



Mr. JAMES MC. HARMS, 410 Conduitt Drive, Mooresville, Indiana advised that he went to Los Angeles, California, on Wednesday, May 29, 1968, from Gregon where he was working on the KNNHEDT primary. MC MANOS said he accompanied the motorcade to downtown Los Angeles where he stopped at the Anhansador Hotel for the ansignment in the California primaries. MC MANUS said that he was assigned to make arrangements for a working press room which was the Colonial Boom of the Anbassador Hotel and a press distribution center which was the North Room of the Anhansador Hotel. MC MANUS stated that he was assisted by ROT RINGER of Malibu, California, and that in addition to making arrangements for the above-mentioned rooms, he and RINGER took over the registration desk of the hotel from approximately 5:00 FM, May 29, 1965, to 1:00 AM, May 30, 1968.

NC MANDS said that sometime between \$:45 and 10:30 PM, AIRGER suggested that they take a break by going for a drink to a free bar which was set up near the Enbassy Room of the Ambassador Notel. MC MANNE gaid while sitting at a table near the free bar, a young man described as 5'3", 120 pounds, dark complexien, with heavy well-groened black hair, wearing a sport cost with blue stripes and contrasting trousers and a dark tie open at the mach, approached him and agked for the schedule of Seaster EXHERNY for the two following days, May 30 and 31, 1968. MC MANUS said his first thought was "what's a Nerican American reporter doing here in Gregon". but then he recalled he was in California. HC MANUS said he checked people in until approximately 1:00 AM, May 30, 1968.

MC MANUS recalled that he saw the individual the second time between 11:00 and 12:00 during a short trip to the North Room at which time the individual again asked the question regarding the Senator's schedule, whereupon MC MANUS informed him that he must go to 5615 Wilshire Boulevard to obtain the same.

MC MANUS further stated that sometime after he saw the first individual (probably Wednesday morning or early afternoon) two Latin types described as well dressed, olive skin, thin faced, wellgroomed dark hair with long sideburns, and wearing dark business suits, also asked for the schedule. MC MANUS added that these two individuals looked enough alike to be cousins.

MS MANUS advised that he left on Thursday Afternoon to go to New York City for campaign arrangements there.

Epen being exhibited a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN, WC MANUS said that the face on view looked like the first individual, but that he could not be positive. He, MC MANUS added that the photograph koked a little messed up and that he had the impression that the first individual mentioned above may have had longer sideburns; however, he added the photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN seemed to him to not be totally unfamiliar, MC MANUS said that the photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN did not in any way recemble the two Latin types mentioned above.

MC MANUS recalled that his first reaction after seeing news media photographs was that he vaguely remembered seeing comeone very similar to SINNAN SINHAN.

NC MANUS further stated that he could not be certain if it was the first individual in the Ambassador Notel the night of May 29, 1968, but someone was wearing a pair of dark brown buckle loafers, with a sheen, made of large grain leather with the buckle across the instep. MC MANUS added that he appreciates good shoes, and that for some reason these stood out in his mind, perhaps because they were uncared for.

MC MANNES finally stated that it was possible that ROY RINGER of Maibu, California, may have seen and could recall the first individual montioned above. MC MANNES added that he did not know IP 62-1957

what RINGER's address was: however, he was sure that he, RINGER, could be contacted through PAT BROWN's Law Office, in Los Angeles, California.

MC MANUS further added that either LISA GWIRTZMAN and/or CONSTANCE CHANCELLOR were present when the two Latin types asked for the Senator's schedule of May 30, 1968. According to ME MANUS, LISA GWIRTZMAN lives in New York City and could be contacted through her busband MILTON GWIRTZMAN of Batton, Gwirtzman, and Wise (phonetic) Law Firm of New York City; and that CONSTANCE CHANCELLOR could be readily found in the Washington, D. C. telephone book, although her address at that time was unknown to him.

