In the News-Democrat the other day Congressman Ford from Michigan was quoted as saying, in regard to the Sirhan case that "our nation is already beset by disruption and we have no need of agitators from abroad."

In my opinion the gentleman is certainly right, as we have enough native-born agitators without importing them from overseas.

One wonders, however, why men like Sirhan, Oswald, Czolgosz and others come to this country at all. If Sirhan had murder in his heart, it looks like he would have taken a shot at a king or a senator in his native land.

Ditto Oswald, who murdered President Kennedy. Although born in New Orleans he went to Russia as a young man, took out naturalization papers there, married a Russian girl, and worked in a Russian factory. But when he got tired of working for peanuts he came back to his native land and shot the president. One wonders if he ever thought of taking a pot shot at Khrushchev and if not why would he rather murder the president of a free country than the ruler of a dictatorship?

Ditto Czolgosz who came from Poland which then, like now, was under the control of Russia. President McKinley, a kindly man was visiting a state fair at

Note 1 — President Nixon has a long record of being less than enthusiastic about federal aid to education. When the first education bill came up in the Senate, sponsored by Sen.

Buffalo, N.Y. in 1901. Hundreds of people were lined up to shake their president's hand when along came Czolgosz with a handkerchief wrapped around a revolver in his hand as if it had been injured. When McKinley offered his hand, Czolgosz emptied his revolver into the president's stomach. He died a couple of days later.

Again, what brings men like that over here; we don't go over there shooting their leaders. Seems like there ought to be some way of screening them out according to law.

Dear Mr. Curtis:

May I thank you for your kind and thoughtful letter of April 23 concerning the murder trial of Sirhan Sirhan.

As you know, Mr. Sirhan was tried and convicted under the laws of the State of California. The jury was impaneled under the laws of the state and acted in accordance with the established procedures in that state.

In Michigan, as you know, we have not had capital punishment for well over 100 years. From time to time both the legislature and the people of the State of Michigan have refused to reinstate this form of punishment.

Furthermore, in the State of Michigan the jury passes on the guilt or innocence of the accused while the judge determines his sentence. Under the laws of the State of California this is different.

As you may also have read in the papers, the chances of the execution actually being carried out in California are somewhat remote. There are a number of convicted criminals in "death row" but no executions have taken place for some time.

Neither the federal government nor any member of the Congress has any jurisdiction over the action taken in California even though a United States Senator was assassinated.

Listening to the radio today I received the joyous news that our wonderful, glorious, just, righteous, and God-fearing country is going to murder in cold blood another member of our society by the name of Sirhan Sirhan.

Since I am a part of this society I cannot sit by and let my country - your country - commit such an immoral and unjust action as this. Can you ??! I surely hope not!! If you can you are violating every Christian principle that the "justice" of our society is based on - the "justice" that we should strive in every way to protect - the "justice" that the uniqueness of our potentially and idealistically wonderful country is based on. Can you still allow this ??! I surely hope not! If you can you are violating as well every Christian belief that you may hold personally! are you willing to do this?

Does politics really result in such immorality and lack of ethical foundation for the lives of those involved directly? If so, I don't want my country run by these people. If so, I have no pride in this country in this respect, in fact, I am downright ashamed of the justice that it so righteously administers with the calculating precision of a psychotic killer.

If you are one of those politicians that stuff your moral and ethical standards in the closet at your easiest convenience then I do not want you representing me. If you allow without a fight the death of Sirhan Sirhan I will have to believe that you in fact do not realize the importance of the

Christian doctrine in the formation of the United States; that you are in favor of such an action; that ~~if~~ either you have no moral & ethical values or that you do in fact pack them in the closet when they get in the way. Sincerely hope you are not such a person (and do believe in actuality that you aren't) for your sake as well as mine.

Having to confine human beings in jail is bad enough but to kill them goes beyond just an immoral action - it becomes the action of a deranged and weak power, one that is unable to confront the reality that its own society is creating the ~~situation~~ situation that it must so "nobly" eliminate. Granted our society is one that breeds violence but this violence is between the people and is no excuse for their leaders to stoop to the worst possible violence - that of taking a life. It is a sorry state that we have come to when we can virtuously give ourselves the power to kill in the name of justice.

Mr. Ford, I live in East Grand Rapids and am a member of Grace Episcopal Church as I know at least some of your family. I plead with you as a member of your religious background as well as your congressional district to do something about Sirhan Sirhan and the death penalty in the United States.

I would appreciate it if you would reply. Thank you.
