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

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. BRENT SCOWCROFT THE WHITE HOUSE

Subject: Attempted Assassination on the Central Republic's (CAR) President, Jean-Bedel

Bokassa

On February 3, three African assailants attempted to assassinate CAR's President, Jean-Bedel Bokassa, as he was about to board his aircraft in Bangui, CAR's capitol. Bokassa was unharmed in the assault.

Attached is a suggested telegraphic message of good will from President Ford to Bokassa, in which the President expresses relief that Bokassa successfully escaped the attempt. President Ford also sends his personal good wishes, and those of the American people, for Bokassa's continued safety and well-being.

Bokassa dispatched a similar good will message to President Ford, following the September 22 attempt on the President's life, and in view of the importance we attach to our relations with the CAR, one of our most consistent supporters in Africa, we recommend White House approval of the suggested message.

sion what he claims is an authentic copy of the Abraham Zapruder film of the assassination. Groden refuses to say how he got the film or to give any personal background other than that he has been investigating the assassination for nine years.

A university audience estimated at more than 600 listened as Groden narrated the film that purportedly illustrates how Kennedy was fired on at least three times.

Findings Queried

Contrary to findings by the Warren Commission, which was charged with the investigation of the former president's death 11 years ago, the film suggests that Kennedy received at least one wound in the left temple. The force of the blow apparently wrenched the president back and to the left, indicating that the shot was fired from the front and to the right.

The Warren Commission's findings said the president received wounds from shots fired from behind him and that a bullet that hit the president also struck then Gov. John B. Connally of Texas, who was riding in the car with Kennedy. Groden claims that would have been impossible.

By enlarging several frames of the Zapruder film and other film footage, Groden shows the location and "forms" of at least two assasins, who were far from Oswald's supposed location.

The outlines of the figures are vague, but suggest the form of a man ready to fire a telescope-equipped rifle, he said.

Groden's lecture was only the second before a public college audience. He delivered a similar talk Tuesday night at the College of William and Mary and has plans for other college speaking engagements and national television appearances.



Leaders To View Zapruder Film

In an effort to prompt the U.S. House of Representatives to reopen the Kennedy assassination investigation, University Union members have persuaded Congressman Robert W. Daniels (R-4th District) to show the Zapruder film to the Virginia Congressional delegation and other Congressional members April 15.

Their action came as a result of a plea by photography expert Robert Groden made during his presentation of the film last Wednesday, according to first-year student Susan Smith, who contacted Rep. Daniels.

The Zapruder film, according to Mr. Groden, disproved the Warren Commission decision that the late President John F. Kennedy was killed by one assassin from the rear.

The House is currently considering a resolution to reopen the investigation of the Kennedy assassination. No corresponding resolution exists in the Senate, however.

"Congressman Daniels would like to see the film, although he has not committed himself one way or the other on the resolution," according to Miss Smith.

Mr. Groden will show the film to the Congressmen, along with some slides he showed here, according to Union. Speakers Committee Co-chairman Andy Purdy.

"We feel that if the investigation will not be reopened now, after the film Mr. Groden showed, it will never be reopened," Mr. Purdy explained.

"We (the union) are considering presenting Mr. Groden again, because many people were turned away from the film, including former University President. Edgar F. Shannon, Jr., a member of the Rockefeller Commission," Mr. Purdy said.

"As the armor of the conspiracy began to crack, some of the principals have been killed along the way, have left the country, or whatever. So it's not intact."


Mr. Groden said that the first thing he did after his investigation was complete, was to take his information to the Rockefeller Commission investigating CIA activities. He added, however, that only a few of the commission members and part of their staff had seen the film.

Mr. Groden said he does not plan to stop, and is expected to make television appearances with his information to get more publicity. He said that he plans a news conference in Dallas and will release more information at that time.

Whatever the outcome of Mr. Groden's campaign, one blatant fact is too powerful to overlook: that the Warren Commission misreported information when it stated that Mr. Kennedy was shot only from the rear



The Zapruder film of the Kennedy assassination, released to the public last month, is only five and one half seconds long. But what it contains may undo what its current holder. New York photo expert Robert Groden, calls twelve years of the biggest lie to have ever hit the American people.

Possible Ramifications

And while the Zapruder film only spans one Dallas street, its possible ramifications-that the Warren Commissions's report, that Lee Harvey Oswald singlehandedly killed John F. Kennedy, was a coverup-may extend nationwide.

What the film shows, simply, are two things; that the assassinated president was shot from the front as well as the back, and that a man with a rifle and sight, who stood between a tree and Zapruder was facing the president's oncoming car.

