to the heart of the city.

Sen. Kennedy was shot in the head near the right ear and also suffered a lesser wound in the shoulder.

VERY CRITICAL

"The operation will take about 45 minutes to an hour," said Frank Mankiewicz, Sen. Kennedy's Press Secretary. He said the Senator was unconscious and "doctors describe his condition as very critical."

The others hit by the burst of gunfire were Paul Schrade, a Steelworkers Union official; Bill Weisel, a television newsmen, and Ira Goldstein, a radio newsmen. An unidentified woman was also reported slightly wounded.

Mr. Schrade, who had been on the platform earlier with Sen. Kennedy, suffered a scalp wound but was reported in good condition. Mr. Weisel, 30, of 2700 UKPTON ST NW, Washington, suffered a serious abdominal wound, while Mr. Goldstein, 19, was wounded in the back and leg but was in good condition.

The shooting occurred at the Ambassador Hotel as Sen. Kennedy left the Embassy room after greeting supporters with the news that he had taken the lead over Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy in the presidential preference voting.

The crowd had just heard Sen. Kennedy vow "to rid the country of violence."

Pandemonium erupted in the room when word flashed thru the crowd that the Senator had been shot. Many thought some firecrackers had been triggered to climax the celebration. A suspect was seized within seconds by Sen. Kennedy's aides, Roosevelt Grier and Rafer Johnson, sports star members of Sen. Kennedy's party. They said the suspect, tentatively identified as Jesse Greer, about 23, attempted to hide behind a steam table in a kitchen off the Embassy room.

'FOR MY COUNTRY'

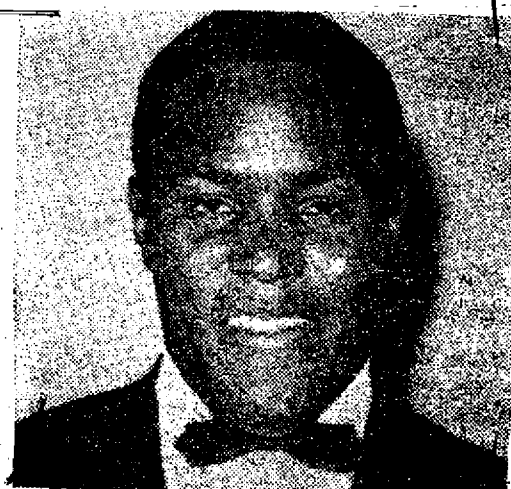
One witness said the man who was captured "was yelling something about saving the country or something. What he said was something like 'I did it for my country'."

Sandra Serrano of Pasadena, Calif., a student and Kennedy worker, was present when the suspect was seized. "He was about 23 years old and he was Mexican-American," Miss Serrano said.

Reporter John Marshall of the Westinghouse Broadcasting Co. said the suspect was "armed with a small caliber revolver."

"We do not have information at this point to lead us to believe that any conspiracy was involved, altho we have not ruled that out," said Police Inspector Robert Rock later.

The inspector did not immediately identify the suspect who was described as a black-haired youth wearing a sweatshirt and blue jeans. He

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"put up a good fight" before being subdued," someone said.

"As of now, he has declined to tell us who he is or anything about himself," Inspector Rock said. "We have the gun in custody."

SHAKING HANDS

Martin Petruski, a waiter at the Ambassador Hotel, said he had just finished shaking hands with Sen. Kennedy and "all of a sudden this fellow jumped out and he started to fire. It was so fast. And all of a sudden somebody was yelling 'Grab him! Grab him!'"

"Then the Senator slid down to his knees.

"His eyes were open when he started to go down.

"His wife came over and she asked the photographers to please stop taking pictures. She wasn't crying or anything."

The Senator was a half step ahead of his wife, Ethel, when the shooting occurred.

"He was walking thru the kitchen toward a corridor going to the freight elevator," said Norbert Schlei, a Los Angeles Democrat who was 10 feet behind the Senator.

"He stopped to shake hands with the kitchen help and I heard a sound . . . clap, clap, clap, clap. It didn't sound at all like gunfire.

"It sounded like a cap pistol or someone popping a paper sack. There were four people lying on the floor after the shots . . . There was a tremendous crush of people.

"A girl rushed to the front of the podium and said 'He's been shot,'" UPI correspondent John Chambers reported. "They've shot Kennedy."

Sen. Kennedy's brother-in-law Stephen Smith rushed to the podium and shouted, "Is there a

doctor in the house? Is there a doctor in the house? A doctor is needed urgently!"

Gabor Kadar, who said he was waiting at the rear exit to the room to shake hands with the Senator, heard four or five shots and saw Sen. Kennedy and a woman fall to the floor.

"Sen. Kennedy was holding the right side of his chest and there was blood on his head," Mr. Kadar said.

Warren Wilson, a reporter for the Westinghouse Broadcasting Co., reported that Sen. Kennedy was conscious and talking after the shooting.

Mr. Kadar said he saw Sen. Kennedy's wife, Ethel, kneeling beside the Senator as he lay on the floor of the hotel kitchen.

Aides quickly blocked the entrance to the room where the Senator was lying.

SEEMED CONSCIOUS

"Sen. Kennedy lay on the floor and his face was tense and white but he seemed conscious. I didn't hear him say anything," Mr. Schlei said. He said an ambulance crew took him away on a stretcher by way of the freight elevator. He said there was blood on the floor. ABC said a priest rushed up to Sen. Kennedy and handed him a rosary. Sen. Kennedy clutched it as he was carried to the ambulance.

Mrs. Smith, speaking calmly moments after the shooting, said:

"The best thing everybody can do here is in an orderly fashion leave the room. Would you please do that? In an orderly way clear the room. The best thing and the most helpful thing would be to leave the room."

