Witness has not been interviewed by the FBI or news media. Witness was contacted by telephone the morning of June 5, 1968, about 1:00 AM by Dr. Gettleman, the family doctor of Ira Goldstein. He was informed that the victim had been shot and was at Central Receiving Hospital and arrangements to move him by ambulance to Encino Hospital were being made by Dr. Gettleman. Witness arrived at the hospital about 3:00 AM. He examined Ira Goldstein and found him to be in moderate pain and had sustained a superficial gunshot wound to the left thigh. X-rays showed no bone damage, nor arterial or nerve injury. "I removed the bullet. I scratched a mark on the butt end so I could recognize it. I believe I made an "X". I have performed many operations on gunshot wounds, and this bullet was obviously a twenty two caliber. I took the bullet, put it in a small glass jar, labeled it with the patients name, my name, and date and time of removal. This bullet was then turned over to the LAPD to a uniformed officer. I believe I could recognize that bullet again with my markings. Plus it was deformed. Ira told me he had been in the immediate vicinity of Senator Kennedy and had been shot, at the Ambassador Hotel earlier that same morning, June 5, 1968. Goldstein was hospitalized on the 5th of June until the 6th. I saw him again on the 11th of June and again on the 18th of June at which time I discharged him from further treatment. I was contacted by the FBI and the only thing they asked me is would I be able to testify."

20 "I walked around the Hotel, met Tom Devine and he  
21 gave me a press pass. I walked up to Room 523, saw Mrs.  
22 Kennedy, talked to her and then I saw Senator Kennedy as he  
23 was walking out of his room. I got on an elevator going down.  
24 Valerie Schulte was on the elevator. We went to the Embassy  
25 Room. I got in because of the press pass and then forced my  
26 way out towards the stage. I got to about fifteen feet from  
the stage and as I arrived at this point, Senator Kennedy was  
on stage but had not yet started speaking. After his speech,  
he started to the left side and I went over some tables to

1 "get to the doors at the right side of the stage. I did not  
2 realize that he had exited through the back of the stage and  
3 I thought that I probably would not get to see him again.

4 "Next I remember that I was in the little anteroom  
5 next to the stage and I heard some shots and a great deal of  
6 commotion. I pushed forward and got into the kitchen and then  
7 I saw the labor man on the floor. I looked across the room  
8 and I saw Valerie sitting on the floor. I went over and  
9 stayed with her until about 45 minutes later when we left the  
10 kitchen and went back to the Third Floor. I did not see the  
11 suspect and I was outside of the room at the time the shots  
12 were fired."

13 There have been no prior interviews of this witness  
14 and he has made no statements to the news media.

Witness was interviewed by the FBI a few days after performing surgery on Paul Schrade. Not interviewed by news media.

"I first saw Paul Schrade in the Emergency Room at Kaiser Hosp. about three in the morning 6-5-68. I examined him and found him a little lethargic, coherent and able to speak in a sensible manner. He was fairly alert but hazy about some details. He didn't remember what happened after he was struck. It is my opinion he was probably unconscious. The bullet entered in the front just behind the hair line and the exit wound was about two and a half inches right in the middle of his head. The route of exit was more jagged looking. The x-ray showed an area three quarters of an inch in diameter which was shattered and bone driven into the skull. Portions of the bullet lodged in the bone. The wound was directly over the area called the sagittal sinus, this is a major vein that collects the blood from both hemisphere of the brain and routes it back to the heart. An incision was made and damaged tissue was removed. It was found there was minor injury to the Sagittal sinus. There was a small hole in the skull at the entry which will heal in time. Part of the bullet exited out of the back. Bullet fragments were sent to the pathologist. It looked like a twenty-two bullet. Schrade made a complete recovery and suffers no ill effects other than occasional headaches."

There were many waiters, serving drinks. All appeared to be Mexican. (No Females serving drinks) As they sat, a young man whom she thought to be a waiter walked by. She and her daughter-in-law decided he was not a waiter. Described as M/Poss Armenian, Mid 20's, short unkempt curly hair, white shirt, dark pants. He was alone as he walked passed them.

She recognized a picture of Sirhan in the paper as the same individual she saw in the Rafferty Room. Mrs. FINLEY was shown mugs of Look-alikes and she selected a photo of Sirhan as the closest resemblance to the person she saw at the hotel.

