and it would not be unusual. T [REDACTED] could only conjecture as to what might have motivated SIRHAN SIRHAN to commit an act of murder. T [REDACTED] said SIRHAN's motive may have been his feeling that the United States was deserting the Arab people, especially if an individual such as Senator KENNEDY indicated he would help Israel in building up their military arms. T [REDACTED] also stated SIRHAN SIRHAN reportedly as a young child saw an Israeli soldier kill an Arab in front of his home.

F [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Beverly Hills, California, was interviewed regarding his knowledge of any meetings at the Green Hotel, Pasadena, California, of Arabic type people.

F [REDACTED] stated he and his mother bought the Green Hotel in April or May, 1967, and began renovating the hotel. He was at the hotel at least five days a week and cannot recall anyone having any meetings, especially in one of the rooms. To his knowledge he has never seen SIRHAN SIRHAN, but after this individual was arrested for the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, his stepfather, [REDACTED] T [REDACTED], mentioned to him he knew of the family. F [REDACTED] stated he could not furnish any information regarding SIRHAN which might be helpful in this case.

L [REDACTED] related that she has been employed as a barmaid at the Golden Garter Bar for approximately one month. She advised that when she first began employment there was a barmaid there named D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED]. D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] had a friend, who L [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] knew only as "J [REDACTED]". She described him as being a male; white; [REDACTED] years of age; blue eyes; curly, sandy hair (usually a curl was hanging down his forehead); heavy eyebrows; 5'10", 170 pounds. He had a "beer" stomach and talked slowly. On one occasion he offered her narcotics and referred to them specifically as the "red, white and blues." He attempted to force a red, identified as seconal by S [REDACTED], into her hand. When S [REDACTED] refused "J [REDACTED]" said " [REDACTED] uses them."

S [REDACTED] was unable to furnish any information concerning SIRHAN.

I [REDACTED] advised that he met SIRHAN on one occasion in connection with this claim but in view of the fact there was a settlement, he did not know him having only this one contact with him.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] [REDACTED] advised that she and her husband, E [REDACTED] M [REDACTED], were visiting Mrs. P [REDACTED] E [REDACTED] in Turlock, California, during the week of Memorial Day, May 30, 1968. She advised they accompanied Mrs. E [REDACTED] to the Turlock railroad station at about 2:30 p.m., on May 30, 1968, to observe the campaign train of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] stated that shortly after her arrival at the train station she observed some benches about seventy-five yards across the street. She stated that she was carrying her small dog with her so she walked over to the benches where she sat down and waited for the campaign train to arrive. She stated that a freight train went through the Turlock station shortly before the arrival of the campaign train. She said that she, and Mrs. E [REDACTED]'s granddaughter, D [REDACTED] age seven or eight, were able to stand within eight feet of Senator KENNEDY when he appeared on the platform of the observation car of the train. She said that she recalled a policeman or deputy sheriff was standing in front of her watching the Senator. She stated that after standing there just a few minutes a man behind her and slightly to her right said, "This is a good aim" to a shorter man who was standing to the taller man's left.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] said that she turned her head to her right and looked up at the man. She said she then spoke to D [REDACTED] and said to watch these two men. She said that the two men then turned to their left and slowly moved away mingling into the large crowd gathered around the railroad car.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] stated that she only got a momentary glance at the smaller man and stated he was white and would estimate his height to be about 5'5" tall. She could furnish no other description concerning this man.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] described the taller man who had made the statement behind her back as being white, about 25 or 28 years old, 5'10", 140 to 145 pounds, dark black wavy hair, medium complexion, no glasses and no hat. He was wearing a short sleeved white shirt open at the collar and she did not observe his trousers.

Mrs. M [REDACTED] stated she did not see the taller man carrying anything in his hands nor did she see him have a camera around his neck. She said she did not see the shorter man long enough to notice whether he had a camera or not.

Photographs of D [REDACTED] P [REDACTED], F [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and V [REDACTED] B [REDACTED] and SIRHAN SIRHAN were exhibited to Mrs. M [REDACTED] and she was unable to identify anyone.

