I, Richard L. Cohen, known as Rick Rosen, 11030 Aqua Vista, Studio City, California furnish the following signed statement to Richard P. Donette who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me and I furnish this statement of my own free will.

On June 4, 1968 I was at the Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles, California when Senator Robert F. Kennedy gave his victory speech following the California Primary election. At the time Senator Kennedy gave his speech I was standing on the steps of the podium, ~~from~~ ^{RC} in the Embassy Room, from which he gave his speech.

After Senator Kennedy finished his speech Jack Hallivan, Mr. Uno, manager for the Hotel, and I started to lead the way toward the Colonial room where Senator Kennedy planned to thank the members of the press. As we were passing through the kitchen area I heard a loud pop, like a firecracker, from my rear and I turned around to see what caused the noise. Senator Kennedy was starting to fall to the floor and I saw a man holding a black gun; the gun was going off and I ~~could~~ ^{could} ^{RC} see fire coming out the back. ~~of the~~ ^{RC} Almost at the same time men were grabbing ~~the~~ ^{RC} for the gun. I remember that a total of five shots being fired. By the time the last shot was fired the man holding the

gun was ~~the~~ subdued by several men including Rosie
Guit, Rafer Johnson, and Jack Halloran.

I immediately went to the swing doors, near the rest
rooms, which lead into the Embassy room and asked two
security guards, who had heard the shots and were coming into
the kitchen, not to allow any more people in. The guards
took out their guns and tried to calm the crowd.

After a while I saw the man who had fired the shots
being taken out of the area. I have since seen photographs
of this man and he is known to me as Surhan Bishara
Birhan.

After Senator Kennedy had been taken to Central Receiving
Hospital I remained at the Hotel until ~~noon~~ 8:00 AM when
I went to school at Valley College, Van Nuys, California.

I have read the foregoing statement
consisting of this and one additional
hand written page. I now sign it
because it is true to the best of
my knowledge.

STATEMENT

I, STEPHEN DALE AHERN, called the Greek Theatre in March of 1968, at 1:45 PM, one day prior to the scheduled speaking appearance of Senator Robert Kennedy. When the operator at the Greek Theatre answered the telephone I said, "There is a bomb inside, it will go off tomorrow afternoon at 4:30 PM." I knew prior to making this bomb threat that the Senator was to address a rally at the Greek Theatre at 4:15 PM the day after I made the telephone call.

Later that same day (i.e. the day before Senator Kennedy was to appear at the Greek Theatre) at approximately 4:00 PM I telephoned the Los Angeles Times and told whoever answered the telephone that "Senator Kennedy will be shot."

Both of the aforementioned phone calls were made from a public phone booth in Sylmar, California. At approximately 1:00 PM, I

telephoned American Airlines at
Los Angeles International Airport
and told whoever answered the
telephone "Senator Gurneely will be
shot when he lands". This call to
the airport was made from a
public phone booth on Laurel
Canyon Blvd, San Fernando, California.

Immediately after making the telephone
call to the Los Angeles Airport I drove
to the airport and saw Senator
Gurneely land and was even able to
shake his hand. After having seen
the Senator at the airport, I drove
to the Greek Theatre where I observed
the entire Gurneely rally.

I originally made the three calls
involving the aforementioned threats in
order to see what news that it
would create.

I have read the statements
contained on this and one (1) other page
& I now sign this statement because I know

I, David Saul Barrett, make the following statement to Richard P. Doucette who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me and I make this statement of my own free will.

I am 24 years old having been born on [REDACTED] in New York City, New York.

I was a volunteer on the Kennedy for president committee and on June 5, 1968, at about 8:30 P.M. I went to the Ambassador Hotel to wait for the results of the election. A little before midnight Senator Robert F. Kennedy came to the Embassy room of the hotel to give his victory speech. During the speech I was directly in front of the senator, about 2 feet away from him.

After the speech was over Senator Kennedy left the podium and disappeared from my sight. A few seconds after he is gone I heard a loud pop, it sounded just like a breaking balloon, there was a short pause and then three more pops in rapid succession. Shortly a young boy, standing on a chair, yells that Senator Kennedy has been shot.

I pushed my way through the crowd toward the area where the pops came from but the crowd was too tight and I could not get through. I got down near the floor and by looking between peoples legs I could see, some distance away,

the foot of someone on the floor. I could not tell if it was Senator Kennedy.