ROBERT ROTH, Correspondent, Philadelphia Bulletin, 1238 National Press Building, furnished the following Information:

ROTH covered the last week of the Oregon primary and the entire California primary. He divided his time between the ENNEW and MC CARTHY campaigns. The night of the California primary election ROTH was at the Ambassador Hotel earlier in the evening and then he went to the Los Angeles Times Building to write his story. He was at the Times Building when the shooting occurred.

ROTH does not remember seeing SIRHAN SIRHAN at any time during the primary campaign and does not remember seeing a girl in a polka dot dress at the Ambassador Hotel. He did not think he could furnish any further information regarding the assassination.

GEORGE CARDIGES, 1401 South Flagler Drive, West Palm Beach, Florida, was interviewed at his place of employment, the Hot Shoppe at the Palm Beach Plaza, Sunshine State Parkway, West Palm Beach, Florida.

He said he recalled JOHN FAHRY as a former Hot Shoppe employee in Washington, D. C., who worked under his supervision on, as best he could recall, two occasions over a period of a year or so around 1955, He said he would describe FAHEY as a "kook" who was not consistent or reliable in accepting responsibility, was emotional and moody, and at least once got emotionally disturbed to the point that he wanted to fight CARDIGES. He said he would not consider FAHEY reliable nor would he "put much stock" in anything FAHEY said. He said FAHEY might well tell a falsehood in order to enhance his own ego and described his leaving the Hot Shoppe chain as "no loss to management." He said he has had no contact with FAHEY for a number of years and is not aware of his present activities or personality but from his recollection of FAHEY he could certainly not recommend him as a man of good judgment, stability or reliability.



During the morning of 6/5/68, after the announcement that the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot in Los Angeles, California, VALERIANO CAPOTE MORENO, 38 67th Avenue, Capital Heights, Maryland, telephonically advised that an associate, JOSE MARTINEZ SAVRE, Project Control Officer at Bolling Air Forge Base and a resident at Apartment 401, 3628 Barcroft View Verrace, Falls Church, Virginia, had in his possession photographs of an unidentified woman who had used offensive language in confronting Senator KENNEDY at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Washington, D. C., on 4/14/68. CAPOTE explained that Senator KENNEDY had appeared as a guest at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in connection with the laying of a wreath by members of Brigade 2506 who had participated in the abortive Bay of Pigs invasion of Cuba. CAPOTE indicated that GABRIEL GOMEZ DEL RIO, a former Captain in the United States Army who was in charge of the above ceremony, possessed all the details concerning this woman. He suggested obtaining copies of the photograph from MARTINEZ and also interview of DEL RIO for all pertinent details concerning the event.

On 6/5/68, JOSE MARTINEZ, identified above, made available two color photographs of the unknown woman mentioned above and an unidentified male companion. These photos are being maintained as an exhibit in instant file. MARTINEZ also referred the interviewing agent to DEL RIO for all pertinent details regarding the incident.

After unsuccessful attempts to contact DEL RIO on 6/6 and 7/68, contact with him was established on 6/10/68, at which time he was interviewed and furnished the information hereinafter set forth:

GABRIEL GOMEZ/DEL RIO RAMON, Apartment 404, 6631 Wakefield Drive, Alexandria, Virginia, telephone number was interviewed in the presence of an associate, PEDRO TRABAZO, in the latter's apartment, number 414, 1225 13th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. (telephone number 332-7894). DEL RIO, born on \_\_\_\_\_\_ in Cuba, exhibited papers showing that he was honorably discharged as a Captain in the United States Army on 3/10/68. His Army Serial Number was 02325635. He indicated that he currently operated the Gapa Construction Company from his home address.

