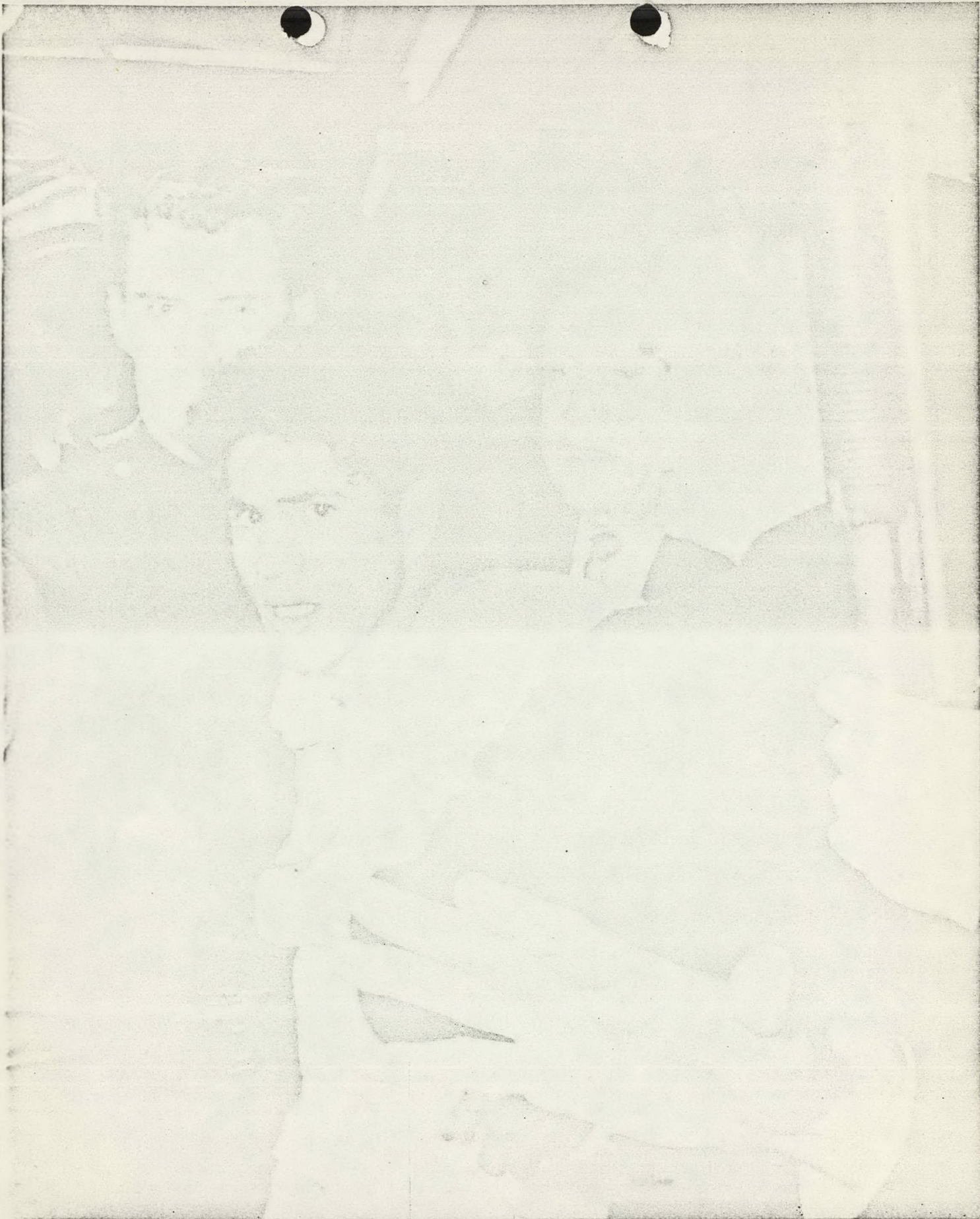

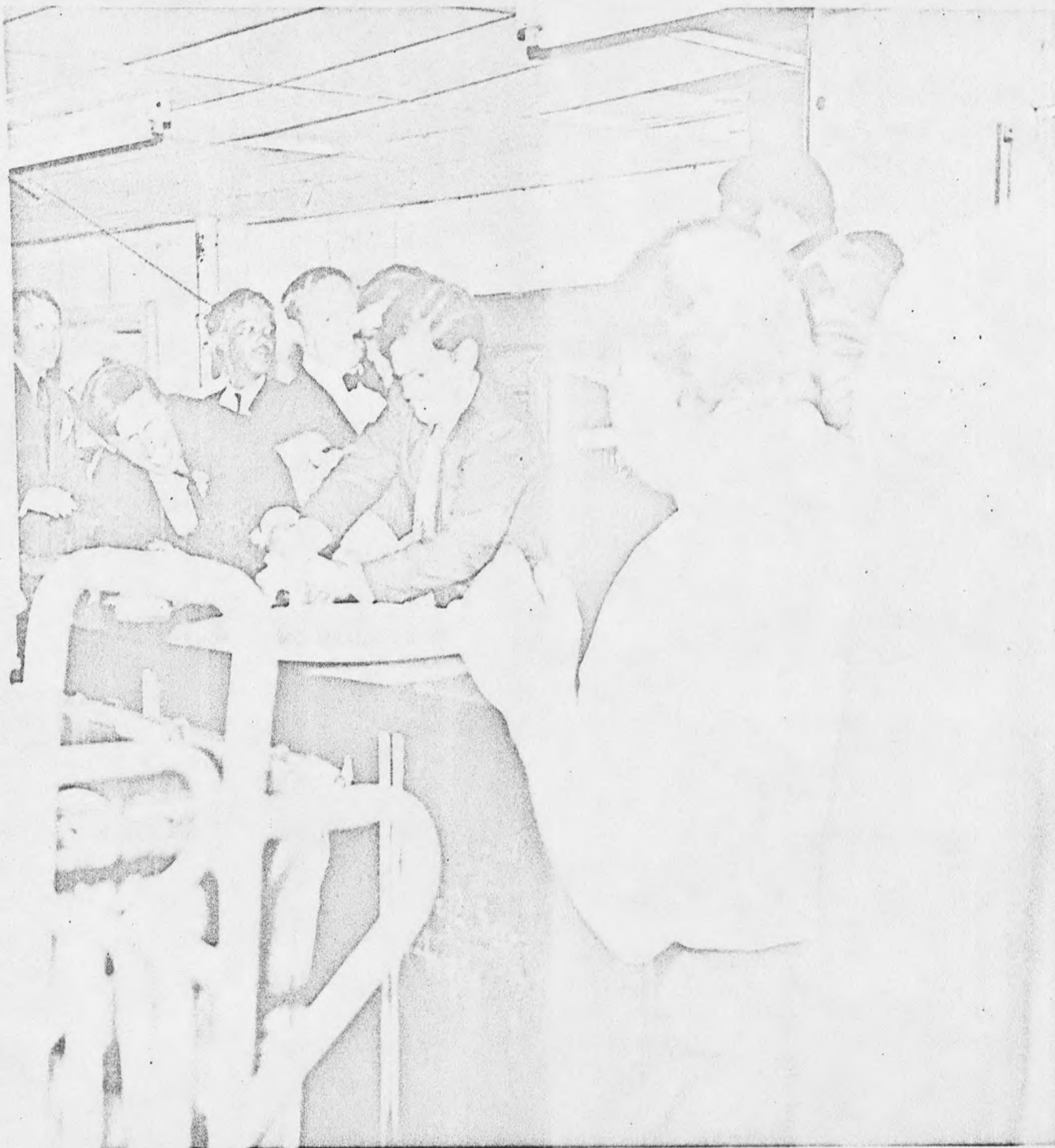

On June 7, 1968, SA EDWARD A. PLEVACK received a photograph from Lieutenant C. F. HUGHES, Rampart Division, Los Angeles Police Department, which had been taken by HAL BURBA of the Los Angeles Fire Department on June 5, 1968. According to Los Angeles Police Department Records, at 12:30 a.m., on June 5, 1968; SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was arrested by Los Angeles Police Department Officers T.R. WHITE (Number 13308) and ARTHUR PLACENCIA (Number 13742) at the Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California under the name of "JOHN DOE #1". He was charged with suspicion of 217 PC (assault with intent to murder). SIRHAN had no identification on his person and refused to reveal his identity.

