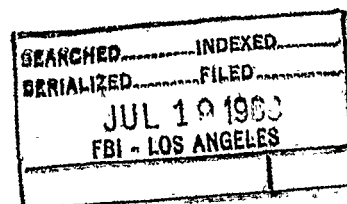

I, William Burton Blume of 2851 North Lake ave, Altadena, hereby furnish the following voluntary signed statement to Special ^{WBB} Agent Norbert R. Linker of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

I am 18 years of age, single and will graduate from John Muir High School on 6-13-68. In my spare time I have been active in the Youth for Senator Kennedy campaign in the Pasadena, California area.

On Sunday, 6-~~2~~^{WBB}68 a friend David Vogel and I attended a reception for Senator Robert Kennedy held on the Palm Terrace of the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles between the hours of 8:30 P.M. and 10:30 P.M. As Vogel and I approached the doorway off the main lobby of the Ambassador which leads onto the Palm Terrace I observed an individual whom I immediately recognized as a onetime employee of the Organic Pasadena Food Company of Pasadena, California. This individual went by me from the opposite direction at a distance of approximately three feet. As he passed I turned at which time I noticed that he was alone and appeared to be wearing a sportshirt and

green trousers.

On turning back in the direction of the Palm Terrace I may have commented to my friend David Vogel that I knew the man that just passed, but I am not sure of this point.

At approximately noon 6-5-68 I was en route home in my car and was listening to a Mr. John Weidner, the owner of Organic Pasadena Food Company being interviewed on radio. Mr. Weidner was identifying Sirhan Sirhan as a former employee of his concern.

I would like to point out that I was employed as a stockboy at the Showcase Liquors at 1374 North Lake, Pasadena from December, 1967 through March, 1968. The Showcase Liquor Company adjoins Organic Pasadena Company. During my four months of employment I frequently observed a person later known to me as Sirhan Sirhan working in and around Organic Pasadena.

When Sirhan Sirhan's photographs were shown on television on the evening of 6-5-68 I immediately recognized him as the person who passed me at the Ambassador Hotel on the evening of 6-~~2~~^{WBB}68 as well as being the person whom I had worked next door to at Showcase Liquor from December

1967 to March 1968.

I, Rogelio Diaz, give the following free and voluntary statement to Robert E. Sage, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the F.B.I. I have been advised that I do not have to make a statement and any statement I do make can be used in a court of law. No promises or threats have been made to induce me to make this statement.

I am 37 years of age having been born June 10, 1931, at Mexico City, Mexico. I reside at 3315 Anadita Street, Los Angeles, California, with my wife Maria, and three children. I am employed as a bus boy at the Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, and have been so employed for the past ten years. I can read and write the English language.

On June 4, 1968, I came to work at 5:00 a.m. and was working out of the kitchen covering primarily the Embassy Room and the Colonial Room. About midnight on June 4, 1968, I was standing between the pantry and the kitchen when

I observed Senator Robert F. Kennedy, accompanied by his wife and a number of other people walk through the kitchen area and go into the Embassy Room where Senator Kennedy gave a speech.

About twenty to twenty-five minutes after entering the Embassy Room, Senator Kennedy came back out of the Embassy Room into the pantry area. I was standing between the pantry and the kitchen about ten to fifteen feet from Senator Kennedy when I heard several loud noises which sounded like shots. At that time Senator Kennedy was shaking hands with the two cooks and I saw him stumble up and fall backwards to the floor. A large crowd of people immediately gathered around him and then I saw three or four men wrestling with a man who had a gun in his right hand. The man with the gun was standing about eight or ten feet from Senator Kennedy and was a young man about twenty or twenty-five years of age. He was wearing a blue sport coat. I

just got a glimpse of the side of the man's face and could not identify him from that quick glance other than to say he was a young man. I also noticed the man had a lot of black hair which appeared uncombed. The only man I recognized who was wrestling with the man was Carl Yucker, the banquet Captain. I recall seeing the same man about twenty minutes prior to that time as he was walking into the Colonial Room. The man was alone and I only saw him from the rear, but I recognized him because of the same blue sport coat.

