Dear KK:

On Saturday afternoon Jack Cogswell brought Colonel Pat Young and his partner, Walter Mercer in to see me to discuss your case.

They have formed a company which is to operate and build some hotels and motels in Iran, both on the Caspian and on the Persian Gulf, as well as some other related facilities.

Colonel Young is going there in May. He frankly says that he has talked about you and your case with the Shah directly. He feels that there is a desire to work out some sort of a settlement with you and bring all of the problems to a final end. He was quite frank and made a lot of statements that I would not expect the Shah's people to make, particularly in terms of the students over here.

He would like to be able to discuss your case with the right people when he goes to Iran and see if he can work out a settlement. It is worth trying. On the other hand, I do not want to take the responsibility of giving him terms, etc.

I told him that I would like to have you be in touch with him directly. His telephone number at home in New York is PL 8-1868 and his office telephone is HA 1-2233. Mercer's telephone number (and Mercer I do not trust the way that I do Young, and Mercer is not going to Iran) at home is TE 1-0962, and his office telephone number is MU 8-0300.

In early December of 1967 three courriers came directly from the Shah of Iran to Hashington, D. C. with special messages of importance for the Ambassador and the Shah's agents in the U. S. namely George W. Ball and George V. Allen. The courriers informed then that the Shah is planning to visit the U. S. counting in June and it is up to them to carry the command of the Shah and work out one of the three following plans:

- 1. To attempt and make peace and settlement between the Shah and myself.
- 2. To secto it that the Shah gots what he wants after having gone through such heavy pay-offs and that is to have me departed to Iran.
 - 3. To get rid of me permanently.

They relayed the displeasure of the Shah that despite of heavy expenditure on their behalf and charging it to his rich pockets no posetive action has been taken place so far and hisis running out of patience and fed up with unfulfilled promises.

The Ambassador and his staff knew the importance of these messages and started planning right away. Rumarous meetings and telephone conversations took place between them and the Ehrh's influential agents George Allen and George Ball. Following people were approached and reprimended for not showing an and result:

F. E. Esperdy and Cook of the Immigration Service in Rew York City, Miss Watson and Miss Folger of the State Department. The importance and urgancy of the Shah's desire to have me deported to Iran wis numtioned and repeated to these people.

On December 14, 1967 while I was riding in Griffith Perk accompanied by my sister and some friends we heard sudden seems of chutters which caused my sister's horse to become frightened and the horse threw her down. This resulted in my sister being badly injured and sustain a fractured pelvis bone. She underwent an operation which lasted more than eleven hours and stayed in the hospital for two wasks and has been on crutches ever since.

Col. Pat Young of the State Department and his associate Walter Morcer approached my Attorney Mr. Richard H. Wels for making peace and

settlement between the Shah and myself. They were insistent upon visiting with me personally which I refused. I told Mr. Wels that I will not meet with anyone connected with the State Department under any circumstances. Approximately a month later on March 25, 1968 I received the enclosed letter from Mr. Hels and agreed to talk to Col. Young on the telephone. I telephoned Col. Young and discussed different aspects of my disagreements and oppositions to the Shah's corrupt regime. I informed Col. Young that my interest is this is not money but to achieve justice and freedom for the poor people of my country. I told him that the only time I would agree to make peace will be when the Shah agrees to honor all of the Chicago agreements which are herewith enclosed.

furing this whole period I received several telephone messages of threats and I was told that the Shah is running out of pationce and I will be corry if I did not agree to their terms and offers and that this time they meant business and if I did not soften up they would see to it that the Shah is pleased somehow. I was reminded of my sister's accidents several times.

On April 18, 1968 I telephoned Mr. Corinblit from Som Promotece and told him that I was planning to come to Los Angeles and will call him when I got there. On April 19, 1968 I telephoned of daughter Shirin and told her I would be in L. A. the next day and sained have to meet me at the air port. While my daughter was at the air port she called home and my youngest son Shahpour told her that Mr. Fred Walker had called a few minutes ago and asked totalk to me. By son had told him that he would pass the message on to his sister and would he call back in half an hour. Shirin told her trother that if Mr. Walker or Mr. Warmbrand call to tell them she will be track in an hour with me and would they leave a number where they called be reached. Fred Walker called back and my san gave him the massage and he said that he would call back later. Half on hour later two people came to the house and introduced themselves as Dringration Agents and asked to see me. They were told that I was not there are such a late hour of night is not the proper time to disturb a family.

