5. Twelve pounds, ten ounces shell casings retrieved in vicinity and in front of firing positions 20 to 23, same gun club.

It is noted that the above shell casings were obtained at the San Gabriel Valley Gun Club on 6/10/68. It is further noted that management of the gun club has indicated that their normal procedure is to simply let expended shell casings accumulate. The last pick up was made at least several months ago.

The laboratory is requested to compare all .22 caliber casings in boxes two, three, four and five with casing contained in box number one, to determine if the same weapon was used in firing any of the .22 caliber casings. Following the laboratory examination, it is requested that item contained in box one be returned to the Los Angeles Office. On June 14, 1968 Mr. RICHARD LUCIEN, manager of industrial relations, The Burroughs Corporation, 460 North Sierra Madre Villa, Pasadena California was contacted regarding an employment application which SIRHAN SIRHAN made with the previously mentioned company. Mr. Lucien made available the original employment application but stated the actual interview of SIRHAN was conducted by MELVIN OLSON, employment representative.

On June 14, 1968 MELVIN OLSON, above, was contacted regarding his interview with SIRHAN SIRHAN on November 7., 1967. OLSON was shown the original employment application and he stated the form was filled out by SIRHAN SIRHAN in black ballpoint, and the red ballpoint notations were completed by him. He advised that SIRHAN was applying for an assembly line job and was not hired because of a sta ted back injury, and a previous poor work record. Olson advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN was referred to this company through the state (California) unemployment agency in Pasadena.

Olson stated that he could recall no additional information regarding this particular interview; he was shown a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN (dated 6/5/68, by L.A.P.D.) and he advised that he could not positively state that this was the man who filled out the employment application in the name of SIRHAN SIRHAN on 11/7/67.

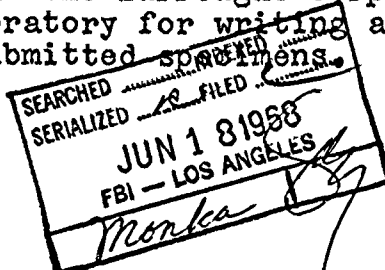

Result of examination:

Due to differences in time of writing and due to the limited amount of available writing of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, a definite conclusion was not reached whether Sirhan Bishara Sirhan wrote any of the questioned writing on specimens submitted previously in this matter. Due to the limited amount of writing available for examination, a definite conclusion was not reached whether the writers of K4 through K7 wrote any of the questioned writing on the specimens submitted previously.

Specimens K2 through K8 are being returned to FBI, Los Angeles. Specimen K9 is being returned to FBI, San Francisco. These specimens have been photographed.

NOTE FOR LOS ANGELES AND SAN FRANCISCO:

This confirms Bureau teletypes dated 6-11-68, 6-12-68, and 6-13-68 addressed to Los Angeles in this matter. For your investigative guidance, similarities were noted in the writings of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan and certain questioned writings.

Los Angeles has been requested to obtain contemporary writings of Sirhan containing words and letters comparable with the questioned writing. Efforts to obtain known writings comparable with the questioned writing should be continued.

San Francisco requested the return of specimen K9 so that it could be returned to the Argonaut Insurance Company. Since K9 may become a piece of crucial evidence in this case, San Francisco should retain K9 until such time as this specimen may no longer be needed as evidence.

Enclosed for the FBI Laboratory is an original employment application executed in the name of SIRHAN SIRHAN for the Burroughs Corporation, Pasadena, California, dated 11/7/67.

Enclosed document was made available on 6/14/68 by RICHARD LUCIEN, Manager, Industrial Relations at Burroughs Corporation, 460 North Sierra Madre Villa, Pasadena, California; however, he stated that the actual interview of SIRHAN was conducted by the employment representative, MELVIN OLSON.

On same date, MELVIN OLSON advised that the application was executed and completed by an individual who identified himself as SIRHAN SIRHAN and was completed in the black ballpoint writing. The red notations on the application were made by Mr. OLSON. Mr. OLSON was unable to identify a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN taken 6/5/68 by the LAPD with the individual named SIRHAN SIRHAN who completed the application on 11/7/67.