~~I saw the~~ The men who were wrestling the man with the gun were near the stream tables and they finally got the man on the stream table and held him down. My attention was then directed again to Senator Kennedy who was lying on the floor. I saw blood on his stomach and on the right side of his head. Then the crowd of people moved in around Senator Kennedy and I didn't see him.

anyone. I then returned to the kitchen area and did not see either Senator Kennedy or the man with the gun again.

I have seen a photograph of Sirhan Sirhan and I do not know him. Further, I can not positively say he was the same man I observed with the gun the night Senator Kennedy was shot. I do not recall ever seeing anyone resembling Sirhan Sirhan in or around the hotel prior to the time of the shooting.

I have read the above statement concerning of this page and 3 other pages and I believe that ~~the~~ ^{the} same is entirely true. ^{R.D.}

I, David Perry Vogel hereby furnish the following voluntary ^{or} signed statement to Robert Sage and Herbert Linker who have identified themselves as Special Agents of the F.B.I.

I am 18 years of age, a senior at John Muir High School, Pasadena and reside at 1678 Casitas Ave. Pasadena. I have been a personal friend of William Burton Blume for the past two years.

At approximately 830 P.M., Sunday, 6-2-68 Blume and I attended a reception for Senator Robert F. Kennedy which was held on the ~~2nd~~ ^{or} Palm Terrace bet the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles. As Blume and I reached the second floor landing which leads into the main lobby of the hotel we crossed the lobby from a west to east direction heading toward doors which lead on to Palm Terrace. Midway across the lobby I noticed that Blume had fallen behind me and it appeared that his attention had been diverted to someone in the lobby. As I approached the door leading on to the Palm Terrace Blume was again abreast

of me. We then entered on to the Palm Terrace and awaited the arrival of Senator Kennedy at approximately 9:30 P.M. After the reception Blume and I drove home and no further mention of the events of that p.m. evening were made by Blume to me until sometime during the day of 6-5-68.

On 6-5-68 Blume approached me at school and informed me that the alleged assailant of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, was known to Blume as a former employee of Organic Pasadena Food company and that he, Blume had seen this individual in the lobby of the Ambassador Hotel on 6-2-68.

Blume then asked me whether I thought that he should notify the police of his observations and I suggested that he immediately contact the Los Angeles Police.

Approximately two days later I happened to meet Blume at which time he informed that he had been in touch with the Los Angeles Police Department concerning his observation on the evening of 6-2-68.

I had never seen or met Sirhan Bishara Sirhan prior to having viewed his

picture on television and in the newspapers on the evening of 6-5-68.

I have written and read the above statement consisting of three pages, initialed all corrections and find it to be true and correct.

I, Russell Doyle Weaver, 2221 Broderick Avenue, make the following voluntary statement to Joseph G. Davis, Jr. and James E. Rose, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the FBI.

On 6/4/68, I accompanied a friend, Charles Millner, 626 Hurstview Avenue, to the San Gabriel Valley Gun

Club, Duarte, arriving there at approximately 11 AM. On arrival, we went to the range master to check in and to get targets. We then went to the pistol range portion, which basically runs East and West. We took a position on the right hand side of the pistol range, that is, the last target position to the East side of the pistol range.

There was one other person on the pistol range at that time. He was

at the target position to the far left of the pistol range, that is, about the last or next to last target position to the West side of the pistol range.

The rangemaster asked this person to cease firing in order that we could put up our targets down range.

