SINCE COMING TO UNITED STATES DJEREDJIAN HAS OFTEN VISITED LAMKIN AND ALSO TELEPHONED AND WRITTEN TO HIM FROM ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES, MOSTLY REGARDING VISA FRAUD INFORMATION, NONE OF WHICH INFORMATION HAS EVER BEEN TRUTHFUL. LAMKIN STATED DJEREDJIAN CANNOT BE BELIEVED AND HE WILL "FEED" YOU ANYTHING IF HE THINKS YOU WILL BELIEVE HIM. DJEREDJIAN IS A GLORY SEEKER AND WOULD WELCOME AN INTERVIEW BY THE FBI, BUT HE SHOULD BE CONSIDERED EXTREMELY UNRELIABLE.

DJEREDJIAN LAST CONTACTED LAMKIN TELEPHONICALLY ON JUNE TWELVE LAST FROM WILBERTON, OKLAHOMA, WHERE HE ATTENDS EASTERN OKLAHOMA STATE COLLEGE. DJEREDJIAN STATE FBI HAD TALKED TO HIS WIFE, SHERIE, AND HE ASSUMED FBI WOULD CONTACT HIM REGARDING SIRHAN SIRHAN. DJEREDJIAN TOLD LAMKIN HE BELIEVED HE HAD FURNISHED INFORMATION TO LAMKIN REGARDING SIRHAN WHILE DJEREDJIAN WAS ATTENDING PCC. LAMKIN STATED A REVIEW OF HIS FILES FAILS TO SUBSTANTIATE THIS AND BELIEVES IT IS ANOTHER LIE. LAMKIN NOT AWARE OF ANY VISIT TO LOS ANGELES BY DJEREDJIAN ON JUNE THREE TO FOUR LAST.

HAROLD SCHNEIDER, ASSISTANT MANAGER, LA AUTO AUCTION INTERVIEWED INSTANT DATE. ADVISED HIS RECORDS REVEAL HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN DELIVERED A NINETEEN SIXTY SEVEN CADILLAC EL DORADO TO AUTO AUCTION AT EIGHT ZERO ZERO ONE E. GARVEY, SOUTH SAN GABRIEL, CALIFORNIA ON MAY TWENTY SEVEN NINETEEN SIXTY EIGHT. EXACT TIME OF DAY COULD NOT BE DETERMINED. DJEREDJIAN WAS ISSUED A CHECK IN AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED ELEVEN DOLLARS AND TWENTY EIGHT CENTS FOR THIS DELIVERY.

ROSE AVAKIAN ONE THREE ONE FIVE EIGHT CHANDLER DRIVE, VAN NUYS, CALIFORNIA, INTERVIEWED INSTANT DATE. SHE ADVISED SHE HAS NOT SEEN HAGOP DJEREDJIAN IN PAST FOUR YEARS. SHE RECALLED SHE LOANED HIM A FEW DOLLARS WHEN HE WAS ATTENDING PASADENA CITY COLLEGE AND SINCE THEN HAS NOT HEARD FROM HIM AND HAS NO IDEA AS TO HIS RPRESNT WHEREABOUTS OR ACTIVITIES.

LOS ANGELES INDICES REVEAL HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN SUBJECT OF IMPERSONATION CASE IN NINETEEN SIXTY FOUR IN WHICH PROSECUTION DECLINED BY U.S. ATTORNEYS OFFICE IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT THERE DID NOT APPEAR TO BE STATUTE.