My daughter and my sister met me and three of my prople, pri Davari, Mr. Khazal and Mr. Foroughi. We left the air port and whon we got to the house nobody was there. ... whirin caid that the .Jhirin caid that they must have gone to pick up screething. We drove out and dropped Mr. Khazal and Mr. Foroughi at the Beverly Hilton Hotel and Com back and drove into the parking lot opposite the house. The min wo got there a car drove in and parked in the back of our car and otunia ear two people came out and rushed to both sides of our car and tried to open the doors. We immediately locked the doors. Another two una came out of the same car and one of them was pointing towards no. Next one of them pulled out an object from his jacket and hit the windshield directely facing me. I opened the door and tried to come out when I was attacked from all sides. I remember the last hit on my head which caused me to fall down and was being dragged 🦂 to their car. Dr. Davari was hit, my sister and my delighter were screaming for help. I was told later that the screens and my wife's car coming in and my son running out and being told to call the police caused these people to run away. I was told later by Dr. Davari and my family that a few minutes after they had called the police three police cars came and inquired from them what had happened.

said that while they were pulling out she could see the first three letters on their plate "IML". My sister also said that When I ? she heard two of the men talking and cursing in Iranian. came out I could not have my hands and I was bleeding very badly. We drove out of the parking lot and was directed by a police car to U.C.L.A. Emergency Room. While I was receiving treatments the police inquired from my sister what had happened. A while luter two more police men came and made more inquiries both from my sister Complete description of the four men was given to the and myself. Police Officer Dehemmer 12738 wrote down the description of police. the four men and the car. I gave officer Dehemmer the name and telephone number of my attorney and told him that my attorney will be in touch with the Police Department on Monday.

The injuries sustained by me as the result of this brutal attack were as follows: Broken thumb, three cut fingers on both hands, substantial arount of bruises and cuts on my legs, loss of an upper end tooth, damage to my left eye, extensive amount of bruises on my face and a black eye, extreme pain on my spine, head blows which resulted in severe headaches and spells of dizziness. The record of these injuries are available at the U.C.L.A. Hospital. Since that time I have been under medical care and have received regular treatments of thumb, neurosurgery and eye care.

Next day I contacted my attorney Mr. Richard H. Mcls in Ecu York and informed him of what had taken place. He advised to to contact Mr. Corinblit and inform him of the same. Mr. Corinblit visited me next morning and was quite shocked by seeing the injuries that I had Mr. Corinblit contacted the Police Department and made sustained. an appointment for me to see you. The appointment could not be kept and was cancelled when I was told by my doctor that my hand was in a bad shape and I must have an operation as soon as possible.

After the operation my attorney made another appointment with you for May 17, 1968. As you recall I met with you on that date accompanied by my attorney and my sister. I told you that incidents like that had happened before (enclosed you will find a biographical sketch of myself pointing out these planned incidents). I informed you that I was makin, my own investigation too to get to the bottom of this matter. I mentioned to you at that time that my information leads me to believe that George Ball was one of the people behind this attack. I agreed with your suggestion that I continuo with my investigation and inform you of the result which would give you a better lead as to the identity of the people involved in this crime.

Now I have reliable information from the inside of the Iranian Embassy that George Ball, Ansari (Iranian Ambassador) and Yazdanpanah (Iranian Press Attache) were behind this. I also have the name of two SAVAK Police officers who attacked mo that night and who are presently in this country. They are Major Naser Nam and Captain Faraj Sepahbodi.

I am herewith making an official charge against the people I mentioned above and I hope that these criminals would be punished for the crime they have committed. If you need any further information please contact me at the following addresses.

# His 392 Suits Lost in Fire, He Can Dress Up With

By ALFRED ALBELLI

As the world's best-dressed man (his own characterization) Khaibar Khan, exiled Iranian tribal leader, had 392 suits in his New York wardrobe when he gave a glittering party for 75 guests on the evening of Nov. 3, 1961.

Being sensible of his obligations as a modern Chesterfield, and of the changing New York climate, he had 88 spring suits, 127 for summer, 77 for fall and 100 for winter.

All these, along with furnishings, rugs, carpets, jewelry and other valuables, to a total of \$411,952, were destroyed or stolen immediately after the party when a fire wrecked his seven-room apartment at 923 Fifth Ave., he charged in a suit against two insurance companies.

#### Evidence Fire Was Set

Yesterday Supreme Court Justice Henry Clay Greenberg awarded the Iranian \$104,316, plus interest.

The judge held there was "considerable evidence" to establish that the fire was of incendiary origin. But he tossed out, as not proved, charges by the Continental and Actua insurance companies that Khaibar knew of its incendiary nature and "gave false testimony with respect to his knowledge thereof."

The companies, Justice Green-berg noted, did not, however, claim that Khaibar Khan himself was guilty of the incendiarism.

