DEEDLE, 100 North 81st Street, advised about two and one-half years ago he met a young Arab at the Steeple Chase Room, Chase Park Plaza Hotel, St. Louis, Missouri, and after conversation, mentioned that he was going to the Playboy Club, St. Louis, and the young man asked to go along. DEEDLE stated that over the next year he saw this young man fairly frequently at the Playboy Club where he was not admitted as a member, but was allowed to use the facilities on a cash basis. He stated he knew the man only as "Sammie" but furnished a business card given to him by the man which bore the name SAMIR M. KHALAF, A.S.P., St. Louis University, 3630 West Pine Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri, 63108.

He stated he enjoyed conversations with this young man who stated that his father was Consul General or Ambassador from his country to the United States and indicated that the family lived in Washington, D. C., and that he had a sister there also. DEEDLE stated that the man was a "little windy" and he looked up the name of the real ambassador from the country, not specifically recalled, and believed the real ambassador's name was FARHAN.

He stated the young man quit coming to the Playboy Club about one and one-half years ago and he has not seen him since. The man gave the impression that he was in the Army Reserve or some similar organization in his own country and might have to serve in the Armed Forces and he assumed he had returned to his country during the Arab-Israli conflict.

The young man had no automobile and was described as white male, 21 or 22, 5 feet 8 inches, slender build, olive complexion, black hair, clean shaven. He spoke fast and spoke fairly good English but with an accent. He also indicated he was engaged to a girl believed also from the Middle East, possibly residing in Washington, D. C., and commented that he had made one or more trips to Jordan or Arabia during DEEDLE's acquaintance with him. 




DIAGRAM OF SHOOTING SCENE—Sketch shows the doors leading from behind podium at Embossy




DIAGRAM OF SHOOTING SCENE-Sketch shows the doors leading from behind pedium at Embossy

JAMES C. MC WHINNEY advised he is a bachelor and resides with his brother on a farm near Coal Valley where he assists with the farm work.

Mr. MC WHINNEY explained that for a number of years he has taken tours set up by a Travel Bureau Service to different parts of the United States. In June, 1968, he was on such a tour, which took him to Los Angeles, California, and the group was registered at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles for three days, which included the day that ROBERT F. KENNEDY was assassinated. Mr. MC WHINNEY recalls on the day before the assassination, which would be June 4, 1968, the group went on a tour of the city of Los Angeles. He believes they returned to the hotel around 6:00 P.M. He had dinner and "hung around" the lobby because of the excitement and on two occasions, saw ROBERT KENNEDY. However, the crowd became so large that at approximately 11:00 P.M. he returned to his hotel room, where he went to bed,

Mr. MC WHINNEY observed the photograph of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN and stated he did not recall observing him at the Ambassador Hotel while he was there, but added that he probably did see SIRHAN B. SIRHAN because he was wandering around in this crowd before he went to bed. When asked specifically if he did observe SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, he answered, "No, I could not testify to that."

During June, 1968, they joined a Berry Tour Group from Chicago, Illinois and traveled with this group to Los Angeles, California. They checked in at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles for a scheduled two-night stay. However, they were quartered in the Ambassador Cottage rather than in the main Hotel.

On the evening of June 4, 1968, they retired at approximately 10:00 p.m. and were oblivious to what subsequently happened at the hotel. Their daughter, who lives in Davenport, Iowa, telephonically contacted them on the morning following Senator KENNEDY's assassination and initially informed them of his death. Prior to this call, they were unaware of the events that occurred at the Ambassador Hotel or that Senator KENNEDY had been killed.

The COVERTS could not identify a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN and do not remember seeing anyone around the hotel premises resembling SIRHAN.

During their brief stay, the only national figure that they remember seeing in the Ambassador lobby soon after they had checked in was football star ROOSEVELT GREER.