According to Los Angeles Police Department Records, Officer ARTHUR PLACENCIA read the following statement to SIRHAN: "you have the right to remain silent. If you give up the right to remain silent, anything you say can and will be used against you in a court of law. You have the right to speak with an attorney and to have the attorney present during questioning. If you so desire and cannot afford one, an attorney will be appointed for you without charge before questioning." SIRHAN was then asked, "Do you understand your rights?" at which time he replied "Yes."; "Do you wish to remain silent?" at which time he replied "Yes." and "Do you want an attorney present?" to which he replied "Yes." SIRHAN was booked as "JOHN DOE #1" on June 5, 1968 at 2:20 a.m.

SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was examined at 2:01 a.m., June 5, 1968 by Dr. E.C. LANZ at the Los Angeles Police Department under the name "JOHN DOE - Suspect". Medical findings indicated a swelling of his left ankle, probable sprain, no fracture, contusion of his left index finger, hematoma of forehead and minor abrasions of face.

As previously reported, the facts of this case were presented to the Los Angeles County Grand Jury on June 7, 1968, by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office.

As a result of the Grand Jury Hearing, an indictment was rendered charging SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN with five counts of attempt to commit murder and one count of murder.

On June 7, 1968, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was arraigned in the Chapel facility of the Los Angeles County Jail before Superior Court Judge ARTHUR L. ALARCON. In this appearance, SIRHAN was represented by the office of the Los Angeles County Public Defender and a date of plea was set by the judge for June 28, 1968.

Also on June 7, 1968, Superior Court Judge ALARCON issued a court order limiting publicity on and discussion of this case as he indicated it was the duty of the court to guarantee that the defendant received a fair trial.

WILBUR LITTLEFIELD, Chief Trial Attorney of the Los Angeles County Public Defender's Office was named as the defense counsel for SIRHAN.

On June 19, 1968, Los Angeles attorney RUSSELL E. PARSONS was selected by SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN as his attorney to replace WILBUR LITTLEFIELD of the Public Defender's Office. PARSONS indicated that he would be assisted by a second attorney whose identity was not made known by PARSONS as this attorney was allegedly currently engaged in trial. As of the date of this report, RUSSELL E. PARSONS remains the only attorney of record.

On June 28, 1968, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, represented by his attorney RUSSELL E. PARSONS, appeared before Los Angeles Superior Court Judge RICHARD B. SCHAUER of Department 100, for the purpose of plea. This appearance was held in the Chapel of the Los Angeles County Central Jail for reasons of security.

At this hearing, an official substitution for the court was made revealing RUSSELL E. PARSONS as the attorney of record for SIRHAN. PARSONS requested a three-week delay which was granted by the court and plea date was set for July 19, 1968. At this appearance, SIRHAN waived his right in open court to a trial within 60 days of indictment. Also at this appearance the court appointed a second psychiatrist to examine SIRHAN as one of the two original psychiatrists designated by the court declined to examine him.

On July 7, 1968, SIRHAN was moved under heavy security precautions from the Los Angeles County Central Jail to the 13th floor of the Hall of Justice where he will remain pending further court action.

On July 19, 1968, SIRHAN appeared in Department 100, before Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge RICHARD SCHAUER. SIRHAN at this hearing was represented by his attorney, RUSSELL E. PARSONS. The prosecution was represented by District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER and Chief Assistant District Attorney LYNN COMPTON.

At this appearance, PARSONS requested and was granted an extension for purpose of entering a plea on behalf of SIRHAN until August 2, 1968. This motion was based on the fact that PARSONS claimed he has not yet received a complete psychiatric report from the two psychiatrists appointed by the court to examine SIRHAN. Also, PARSONS requested and permission was granted for Dr. RODERICK RICHARDON, a psychiatrist, to continue further examination of SIRHAN and for Dr. EDWARD DAVIS to conduct an encephalograph.

At this court appearance, District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER submitted to the court and to the defense attorney a matter of motion which he intends to make on August 2, 1968, to vacate or modify the previous court admonition against discussing this case with news media and other unauthorized individuals.

On 9/19/68, Los Angeles County Deputy District Attorney JOHN HOWARD advised that Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge RICHARD SCHAUER has assigned Superior Court Judge HERBERT WALKER to preside over the upcoming trial of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN.