Mrs. FINLEY & her daughter-in-law left the Hotel about 12 midnight. Heard of the shooting on the radio. She did not have a camera or tape recorder.

Mr. FRANKENHEIMER is a producer for MGM and was contacted by phone in Wichita, Kansas where he will remain until mid-September (Ph#-778-1192 & 685-2740).

Mr. FRANKENHEIMER states that Kennedy stayed at his house and that he drove Kennedy to the Ambassador. He arrived at the Hotel at approx. 8:05 PM and went to the suite Kennedy reserved. Mr. FRANKENHEIMER and Steve went downstairs to the Embassy Room about 5 minutes before Kennedy. The route Mr. FRANKENHEIMER took to the Embassy Room took him through the kitchen and he states that at that time he didn't see anyone in the kitchen. During the speech he was standing behind the right door of the stage and watched it on a TV. Approx. 5 minutes before Kennedy finished his speech, Mr. FRANKENHEIMER states a male visibly shaking pushed him (FRANKENHEIMER) and stated, "Get out of my way". Mr. FRANKENHEIMER states that his first reaction was to get mad but he disregarded the incident. He then saw the male walk behind the stage and make a right turn which would put the male going the the direction of the kitchen. Mr. FRANKENHEIMER describes this male as M/unk descent. early 20's dark bushy hair, wearing a blue sweater. Mr. FRANKENHEIMER has seen pictures of Sirhan but feels he could not ID this male if he saw him again and therefore doesn't know if this male was Sirhan or not.

He does not recall seeing any woman in a polka dot dress. He did not have a camera. He has not been contacted by the FBI.

He has made one statement to a female reporter from a Santa Monica paper and it appeared in the 6-5 edition of the paper. Other numerous reporters have attempted to contact him but he would not give any statements.

This is a re-interview.

Mr. Freed was interviewed in Room 803, P.A.B., and made the following statement with the use of "the mock up". Freed arrived at the hotel approx. 8:00 PM and went directly to the Embassy Rm. He remained there for approx. 10 min. and then went to the Kennedy suit on the 5th floor. Freed is a photographer. He remained on the 5th floor until the Senator went down stairs to make his speech. He went to the Embassy Rm. to hear the Senator's speech. While in the room, he became involved in a scuffle with an unk. male and damaged his camera. He went to the kitchen area to make repairs on his camera. While in the kitchen, he obs. the Senator coming toward him. At that time he was in the vicinity of the first of the three steel tables. He obs. the Senator stop to shake hands with some people. At this time, he was off to the Senator's left and facing the Senator about 6 feet from him. He was looking in his camera, focusing it, waiting to get a good picture. He described the room as being fairly dark or the lighting not too good. He recalled hearing the noise on his left, which was in the opposite direction from the Senator. He did not recall what the noise was. He started to focus his camera when he simultaneously heard what he thought were firecrackers going off to his right. He turned and looked toward the floor and then in his field of vision, he saw the suspect with gun in hand. He did not recall how the suspect was holding the gun. He did not see flashes from the gun or smoke. Suddenly, he became aware of people falling. He is not sure that he saw the Senator fall, but he did see someone fall who was in the area where he last saw the Senator. He started backing up himself, and at the same time recalled a group of men struggling with the suspect. He next recalls being in the area of the doors going into the Colonial Rm. He stood there for approx. 10 seconds and then went into the food preparation area of the kitchen and from there back to the area of the shooting. He stated he was so overwhelmed by the incident that he was just wandering around. When he returned to the area of the shooting, he saw the Senator lying on the floor. After that, he said, "I'd seen enough, I didn't want to see any more so I left." Immediately after the shooting, while standing by the doors to the Colonial Rm., he saw 2 men run from the vicinity of the second steel table. One man seemed to be chasing the other and was hollering, as best as he could remember "Get him; Get him; Get it." He felt the men could have been going for help or that one was chasing the other; he didn't recall seeing either one again. He was not interviewed by the F.B.I.