"In his mind, Khaibar Khan considered himself to be the world's best dressed man and it is not for the court to speculate as to whether this was or was not the actual fact.




#### His Side of Story

Khaibar, at the trial, offered two possible explanations for the fire:

Accidental: He had just received from Mrs. Lauren Osias, a divorcee who attended the party, a gift of two candelabra illuminated by butane gas. During the party someone smelled fumes and the butane was shut off. The apparatus may have been responsible.

International plot: Two myster-ious strangers, the only men not in tuxedos, appeared among the guests but drifted away when they were questioned. They might, Khaibar suggested, have been Iranian agents seeking to steal or destroy government records he

The documents, along with his jewelry box, were missing after the fire, according to Khaibar.

MRS. MARGARET SWEENEY

Mrs. Sterns supervisor, Mrs. Sweeney, was seated at her desk on June 4, 1968. Mrs. Sweeney observed the same people and there actions as Mrs. Sterns. She recalls Khaibar Khan entering Kennedy headquarters with two other males and a female, as he had done on other occasions in the past. She stated that she was certain that Sirhan B. Sirhan was not present and that no one was armed with weapons. Sirhan has definitely been identified as being at the San Gabriel Valley Gun Club on June 4, 1968. Mrs. Sweeney gives the following evaluation of Mrs. Sterns as follows: "Stupid, libel to say anything to focus attention to herself, and extremely excitable."

SERIAL W. MERS

MRS. ELEANOR SEVERSON

Mrs. Eleanor Severson another campaign worker in the Kennedy headquarters at 5615 Wilshire Blvd. Mrs. Severson stated that she did not observe Sirhan B. Sirhan in the campaign headquarters on June 4th. However, Mrs. Severson alleged that she did observe Sirhan both on June 2nd and 3rd in campaign headquarters in the company of Khaiber Khan.

Mrs. Sweeney also discredits Mrs. Severson's allegations. Mrs. Sweeney is certain that Sirhan B. Sirhan was not among any of the volunteer workers brought to campaign headquarters by Khaibar Khan. It is Mrs. Sweeney's opinion that Mrs. Severson is attempting to "out do" Mrs. Sterns.

Mrs. Severson was unable to identify any photo of Sirhan other than the one published in the news media.

WALTER SHERRILL CROWE JR

Walter Crowe an admitted member of the Communist Party when interviewed stated that he befriended Sirhan B. Sirhan while students at Pasadena City College. Crowe further stated that he met and had a conversation with Sirhan in March 1968. There conversation covered politics, various organizations, etc.

A complete background investigation on Crowe, his associates, etc is being conducted in an attempt to determine if Sirhan was in anyway connected with Crowe's associates or documented organizations. This investigation when completed will be covered in a subsequent report.

John Khoury employed by the Ambassador Hotel in the controller's office. When interviewed stated that he left the Ambassador Hotel on the 4th of June at approximately 5:00 or 5:15PM and did not return until June 5, 1968. Other witnesses at the hotel, Fred Droz and Judy Groves both acquaintances of Khoury positively place Khoury on the second floor of the Ambassador Hotel in the vicinity of The Lobby and The Colonial Room between 9:30PM and mid night on June 4, 1968.

closely resemble Sirhans'.

The resemblance of Andrese to Sirhan, coupled with the statement allegely over heard by Martigani prior to the assassination, have resulted in numerous people including three Alhambra police officers definitely placing Sirhan in the beer bar during May 1968.

Wilson was re-interviewed and placed on the polygraph, the results are as follows: Wilson was truthful, was not associated with Sirhan, and was not involved in a conspiracy to assassinate Robert Kennedy.

The Alhambra Police Officers were re-interviewed at the Alhambra Police Station in the presence of Captain Fratt, Chief of Detectives. The officers cannot definiately state that the person they saw was Sirhan, only that the person resembled Sirhan.

MISS VIRGINIA TERESI

Miss Virginia Teresi alleges that on June, 1968 at Melrose and St. Andrews Place, she observed Sirhan B. Sirhan and two male companions in a 1959 blue Ford. She further stated that Sirhan was carrying a pistol in his waistband and she observed a rifle barrel partially covered by clothing in the rear seat of their vehicle. She recalls hearing some conversation redarding: "We'll get Kennedy". Mrs. Teresi was interviewed and then given an polygraph examination. She subsequently admitted that her entire story was a hoax and had not occurred.