I would describe this person as follows: a heavy set muscular person weighing approximately 200 pounds. He was a white, male, approximately 6 feet tall, 24 or 25 years of age, olive complexion, black "kinky" hair resembling that of a person of Italian descent. He was wearing a dark blue flight deck shirt with ~~short~~ ^{short} sleeves. He had on shooter type "ear muffs", appearing to be of some type blue cloth with fur on it, of a commercial nature. It was my impression only, that he might be a police officer, because he was orderly in handling his guns and ammunition and he appeared to be

an experienced shooter. This person had two guns. One was a .44 magnum automatic, the gun he was then shooting and holding in his right hand. The other gun was a smaller automatic, blue in color, and which may have been a .22 caliber. This smaller gun was lying in a black "satchel" type of case, one side of which folded down opening up the "satchel." He also had a small telescope which was mounted on a tripod resting on the bench. The scope was about a foot long and on the ~~tripod~~ tripod, it stood about a foot tall.

Approximately 10 minutes or so after our arrival, I went over to this person and asked that ~~person~~ ^{person} he cease shooting in order that we could go down and check ~~the~~ ^{person's} ~~one~~ targets. It was at this time that I observed the small gun in his "satchel" and the other details ~~which~~ ^{person} listed above. On one other occasion during

the hour that we were there, I asked this person if he would agree ^{check Plev.} firing in order that we could ~~change~~ our targets.

Based on my observations of this person, I can definitely say that he is not identical with the person pictured in the photographs ~~are~~ displayed to me by Special Agent Davis. I did ~~recognize~~ ^{Plev.} recognize the photographs as being ~~the~~ ^{Plev.} the person identified in the newspaper as Jordan Sirkhan. I did not observe ~~the~~ ^{Plev.} Sirkhan on the pistol range while I was there or anyone resembling him.

While we were there, two men ^{white} persons arrived on the pistol range. They both spoke to ~~the~~ ^{Plev.} the person at the West end of the pistol range and then took up a target position approximately middle-ways between us, and about in the middle of the ~~pistol~~ ^{Plev.} range. I assume ~~that~~ ^{Plev.} from their physical ~~description~~ ^{Plev.} appearance that

they were father and son. The younger individual was approximately 30 years of age and wearing an Army type fatigue hat, with civilian clothes. His build was small and he weighed about 150-160 pounds. He was approximately 5 foot 6 inches tall. The older man was between 45 ^{and 46} to 50 years of age and weighed approximately 175 pounds. He was wearing a jacket and pants. His hair was "salt and pepper" gray. I did not observe these individuals ^{sufficiently} to furnish any additional description of them nor did I know either, or observe their mode of arrival. I did not notice any conversation between these 2 persons and the man on the West end of the pistol range other than when they first arrived, as mentioned above, which conversation I could not hear.

About 20 minutes later, a white male and female arrived at the range. I noticed them because she was the only female on the range and both had

to walk ^{Pdew.} ~~past~~ ^{near} me to enter the rifle range. They both went over on the rifle range, where there were also other males unknown to me, also firing on the rifle range. I did not talk to either of them. The man was a heavy set male, 45 to 50 years of age, weighing 175 to 180 pounds. The woman was about 18 to 19 years of age, 5 foot 2 inches to 5 foot 3 inches tall, ^{Pdew.} ~~was~~ with a slender build, weighing approximately 100 pounds. She had blond hair and was wearing a scarf. She was shooting a .22 caliber rifle. She had on slacks. This is ^{Pdew.} ~~not~~ all I can recall of their description; neither of these two persons ever came over to the pistol range. I cannot recall anyone from the pistol range ever going over to the rifle range to talk with them.

While we were there, there were only ^{Pdew.} ~~to~~ ^{Pdew.} ~~approximately~~ ^{Pdew.} ~~about~~ ^{of} 5 of us on the pistol range. We left about

noon, going home. When we left, the man was still at the West end of the pistol range, and the other two individuals were still shooting at midrange. The man and woman who also arrived later were still at their position on the rifle range.

I have read the above statement consisting of this and six other pages.

I, Jesse Cardona, 620 Hurstview Avenue, make the following voluntary statement to Joseph G. Davis Jr. and James E. Ron, who have ~~themselves~~ ^{J.C.} identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the FBI.