DJEREDJIAN WAS INTERVIEWED BY BUREAU AGENTS AT THIS TIME IN PHOENIX AND DENIED EVER HAVING REPRESENTED HIMSELF AS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE U.S. GOVERNMENT. 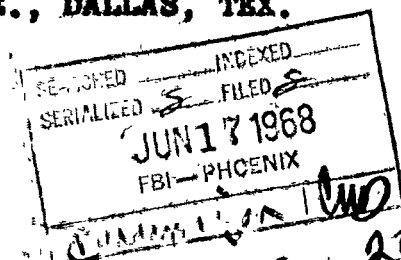

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Marge Rodak, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed at her place of employment, Motorola, Inc., 5605 East McDowell Road, Phoenix, at her request. Mrs. Rodak advised that on the Wednesday (June 5, 1968) following the assault on Robert F. Kennedy while she, her daughter, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djerredjian, and her son-in-law, Hagop H. Djerredjian, were watching television at the above 31st Street address, it was flashed on television a photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, as the assailant of Senator Kennedy. Mrs. Rodak advised that at that time Hagop Djerredjian stated "I know that man." Djerredjian further stated "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djerredjian) two days ago that Kennedy was going to be shot and Humphrey will probably be shot next and Ted Kennedy shot if he runs for office."

Mrs. Rodak advised that when she queried Djerredjian regarding these statements, he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. Rodak admitted that she dislikes her son-in-law intensely, advising that he never works and mistreats her daughter Sherie and her grandson David by Sherie's first marriage.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djerredjian was interviewed at 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona. At this time she denied that her husband made such statements

as related by her mother above. Mrs. Djerredjian stated that it was she who speculated two days before the actual assault on Kennedy that he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Vice President Hubert Humphrey and Senator Ted Kennedy would probably be shot also. Mrs. Djerredjian insisted that such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of these political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will, in fact, occur.

Mrs. Djerredjian advised her husband is in the United States on a visa from Beirut, Lebanon; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles. She believes that he went to Pasadena City College where he was active in American Foreign Crusade, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. She stated she married Djerredjian on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against Djerredjian.

Mrs. Djerredjian advised that she and Djerredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965 until the latter part of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djerredjian supported the family on infrequent Perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Dr. Zehrab Djerredjian, No. 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djerredjian stated that during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and her son David drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, where she and David stayed while Djerredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which he returned to Phoenix June 4, 1968. She stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) regarding staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lamkin (phonetic) of INS in Los Angeles. Mrs. Djerredjian advised her husband left Phoenix June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma

State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. Djeredjian advised she received a telephone call from her husband June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

On June 13, 1968, Special Agent Robert Keyser, U. S. Secret Service, Phoenix, Arizona, was advised of the above.

On June 13, 1968, Hagop H. Djeredjian was interviewed at Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma. He advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanon. During this period he worked with a Mr. Lamkin, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, U. S. State Department, Los Angeles, California. During this time he submitted numerous reports to Lamkin concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations, including the Arab Student Association.

He stated that in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after the assassination of Robert Kennedy, he saw a picture of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law that the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadena City College or Pasadena High School while attending school in Pasadena. He did not and still does not recognize the name Sirhahn Sirhahn. It was his opinion that of all the organizations, at Pasadena City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would come from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. Lewis, Dean of Admissions, and Mr. Weldon, ex-Dean of Admissions at Pasadena City College, might have more details concerning such individuals or organizations.

Djeredjian stated that the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 20, 1968, he had picked

up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Michigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. He stated that he had driven this automobile from Detroit to Phoenix and on May 27, 1968, from Phoenix to South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 12:10 p.m., where he turned in the car, received a cashier's check on the Bank of America for approximately \$113.00, cashed this check at the bank across the street and took a bus to Los Angeles.

In Los Angeles, he went to the office of Mr. Lampkin in the Federal Building, where he arrived at approximately 3 to 3:15 p.m. He talked with Mr. Lampkin concerning a possible trip of his back to Lebanon caused by his father's illness and departed at approximately 4:30 p.m. He walked several blocks to the Greyhound Bus Depot where he purchased a ticket to Phoenix, Arizona, and departed on this bus to Phoenix at approximately 7:10 p.m. that date. Djeredjian stated he had not been back to Los Angeles since that time for any reason. He stated he had not seen nor talked with any other person on that occasion in Los Angeles, and that he has no friends or acquaintances currently living in the Los Angeles area with whom he has visited recently or with whom he corresponds.