MRS. ESTELLE STERNS

Mrs. Estelle Sterns is a voluntary Kennedy worker at 5615 Wilshire Blvd. Mrs. Sterns stated that on June 4, 1968, Sirhan B. Sirhan accompanied by two other male Jordanians and one female Jordanian entered the Kennedy headquarters. Mrs. Sterns went into great detail describing Sirhans surreptitious movements about the headquarters. She further stated that Sirhan and one of the other male Jordanians were armed with guns carried in a shoulder holister and that Sirhan offered to buy her a cup of coffee. Mrs. Sterns in her description of the three male Jordanians which includes Sirhan and the female Jordanian has described Khaibar Khan, his son and daughter. The other individual was one of approximately twenty males of mid eastern extraction who Khaibar Khan brought into the Kennedy headquarters for campaign work. None of the other campaign workers in Kennedy headquarters on the 4th of June can identify Sirhan B. Sirhan as being present or being armed with weapons.

Mrs. Sterns has indicated that she is to busy to be examined on the polygraph and was unable to identify any mug photo of Sirhan with the exception of the photo that was carried by the various newspapers and news media.

## KENNEDY HEADQUARTERS

The Konnody Headquartors located at 5615 Wilshire Blvd cmployed approximately twenty salaried employees from the day it opened March 24, 1968. The number of salaried employees increased from twenty to one hundred prior to the assassination. A roster of the salaried employees is being compiled and will be placed in file for future disposition.

The number of volunteer workers varied from hour to hour and from day to day. The approximate number of volunteer workers was in excess of five thousand.

A list of the volunteer workers has been compiled however the validity of the names and addresses of these workers is questionable. The volunteer worker would list his name and address on a card and subsequently forward it to a salaried employee.

A couple of volunteer workers mentioned in the first progress report, Mrs. Storns and Mrs. Soverson alleged that they had observed Sirhan in the campaign headquarters between June 1 and 4 inclusive. Khaibar Khan also alloges that he observed Sirhan in the campaign headquarters periodically which will be covered in section B of this report.

There is no evidence to date or of individuals, who can positively place Sirhan B. Sirhan in the campaign headquarters.

#### KHAIBAR KHAN

Khaibar Khan an Iranian alien first came to the United States with his family in 1953. Khan alleges to be a personal friend of the late Senator Robort F. Konnedy and he has personal correspondence which corroborates this fact. This correspondence has been examined . and photostat copies obtained.

Mr. Khan allegedly has been politically exiled from Iran as a result of a finanical business venture and subsequent international lawsuit with the family of the King of Iran.

During the Khans stay in the United States he has become active in a group known as the "United Patriots for Justice".

The Khan began visiting the headquartors on Wilshiro Blvd on June 1, 1968. During his frequent visits he would bring members of his family and friends most of which were of mid-eastern extraction.

Khaibar Khan alleged that he observed Sirhan B. Sirhan on 6-3-68 and again on 6-4-68 in campaign headquarters. On one occasion Sirhan was allegedly accompanied by a girl wearing a polka dot dress. Upon subsequent questioning by investigators of the SUS Unit Khaibar Khan is uncertain of his observations. He has refused to take a polygraph examination or view a show-up.

ITEM No. QUAN. 3 Progress Report for July 19, 1968

Mr. Khan is presently awaiting the outcome of legislations now before the U.S. Congress to determine if he will become a citizen of the United States by an act of Congress. The Khan was also the subject of a Department of Immigration warrant of arrest charging him with "illegal entry." The Department of Immigration was informed of his whereabouts by investigators of this unit which resulted in his arrest. He is presently on bail and awaiting an additional hearing which will rule on deportation proceedings.

# C. HOTEL SECURITY

The hotel security force numbering eight uniformed officers and two plainclothes officers supplemented by six uniformed officers from the ACE Guard Service were deployed throughout the hotel. The investigation has disclosed that the security guards positions were frequently changed and their instructions often modified and countermanded. A list of the guards positions immediately prior to and after the shooting is attached to this report.

The Kennedy Party was opposed to any and all security measures. Bill Gardner, Chief Security Officer for the hotel instructed the security force to be "unobtrusive" and that each guard was to allow "the common man to be with the Senator".

There were some vague attempts to prevent all unauthoritized persons from entering the Colonial Room which was used as the press room. Once representatives from the Los Angeles Fire Department formed the opinion that various rooms on the first and second floors were over crowded, the guards were notified to restrict further entry. However it does not appear that the security force was sucessful.

# D. MICHAEL WAYNE

Michael Wayne came to the attention of the SUS Unit by several persons who allegedly observed him running from the kitchen area subsequent to the shooting. Wayne allegely was to have carried a rifle case containing a rifle with a brown stock, etc.

Michael Wayne had obtained a large campaign poster which he rolled up into a tubular shaped object. Senator Kennedy enroute to the Embassy Room where he made his victory speech, authographed the campaign poster for Wayne.