After the shooting a crowd of nearly 500 per-

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sons knelt in prayer around the fountain in the main lobby of the hotel.

Sen. Kennedy was taken first to Central Receiving Hospital and transferred within an hour to nearby Good Samaritan Hospital. Several specialists, including a neurosurgeon, were summoned.

The shooting occurred about 12:15 a.m. PDT (3:15 a.m. in Washington) as Sen. Kennedy pulled a bare 1000 votes ahead of Sen. McCarthy. Nearly two hours later, aides said Sen. Kennedy was breathing steadily and the bleeding from his wounds had been stopped.

FAMILY CALLED

Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, (D., Mass.), brother of Robert Kennedy, phoned his family in Hyannis, Mass., and said his brother had been shot twice, a family spokesman said.

The Senator's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph P. Kennedy, were not awakened and informed of the shooting, according to Ann Gargan, a niece of the elder Mr. Kennedy. She said Mrs. Kennedy probably would be told when she awakened to attend an early morning Roman Catholic mass. Sen. Kennedy's father is a semi-invalid as a result of a stroke several years ago.

Dr. Ross Miller, who attended Sen. Kennedy immediately after the Senator was shot, said Sen. Kennedy had a head wound, but a "good heart beat."

It was a " cursory examination," Dr. Miller said, but on its basis "I would be forced to describe his condition as critical."

Dr. Miller said Sen. Kennedy's pulse was "rapid but strong and full."

Gene Pell, a Westinghouse Broadcasting Co. correspondent, said Sen. Kennedy had an oxygen mask on his face when he was transferred to Good Samaritan Hospital. He said Sen. Kennedy appeared to be unconscious and a plasma bottle was suspended over the stretcher.

A large crowd gathered outside Good Samaritan Hospital as word of the shooting spread thruout the city.

Police were stationed at the hospital doors.

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Jeane Foresaw RFK's Fate

For Jeane Dixon, the famous Washington seeress, the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy (D., N.Y.) in Los Angeles, Calif., was a ghastly repetition of the events leading up to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, in Dallas, Tex.

According to a number of witnesses, Mrs. Dixon, as long ago as last January, predicted that there would be "a planned attempt" on Robert Kennedy's life.

She told this to businessmen in Nashville, Tenn., last January; to her luncheon partner, also in Nashville; to Alex Bilanow, Real Estate Editor of The Washington Daily News; and to former Rep. Frank Boykins (D., Ala.).

In her 1968 forecasts for Newsday Inc., she saw "a dark cloud" over Sen. Kennedy; In an interview with the Evening Star newspaper here, she predicted that Sen. Kennedy might have "a great — and planned — accident."

Mrs. Dixon, whose column of forecasts and horoscope readings appears here exclusively in The Washington Daily News, is the wife of local real estate broker James L. Dixon. Since she arrived in Washington, during World War II, Mrs. Dixon has made some uncannily accurate predictions, many of which are documented in the best-selling book, "Gift of Prophecy," written by Ruth Montgomery.

The prediction for which she is most widely known involved the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. As early as 1956, she said on radio and TV interviews that she saw "a blue-eyed young man, a Democrat, as President, and a dark cloud hovering over the White House."

After Mr. Kennedy was elected, she told numerous friends that she had had a "presentiment" that he would be assassinated. "At the time," Mrs. Dixon said, "all of my friends urged me to stop saying things like that. But I told them he should be warned."

On several occasions, shortly before JFK left for Dallas, Mrs. Dixon tried to get mutual friends to beg him not to go. Just before noon, on Nov. 22, 1963, Mrs. Dixon was lunching with three friends at the Mayflower Hotel here.

"All at once, it came to me," Mrs. Dixon said. "I blurted out, 'I see the President being shot!' My friends urged me to be still. About 30 minutes later, Sidney, the orchestra leader leaned over to talk to an excited waiter. Then Sidney stopped the music and said, 'The President has been shot.' One of my friends said, 'Oh, I hope he's only wounded.' I said, 'No, I'm afraid he's dead.'"

The prediction about Robert Kennedy was along similar lines. While speaking before a group of sales executives in Nashville, Tenn., on Jan. 9, 1968, Mrs. Dixon said a vision revealed to her that Robert Kennedy would be in physical danger soon.

'WILL BE SHOT'

Later that day, according to a copyrighted story in the Nashville Banner, Jeane Dixon told her luncheon companion, a prominent Nashville businessman, that "Bobby Kennedy will be shot."

Her January column of predictions for Newsday Inc., carried the following paragraph: "I get a dark cloud around Sen. Kennedy with strings that lead backward. This I see as a tragic event in which he was an unwilling participant long before his brother's assassination — this event still hangs over him. It seems as tho the heavens will not allow a shining light to break thru for him at this time. However, I see surprising changes and decisions around him."

Also in January, the Evening Star, in an interview, quoted Jeane Dixon as saying this: "I see a great burst around Sen. Kennedy. This could mean a great tragic — and planned — accident."

Last September, Alex Bilanow interviewed Mrs. Dixon for a story regarding the real estate interests of both Mrs. Dixon and her husband.

"We were sitting in a restaurant," Mr. Bilanow said, "when Mrs. Dixon said, 'Something terrible is going to happen to Sen. Robert Kennedy. I wouldn't be in his shoes for anything!'"

"I said, 'What do you mean, Jeane, a plane crash or an automobile accident?' She said, 'No, much worse. He's going to be shot.'"

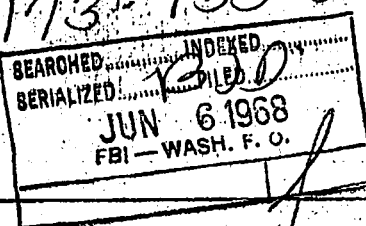