On 6/4/68, I was regularly engaged in delivering mail out of the Duarte Post Office. Part of my route takes me to the San Gabriel Valley Gun Club, Duarte, where I usually take my daily break. I arrived about 10:50 AM and took the mail to Lloyd Hager, the range master. We were standing there talking and my neighbor, Charles Miller, and a friend, Russell Weaver came in. They arrived at approximately 10:55 AM. I greeted them, they paid their ~~their~~ ^{J.C.} fees, got their targets, and then we all walked to the pistol range.

There was only one person on the pistol range at that time. He was on the far West end of the shooting line, down near ~~the~~ ^{GC.} where the small numbers begin. He was not then shooting, so Miller and Wesson got up their targets, and returned to the firing line. Miller and Wesson were at the opposite end of the pistol range, the East end.

I did not talk to the person at the West end of the pistol range. As best I can recall, he was a white male, approximately age 25 to 30 years old. He was about 5 foot 8 inches tall, weighed about 150 pounds, and had dark, possibly black hair. He wore "blue levis" pants and had ^{GC.} a "pull over" ~~GC.~~ ^{GC.} sweater type shirt with short sleeves. He was a very muscular person. He had on shooter's type "ear muffs". I do not know what type of gun he was using but he did have what appeared to me to be a telescope with which he

could look ^{gl.} ^{through} at a target.

Based on my observations of this person, I do not think that he is identical with the person pictured in the photographs displayed to me by Special Agent Davis. I did recognize the photographs as being the person identified in the newspaper as Sirhan Sirhan. I cannot recall observing Sirhan at the pistol range while I was there or anyone resembling him.

I left the range about 11:15 Am continuing on my mail route. At the time I left, only my two friends and the person at the West end of the pistol range previously mentioned were ~~still~~ ^{at} there at the pistol range. No other persons came during this time to the pistol range.

To the best of my recollection, there were no female persons on the range, although there were several other

oral persons on the rifle range, whom
I did not know.

I, Andrew Divyak, Chief Steward, Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, voluntarily furnish the following signed statement to Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, J.C. Fishbeck, Jr., who has identified himself by display of his credentials:

I reside at 758 South Ardmore Street, apartment 602, Los Angeles, California, and have no home telephone. I am single and have never been married. I have been employed by the Ambassador Hotel since 1950, except for a short period of time from late 1965 until April, 1966. From 1950, until late 1965, I was employed as Purchasing Agent, and since April, 1966, I have been Chief Steward at the Ambassador Hotel.

I was born January 30, 1918, in Hibbing, Minnesota and have resided in Los Angeles, California since 1943. I am five feet eleven inches tall, weigh 170 pounds, and have been issued Social Security number _____

I recall the following events that occurred in the Ambassador Hotel during the late evening hours of June 4, 1968, and the early morning hours of June 5, 1968:

Shortly before twelve o'clock midnight on June 4, 1968, I was sitting in the kitchen employee's dining room adjacent to the Embassy Room (D),

Service Pantry. I was sitting with Jesus Perez, hotel employee, and a hotel security guard whose name I do not recall. As we sat at the table, I saw Senator Robert F. Kennedy and other persons walk through the dining room and proceed to the Embassy Room.

I remained at the dining table figuring my work schedule when at about 12:15 AM, June 5, 1968, I heard what sounded like three firecracker explosions. About two seconds later, I heard a burst of about six more firecracker explosions. As best as I can recall, there was about one second delay between the first and second explosion, and about the same length of time between the second explosion and series of about six bursts. I looked up to see what made these noises and saw small lines of smoke coming from the Embassy Room Service Pantry.

Immediately I arose from the table, ran into the pantry, and stood next to a metal tray stand across from a row of chrome steam tables. I saw two white male Caucasians wearing Kennedy campaign sport coats and top hats standing on each side of a slender built male who appeared to be of Cuban descent standing against the