A security officer, Augustus Mallard, observed Wayne running through the lobby of the hotel and apprehended him. Wayne was handcuffed and interviewed by investigators of the Los Angeles Police Department and released. Wayne was not armed and the witnesses who allegedly viewed the rifle when re-interviewed immediately modified their statements.

## E. JOHN ANTOINE KHOURY

John Khoury an alien from Lebanon came to the attention of the Los Angeles Police Department as he was allegedly a "militant anti Kennedy" and an employee of the Ambassador Hotel. Khoury was originally interviewed by investigators from the District Attorneys Office.

Khaibar Khan (LA#835805) and family came to Los Angeles in 1953, this included his wife Talat Khan, his sons, Khosrow Khan, and his daughter

In 1959, Mr. Khan returned to Iran with an American Construction Company to take part in a business deal with the King of Iran who at that time was a personal friend of Mr. Khan. The venture fell through and Mr. Khan returned to the United States. Mr. Khan then became active in a group known as the "United Patriots for Justice". This group consisted of various leaders of tribes in Iran) who don't generally favor the King.

Mr. Khan then initiated legal action against the family of the King of Iran in a lawsuit for a sum exceeding one million dollars. He also testified before the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on the investigations of The Committee on Government Operations, this committee was presided by Senator John L. McClellan (D-Ark). The committee was concerned with the mis-use of foreign aid funds in Iran. This all occurred between the years of 1959 and 1963.

Also during this time the King of Iran declared Mr. Khan a political exile. Much of the legal action that took place during the hearing before the Subcommittee brought Mr. Khan in contact with the United States Attorney General's Office and Mr. Robert F. Kennedy, who at that time was the United States Attorney General. And according to Mr. Khan this is how he became quite impressed with Robert Kennedy and which made him volunteer as a Kennedy worker.

Mr. Khan's first visit to the headquarters was on 6-1-68 at which time he registered. He again returned on 6-2-68 with Maryam Kouchan and during that time worked answering telephones and left at approximately 6:30PM. On 6-3-68 he again arrived at the Kennedy headquarters at approximately 3:00PM, with his daughter, Shirin. During this time Mr. Khan recalls seeing a male seated in a car outside the headquarters which in his mind resembled Sirhan. Also during this time Mr. Khan filled out registration cards and listed various names of individuals who are tribal leaders in Iran. The purpose of this was that in November 1968 when the presidental election takes place these various people would be in the United States and were supposedly going to help take the callers name and use his mailing address on the cards. This mailing address (10455% Wilshire) belongs to his ex-wife Talat Khan. He also used this address on the registration cards for the tribal leaders.

On 6-4-68, Mr. Khan again went to the headquarters accompanied with Maryam Kouchan and his son Khosrow Khan. Mr. Khan then worked at one of the desks selling campaign buttons and claims that he observed a male who he supposedly states was Sirhan enter the rear door. He also observed a girl in a polka dot dress enter the front door. These two individuals were then seen later

standing within three feet of one another and apparently talking to one another. This supposedly occurred during the afternoon hours.

Due 11to the fact that Sirhan on 6-4-68 (afternoon hours) was at the target range I suggested to Mr. Khan he take a polygraph examination to verify the truthfulness of his observation of Sirhan. Mr. Khan refused and stated he wanted to be 100% sure before actually accusing anyone. I then suggested that if a "show-up" could be arranged if he would come to the police station. Mr. Khan again refused and refused to go anywhere near a police station.

This type behavior was expected since Mr. Khan was always a bit reluctant about his whereabouts and would always insist that during our interviews we meet in a public park or restaurant. Also that during any interview with members of his family or friends he insisted on being present.

It should ne noted that the times Mr. Khan was at the headquarters he had his arm in a cast due to a dispute that took place in April, 1968 in a parking lot adjacent to 10455 Wilshire Blvd. This incident was reported to West Los Angeles Detectives. Also his traveling campanion Maryam Kouchan was using crutches to walk due to a horse back riding accident that took place in Griffith Park.

In regards to the interview of Maryam Kouchan she also ID's Sirhan but this ID is very weak and she gives the impression of being a puppet of Mr. Khan. Miss Kouchan also refused to take a take a polygraph without the sanction of Mr. Khan, which of course was not given.

It is therefore this officers opinion that the ID of Sirhan by Mr. Khan and Miss Kouchan is very doubtful or simply a mistake in identity.

I was also informed that Mr. Khan was wanted on an Immigration warrant #All-011142 (Illegal Entry) remaining beyond specified time. This warrant was served on Mr. Khan by Immigration authorities shortly after the last interview.
