steam tables. This person waved a pistol with his right hand, thus I yelled out to the effect, let's get him. The two men in the Kennedy campaign clothes grabbed the person waving the pistol before I did, and in the confusion, someone jumped ahead of me before I could reach him. However, I was able to observe his face and the pistol he held in his hand.

By this time, several persons had shoved the above person against the steam tables, and had him sprawled over the table; but he was still waving the pistol. I ran around to the other side of the steam tables in attempt to get the gun but too many people blocked my path. As I turned, I observed Senator Robert F. Kennedy lying on the floor of the Embassy Room Service Pantry. I ran to the room service desk to call for an ambulance, however the phone was being used. I then ran to the room Clerk's Office in the main lobby, but his telephone was also in use. Unable to locate an unused telephone, I ran back to the Embassy Room Service Pantry.

Senator Kennedy was still lying on the floor, however the person waving the gun had been moved down to the east end of the Service Pantry and was being held against the steam

tables. I walked down toward where the individual was being held and saw Karl Eucher, Maitre D'Hotel, and Eddie, last name unknown, assistant Maitre D', along with a tall heavy Negro in a maroon sportcoat, holding this individual against the steam tables.

Eddie asked me to go get some rope in order that they could tie this individual up. I turned to go find some rope, however I saw some Los Angeles Police Department officers enter the pantry. From that point, I assisted the police department and ambulance crews load the wounded individuals (total of four including Senator Kennedy) onto the service elevator and out of the hotel.

I did not observe the police officers take the ~~about~~<sup>up</sup> above individual who waved the pistol from the Embassy Room Service Pantry, however as stated, I did observe him when I ran into the Pantry after hearing the above described explosions. The following is a physical description of that person:

Sirhan B. Sirhan and positively identify it as that of the above described person whom I saw waving a pistol in the Embassy Room Service Pantry about 12:15 AM on June 5, 1968, and who I attempted to apprehend together with several other persons in the room. I have seen Sirhan B. Sirhan's photograph in the newspapers and it is also the same person I have previously described on page five of this statement.

I have read the above 6 page statement and it is true to the best of my knowledge.

I, Roy Varrow, banquet manager at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, voluntarily make the following statement to David R. Pender, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

I was born on May 20, 1930, at London, England. I have been employed by the Ambassador Hotel for 3 months. I now reside at 430 South Berendo, Los Angeles.


I was at the Ambassador Hotel from 9:00AM on June 4, 1968, until approximately 1:00AM on June 5, 1968. During Senator Kennedy's victory speech in the Embassy Room I was near the front of the stage. When Senator Kennedy finished his speech, I left the Embassy Room through the front door, and I was headed toward the Colonial Room where a press conference was to be held. I was standing in the hall in front of the Embassy Room, near the swinging doors which lead to the kitchen, when I heard 2 or 3 pops in quick succession. At the time I thought these noises were balloons popping. I then heard a commotion in the kitchen and Uno Simonson came out and said something about "shooting". No one else came through the swinging doors while I was there. I went into the kitchen right after Simonson came out of it, and I saw a struggle going on. I jumped on top of the ice machine.

and I saw that several men had a man pinned against the ice machine. This man's head was on the ice machine, and I was about 6 inches from him. I did not see the man's hands, nor did I see a gun. I have been shown a photograph of Dirhan Dirhan, and this man in this photograph is 99 per cent the same as the man whose head was on the ice ~~chest~~ machine. I could not say they were 100% identical unless I were to see the man in person.

I remained on top of the ice machine for several minutes. When I got off the ice machine I remained in the general area until the police came and arrested the man who had been pinned against the ice machine. The man whose head I saw on the ice machine and the man the police arrested were identical.

I later went to the hospital with the police.

I have read the 1½ Page Statement and is true to the best of my knowledge.

I, Larry Kenneth Arnot hereby furnish the following signed statement to Norbert R. Linker & D. Bruce Bradford who have identified themselves as Agents of the F.B.I.