Interviewed Mr. Freed at Police Bldg. above date and time. Mr. Freed stated that he is a free lance press photographer for the Evening Star News - Culver City, and was covering the activities at the Ambassador Hotel on Election Night. (6-4-68)

He arrived at the Ambassador Hotel at at approx. 8:30 PM and was admitted to the fifth floor, where he spent most of the evening. Claims he took several photos of Senator Kennedy during the evening when the Sen. was walking about the fifth floor. However, he stated photos had not been developed at this time. Sometime later that evening he heard someone say that Sen. Kennedy was going down the elevator to the Embassy Room. Mr. Freed States he also went to the Embassy Room, but used spiral stairway instead of elevator, which was too crowded.

After hearing most of Senator Kennedy's speech from the Embassy Ballroom, Mr. Freed walked into the kitchen area and stood in the vicinity of the ice making machine. When Mr. Freed heard the applause and realized the speech was over, he looked down the corridor toward the back of the stage, and saw the Senator approaching. He entered the kitchen with very few aids in front of him (possibly only one.) At first he headed toward the freight elevator, but for some reason he turned and walked toward the stainless steel table in the kitchen area. Mr. Freed claims he stood in path of Sen. Kennedy while the Sen. was shaking hands with some of the kitchen personnel. When the Sen. got within three to five feet of Mr. Freed, and was shaking hands with one of the kitchen help, Mr. Freed heard a "pop noise" like a balloon. Freed turned to his left (direction of the noise) and then heard sounds like fire crackers going off. He instinctively looked up to see Sirhan Sirhan firing what appeared to be a 22 cal. pistol in the direction where Sen. Kennedy had been standing. However, he could not see the Sen., because suddenly there were numerous people running in different directions and as a result, he was forced against the east wall of the kitchen. However, immediately after the shots were fired, Mr. Freed claims he saw Rafer Johnson and someone else (thinks it was Bill Bundy) struggling with Sirhan.

A few seconds after being pinned against the east wall of kitchen, Mr. Freed stated he saw three people running in his direction. One was a woman, the other two were men. The woman ran out the door to his right and a man wearing a bright blue sports coat ran out the door to his left. The third man was yelling "get him, get it". He ran out, apparently chasing the man in the blue coat. The man doing the chasing according to Mr. Freed was a "Kennedy Advance Man". He described the man being pursued as a male cauc., 24 hrs., 6-1, 150/160

black hair, med. length, dark complexion. No description of the woman except she was a female cauc., possibly wearing a polka dot dress.

A rough sketch of the kitchen as sketched by Mr. Freed is attached to this report.

There seems to be some credibility to Mr. Freed's story. However, it is believed that Mr. Freed tends to be a name dropper, using names such as Thomas Braden, Bill Bundy, Frank Markowits and Dick Drew as being personal associates of his.

INFORMATION:

Above party was interviewed at his residence. States that he attended Pasadena City College with suspect SIRHAN SIRHAN. Stated that both were members of the International Club which is composed of approximately 150 foreign students. Also, used to see SIRHAN at Santa Anita Race Track periodically. Last time he saw SIRHAN was during the months of January or February of 1968. Had conversation with SIRHAN relative to SIRHAN's accident at the track. SIRHAN stated he felt well, but was suing the "people". GOEL states that in his opinion SIRHAN looked or acted no different than when he used to attend school with him.

The above party was interviewed in his residence 1122 W. 30th St. on 6-14-68. The persons present at time of the interview were Sgts. E. Hernandez # 7101; L. Sandlin and Strong. The purpose of the interview was to determine if Mr. GOEL had any knowledge or information that might possibly be relevant to the SENATOR KENNEDY INVESTIGATION.

STATEMENT

I met SIRHAN SIRHAN during the early part of 1963 at Pasadena City College. He and myself were foreign students attending school there during this time

which was somewhere around a period of about 1½ years I had many conversations with SIRHAN. We both belonged to the PASADENA CITY COLLEGE INTERNATIONAL CLUB, The club was composed of about 150 foreign students. I would say that from my own personal observations SIRHAN's best friend was another Arabic student by the name of MOHAMAD (M-Arabic-Tall-Good looking-Fair complexed).

As far as any of the teaching Staff knowing SIRHAN, I believe that there was a member of the Political Science program that I believe knew SIRHAN quite well (M-C, has only one eye-wears artificial eye and glasses). I do remember that MISS NICELY who is the head of the International Students talked with SIRHAN and so did MR. RUDE from the ENGLISH DEPT. MISS ELDER also was the Foreign students English teacher and talked with SIRHAN.