According to HOWARD, Judge WALKER is a man of many years experience and completely competent to preside over these proceedings. The previously scheduled 10/4/68 appearance in Superior Court for SIRHAN will takeplace as scheduled to permit the court to maintain jurisdiction over this matter.

On 9/20/68, HOWARD was again contacted at which time he confidentially advised (not for dissemination) that Los Angeles Attorney GRANT COOPER, currently engaged in representing one of the defendants in the Friar's Club prosecution in United States District Court, Los Angeles, is expected to participate as defense attorney for SIRHAN.

HOWARD continued by stating that Attorney RUSSELL PARSONS apparently has the SIRHAN family "in his pocket". HOWARD explained that he is convinced PARSONS has legally obtained the family permission to represent them in any books, stories, or publications which may be subsequently written.

HOWARD has received no information nor has he heard any rumors which would indicate that any other attorney of national prominence is being considered to represent SIRHAN.

Enclosed for the Bureau is one photograph of the custodial facilities in which SIRHAN B. SIRHAN is being detained at the Hall of Justice, Los Angeles, California. The left half of the photograph, under the numeral 2, depicts SIRHAN's general living quarters. This portion of his cell is furnished with a permanent steel cot with mattress, a porcelain wash basin and polished metal mirror. To the right on the photograph, under the numeral 1, is the portion of SIRHAN's quarters containing the necessary sanitary facilities. The foreground portion of the photograph is the corridor in which SIRHAN is permitted to exercise daily. Both ends of this corridor are enclosed.

For the information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Special Unit which has been handling the investigation into the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY is curtailing some of their activities with respect to this investigation. Of the 23 men assigned, two of the Lieutenants have been returned to general assignment, though remaining available for special assignments with the unit on a part-time basis. The LAPD team preparing the case are coordinating their reports at this time with the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office so that all interviews conducted by the FBI and the LAPD will be coordinated.

The District Attorney's Office for Los Angeles County is preparing the list of tentative witnesses which they hope to

utilize in the forthcoming trial of SIRHAN. They have broken the witnesses down into approximately three categories:

(1) Witnesses who will be used in the trial and whose testimony will be available to the defense under the proper motion before the Court.

(2) Witnesses who might be of possible interest to the defense attorneys and to the trial but who will not be used by the District Attorney.

(3) Individuals who have been interviewed but who contribute nothing toward either the prosecution or the defense of SIRHAN.

The District Attorney's Office has taken the position that nothing will be made available except through the proper channels of the Court. The prosecutive team for the District Attorney's Office at this time consists of Chief Deputy District Attorney LYNN COMPTON and Deputy District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS. Any participation on the part of Los Angeles County District Attorney EVELLE YOUNGER has not yet been decided upon. The current estimate of the length of the trial on the part of the District Attorney's Office at this time is 12 weeks.

The defense has investigators attempting to locate any persons who might have served SIRHAN liquor at the Ambassador Hotel on the night of 6/4/68. This is apparently in connection with the previously reported information that SIRHAN allegedly paid a \$20.00 tip to an individual in the MAX RAFFERTY Campaign Headquarters at the hotel for serving him a drink. No such person or incident has yet been uncovered. Hotel officials have been informed by the District Attorney's Office that there is no restriction on making available to the defense a list of employees so that such employees may be interviewed by the defense.

Detective Sergeant GUS FEDERLY, Assistant to Under-Sheriff WILLIAM MC CLOUD, Los Angeles County, advised on a confidential basis that the only individuals visiting SIRHAN are his mother, MARY SIRHAN, and his brothers, MUNIR and ADELE. However, none of these individuals have visited SIRHAN alone. They are always accompanied by his attorney, RUSSELL PARSONS.

In addition, MICHAEL MC COWAN, who is acting as a private investigator for the defense, also visits with SIRHAN. Among the visitors permitted by PARSONS is ROBERT KAISER, who is listed as an investigator. KAISER is reported to be a former photographer and writer for "Time Magazine" and is believed at this time to be gathering information for articles, stories or books concerning SIRHAN to be written at a later date. It has previously been indicated that PARSONS has apparently assumed the position of legally representing the SIRHAN family in any publications to be prepared.

