

## UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Richmond, Virginia April 11, 1968

RE: EVERETT (No Middle Name) ELLIOTT; LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON - VICTIM; ROBERT F. KENNEDY - VICTIM; RICHARD JONES - VICTIM

Captain Murray O. Cochran, Roanoke, Virginia Police Department, advised that at 8:30 AM on April 9, 1968, Special Agent R. J. Hankinson, U. S. Secret Service, had contacted him about a threat a resident of Roanoke, Virginia, had made against the life of Fresident Lyndon Johnson and that he would like for a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FSI) to neet with Special Agent Hankinson.

Special Agent Hankinson advised that he had been informed by the Intelligence Unit of the U. S. Secret Service, Washington, D. C., that a person who identified himself as Everett Elliott, 3141 Hillcrest Avenue, Northwest, called the White House, Washington, D. C., by telephone from Roanoke, Virginia, at 11:40 PM, April 8, 1968. This call was transferred to the Intelligence Unit of the Secret Service and Special Agent Richard Jones took the call. Special Agent Hankinson advised that Ellictt made a statement to Special Agent Jones that if Lyndon Baines Johnson and Robert F. Kennedy attended the funeral of Martin Luther King, he would kill them. According to Special Agent Hankinson, Elliott stated "I'll kill him Lyndon Baines Johnson, the 'SOB' and Senator Robert Kennedy, too. I have a .30 caliber machine gun and a double barrel shotgun and will kill any agent who comes to my door." Special Agent Jones asked Elliott if he had been drinking or if he was drunk and Elliott stated that he was not drunk. Special Agent Jones then asked Elliott if he knew he was violating the law and Elliott stated that he did and he would kill Jones also.

Captain Murray O. Cochran advised records of the Roanoke Police Department do not contain any information identifiable with Elliott.

Records of the Roanoke Merchants Association, as furnished by Miss Betty Puckett, Clerk, reflects they have had a file on Elliott since August, 1966. His address is 3141 Hillcrest Avenue, Northwest, Roanoke, Virginia, and he is employed by the Murray Biscuit Company, Augusta, Georgia. He has worked for this company about six years. His wife is Emily G. Elliott and they have four children. She is employed by the Rusco Window Corporation, Roanoke, Virginia. Elliott formerly lived on Colonial Avenue, Cambridge, Maryland. His credit rating is good.

Inquiry at 3141 Hillcrest Avenue, Northwest, Roanoke, Virginia, on the morning of April 9, 1968, revealed there was no one at home at this address.

A neighbor advised that Elliott and his wife and four children have lived at this address about one year. Elliott is employed as a route salesman for the Murray Biscuit Company and his local headquarters are in Lynchburg, Virginia. Elliott usually spends one or two nights per week at home and is at home every weekend. The neighbor does not know if he stays in Lynchburg, Virginia, on the week nights he is not at home. Elliott drives a white late model panel truck owned by the Murray Biscuit Company, and his wife uses a 1967 model Plymouth, tan in color. She is employed at a company which makes storm windows near Salem, Virginia.

The neighbor advised that Elliott was at home on the evening of April 8, 1968 and departed from his home at about 9:00 AM on the morning of April 9, 1968, in his late model panel truck. The neighbor does not know if Elliott drinks to excess or whether he drinks at all. He does not know if Elliott owns any guns. He has had very little communication with Elliott and therefore knows nothing about his personal

life or habits. He described Elliott as a white male, 35 - 40 years old, 5'9" and weighing about 175 pounds. He has black hair and the neighbor does not know the color of his eyes or if he wears glasses. Elliott is a neat dresser, he usually wears a white shirt and tie and business suit even when he is driving his truck.

On April 9, 1968, Mr. James P. Brice, Assistant U. S. Attorney for the Western District of Virginia, Roanoke, Virginia, authorized prosecution of Elliott for the threat made against the life and well being of President Lyndon Baines Johnson, under Title 18, Section 871A, U. S. Code. He declined prosecution of Elliott for making the threats against Senator Robert F. Kennedy and Special Agent Richard Jones, U. S. Secret Service. Mr. Brice stated that it was his opinion the threat was made primarily against President Johnson and the one charge is adequate at this time. Mr. Brice stated that since the U. S. Secret Service is primarily responsible for the safety of the President and the threats were made to that agency, the U. S. Secret Service should handle the investigation of the matter. He advised further that if events and investigation reveal that Elliott should be prosecuted for the threats against Senator Kennedy and Special Agent Jones, he can be charged with these violations also.

On April 10, 1968, R. J. Hankinson, Special Agent, U. S. Secret Service, advised Elliott was arrested at 8:00 AM this date at Roanoke, Virginia, and charged with violation of Title 18, Section 875C, U. S. Code, rather than Title 18, Section 871A, U. S. Code. Elliott was charged with threatening the life of Special Agent Richard Jones, U. S. Secret Service Agent. Elliott was afforded a hearing before U. S. Commissioner Charles D. Fox, Jr., Roanoke, Virginia, and waived preliminary hearing and was remanded to the custody of the U. S. Marshal, Roanoke, Virginia, in lieu of \$5,000.00 bond. His bond restricted Elliott's travels to the Western District of Virginia and the Middle District of North Carolina.

It is further noted that on 4/10/68 subject arrested by US SS. The investigation is being handled by SS with no further investigation remaining at WFO. Therefore recommend case be RUC'd administratively.