Socially I did not know SIRHAN too well. I know that he did not drink liquor and I believe that he was a MOSLEM, He never told me this, but this is what I believe. I also believe that his friend MOHAMAD was a Moslem.. SIRHAN was a heavy better at the race track. I know that he used to go to SANTA ANITA a lot. I myself go to Santa Anita but not as much as he did, every time that I did go, I used to see SIRHAN there. He used to make big bets 60-80 dollars on a race. One time when we were at Santa Anita a middle aged woman gave him a good tip on a horse and he gave me the tip, the horse came in and he made a lot of money on his bet.

No, SIRHAN did not have any girl friends that I know of, he was a very quiet type of man and the only time that I remember him talking to any girls was during our meetings at the International Club. I remember seeing him talking to a girl by the name of "SUZIE" and another girl by the name of "SHARON" but I don't remember their last names. But to my knowledge he didn't have any girl friends and I never saw him with a girl.

No, I truthfully can't say where SIRHAN got his money. I remember that at one time he was working in a gasoline station in Pasadena. After he left school somewhere around the middle of 1964 I believe, I think it was 1964, anyway I heard that he was working horses in Del Mar. I think that his brother the one that wears a beard and works at the FEZ as a musician got him the job in Del Mar. His brother is a much bigger better than SIRHAN was, and I think that he is the one that told me that SIRHAN was working in Del Mar and that he had had an accident.

When I saw SIRHAN at Santa Anita in February or January of this year I told him that I had heard about his accident, I asked him how he was feeling and he told me that everything was alright. He was real happy. He told me he felt fine but that he was suing those people and that he was going to get some money from them.

Yes, during the time that I knew SIRHAN he had two cars first he had a 1952 or 1953 black cadillac and then the last car that he had was a real big one, it was a huge reddish DeSoto but I am not sure of the year. Once or twice he drove me home when I was walking from school.

To my knowledge SIRHAN didn't return back to Jordan or anywhere that I

know of. I remember seeing him in the track in Santa Anita during 1964 and 1965.

Well Politically I know that SIRHAN was very much against the Jewish people. He hated the Jews. In fact he stated to me many times that he was for Hitler and the way that he handled the Jews. He used to say that he couldn't understand the Americans, that they let the Jews suck the blood of the nation and keep putting the money in the banks, and the Americans let them get away with it.

SIRHAN was usually very quiet, he used no profanity, except sometimes he used to swear in Arabic. Once a man spilled some coffee on his brother in a restaurant in Hollywood and SIRHAN called him a Mother Fucker in Arabic. But most of the time he was polite, helpful and quiet but he was very much Anti Jew.

No, I never myself heard SIRHAN mention KENNEDY.

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION - V6- GOLDSTEIN, IRA

Central Receiving Hospital indicates that victim Goldstein was brought in at 12:50 A.M. on June 5, 1968 via Unit G-4 which had responded to the shooting call at 3400 Wilshire Blvd. Victim Goldstein was treated for a bullet wound in the left hip thigh with entry under skin anteriorly VS OK. Feels weak.

Treatment received LMD Hosp. followup X-Ray. Condition on release described as satisfactory by Dr. Bazilauskas. MT slip indicated victim Goldstein transferred to Encino Hospital via Goodhue Ambulance at the request of Dr. Gettleman on June 5, 1968. at approximately

At approximately 6:35 P.M. victim Goldstein was contacted by phone at Encino Hospital, phone 789-8131, address of 16237 Ventura Blvd., Encino. Goldstein related that he would be released from the hospital tomorrow morning (6-6-68). That he was under treatment by Dr. Irving Gettleman, 4835 Van Nuys Blvd, Sherman Oaks, Phone ST 8 1130 and Dr. Max Finkel, Surgeon, 22030 Sherman Way, Canoga Park, Phone 883-5700. He further stated that s witness to the attempted assassination is a Robin Caslen, unknown address on Mooncrest, Encino, phone 789-7736 and 784-4329. This witness stated to Goldstein that she was in the kitchen of the Ambassador Hotel during the assassination attemp during which Senator Kennedy fell backwards on her and as a result blood splattered on her face and clothing. She also stated that she saw the suspect Sirhan Sirhan in the background, Victim is cooperative and will be able to attend the Grand Jury Hearing June 7, 1968.
