M [redacted] advised that on June 4, 1968, he went to work at 6:00 p.m. and was assigned to the Venetian Room to serve drinks at the MAX RAFFERTY rally. M [redacted] stated that he watched Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY give his speech on a television set which was in the room and as KENNEDY neared the end of his speech, M [redacted] left the Venetian Room and headed toward the Embassy Room in an attempt to see Senator KENNEDY as he left. As M [redacted] neared the double doors going into the kitchen, he heard about five noises, which sounded like firecrackers. As he entered the kitchen, he observed C [redacted] U [redacted] R [redacted] G [redacted] and one other man with grey hair, along with the Japanese cook, holding a man down on the steame table, trying to take away a gun, which the man had in his right hand. M [redacted] said he also observed Senator KENNEDY lying on the floor about ten feet away, with a large number of people around him. M [redacted] observed two other men nearby, who had also been shot.

M [redacted] stated that a fireman, who was present, then told the employees to keep everybody out and M [redacted] along with three or four other waiters, locked arms and kept other spectators from coming into the kitchen. He stated that within the next few minutes, the ambulance and police arrived.

M [redacted] advised he is unable to furnish any additional information and SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was unknown to him. He further advised that he had never observed SIRHAN in or around the hotel area.

She advised that her regular shift is from 6:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. and on June 5, 1968, she was working in the liquor service area located just off the main kitchen.

She stated that shortly after midnight she was en route to the front office to get approval on a check and as she was going through the room service area of the kitchen she heard a lot of people yelling. She stated that at that point J [REDACTED] A [REDACTED] the head food checker, yelled at her to get back and she heard someone else shout that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot.

Mrs. L [REDACTED] advised that she returned to the liquor service area and in a few minutes walked back to the kitchen where she saw Senator KENNEDY being placed on a stretcher and wheeled into the freight elevator. She stated that at that time there were a great number of people milling around the area and a great deal of confusion and noise.

She stated that SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was unknown to her. However, about 10:30 p.m. or 11:00 p.m. on June 4, 1968, she recalled seeing an individual who resembled SIRHAN loitering around the door which leads from the hallway into the kitchen. She stated she could not positively identify SIRHAN as being identical with that individual and did not recall ever having seen SIRHAN in or around the hotel prior to that time.

MRS. L [REDACTED] advised she was unable to furnish any additional information concerning the shooting.

Mrs. W [REDACTED] advised that her regular shift is from 6:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and on the evening of June 4, 1968, she was working as a cashier in the Cave Bar at the hotel and had no knowledge concerning the shooting of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY until she heard one of the waitresses say that KENNEDY had just been shot. She recalled that this was at approximately 12:30 a.m. or 12:45 a.m. on June 5, 1968, and the bar manager immediately closed the bar. She went upstairs to the room service bar located adjacent to the main kitchen to turn in her money and check out.

She stated that she was unable to furnish any additional information concerning the shooting incident and SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was unknown to her. Further, she had never observed anyone resembling SIRHAN in or around the hotel.

S [REDACTED] advised that on June 4, 1968, he came to work at 5:00 p.m. and was working in the room service area, located just off of the main kitchen, taking telephone orders for room service. S [REDACTED] advised that at approximately midnight, he observed Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and KENNEDY's wife, along with a party of approximately eight to ten people, as they passed through the kitchen area enroute to the Embassy Room, where KENNEDY was to make a speech. S [REDACTED] stated that at that time, Senator KENNEDY stopped and shook hands with several of the kitchen employees, including himself.

S [REDACTED] continued that at approximately 12:15 a.m. on June 5, 1968, he heard a popping sound, which sounded like firecrackers and heard [REDACTED] (phonetic), captain of the waiters, shout that Senator KENNEDY had just been shot. S [REDACTED] stated that at that time, he immediately picked up the telephone, contacted the hotel switchboard and told them to get the police and an ambulance. He advised that he stayed where he was and did not witness the shooting or observe Senator KENNEDY after the shooting.

P [REDACTED] advised that the foreman of the Grand Jury had instructed him that under no condition was he to repeat anything that he had told the Grand Jury to anyone else.

P [REDACTED] advised that he realized the identity of the interviewing Agents but that he felt that he must obey the instructions given him in Los Angeles County Grand Jury, and that he could not make any comment or furnish any signed statement.

B [redacted] was apprised of a statement that a male had been in his liquor store on the weekend prior to the assassination of Senator KENNEDY and was asking several questions such as what would happen if he were to hold up a store, murder somebody or if he were to be arrested. B [redacted] advised that no one had been in his store making statements of that nature. He stated that on a Saturday or Sunday prior to the assassination a male entered his store and inquired how he could get on an ammunition ship going to Vietnam. Mr. B [redacted] stated this was at approximately 7:00 a.m. He indicated that this was an easy way to make money and he needed money to stay out of jail. B [redacted] stated that the questions struck him as being peculiar inasmuch as he felt the man was going to hold him up. The man later departed after buying a pack of cigarettes. He left in a green 1956 Ford.