Mr. E [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] advised that he and his wife were visiting Mrs. P [REDACTED] E [REDACTED] in Turlock, California, during the week of Memorial Day, May 30, 1968. He advised they accompanied Mrs. E [REDACTED] to the Turlock railroad station at about 2:30 p.m. on May 30, 1968, to observe the campaign train of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Mr. M [REDACTED] stated that he left his wife and Mrs. E [REDACTED] and walked some one hundred or more yards away to a small park near the train station where he could sit down in the shade. He stated that he is not able to stand for lengthy periods of time as he has had two operations for varicose veins in his legs. He further stated that the KENNEDY train arrived at approximately 4:45 P.M., and then he walked over near the railroad station to observe Senator KENNEDY. He stated at no time did he see the two men whom his wife, M [REDACTED], had spoken to him and Mrs. E [REDACTED] concerning any suspicious actions.

I. [redacted] advised that on June 4, 1968, he and his friend, B. [redacted] T. [redacted] Arcadia, California, went to the San Gabriel Valley Gun Club, 4001 Fish Canyon Road, Duarte, California. He further advised that they arrived there at approximately 3:30 PM and left the range for home at approximately 4:45 PM. L. [redacted] stated that they only fired on the rifle range and observed only one other man on this range when they arrived. One other man arrived a littler later and also fired on the rifle range. I. [redacted] stated that he did not know these individuals and this was the first time he saw them.

A photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN dated June 5, 1968, Los Angeles Police Department Booking Number 495139, was then displayed to L. [redacted]. He stated that this individual was unknown to him and he did not see him at the range on June 4, 1968.

Sierra Madre, California, age [REDACTED] retired drugstore maintenance man, furnished the following information:

M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] advised that on June 4, 1968, he went to the San Gabriel Valley Gun Club, 4001 Fish Canyon Road, Duarte, California. He stated that he went alone and arrived there at approximately 8:30 to 9:00 AM. M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] further stated that he met a friend, C [REDACTED] A [REDACTED] who resides in Eagle Rock, at the range. They both fired on the rifle course which is adjacent to the pistol course. Both of these courses are separated by a small two story building where they sign in for the day's shooting. He stated that when one is firing on the rifle range, it is impossible to see people firing on the pistol course due to this small building. He stated that he had lunch at the range and left for home at approximately 12:30 PM. During the time he was there, he did not meet anyone or talk to anyone other than his friend, A [REDACTED]

M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] was then shown a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN dated June 5, 1968, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Booking Number [REDACTED]. He stated that the picture resembled a man he saw at the range on June 4, 1968. This individual was accompanied by another man, whom he cannot described, and he cannot remember what range they were on. M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] also observed two women at the range, accompanied by two other men. M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] stated that the women were not firing but were waiting behind the men they were with, who were firing on the rifle range.

M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] described one of the women as being Caucasian, 25 to 30 years of age, 5'2" tall, long blond hair, wearing a skirt and gave the appearance of being very heavy. He described one of the men as being Caucasian, 30 to 35 years of age, 5'9" tall. M [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] was unable to describe the other two people, and advised that he goes to

this range almost every Tuesday, and this was the first time he saw any of these individuals. He concluded by saying he does not believe he would recognize any of these individuals if he saw them again.

P [REDACTED] A [REDACTED] was interviewed at the Offices of Immigration and Naturalization Service, 300 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, California. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent. He was interviewed in the Spanish language. He advised that he is a Mexican citizen who is illegally in this country and on June 6, 1968, he was arrested by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Los Angeles, California, as an illegal alien. He said that he is being deported on June 6, 1968, by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to Tijuana, Baja California.

He said he was born [REDACTED] in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico, and lived there with his family until he was fourteen years of age. In 1963, he and his family came to Tijuana, where they lived until 1964. He and his family then returned to Guadalajara.

On September 9, 1966, he came to Tijuana with his family and worked as a dishwasher. He then entered the United States illegally and worked at the Ambassador Hotel as a dishwasher. He again returned to Tijuana to live with his family on June 15, 1967. He worked in Tijuana as a dishwasher and auto mechanic.

On May 24, 1968, he again entered the United States illegally and returned to work as a dishwasher at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, California.

He said the kitchen management had known him from before and he had no difficulty in securing employment. He said he took up residence at a rooming house at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He worked daily at the Ambassador from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. in the central dishwashing room emptying garbage cans and washing dishes.

