Senator Kennedy was apparently treated by <u>Dr. Bazilauskas</u> and <u>Dr. Holt</u>, with his wife <u>Ethel</u> in attendance. Condition diagnosed as Comatose, weak thready pulse in extremis. Bullet wound right mastoid area with swelling. Responded with heart beat and breathing to CCM & Heart Lung Machine. Sounds good quality later. DTR's normal, elevated knees. Pupils 3-4 mii R&R&E - rigidity began 1 ext with quivering abdominal tremors.

Treatment: C. Cardiac massage. Adrenalin 1CC 1 M Stat 02 Airway. H-L machine-cutdown. Dextran 6% 1V cutdown Serum Albumen. Blood drawn T&X match. Polysorin oint eyes. Stat to Good Samaritan Hospital. Condition on discharge listed as critical, quivering abdominal and lower ext, on leaving left foot more so.