Djeredjian could not locate his ticket from Los Angeles to Phoenix but did produce a contract with the Ace Automobile Transportation Company to deliver a Cadillac to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. This contract indicated that the vehicle was picked up on May 20, 1968, in Detroit, Michigan, and was due on May 27, 1968, in South San Gabriel. This form indicated that after his arrival in South San Gabriel he could be reached in care of Rose Avakian, 13158 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California. Djeredjian stated he did not even know if Avakian still resided at that address or not; that he had not contacted her and that he only used her name because it was required on the contract to have a contact point in California.

Djeredjian denied that he had ever made any comments concerning the possible assassination of Vice President Humphrey or anyone else. He stated he had never commented about talking with anyone in Los Angeles about any assassination. He stated that when he first married, his mother-in-law had notified the FBI in Phoenix that he was bringing dope in and was making approximately seventy thousand dollars per year which he was not declaring for income tax purposes.

Djeredjian advised he was running his own import-export business in Detroit, Michigan, prior to his departure in May, 1968.

Djeredjian advised that his ex-wife, Shakey Kasparian, current location unknown, a natural born American citizen, had previously complained in Los Angeles to the police about his taking nude photographs.

Djeredjian stated that while in Detroit, Michigan, he had produced the Armenian Radio Voice radio program and published a national weekly newspaper, "Nye Serant."

On June 14, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djerredjian and Mrs. Marge Rodak were re-interviewed. Both advised they had been mistaken about the dates of Hagop H. Djerredjian's traveling to Los Angeles, and both now agree that Djerredjian's travel dates coincided with dates reported by him above.

Hibbard Lankin, Special Agent in Charge, U. S. Department of State, Office of Security, Los Angeles, advised on June 14, 1968, that Hagop H. Djerredjian, also known as Jack Djerredjian, last visited him the afternoon of May 27, 1968. Djerredjian requested Lankin to intervene in Djerredjian's behalf regarding Djerredjian being departed by INS. Lankin refused any assistance. This was the sole purpose of his visit, although Djerredjian mentioned he may visit his father in Lebanon. No mention was made of politics at this time.

Djerredjian First came to the attention of the State Department in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1959 where he served in informant capacity regarding fraudulent visas. Djerredjian subsequently came to the United States and attended Pasadena City College (PCC) starting September, 1959.

Since coming to the United States, Djerredjian has often visited Lankin and also telephoned and written to him from all over the United States, mostly regarding visa fraud information, none of which information has ever been truthful. Lankin stated Djerredjian cannot be believed and he will "feed" you anything if he thinks you will believe him. Djerredjian is a glory seeker and would welcome an interview by the FBI; however, he should be considered extremely unreliable.

Djerredjian last contacted Lankin telephonically on June 12, 1968, from Wilburton, Oklahoma, where he attends Eastern Oklahoma State College. Djerredjian stated the FBI had talked to his wife, Sherie, and he assumed the FBI would contact him regarding Sirhan Sirhan. Djerredjian told Lankin

he believed he had furnished information to Lankin regarding Sirhan while Djerredjian was attending PCC. Lankin stated a review of his files failed to substantiate this and he believes it is another lie. Lankin was not aware of any visit to Los Angeles by Djerredjian on June 3 to 4, 1968.

On June 14, 1968, Harold Schneider, Assistant Manager, Los Angeles Auto Auction, advised his records reveal that Hagop H. Djerredjian delivered a 1967 Cadillac El Dorado to Auto Auction at 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California, on May 27, 1968. Exact time of day could not be determined. Djerredjian was issued a check in the amount of \$111.28 for this delivery.

On June 14, 1968, Rose Ayakian, 13158 Chandler Drive, Van Nuys, California, advised she had not seen Hagop Djerredjian in the past four years. She recalled that she loaned him a few dollars while he was attending PCC and since then has not heard from him and has no idea as to his present whereabouts or activities.