DEL RIO, a veteran of Brigade 2506, advised that he has been in charge of the annual wreath-laying at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in memory of those lost in the Bay of Pigs invasion. Indicating that he has had a personal relationship in the past with Senator KENNEDY subsequent to DEL RIO's release as a prisoner in Cuba, he advised that three days prior to the ceremony on 4/14/68, he had personally extended an invitation to Senator KENNEDY and his wife to appear at the ceremony of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Senator KENNEDY accepted the invitation and at approximately 2:00 on 4/14/68, appeared at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier accompanied by Mrs. KENNEDY and the eldest KENNEDY daughter. The Senator arrived driving an open convertible. After conferring inside the building at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier with approximately 1? to 15 people directly connected with the strictly memorial type of service. Senator KENNEDY joined DEL RIO in the wreath-laying ceremony. He did not make a speech. According to DEL RIO, the event received coast to coast television coverage and although only a small group participated in the ceremony, there were an estimated 1500 spectators in the area of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

After the ceremony, as Senator KENNEDY was departing

from the area of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the middle-aged redheaded woman appearing in both photographs, approached Senator KENNEDY. DEL RIO made an effort to physically force the Senator to one side to avoid confrontation with the woman, but the Senator rebuked his efforts and squarely faced the woman. As related by DEL RIO, who was standing next to Senator KENNEDY, a definite smell of alcohol was evident about her. She immediately directed uncomplimentary remarks to Senator KENNEDY such as "What the hell did you ever do for New York State --I'm a taxpayer from New York -- What are you doing here?" Although highly offensive and disrespectful in her words, DEL RIO stated that nothing in the nature of a threat was made by this woman. He stated that during her tirade, Senator KENNEDY merely looked her straight in the eye, not saying anything. He thereafter returned to his car and departed the area.

Subsequent to the ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, DEL RIO and the Brigade 2506 group went to the grave of the late President JOHN F. KENNEDY to make a floral presentation there. At that time, the above unidentified woman was again observed in the company of the unidentified white middle-aged man, who appears in the photographs with her. DEL RIO commented that this unidentified man also carried a strong odor of alcohol on his person. When the unidentified woman began making derrogatory comments about Cubans being trash and that they should be thrown out of the country, DEL RIO indicated that he lost his patience and personally had words with this woman, calling her "a drunken bitch."

JULES J. WIGCOVER, 2505 Fowlers Lane, Reston, Virginia, telephote number: Advised he is suplayed as the Schlar Correspondent by Nachouse National News Service, Weshington, D. C. He related he followed the ROBINT F. KENNEDY campaign both in Oregon and California. UINCOVER related he was at the Ambessador Hotel in Los Angeles, California on the night of June 4 - 5, 1968, when ROBENT F. KENNEDY was assessinated.

WITCOVER informed that he had congratulated his on his victory when he came into the area of the hole) where he was located and had followed KENNEDY to the platform in the Eduasy Room of the hotel. then MERREPY finished speaking, he passed through the corridor the same way that KENDEDY had come into the Rebisty Room. FRID DULINA op RECHARD GRAHAM, aides to KEENEDY had advised him that a preus conference was to be held immediately after in the Colonial Room and thus he presumed that HEMIEDY would be going to the Colonial Room via the kitchen, through which he had eene to onder the Embassy Roem, ELECOVER stated that access to the Colonial Room and the Subassy Room could be gotten by going through the kitenet. WITCOVER stated that when KEIMEDY left the platfort in the Embassy Room he was apprenimately thirty feet shead of KENNEDS going down the corridor, which was ten to twolvo feat wide and he roted that two women wore sitting in this corridor. Mnay were sitting in chairs on the right side. He believed these women were with the KANAEDI party and possibly wives of some of the sides and he based this upon the fact that they were very carually pressed and dofinitely not actively working for the KERLOY campaign as they were not visibly excited at the particular time. MITCOVER stared he then caus to a passage way about six fost wide. At no time did he see anyone other than these two woman in the corridor. He stated he had elmost reached the doors into the Litchen when he heard a shot. He first was unimpressed and thought it was a firstreckor and then he beard rapid firing, at least jour or five chois. No informed he could not be positive that there

were four or five shots, or more. He informed that there was a definite pause between the first shot and the subsequent shots. WITCOVER stated that he turned around and first noted RCOSEVELT GREER and others whom he did not immediately identify. He advised he did not notice the suspect immediately as there was alot of pushing in one area. He did notice an individual with his hand in the sir and there was a gun in this hand. He advised he is not certain at this time in which hand the gun was, but he believed it was in the right hand.