I am 36 years of age and reside at 517 Melcoman Rd. Duarte California. I am employed as a salesman at the Lock Stock & Barrel gun shop, 8972 E. Huntington Dr. San Gabriel California.

During the afternoon of June 1, 1968 3 men entered my employment and walked to the rear of the store where our stock of ammunition is located. Two of the men remained positioned at the counter, their associate parted from them at a distance of about six feet and began to look over the items behind another counter.

One of the men standing together

appeared interested in the ammunition behind the counter. After approaching them to inquire if I could be of any help. The shorter of the two men responded by stating "I want two boxes of 'Mini Mag' or words to that effect. On questioning he added that he wanted the hollow point as <sup>MLA</sup> opposed to the standard type. I would like to point out at this time that "Mini Mag" is a brand or type of high velocity .22 caliber <sup>MLA</sup> ammunition of <sup>MLA</sup> short, long or long rifle sizes.

~~I~~ <sup>MLA</sup> obtained two boxes of hollow point .22 cal high velocity, long rifle "Mini Mags" made by the Cascade Cartridge Inc. of Lewiston Idaho and placed them <sup>MLA</sup> on the counter. Each box contained fifty cartridges.

After placing the cartridges on the counter the person standing next <sup>to the L.H.A.</sup> person who had ordered the "Mini Mag" <sup>MLA</sup> asked me to get

him two boxes of .22 Cal "Super X" long <sup>L.H.C.</sup> rifle bullets. On returning to the counter I placed two boxes of .22 cal. "Super X" <sup>L.H.C.</sup> standard long rifle bullets manufactured by Winchester - Western Division of Olin Mathieson Chemical Corp. alongside the other boxes.

I totaled a sales receipt <sup>L.H.C.</sup> arriving at a total of \$3.99. I placed the four boxes of ammo. in a paper bag along with the customers yellow copy of the cash sales slip. I cannot recall whether one of both of these men paid me the cash covering the \$3.99 sale.

I have been shown a photograph of Sirhan Fisiara Sirhan by agents Bradford and Linke of the F.B.I. and positively <sup>L.H.C.</sup> I identified this individual as the person to whom I sold the two boxes of .22 cal. high velocity, long rifle, hollow point "Mini Mags" on 6-1-68.

I have been shown a photograph of a person identified to me as Sharif Trishara Sirhan by agents Bradford and Linker and believe that he strongly resembles the individual who was with Sirhan <sup>PNK</sup> Trishara <sup>PNK</sup> and to whom I sold the two boxes <sup>of PNA</sup> standard .22 Cal. long rifle Super X Western ammunition on the same date.

I have read this statement, initialed all corrections and find it to be true and correct.

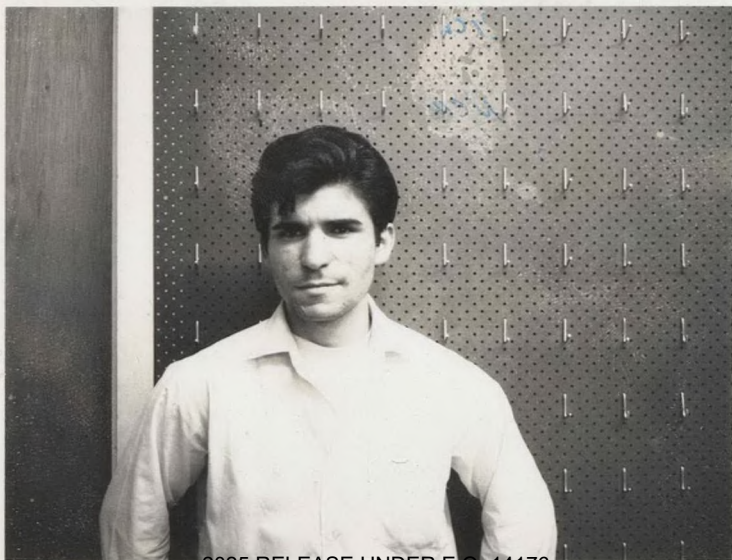