He said that the dishwashing room is downstairs from the Embassy Room of the Ambassador. A wide corridor leads from the central dishwashing room to the Embassy Room.

At approximately 12:15 a.m., June 5, 1968, he was at the back of the central dishwashing room emptying the garbage when he heard a series of reports. He said the sounds were so loud he thought they were rockets going off. He ran through the central dishwashing room and through the passageway to the Embassy Room. When he reached the doorway to the serving room, which is just east of the Embassy Room, he saw Senator KENNEDY lying on the floor. He did not see KENNEDY's assailant as the assailant was apparently surrounded by persons grappling with the assailant.

He stayed viewing the scene for about five minutes and then his boss told him to return to work, and he returned to the central dishwashing room. He worked through the night until 6:00 a.m. in the morning and then returned to his rooming house. He has never heard of the assailant of Senator KENNEDY before. He did not hear anything at the Ambassador Hotel that would indicate anyone had knowledge of the impending assassination.

Father T. [REDACTED] P. [REDACTED] assigned to the Roman Catholic Parish at [REDACTED] furnished the following information:

He was in downtown Los Angeles after leaving a movie at the time of the KENNEDY shooting. He recalled that a parking lot attendant at the Los Angeles Athletic Club, mentioned that KENNEDY had been shot. He immediately went to the Central Receiving Hospital alone. He went into the hospital, but did not enter the emergency room. A short time after his arrival an unknown male Caucasian came from the emergency room and told him to go in. This individual told Father P. [REDACTED] that he was "a laicized priest and a friend of the KENNEDY family". This individual who did not identify himself told Father P. [REDACTED] that he had given absolution to Senator KENNEDY but had not anointed him with holy oil. He requested that Father P. [REDACTED] go into the emergency room and take care of the absolution and the anointing. Father P. [REDACTED] stated that he did enter into the room and gave him absolution and anointed him with holy oil. Shortly thereafter, Senator KENNEDY was transferred from Central Receiving Hospital to Good Samarital Hospital. Father P. [REDACTED] returned to his Rectory.

Father P. [REDACTED] stated that he had seen photographs of suspect SIRHAN SIRHAN and he does not recall ever having seen this individual at any time.

Father P. [REDACTED] stated that he was subsequently interviewed by Sergeant G. [REDACTED] of the Los Angeles Police Department, extension 2962, who had a photograph and the name of the laicized priest who is referred to above. Father P. [REDACTED] stated that Sergeant G. [REDACTED] told him that this former priest was J. [REDACTED] W. M. [REDACTED] M. [REDACTED] was formerly associated with the Maryknoll Fathers, a religion order of missionaries with New York Headquarters. The order has a local house at [REDACTED] telephone No. [REDACTED]

following information:

He is currently employed as a Staff Photographer for the Independent Star News, 525 East Colorado Boulevard, Pasadena, California. He was assigned as a photographer to cover the KENNEDY function at the Ambassador Hotel on June 4, 1968.

He took no photographs of the actual shooting of Senator KENNEDY or of suspect SIRHAN SIRHAN. His photographs taken at the scene were made immediately after the shooting occurred. He recalled seeing suspect SIRHAN SIRHAN struggling with several people immediately after the shooting, but he can not, of his own recollection, identify SIRHAN as the individual who did the shooting or as the individual struggling with members of the crowd around KENNEDY after the shooting.

He recalled seeing the individual later identified as suspect SIRHAN, struggling with several people, two of whom were R [REDACTED] G [REDACTED] and R [REDACTED] J [REDACTED]. He did not take photographs of the struggle inasmuch as the light was not sufficient for his photography and he was concentrating on photographs of Senator KENNEDY.

Mr. D [REDACTED] made available three copies of photographs taken of Senator KENNEDY immediately after the shooting. Mr. D [REDACTED] stated that the negatives of these particular shots are being retained by the paper on the advice of counsel, and copies of additional shots made at the same time will be made available in the near future.

Mr. D [REDACTED] was unable to recall the exact time that the above photographs were taken. He remembered that the shooting occurred shortly after midnight on June 5, 1968, at the Ambassador Hotel. After he arrived at the hotel and went to the Embassy

Room he scouted the area in an effort to determine the entrance and exits which Senator KENNEDY might utilize. He decided that the most logical exit and entrance would be from the kitchen area into the Embassy Room.