B [redacted] viewed photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and stated that he had never seen him in his store and that he definitely was not the person who was asking the questions referred to above.

was interviewed concerning information she might possess regarding the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. She furnished the following information:

She is employed as a relief powder room girl at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles. Her duties include replenishing the supply of tissue and other items in the powder rooms of the hotel. In carrying out her duties, she generally moves between the several different powder rooms in the basement and lobby floor of the hotel.

She was on duty until about 11:30 p.m., June 4, 1968. She had intended to stay after working hours so she could listen to and perhaps observe Senator KENNEDY; however, her husband was waiting for her outside the hotel to take her home, so she departed the hotel at 11:30 p.m.

During the evening, several young people asked her where the Senator would deliver his victory address. She told them that it would probably be delivered in the Embassy Room. None of these people was SIRHAN SIRHAN, accused assassin of Senator KENNEDY. Further, she did not overhear any conversations which indicated a plot to assassinate the Senator.

When they saw A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] approach, "J [REDACTED]" said "Cool it". A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] heard nothing further concerning this conversation but noted that SIRHAN SIRHAN was driving a 1957 or 1958 DeSoto. Also, A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] stated that a K [REDACTED] V [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Alhambra, had dated "J [REDACTED]" in the past. According to Detective A [REDACTED], both A [REDACTED] and C [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] had advised that when SIRHAN and "J [REDACTED]" were in the bar, they were accompanied by a dark complexioned, similar nationality to SIRHAN's, man, who had a mustache and beard which he has recently shaved off. The M [REDACTED] believe that "J [REDACTED]" works at the Worthington Corporation, Alhambra.

Detective A [REDACTED] also advised that A [REDACTED] and C [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] had informed the Alhambra Police Department that the following individuals had also reportedly seen SIRHAN in the Golden Garter in the recent past:

A [REDACTED] and C [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] advised Detective A [REDACTED] that approximately one month ago, "J [REDACTED]", mentioned above, had come into the Golden Garter Bar and, either on that occasion or another occasion, mentioned that he knew of a girl who would be willing to work in the Golden Garter as a barmaid. He subsequently introduced a girl, using the name D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] to A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and she was hired by the M [REDACTED] brothers. At the time of employment, she listed her address as [REDACTED] Alhambra, and indicated that she was either presently employed part-time or previously employed at the Purple Bunny, Imperial and Norwalk Boulevards, Norwalk, California, telephone number [REDACTED]

Detective A [REDACTED] related that in checking public utilities and the Post Office Department, it was determined that a J [REDACTED] W [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Alhambra, and that he had left this address on or about June 1, 1968, no forwarding address given. Post Office information was obtained from Inspector J [REDACTED] C [REDACTED], United States Post Office, Los Angeles, who had advised Detective A [REDACTED] that the mail carrier covering that address had reported a J [REDACTED] W [REDACTED] was receiving mail at that address and the mailman indicated this particular mail appeared "subversive" to him.

From utility records, Detective A [REDACTED] determined that J [REDACTED] W [REDACTED] was last employed by the International Extrusion Corporation (International Aluminum), 1000 South Meridian Avenue, Alhambra.

Inquiry with B [REDACTED] C [REDACTED], Personnel Manager of the International Extrusion Company, revealed that J [REDACTED] W [REDACTED] was formerly employed with this concern; had Social Security Number [REDACTED]; date of birth [REDACTED], 5'9" tall, 174 pounds; was a white male and resided at [REDACTED] Alhambra. According to company records, his employment was terminated on May 9, 1968, and he had Texas driver's license number [REDACTED].

Detective A [REDACTED] also advised that when D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] was introduced to A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED], Golden Garter Bar, for employment, she gave her Social Security Number as [REDACTED]. According to Detective A [REDACTED] this Social Security Number is subscribed to D. [REDACTED] S [REDACTED], as of February 1966.

Detective A [REDACTED] related that no further investigation has been conducted by his office concerning this matter other than an inquiry at the last known address of D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Alhambra, and no positive information was obtained from neighbors other than W [REDACTED] was reportedly driving a blue Ford. Also, Detective A [REDACTED] stated that he is presently awaiting further utility checks and other established checks in an effort to identify "J [REDACTED]" and also D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and their locations.

He became a semi-frequent customer of the bar and, during the course of his early visits, indicated that he knew a girl who would be willing to work in the bar as a barmaid. On a later occasion, he came into the bar with a girl who was identified to M [REDACTED] as D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED]. D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] stated she resided at [REDACTED] Alhambra; gave her Social Security Number as [REDACTED] and indicated that she was presently connected with, or was formerly connected with, the Purple Bunny Bar, Imperial and Norwalk Boulevards, Norwalk, California, telephone number [REDACTED]. A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] described D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] as a white female, 5'5" tall, 125 pounds, light complexion (rosy cheeks), bleached blonde hair, blue eyes and appeared to be approximately 23 or 24 years old.

A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] advised that on one occasion, "J [REDACTED]" came into the bar with an individual who appeared to be of Spanish descent and he received the impression that he was the boy friend of D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED]. M [REDACTED] added that after two days, he became displeased with the work of D [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and fired her for personal reasons.