In a three and one half hour presentation last night, Mr. Groden showed and told more: including the fact that in four years 19 key witnesses to the Kennedy assassination died, over a trillion to one odds-and that today over 100 witnesses have died or been killed-"blowing it right off the statistics chart."

For example, columnist Dorothy Kilgallon had had an exclusive interview with Oswald assassin Jack Ruby who had claimed to Warren Commission members Earl Warren and Gerald R. Ford that the assassination "was a conspiracy."

When Miss Kilgallon returned to New York after speaking to Mr. Ruby, she reportedly told associates: "I think I can blow this whole thing open in a couple of days,"

Mr. Groden explained that she died a few days later, and although the press reported suicide from an overdose, he claims that an autopsy was never performed.


Mysterious Origins

Mr. Groden failed however, to name where he had gotten the film in the first place and he explained that "a lot of people could be injured by this," if the information were released.

The film was first shown at a Georgetown University Convention in 1973, but the incldent received little public notice. He said that he was in danger at the time because so few knew about the film

"There was more chance of my being hurt when just a few people knew about this than with millions of people knowing it," he said. "We had to do it very quitely, and we couldn't tell anyone about it. From the time that we planned to do it and the time that it was released was less than 24 hours."

Daniel J. Meloy, 52, Dies, Served State in Japan

Daniel J. Meloy, 52, a former Foreign Service officer and resident of Washington, died of a heart attack Friday while swimming off the coast of Yucatan.

He was the brother of the late Francis E. Meloy Jr., who was kidnaped and murdered last June while serving as U.S. ambassador to Lebanon.

Molly L. Fitch, Was CIO Chief's Secretary Here

Molly Lynch Fitch, 65, who was secretary to the late Philip Murray, president of the Congress of Industrial Organizations, died of cancer Jan, 2 at Georgetown University Hospital.

Born in Pittsburgh, Mrs. Fitch was a legal secretary at ClO headquarters here when Mr. Murray was elected president in 1940. She served as his secretary until his death in 1952.

Daniel Meloy had joined the Foreign Service in 1949. He was a specialist in Japanese affairs and spent much of his career in Japan with intermittent assignments at the State Department here.

He had left the Foreign Service recently. At the time of his death he was a consultant for a Japanese Bank in New York and other Japanese and American firms.

Born in Washington, Mr. Meloy was a graduate of Woodrow Wilson High School and Oberlin College, He later studied at Harvard Business School, the University of Colorado, George Washington University and the University of Paris

During World War II, he served as a lieutenant with the Navy in the Pacific. He was present at the surrender of Japan and was attached to Geo. MacArthur's staff during the early part of the occupation of Japan.

Mr. Meloy then worked for the State Department and the Central Intelligence Agency.

There are no immediate survivors.

This is in response to your letter dated January 8, 1976, in which you requested "a copy of the White House tape or a transcript of that tape which was made on the night that Arthur Bremmer shot Governor Wallace in Maryland." Your request is based on the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 552.

The White House Office is not believed to be an agency for the purposes of this Act and is, therefore, not subject to its mandatory disclosure provisions. In addition, the White House is presently subject to the Order of the United States District Court for the District of Columbia, entered October 21, 1974, as amended, in Nixon v. Sampson, et al., Civil Action No. 74-1518, which prohibits the disclosure of the contents of the "Presidential materials of the Nixon Administration". For these reasons, your request is hereby denied.

In addition, I have taken the liberty of forwarding a copy of your January 9 correspondence to the Justice Department for appropriate consideration.

SUBJECT: Alleged Cuban Assassination Plot

On March 4, 1976, the Federal Bureau of Investigation advised the Secret Service that the San Francisco FBI Office had obtained information concerning an alleged plot to assassinate President Ford and former Governor Ronald Reagan at the Republican National Convention in Kansas City. The FBI indicated that the source of the information was an individual who was known to have been associated with terrorist activities in California. In addition to the above allegation, which could not immediately be either refuted or substantiated, the source provided information, which was known to be true, concerning himself and his associates. The alleged plot reportedly involved a high-ranking Cuban guerrilla leader acting upon orders from Fidel Castro and several individuals from the West Coast, including the source.

A joint investigation by the FBI and Secret Service has failed to verify the existence of such a plot. On March 15, 1976, the Secret Service in San Francisco reinterviewed the source. He admitted that he had fabricated the plot in order to impress investigators. The Secret Service investigation concerning the source and the persons he named continues in order to determine the degree of danger these individuals present to persons under the protection of the Secret Service.