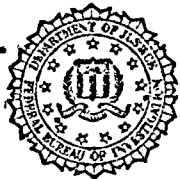

Mrs. Djerredjian advised she and Djerredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965, until the latter week of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djerredjian supported the family on infrequent perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Doctor Zohrab Djerredjian, Number 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djerredjian stated during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and son, David, drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, Arizona, where she and David stayed in Phoenix while Djerredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which time he returned again to Phoenix on June 4, 1968. Mrs. Djerredjian stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with Immigration and Naturalization Service regarding his staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lampkin of the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Los Angeles.

Mrs. Djerredjian advised Djerredjian left Phoenix on June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. Djerredjian advised

she received a telephone call from Djerredjian on June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

Mrs. Djerredjian described her husband as white, male, five feet eight inches, approximately one hundred sixty-five pounds, flabby, date of birth December 12, 1938, place of birth unknown, brown wavy hair, brown eyes, olive complexion.

On June 13, 1968, Hagop H. Djerredjian, Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanon. During this period he worked with a Mr. Lampkin, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, United States Department of State, Los Angeles, California. During this time, he submitted numerous reports to Lampkin concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations, including the Arab Student Association. He stated that in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, he saw a photograph of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law, the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadena City College or Pasadena High School while attending school in Pasadena. He did not and still does not recognize the name Sirhan Sirhan. It was his opinion that of the organizations at Pasadena City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would come from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. Lewis, present Dean of Admissions, and Mr. Weldon, former Dean of Admissions at Pasadena City College might have more details concerning such individuals and/or organizations.

Djerredjian stated that the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 21, 1968,

he had picked up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Michigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. He stated that he had driven this automobile from Detroit to Phoenix and on May 27, 1968, from Phoenix to South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 2:10 p.m., where he turned in the car, received a cashier's check on the Bank of America for approximately one hundred thirteen dollars, cashed this check at the bank across the street, and took a bus to Los Angeles, California. In Los Angeles, he went to the office of Mr. Lampkin in the Federal Building where he arrived at approximately 3:00 to 3:15 p.m. He talked with Mr. Lampkin concerning a possible trip of his back to Lebanon caused by his father's illness and departed at approximately 4:30 p.m. He walked several blocks to the Greyhound Bus Depot where he purchased a ticket to Phoenix, Arizona, and departed on this bus to Phoenix at approximately 7:10 p.m., that date. Djeredjian stated he had not been back to Los Angeles, California, since that time for any reason. He stated he had not seen nor talked with any other person on that occasion in Los Angeles, and that he has no friends or acquaintances currently living in the Los Angeles area with whom he has visited recently or with whom he corresponds.

Djeredjian furnished a tube with a prescription on it which indicated it had been issued by Blaine's Pharmacy, telephone number 944-9441, on June 3, 1968, prescription number 68592, with Pharmacist's initials B.S.K. Djeredjian stated that this was a medicine prescription to him for a severe sun burn he had gotten by sleeping in the sun in Phoenix, Arizona. He said that when he originally observed the photograph of the assassin on television, he had considered contacting the Federal Bureau of

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN

Investigation but his wife had persuaded him not to because of this severe sun burn and because he had been involved in trouble in the past concerning deportation from the United States.

Djeredjian could not locate his ticket from Los Angeles to Phoenix but did produce a contract with the Ace Automobile Transportation Company to deliver a Cadillac to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. This contract indicated that the vehicle was picked up on May 29, 1968, in Detroit, Michigan, and was due on May 27, 1968, in South San Gabriel. This form indicated that after his arrival in South San Gabriel, he could be reached in care of Rose Avakian, 13158 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California. Djeredjian stated he did not even know if Avakian still resided at that address or not; that he had not contacted her and that he only used her name because it was required on the contract to have a contact point in California.

After his return to Phoenix, he obtained a copy of his marriage license on May 31, 1968, and talked with Mr. Isreal (phonetic) in the Immigration office concerning a possible trip back to Lebanon.