M [REDACTED] related that on May 29, 1968, an individual he believed to be SIRHAN SIRHAN was in the bar along with "J [REDACTED]", mentioned above. During the course of the evening, he happened to be walking by their table and overheard this individual comment to "J [REDACTED]", "We will wait till he gets into town and then we will get him." When they saw A [REDACTED] approach, "JIM" said, "Cool it." A [REDACTED] heard nothing further concerning this conversation.

He continued that he had furnished the above information to the Alhambra Police Department and that based on this description they had made up a composite photograph of "J [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] related that he had seen this individual on one occasion (May 29, 1968) and that his partner, C [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] had seen him on three previous occasions; Detective D [REDACTED] T [REDACTED], Alhambra Police Department, had observed this individual at the bar on at least one occasion and had played pool with him; and, also, the following customers of the bar had reported seeing the same man at the Golden Garter Bar:

J. P. [redacted] who resides at [redacted] Los Angeles, and who works as a kitchen helper at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, was interviewed in the Spanish language by SA E. R. [redacted] JR. Due to the fact that P. [redacted] is unable to read well in either English or Spanish, and what little reading he can do must be done with the aid of a magnifying glass because of poor vision, no signed statement was taken from him. He furnished the following information:

P. [redacted] stated that he was born on [redacted] at Los Angeles, California, and that his parents were Mexican citizens living in the United States. He stated that at an early age his family returned to Mexico and he was raised in Mexico City. P. [redacted] advised that he has worked at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles since the year 1955, and that he is presently working the 4:00 p.m. to midnight shift working in the kitchen.

P. [redacted] advised that he was working this shift on the date of June 4, 1968, and that shortly before midnight, or approximately 11:30 p.m., June 4, 1968, he and several other kitchen employees were standing in the pantry watching the happenings connected with the victory speech of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. P. [redacted] stated that approximately one half hour before midnight, the man who was later identified to him as SIRHAN SIRHAN, was also in the pantry of the Ambassador Hotel and appeared to be just another curious onlooker waiting to get a glimpse of the celebrities.

He stated that SIRHAN asked him and the other kitchen employees three or four times if they were sure that Senator KENNEDY would pass that way as he left the Embassy Ballroom. P. [redacted] advised that he simply told SIRHAN that he did not know.

P [REDACTED] stated that SIRHAN was just standing around waiting as was everyone else, but that he did notice that he, SIRHAN, had some type of papers in his hands and that he was ~~fold~~ing them or twisting them in some way, which gave the impression that he was nervous.

P [REDACTED] advised that about 15 or 20 minutes after midnight, or approximately 12:15 a.m., June 5, 1968, Senator KENNEDY and his party left the Embassy Ballroom and entered the pantry where he and the others were standing. He stated that all of the people in the pantry, including himself and his fellow workers, pressed forward to greet the Senator and attempted to shake his hands and meet him.

P [REDACTED] stated that he was shaking the Senator's hand, or rather the Senator was just letting go of his hand after having greeted him, when he heard a noise which sounded to him like a gun shot or a fire cracker. He stated that he turned his head and saw the man later identified as SIRHAN SIRHAN, waving his arm with an object in his hand, which P [REDACTED] recognized as a revolver. He stated he saw the individual with the gun fire several more shots just as several men grabbed him in an attempt to subdue him and take away the pistol. P [REDACTED] stated that his first thought was that the man was simply making noise and waving his arm to get people out of the Senator's way, but that he quickly realized that he was actually firing the gun. He stated that after seeing the man partially subdued by others, he turned to look back at Senator KENNEDY and saw that both the Senator and one other individual had fallen to the floor.

P [REDACTED] advised that at this point many people crowded around KENNEDY and that he, P [REDACTED], backed up slightly into the crowd to make room for those who would have to care for the wounded. He stated that everyone was yelling and milling about and calling for the police and an ambulance, and that in a few minutes the ambulance came and the Senator was taken out.

P [REDACTED] recalled at this point that when he had seen SIRHAN prior to the shooting in the pantry, he appeared to be alone and that at no time did he, P [REDACTED] see anyone else who appeared to know or be accompanying SIRHAN. P [REDACTED] stated that while SIRHAN was shooting the last several shots he appeared to be saying something, but that he, P [REDACTED] could not make out what SIRHAN said because of the noise of the crowd. He further stated that after having seen SIRHAN subdued by other men, he did not see him again.

P [REDACTED] stated that he had no idea how many people had actually been in the pantry and hall during the shooting inasmuch as everyone, including the press and the onlookers, had been coming and going during the entire evening.

P [REDACTED] advised that shortly after the ambulance had taken Senator KENNEDY away, a detective from the Los Angeles Police Department took him to the Rampart Division Office in Los Angeles where he was interviewed and then taken to the hotel from where he proceeded to his home.

P [REDACTED] advised that he had appeared before the Los Angeles County Grand Jury and that he had identified a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN as being the same individual that he saw shooting the gun in the pantry at the Ambassador Hotel. He stated that should he recall any further information that he feels would be of interest to the FBI, he would immediately contact the Los Angeles Office.