About 15 minutes later Steve Smith asks everyone to leave the ~~the~~ Embassy room. I left the room, went down stairs to the ballroom, and watched television until about 3:30 A.M. when I went home. Later I went to the hospital. I have read this statement of two ~~of~~ ^{pages} and now sign it because it is exactly what I know.

Sir:

I received your letter dated November 10, informing me that my son was detained on October 24 and that you wish to know what should be done with him. First of all I want you to know that I was glad to have news about my son, and I want to tell you a few things about him.

Last year I sent him to secondary school here in Colina, but because he becomes angry easily he did not get along with his school companions and he only made enemies in school. He left from school without my permission and went to my sister's in Mexico-Cuernavaca. He constantly took things from the house like: key (estilson?) remnants of ^{cashmere} casimir, an electric shaver, and things of that kind. I know that he got to Cuernavaca asking for rides. When I found out where he was I went to Cuernavaca to get him and he promised me that he would behave and it was arranged so that he would return to school ^{and not} without losing the school year. Five or six months afterwards he started behaving the same way as before and started taking things out of the house. For the second time his mother went to Cuernavaca and it was then that his mother and myself decided to take him to Los Angeles, California, to see if we could get him into a school there. His mother took him to Los Angeles and it was decided that she would go to a school located in Figueroa Street, in Los Angeles -- and I think that he was even going to live there -- but he did not want to go to that school and took \$70. from his mother's purse and escaped to San Francisco. You probably know already, from his record, that

the Probation Department of San Francisco took hold of him, and that his mother also, when he took the seventy dollars, went to the Probation Department of Los Angeles where I believe they also keep his record. The Probation Department of San Francisco returned him to Cuernavaca. When his mother found out that he was in Cuernavaca she went there after him. He wanted to continue studying, but his mother insisted that he didn't finish the year because she said that he was making too much fun of the school teachers. He went to see the Director of Public Education of the state and he was excused and accepted again in school, but his mother was against it and she ordered that I ^{would} take him to my Rancho and teach him how to work in the field to see if in that way he could change his manner of thinking. Mr. Howard, according to the information I have here, in school he is a very intelligent boy, the only thing wrong was the lack of guidance and control. I brought him to the Rancho to work with me and for four or five months he helped me very much like anyone else would have done. When I finished my harvest I didn't have any more work and then I had to leave for the United States accompanied by my wife. I asked my son if he wanted to come with us in order to work, or if he would rather stay and study. He said that he wanted to stay and study, but his mother did not approve and asked me to take him with us. I didn't want to take him with me because I wanted to give him the last opportunity. I came to United States with his mother and he went back to school. I know that he only studied for about two weeks and then he started getting things from the house again.

He broke the lock of the desk and took my pistol and other things of little value. This was the manner in which he left this place. I sent 90 dollars for the support of my sons to the girl who was taking care of them. She had spent only about 300 pesos and the rest of the money she kept in the wardrobe -- that I think were about 800 pesos --. Well, my son broke the lock of the wardrobe, took the money and ~~took it~~ with him when he left here. Only today, I know about his whereabouts, thanks to you, Mr. Howard. I am very grateful for this courtesy that I don't deserve.

Now, Mr. Howard, with reference to what I want to do about my son, I want you to know that right now I am doing the harvesting of my crop and I will not finish doing so probably in a month, since I have only five or six men helping me. It is impossible for me to hire more men because I have a lot of corn, and too many people will not do the work right since it is impossible for me all by myself to control them. This is the reason why it will take ^{me} a long time to finish with the harvest. I also wish to tell you that it is impossible for me to leave right now in order to get my son because my economic situation is critical. I invested a lot of money in my land because I had to get it ready (cultivated). I owe the Bank about \$40,000 (forty thousand pesos). I think that I will get twenty or twenty five from my harvest. I had in mind to go to the United States after the harvest in order to work and pay the balance of the debt. Mr. Howard, I would like for you to help me with reference

to my son only until I finish ^{my} harvest, so that you can deliver him to me ^{then} and I can have him work with me, or maybe you can help me put him in a Military college. Mr. Howard, I beg of you for the sake of what you love most, don't release my son, by himself, since God has been taking care of him until now so that he does not get into serious difficulty.