Djeredjian provided a copy of a reissued Greyhound Bus Company ticket dated June 9, 1968, number 0665653, for travel from Dallas, Texas, to Wilburton, Oklahoma, in the amount of \$43.00. This ticket was marked as a reissue. Djeredjian stated it was the only bus ticket remaining in his possession for any of his travels from Los Angeles to Phoenix and from Phoenix to Wilburton, Oklahoma.

Djeredjian denied that he had ever made any comments concerning the possible assassination of Vice President Humphrey or anyone else and stated he had never commented about talking with anyone in Los Angeles about any assassination. He stated that when first

married, his mother-in-law had notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Phoenix that he was bringing in dope and was making approximately seventy thousand dollars per year which he was not declaring for income tax purposes.

Djeredjian advised he was running his own import-export business in Detroit, Michigan, prior to his departure in May of this year.

Djeredjian advised that his ex-wife, Shakey Kasparian, current location unknown, a natural born American citizen, had previously complained in Los Angeles to the police about his taking nude photographs.

He stated he had applied to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a position as translator in Dallas, Texas, on one occasion, but had not been hired because he was in the country on a student visa.

Djeredjian stated that while in Detroit, Michigan, he had produced the Armenian Radio Voice Radio Program and published a national weekly newspaper, "Hye Serant".

Djeredjian stated he would cooperate with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in any manner possible and if desired, he might be able to provide helpful information in this matter if he could review his old reports as submitted to Mr. Lampkin.

The files of the college Registrar's Office, Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, revealed Djeredjian enrolled on June 10, 1968, which was one week past beginning of classes. He gave as reason for late enrollment lack of funds because of delay in receiving check from overseas. He had previously applied to attend the college ten years ago, but could not leave his country at that time because of a revolution. He plans to enroll as a full-time student in the fall semester. His home address was given as Number 28 Rue Khoder Hadjiore, Beirut, Lebanon.

On June 14, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Djeredjian and Mrs. Marge Rodak were reinterviewed and both advised they had been mistaken about the dates of Djeredjian traveling to Los Angeles and both now agree that Djeredjian's travel dates coincide with the dates as given in his Federal Bureau of Investigation interview. Mrs. Djeredjian still insists it was she who made the statement regarding Senator Robert F. Kennedy being assassinated rather than her husband. Mrs. Rodak still insists it was Djeredjian who made the statement previously reported by her.

Mr. Michael Rodak was interviewed on June 14, 1968, and advised he did not recall the incident sufficiently to state what the conversation was about at the time they were viewing television and Sirhan Bishara Sirhan's photograph was shown, but he advised he recalled no statements regarding Vice President Hubert Humphrey or Senator Ted Kennedy being shot in the future.

On June 14, 1968, Mr. Hibbard Lamkin, Special Agent in Charge, United States Department of State, Office of Security, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He advised Hagop H. Djeredjian, also known as Jack Djeredjian, last visited him the afternoon of May 27, 1968. Djeredjian requested Lamkin to intervene in Djeredjian's behalf regarding Djeredjian being deported by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Lamkin refused any assistance. This was the sole purpose of the visit, although Djeredjian mentioned that he may visit his father in Lebanon. No mention was made of politics at this time. Djeredjian first came to the attention of the State Department in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1959, where he served in an informant capacity regarding fraudulent visas. Djeredjian subsequently came to the United States and attended the Pasadena City College, starting September, 1959.

Since coming to the United States Djeredjian has often visited Lamkin and also telephoned and written

to him from all over the United States, mostly regarding visa fraud information, none of which information has ever been truthful. Lamkin stated Djeredjian cannot be believed and he will "feed" you anything if he thinks you will believe him. Djeredjian is a glory seeker and would welcome an interview by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, but he should be considered extremely unreliable.

Djeredjian last contacted Lamkin telephonically on June 12, 1968, from Wilburton, Oklahoma, where he attends Eastern Oklahoma State College. Djeredjian stated the Federal Bureau of Investigation had talked to his wife, Sherie, and he assumed the Federal Bureau of Investigation would contact him regarding Sirhan Sirhan. Djeredjian told Lamkin he believed he had furnished information to Lamkin regarding Sirhan while Djeredjian was attending Pasadena City College. Lamkin stated a review of his files fails to substantiate this and he believes it is another lie. Lamkin is not aware of any visit to Los Angeles by Djeredjian on June 3, 1968, to June 4, 1968.