WITCOVER informed that he did not see KENNEDY on the floor immediately as there were three or four people around him. He stated there was no crowd at that particular time. He advised that he noticed blood on KENNEDY's head and his hand and that his mouth and eyes were open. He thought that KENNEDY had been shot in the head and stomach, inasmuch as the hand on his stomach had blood on it. He noticed that KENNEDY at this point was still alive.

WITCOVER informed that he then turned around and noted a scuffle was continuing with the suspect and now ROOSEVELT GREER and RAIFORD JOHNSON and others wore holding the suspect. Present at this point were yells," Get the gun, kill him, don't kill him ," and the scene was complete pandemonium.

He informed that there were no police or doctors for approximately fifteen minutes and it was his thought that it took approximately five minutes to get the gun from the suspect.

He noticed that GREER had a headlock on the suspect and that they had finally succeeded in removing the suspect down the corridor away from KENNEDY.

He related that photographers were all around KENNEDY at this time taking photographs and finally the aides came and purched the photographers out of the way, LA 56-156 RH 62-2248 -3

however, the photographers continued to take photographs. Mrs. ROBERT F. KENNEDY came several minutes later, knelt down beside her husband and said something to him or was She finally got up and asked the photographers praying. to leave and then knelt back down by her husband. Shortly thereafter, a security police came, took his gun out and then WILLIAM BARRY, an aide to the KENNEDY campaign, told this man to put his gun away. This man then went to the area where the suspect was. Finally, about one half dozen Los Angeles police officers came into the area and relieved GREER of the suspect and took him away. Shortly thereafter, an attendant came, placed KENNEDY on a stretcher, and he was taken out of the area and put into an ambulance. WILLIAM BARRY and Mrs. KENNEDY accompanied KENNEDY in the ambulance.

WITCOVER informed that after KENNEDY was taken out, he stood in the room, observed the room, and went to the press room to write his story.

WITCOVER stated that at one time he noted that they had moved the suspect down to the end of the table, and heard the suspect say, " My leg, my leg."

He described the gun as beingashubnose revolver.

WITCOVER stated that he did not see anyone else on the floor initially, however, all attention was focused on KENNEDY, but then noticed another individual on the floor who was wearing a press badge. He later found out that this person was PAUL SCHRADE.

WITCOVER stated in reconstructing the matter that when he left the platform he had a clear passage way before bim although there were two women sitting in chairs on the right side of the corridor and when he turned around, he also had a clear passage back to the group of individuals. He stated he believed he was immediately ahead of KENNEDY when proceeding through the corridor. He stated that he was concerned with getting to the Colonial Room which was to be used for the press conference, inasmuch as he was interested in getting the best possible story. WITCOVER stated that another reporter, ROBERT HEALY, The Boston Globe political editor, wrote a story stating he was coming through the door at the time of the shooting, however, WITCOVER informed that he has no recollection of HEALY being in that position.

WITCOVER stated thatothers that were in the area as he recalls were RICHAED TUCK, a KENNEDY advance man; RICHAED DRAYNE, a KENNEDY press man actually Senator EDWARD KENNEDY's press man; HUCH McDONALD another KENNEDY press man; PAUL HOPE, a reporter for the Washington Star; JIMMY ERESLIN for the New York Post; VIRGINIA GOI of Flair Magazine; and WARRE! ROGERS, The Washington editor of Look Magazine. Also noted was JESSE UNRUH, a democratic leader in California.

WITCOVER stated that when he noticed the suspect he recalls thinking he was a member of the kitchen staff. He recalled this man was short of stature, was dark complexion, dark eyes and hain was wearing a blue denim shirt and tan pants.
