end of the ~~Hall~~ hall. I did not actually see Senator Kennedy at this time but by the movement of the crowd I was under the impression that he was in the group.

I heard what sounded like three shots fairly close, followed by several more at random intervals. They sounded like <sup>they</sup> came from a cap pistol. I also saw what appeared to be flashes from the shots. At this time I had the impression of someone standing on a table and firing a gun at a downward angle.

I moved toward where this activity had happened and learned that Senator Kennedy had been shot. I got my camera and returned and began to take pictures. I took five pictures of the activity. I then learned that in addition to Senator Kennedy, several others had been shot. I also became aware that some of the commentators were caught by several others subduing the person who apparently had done the

Shooting.

I later left the Ambassador Hotel and went to Fire Department Headquarters. Enroute I wondered whether ~~this~~ <sup>was</sup> the person I had seen following the Senator's party with <sup>the</sup> ~~the~~ poster had been involved in the shooting. However, after I arrived at Headquarters <sup>and</sup> I had a news cast that described the suspect as <sup>being</sup> a Negro or Mexican man about 25 years of age. ~~However~~ <sup>I</sup> recalled the person I had seen with the poster as about of that <sup>description</sup> ~~age~~ but with a complexion too light to be described as Negro or Mexican. The man I had seen had <sup>a full head of</sup> ~~black~~ <sup>black</sup> hair and ~~so~~ he was wearing a blue shirt or blue jacket and ~~also~~ possibly dark trousers.

<sup>newspaper</sup> ~~the~~ I later saw pictures of the person charged with the shooting and I felt that it was the same person I had seen following ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> Senator

Kennedy and carrying the poster.

The pictures I took showed several people struggling with a man who apparently had done the shooting. One picture showed Senator Kennedy on the floor surrounded by people. The foot and a portion of the leg of one of the other victims was also shown in the picture of Senator Kennedy. One of the pictures only showed the backs of some by standers. Another picture showed a man standing on a table next to the wall near where the Senator had been shot. 21/B

I, Henry Adrian Corrao, hereby give the following voluntary statement to George M. Kling and Roland H. Broyles who have identified themselves to me as Agents of the FBI. This statement may be used in any manner deemed necessary.

I am 19 years old, Born 10/30/48 in Los Angeles, Calif. I currently reside at 1838 Workman, Los Angeles. I am employed by the Los Angeles City School Districts as a Playground Director. I currently attend East L.A. College, majoring in Police Science. This is my freshman year.

On Tuesday 6/4/68 at approximately 11 AM David Montellano and myself attended the San Gabriel Rifle Range for Target Shooting. David resides at 3314 Muced St., Los Angeles.

After shooting at the rifle range, we noticed an individual shooting very rapidly on the Pistol range which is beside the rifle range. At this time we decided to start shooting our own Pistol, a .22 ~~caliber~~ colt moorman.

Noticing the individual down the range was shooting rapidly, we decided to approach him and inquire about the <sup>H.O.C.</sup> weapon. David asked him if the weapon was a 38 & he replied "No, it was a .22 <sup>H.O.C.</sup> caliber." Then I asked him how many bullets the pistol was able to hold and he replied "it is an eight shot pistol." I then asked him if it was single or double action and he replied "it is single." I was quite obvious he didn't know and about the gun so we could see that it was double action. He finally said that we had gotten him confused and that the pistol was double action. I asked him what make the gun was and he didn't answer. I asked again and he said "it was an Iver-Johnson" and showed me the inscription on the barrel which verified this.

This individual then ask us if we hunted and we answered "No, we had just begun learning about pistols." I believe I asked him if he hunted himself and he said, "I just started shooting myself." David asked him about a special box of

Bullets which he had on the support in front of him. The bullets were mini-magnum. He also had several boxes of regular ammunition. The box of mini-magnum was about 3 gone. He had about 400 empty casings to the right of him which he had apparently fired.

~~David and I decided to leave~~

The individual asked David how to obtain better accuracy than the sight pattern and they discussed briefly and then David and I left the range at approximately 2 PM. The individual was still shooting.

After Senator Kennedy's attempted assassination early in the morning of June 5, 1968 David and I heard the description of the suspect and the gun used and decided it matched the description of the individual we had seen and talked with at the range and the gun likewise matched. We decided to call the Police.

The individual at the range was about 22 to 23 yrs. of age, thin build, weighing about 135 pounds, about 5'5" to 5'6" tall, dark complexion with curly, black or brown hair.

hair. AT was apparent that he was  
of a foreign extraction. He spoke with  
some type of accent not readily known to me.  
He was wearing a long sleeve Base or  
white shirt with stripes and light  
blue jeans. I noticed no apparent scars  
or identifying marks. I saw no one with  
him and noticed no automobile.

After we called the Police, Detective  
Lou ESTRELLA of Homicide Division, Central,  
LAPD came down with six mug shots. David  
and I both picked out one mug shot as  
definitely being the individual we had  
seen at the range. We did not know his  
name at that time and didn't know it until  
we heard the name on television.

I have read the above statement

lieve it to be true to the best of  
my knowledge.

I, Thomas Perez, make the free and voluntary statement to Bernard M. Connors who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I live at 538 South Lorena Los Angeles home phone AN 9-4387 and am a Security Guard at the Ambassador Hotel 3400 Wilshire Blvd. L.A. On the night of 6/4/68 I came to work at 5:50 P.M. and punched out about 2:48 A.M. 6/5/68. I was assigned to the Embassy room during Senator Kennedy's speech. My post was <sup>some</sup> the first swinging door to the left of the stage as Senator Kennedy faced the guests in the Embassy room. It was my understanding that when the Senator finished his speech he was to come through the door I was on and then left down the hallway behind the stage. As soon as the Senator finished his speech a superior of mine, whom I don't recall, told <sup>some</sup> me to close my door and keep the people out. About a minute after the senator finished his speech I heard about seven shots all in a row, all in about three seconds. The crowd was starting to force

there way through my door before the shots and I was busy keeping them back and did not see which way the Senator went after his speech nor did I see the shooting or the suspect.

When I heard the shots I turned toward the swinging doors leading into the Pantry and saw a woman bleeding from the head. She was still standing at these swinging doors and I helped her back into the Embassy room and a doctor, whom I don't know, asked me to get some ice, which I did. I did not go into the Pantry until about fifteen minutes later and everything was over with in there except the Los Angeles Police Officers were interviewing people in there.

As I said above I didn't see the shooting as I was too busy keeping the crowd from coming through my post.

I have declared the above and