Harold Schneider, Assistant Manager, Los Angeles Auto Auction was interviewed June 14, 1968. He advised his records reveal Hagop H. Djeredjian delivered a 1967 Cadillac El Dorado to the auto auction at 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California, on May 27, 1968. The exact time of day could not be determined. Djeredjian was issued a check in the amount of one hundred eleven dollars and twenty-eight cents for this delivery.

Rose Avakian, 13158 Chandler Drive, Van Nuys, California, was interviewed on June 14, 1968. She advised she has not seen Hagop Djeredjian in the past four years. She recalled she loaned him a few dollars when he was attending Pasadena City College and since then has not heard from him and has no idea as to his present whereabouts or activities.

JAMES SDOWINSKI, Identification Bureau, Detroit Police Department, advised SA(A) WILLIAM O. BRADLEY, JR. on June 14, 1968 that records of his office contain nothing identifiable with HAGOP DJEREDJIAN, 108 West Margaret, Detroit, Michigan.

HERBERT N. LLOYD, JR., Service Representative, Dun and Bradstreet, Inc., 1600 Porter, Detroit, advised SA(A) ROBERT S. BARNHART on June 14, 1968 that a search of the files of that organization revealed no record or inquiries concerning HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN, Zo Jac, "Hye Serant", or Armenian Radio Voice. All logical variations of names were searched with negative results. Mr. LLOYD stated the cross index directory contains no listing for a telephone at 108 West Margaret, Detroit.

JAMES A. ZIEGLER, Agent, Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, Detroit, Michigan, advised SA BARNHART on June 14, 1968 that records of his office have nothing identifiable with HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN.

On June 14, 1968 Miss KATHERINE TRACY, Supervisor, Merchants Credit Bureau, advised SA BARNHART her files contain three references to HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN. In April, 1966, Manufacturers National Bank rejected a loan application for DJEREDJIAN based on insufficient employment and income. On a date not shown, Manufacturers National Bank granted him a loan for \$548.00 (A/C #3100171072). The address 5740 Woodward, Apartment 20, was listed for both of the above items. In February, 1968, the Danish Club, 22711 Grand River, Detroit, made an inquiry concerning HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN, Post Office Box 2642.

The following investigation was conducted by SA(A)s LEROY D. BIAVA and VERNON G. WALTERS on June 14, 1968:

Mrs. ALICE DERVARTANIAN, 16203 Ashton Road, Detroit (formerly 12616 Littlefield, Detroit), was not available for interview June 14, 1968. She was in the hospital after a heart attack.

Her husband, MATTHEW DERVARTANIAN, President, Dearborn Glove Manufacturing Company, 3461 West Fort, Detroit, advised HAGOP DJEREDJIAN has been in the United States about six years and in Detroit over two years. He left Detroit one or two months ago after applying for United States citizenship. The witnesses

on his citizenship petition were Mr. and Mrs. HAMAZASP ARSLANIAN (address unknown). His attorney was ARPO YEMEN (listed in a telephone book at 2872 Utica, Roseville, Michigan). He allegedly had married an Armenian girl in Arizona, got her money, and ran away. While in Detroit he had a radio program on station WQRS, published a newspaper or magazine, and operated an import business. He also was believed to have had a radio program in Arizona or California (Fresno or Los Angeles). Mr. DERVARTANIAN had no personal contact with DJEREDJIAN and does not know if he was arrested, but DJEREDJIAN allegedly had passed bad checks and had a poor reputation among Armenian businessmen in Detroit.