Results of examination:

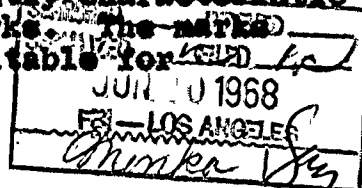
Specimen Q21, as received in the Laboratory, consists of a metal container, a piece of insulated wire and numerous black particles. Specimen Q21 is contained in a plastic envelope and the wire is not attached to the metal container.

The blast drum-shaped metal container in specimen Q21 is approximately 13/16" in diameter and approximately 5/16" thick. A 1/4" diameter brass rod extends from one side of the container and a mica diaphragm and brass plate are mounted on the other side. Black granules or particles are present in the container. The container appears to have been damaged before receipt in the Laboratory.

The metal container appears to be a microphone button of the type used in telephones manufactured twenty to thirty years ago. Microphone buttons of this type were manufactured in great quantities. These microphone buttons contain carbon granules which form a variable resistance under the influence of voice vibrations. Without additional components and circuitry, Q21 could not transmit special speech signals or otherwise act as a monitoring "bug."

The black particles present in Q21 are essentially carbon.

There are impressions on the metal container which appear to have been made by a tool employing a gripping action such as a pair of pliers. There are also scratch type marks on the container which are not sufficiently characteristic to determine the type object causing these marks. The marks and impressions on the metal container are suitable for comparison purposes.

The signatures appearing on K15 are too limited to permit adequate comparison of these signatures with the questioned writings.

1. Post card, unsigned, addressed to "Sen. R. KENNEDY, Dem. Hdqs, Eugene, Oregon", containing handwritten message in Latin, and postmarked West Palm Beach, Florida, 5/21/68.
2. Airmail envelope, postmarked West Palm Beach, Florida, 5/29/68, addressed to "Ad Sen. R. KENNEDY and Adgne Sen. EUGENE MC CARTHY", containing printed message, unsigned, also in Latin.

The above items were received by RICHARD L. KENNEDY, member of the Oregon Legislature and chairman, Volunteers for Kennedy, 705 Willamette Street, Eugene, Oregon, who felt they might have some interest to this Bureau in instant case.

It is suggested that the messages be translated, if deemed pertinent, and translation be furnished the Los Angeles Office. The enclosures may be disposed of by the Laboratory, and need not be returned to the Portland Office. No latent examination is indicated in view of the large number of persons who have handled the items.

TRANSLATION FROM LATIN

The airmail envelope is addressed to Senator R. Kennedy and Senator Eugene McCarthy, Democratic National Headquarters, Eugene, Oregon.

It bears the postmark of West Palm Beach, Florida, dated May 29, 1968.

A line of French prose or poetry is pasted to the envelope in lieu of a return address. It reads:

A blase bird, if such a bird exists.

The printed message contained in the envelope is a portion of a page taken from a textbook version of Julius Caesar's "Commentarii de Bello Gallico." The portion marked "K" describes a battle in which the Gauls discarded their shields and fought "with their naked bodies."

The portion marked "M" contains descriptions of war actions against the Helvetii.

TRANSLATION FROM LATIN

Post card with airmail postage and an airmail notation addressed to Senator R. Kennedy, Democratic Headquarters, Eugene, Oregon.

The post card bears the postmark of West Palm Beach, Florida, dated May 21, 1968, A.M.

The message on the reverse side of the post card consists of two verses in Latin. They read:

I sing (celebrate) because of the compromise to be made on the swift vessel.

I was only reading the remaining part little by little.

The notation:

"(imperio) by command"

appears at the bottom of the post card.

TRANSLATOR'S NOTE:

The communication is anonymous. The verses appear to be taken from a Latin writing of the classical period, possibly Ovid. It is recalled that correspondence of a similar nature, consisting of verses taken from the classics was handled in the past. This correspondence, consisted for the most part of two or three Latin verses without any explanation.
