If I know something to be a fact, there's nothing in the world that I can do to say no, I don't know it, you see. If I hold something in my hand, there's nothing in the world that I can may, no, I don't hold it.

Q. You see? So, for the treeson, because of the national interest in this case here, I've been asked to give you a lie detector test. Now what I want to do here in the first place, I'm going to give you a control test. That is to find out how you are feeling right now, how nervous you are; because I presume that you are pretty nervous.

15 Q. I would be nervous if I were in here. So, as I go 16 along here, I'll explain the test to you and I'll show you 17 what happens. If you look at the box--now if I make any noises I'm not trying to scare you. I'm merely trying to find out how your body responds to noise.

Will you close your eyes for me, please. Just keep them 8 closed. I'm going to touch your left hand. Just keep your 9 eyes closed. I'm not going to hurt you. You can open your 10 eyes now. I want youto concentrate here on something now. 11 This lie detector -- there are people that are capable of lying 12 13 to a lie detector. There are not many of them, but to be truthful with you--and I am being truthful with you--there are .14 15 people who are capable of lying and of not being found out. The last survey we had across the country was in 1964. At 16 that time we found out that out of a thousand people that were 17 examined for statistical purposes, there were 32 that were :18 able to lie and not be found out. But I want to show you here 19 what happens when you say something that you know is not the 20 21 truth, Munir. Can you see these numbers here?