CHARLES BOYAJIAN, Partner, Royal Mourad Imports, 13847 Hamilton, Highland Park, Michigan, advised as follows regarding HAGOP DJEREDJIAN:

DJEREDJIAN has a very poor reputation among Armenian businessmen in Detroit and is considered to be a "crook" and confidence man. He first came to Detroit about 1964 from California, left Detroit, and came back the following year to Detroit, where he established an Armenian radio program on station WQRS for about a year; promoted an Armenian telephone directory entitled "Armenian Radio Voice's Telephone Directory of Greater Detroit" dated February 25, 1967, and previously published a weekly newspaper named "Hye Serunt" (meaning "Armenian Heritage"). This newspaper was established about four months ago and was published for about five weeks, although he had sold advertising and subscriptions for a longer period of time. He allegedly owes money to the radio station and printer. By taking advantage of their Armenian heritage, he also gained the confidence of and obtained money from various prominent Detroit businessmen, including ALEX MANOOGIAN of Masco Products and EDWARD MARDIGIAN of Mardigian Company.

DJEREDJIAN used the business name "Zo-Jac Products, Division of H. H. Djeredjian Bros., Import-Export-Distributor, P. O. Box 2642, Detroit". He obtained \$255.00 in advance from BOYAJIAN for backgammon boards to be imported from Lebanon, but they were not delivered. He later cashed a "NSF" personal check through BOYAJIAN on the pretence that this money was needed to complete delivery of the boards. This merchandise was never received by BOYAJIAN, who turned the two checks over to the Highland Park Police Department three or four weeks ago. No arrest record of DJEREDJIAN is known to BOYAJIAN.

DJEREDJIAN had rented a flat at 108 West Margaret until he left Detroit about two months ago. Furniture company repossessed the furniture in his flat. He reportedly returned to Detroit about ten days ago but left and his present whereabouts are unknown. BOYAJIAN did not see DJEREDJIAN in Detroit ten days ago but heard from an unrecalled source that he was in Detroit approximately that long ago. He is believed to have victimized other businessmen in Detroit and also to have been involved in "crooked deals" in California before coming to Detroit (details not known by BOYAJIAN).

The following investigation was conducted by SA REX H. PLOEN at Detroit, Michigan:

On June 14, 1968 GERALD LYONS, Investigations Section, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Detroit, made available INS file Number A 11952581 for HAGOP DJEREDJIAN, also known as H. Jack Djeredjian, Hagop Harutium Djeredjian, Hagop Jerejian, Jack, Gaby, which contains information as follows:

Date of birth was shown as December 12, 1935, place Beirut, Lebanon, present nationality Lebanese. DJEREDJIAN was issued a student visa at the American Embassy, Beirut, Lebanon, on September 10, 1959. He entered the United States at New York, New York on September 15, 1959, as an "F" student. Lebanese Passport [redacted] was issued DJEREDJIAN on July 12, 1958, valid to July 17, 1963. Parents were listed as father: HAROUTIOUND, mother: ANNA, nee Prindjian, address 28 Rue Naher Khoder, Beirut, Lebanon. Marital status: DJEREDJIAN was married on January 8, 1962 and divorced February 8, 1963, from SHAKEY, nee Kasparian, born November 9, 1932, at New York City, New York, address 3420 West Ninth Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

On June 5, 1965 at Phoenix, Arizona DJEREDJIAN married SHERRI LYNN, nee Gibson, formerly SHERRI LYNN MARKEL, born July 9, 1941, at Huntington, Indiana. They are presently married.

DJEREDJIAN was accepted by the Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for admission to a full course of study beginning September 14, 1959. He registered at the college on September 22, 1959 in the foreign student program and terminated on October 30, 1961. Reason given was illness.

In a sworn statement by DJEREDJIAN furnished to INS on March 27, 1963 regarding his right to remain in the United States, he advised he had performed certain confidential work for the American Embassy under the Security Office of the Department of State in Beirut, Lebanon, under the supervision of FRANK GRAY TERRY and JOHN BALDADIAN and the Vice Counsel of the American Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, a Mr. GATHY.