At the present time the Los Angeles Division is current in its investigation, and a current report is being prepared. The bulk of the outstanding investigation at the present time is to report the results of the interviews of out-of-state guests at the Ambassador Hotel, as requested by the LAPD. The results of these interviews will be incorporated in an additional report.

The Bureau will be kept advised of current events, and it is to be noted that the forthcoming October 4 hearing in this matter may not be held, in view of the appointment of a trial Judge during the past week. This information was furnished to the Bureau previously.

On August 2, 1968, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN pled not guilty to the charge of murder in the slaying of ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Los Angeles Superior Court Judge RICHARD SCHAUER set the trial date for November 1, 1968, in this matter.

Represented by his attorney, RUSSELL E. PARSONS, SIRHAN also pled not guilty to feloniously assaulting, with a deadly weapon and with intent to commit murder, five other persons wounded the same night at the election celebration at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California.

Judge SCHAUER did not at this hearing name the judge who will preside over the case.

Also at this hearing, Los Angeles County District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER assisted by Deputy District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS asked that Judge SCHAUER vacate or modify a previous court order restricting publicity in this case.

SIRHAN's attorney RUSSELL E. PARSONS and A. L. WIRIN, Chief Counsel of the Southern California Chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union, opposed the motion of YOUNGER. WIRIN was allowed to appear as a "friend" of the court.

The motion of YOUNGER regarding publicity on this case was denied by Superior Court Judge RICHARD SCHAUER.

On September 10, 1968, District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER signed an appeal requesting that the court order limiting publicity in the SIRHAN case be modified. The District Attorney sought reversal of the order in a petition for a writ of mandate and prohibition from the State Court of Appeal.

On September 19, 1968, Superior Court Judge RICHARD SCHAUER of the Master Calendar Criminal Department, of the Superior Court, selected Superior Court Judge ROBERT V. WALKER to try SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN.

SCHAUER also announced that the trial would take place in the courtroom now designated as Department 107, Room 832, located on the 8th floor of the Hall of Justice. Trial is currently scheduled for November 1, 1968.

The California State Court of Appeals on September 25, 1968, denied District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER's petition to block enforcement of a publicity ban on the pending trial of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. The office of the District Attorney indicated that it might ask for a hearing on the matter before the State Supreme Court.

On 10/4/68, SIRHAN B. SIRHAN appeared in Los Angeles County Superior Court before Judge RICHARD B. SCHAUER. SIRHAN was accompanied and represented by his attorney, RUSSELL PARSON. The people were represented by Chief Deputy District Attorney for Los Angeles County LYNN COMPTON and Deputy District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS.

At the hearing, Judge SCHAUER formally appointed Judge HERBERT V. WALKER to be the presiding judge at the trial of SIRHAN which will take place in Department 107.

Judge SCHAUER advised that two motions are presently pending before the court; one a motion to suppress evidence obtained during the investigation and the second a motion for discovery, both of which were filed by PARSON in behalf of SIRHAN. On 10/22/68, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN appeared in Department 107 of the Los Angeles County Superior Court before Superior Court Judge HERBERT V. WALKER. SIRHAN was represented by his attorney, RUSSELL PARSONS. The prosecution was represented by Chief Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorney LYNN COMPTON and Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS. The purpose of that appearance was for the court to rule on evidence obtained at the SIRHAN residence in Pasadena, California, following the assassination of the late ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Sergeants WILLIAM BRANDT and DANTE A. LODOLLO of the Los Angeles Police Department testified as prosecution witnesses relative to the search of the SIRHAN residence. During their testimony they testified that a search of the residence was permitted by SIRHAN's brother, ADELL SIRHAN. During the proceedings it was brought out that the residence is actually being purchased by SIRHAN's mother, MARY SIRHAN.

ADELL SIRHAN and MARY SIRHAN testified as defense witnesses before the court as did another brother, MUNIR SIRHAN. MARY SIRHAN testified that the residence at 696 East Howard Street is her home and that she has a deed in her name showing ownership. She further testified that in June 1968 the residence was occupied by herself and her three sons, ADELL, MUNIR, and SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. She testified that at the time the search of her residence was conducted she was at work at the Westminster Nursing School in Pasadena. She further testified that she was not aware that a search of her residence had taken place; that she had never given permission to any one to search her