He recalled seeing H. F. [redacted] and W. F. [redacted] of the local office of Associated Press in the Embassy Room. He does not recall seeing them in the kitchen area where the Senator was shot.

He recalled that Senator KENNEDY came on to the podium in the Embassy Room for a speech. Mr. D. [redacted] took photographs of KENNEDY from the stage. Mr. D. [redacted] then left the stage and went behind the podium into a hallway and down to a small room. He was looking for a sandwich at the time. He recalled that this might have been a press room. He found a sandwich and then went back out into the Embassy Room. He went around the room to the television stands behind the crowd and took some additional pictures. He then went into the kitchen area and asked for water. He got a glass and filled it with ice from the ice machine. He recalls standing in the kitchen talking with Reporter B. Y. [redacted] of the Los Angeles Times. During the time he spent in the kitchen looking for water, he recalled that he walked almost to the back of the kitchen and then returned to stand with Y. [redacted] near the entrance of the kitchen. They heard that Senator KENNEDY was coming off the podium. At this time, he handed his glass of water to one of several KENNEDY girls that were standing inside the entrance to the kitchen area so that he could be ready to take photographs. Senator KENNEDY came into the kitchen area and passed Mr. Y. [redacted], and then approached D. [redacted]. Senator KENNEDY smiled and passed Mr. D. [redacted] who followed him. Mr. D. [redacted] next impression was of a "movement of people in the far end of the kitchen." He heard a noise similar to a firecracker and then saw smoke. He looked up and "saw an arm with a gun pointed at me." He ducked. Mr. D. [redacted] recalled that after he saw the smoke he noticed Senator KENNEDY's head sink.

He remembered hearing two shots, then a pause and then three more shots. There may have been more shots, but this was his impression at the time. Immediately thereafter, people began pushing D [REDACTED] back and he saw others lowering Senator KENNEDY to the floor. The coat he was wearing was splashed with drops of blood. At this point, he realized he was a photographer and began taking photographs. He recalls taking some photographs from the top of a nearby serving table. He recalled that some other photographer took a photograph which showed Mr. D [REDACTED] on the serving table taking photographs.

Mr. D [REDACTED] stated that he is retaining his sport coat in a safe condition and with the blood spots still on it in the event that it is needed at some future time by the authorities.

Mr. D [REDACTED] did not see the Police Officers taking suspect SIRHAN out of the area as during this period he was looking for a phone to call his newspaper. He recalled that originally he mentioned that he thought the suspect was dressed in some type of blue jump suit, however, upon further reflection he believes that he was mistaken. He apparently received this impression of a blue jump suit because he thought the suspect's clothes were all one color and possibly bluish.

Mr. D [REDACTED] took no photograph in the kitchen prior to the shooting and he stated that he did not recall seeing suspect SIRHAN or any woman in a polka dot dress in the kitchen prior to the shooting. He did not recall seeing a woman in a polka dot dress in the kitchen after the shooting.

He recalled seeing Reporter R [REDACTED] E [REDACTED] of United Press International in the kitchen after the shooting, but he can not say if B [REDACTED] was present when the shooting occurred.

Subsequent to the shooting, he and B [REDACTED] proceeded to the home address of suspect SIRHAN and took a number of photographs. He recalled that Y [REDACTED] discovered what appeared to be a .22 caliber spent slug in a trash box at the back of the house.

It was left there for the Police. Mr. D [REDACTED] recalled pointing the items out to a Police Officer who picked it up. Mr. D [REDACTED] recalled that he also took a photograph of a bullet found in the garage at the house which was being placed in a bag by a Policeman.

These notes by P [REDACTED] were made during his phone conversation with the newspaper Staff Photographer R [REDACTED] D [REDACTED] who called in to P [REDACTED] information about the shooting of ROBERT F. At the time of the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, she was putting her tools away in the Salad Pantry of the kitchen, and she did not hear the shots. She heard screaming and hollering, and she went through the kitchen and saw Senator KENNEDY lying on the floor. She saw none of the incidents surrounding the shooting of Senator KENNEDY and she did not see the man who shot KENNEDY. M [REDACTED] was shown a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN and she advised that she had never seen the man. M [REDACTED] added that she did not think there was a guard posted at the swinging doors which lead to the kitchen from the hallway in front of the Embassy Room.