DJEREDJIAN allegedly subsequent to this continued the same confidential work in the United States on fraudulent visas and fraudulent people entering into the United States through Middle-East countries, which was done at the request of the Vice Counsel of the American Embassy in Beirut.

On January 25, 1962 DJEREDJIAN's first wife submitted a visa petition to INS, Los Angeles, which was approved on February 19, 1962 and afforded DJEREDJIAN non-quota status. DJEREDJIAN submitted an application for adjustment of his immigration status in conjunction with the visa petition.

On November 5, 1962 INS, Los Angeles, revoked the petition previously approved in behalf of DJEREDJIAN. DJEREDJIAN was found not eligible to have his immigration status adjusted. He is amenable to deportation as an over-stay non-immigrant student.

On July 10, 1967 DJEREDJIAN's second wife filed for a visa petition on behalf of DJEREDJIAN which was approved by INS, Detroit, on November 16, 1967. DJEREDJIAN is currently under deportation proceedings.

The following investigation was conducted by SA(A)
FRANK J. KNOTH:

On June 14, 1968 Mr. THOMAS WARNER, General Manager, Radio Station WJLB, 3100 David Broderick Building, Detroit, Michigan, advised that the "Armenian Radio Hour" is a weekly program that is produced on WJLB every Saturday. Mrs. ALICE DER VARTANIAN, 16203 Ashton, Detroit, telephone 255-1941, is the program director. In 1966, Mrs. DER VARTANIAN began teaching HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN how to run the program; she intended to train him to be her assistant.

DJEREDJIAN could not get along with anyone at the radio station and tried to take over and run things his way. He seemed to be quite hot-headed so Mrs. DER VARTANIAN had to let him go after only a few months.

DJEREDJIAN then started an "Armenian Radio Hour" at WQRS, Royal Oak, Michigan. He called the program the same name as the program on Station WJLB. When he refused to change the name upon suggestion by WJLB, it was necessary for WJLB to get an injunction to stop him from using the same program name. The Armenian program is no longer on WQRS.

JERRY TERTZAKIAN, Control Room Chief, Radio Station WJLB, advised he had a run-in with DJEREDJIAN when he was trying to take over the Armenian Radio Hour. DJEREDJIAN tried to tell him what to do and TERTZAKIAN would have no part of it. He said he heard that DJEREDJIAN was wanted in Fresno, California for some confidence racket. He also heard that DJEREDJIAN had been affiliated with a radio program somewhere in Texas. He said DJEREDJIAN has not been seen around town recently but believes he still has an export-import business which TERTZAKIAN did not know any details of.

RICHARD DESAUTEL, Station Manager, WJLB, advised that after the injunction was served on DJEREDJIAN he sat down with him and suggested the name of "The Armenian Radio Voice" be used. DJEREDJIAN was represented by ARPO YEMAN, telephone 562-5725, and DESAUTEL understands that the lawyer stopped representing DJEREDJIAN because of his overbearing attitude and hot temper. He recalled DJEREDJIAN becoming very upset and mad when someone called him a Turk.

Prior to the injunction, DJEREDJIAN threatened to put WJLB out of business for trying to tell him to change the name of the program.

DESAUTEL said WQRS was willing to go along with his suggestion but DJEREDJIAN refused and therefore, the injunction was necessary.

WARNER, TERTZAKIAN and DESAUTEL never heard DJEREDJIAN make any comments about any political figures.

HAGOP DER HAGOPIAN, 19370 Antago, Livonia, Michigan, advised SA(A) CLYDE B. LAUER on June 17, 1968 that he lived at 110 West Margaret, Detroit, until recently. DER HAGOPIAN advised that he owned the two story flat comprising 108 and 110 West Margaret and that he rented the upstairs portion to HAGOP DJEREDJIAN in about August or September, 1965. DJEREDJIAN paid rent through May 24, 1968 but moved out without giving notice four or five days before his rent was due and without leaving any indication as to where he went. DER HAGOPIAN advised that DJEREDJIAN lived with a woman by the name of SHERRI who may have been his wife and a six or seven year old boy by the name of
