As was reported in referenced teletype to Bureau, 4/24/81, Mrs. Brussell expressed her intention to request the FBI to make available a task force to study the information she has compiled regarding this conspiracy. The sources she wished to make available consists of thousands of newspapers clippings and hundreds of books she has collected.

The Bureau should be advised that any further contact with Mrs. Brussell regarding her theories would not be considered a wise expenditure of investigative effort.

One copy of the LHM is being disseminated to the United States Secret Service, San Francisco, California.
