7 On the evening of June 4th, he went to a hotel with a letter
8 from his union stating that their local had voted to support
9 Robert Kennedy for President of the United States. He
10 arrived at the hotel at approximately 9 p.m. He went to the
11 Colonial Room, produced identification, and the letter from
12 the union and was allowed admittance through the Colonial
13 Room through the pantry area leading to the Embassy Room.
14 He stated the pantry area where ABC was doing interviews and
15 he had sandwiches with the television crew, he was standing
16 in this area when Senator Kennedy walked through en route
17 to the stage to make his speech. He gives the following
18 account of the occurrence which followed: I was standing in
19 the pantry when Senator Kennedy passed me after his speech.
20 He came through very fast. I recognized Jesse Unruh, who
21 was with him, and then it seemed like a few seconds later I
22 heard shots. I did not see the Senator when he was shaking
23 hands with anyone. I ran around the partition and saw a man
24 on the floor. There was blood on his head. I ran over to a
25 table and Rosie Grier had a suspect. I did not see Kennedy
26 at this time. I had run to the left side of Schrade. When
I heard the shots, it sounded like one shot, a pause, then
two loud shots. The first shot sounded muffled. I heard

1 someone yelling, "Get him." And I hit him. Rosie got there
2 just about then. I jumped up on the table and grabbed his
3 hand. I put my foot on his hand and then I got down off the
4 table. I remember a guy with a light Panama jacket, pin-
5 striped, and horn-rimmed glasses that had a hold of his hand.
6 I looked back at Robert Kennedy, and when I looked back again,
7 I saw the gun was gone. Someone said Rafer had it. We
8 continued scuffling down the table. I kept holding on to the
9 guy's arm. A bus boy was holding on to him by then, too,
10 an Oriental. The Oriental bus boy ran for a rope and came
11 back with some kind of wire. I remember Rosie said, "Don't
12 tie him; the police will be here soon." It was about then
13 that Jesse Unruh began pushing people off the table. The first
14 time I remember seeing the suspect, he was next to the table.
15 He seemed to be wearing a white T-shirt, his arms were bare,
16 he appeared drabby. I don't know which hand the gun was in.

I was to the left of the Senator and about five feet behind him. I heard what sounded like firecrackers popping, there was probably less than 10 of these popping noises. I saw 3 or 4 hands on an arm and there was a gun in the hand. I never saw the person who was holding the gun as people were obstructing my view. The gunman was subdued by other persons so I directed my attention to the Senator who was lying wounded on the floor. I cannot I.D. the susp.

Above subject, it was found, is the same JIM who Mr. MARIGANI was referring as being with SIRHAN at his bar. WILSON was found at his residence and interviewed at Santa Ana PD. He stated that he had lived in Alhambra at the Main Street address with NESS, DOROTHY MANNING, and RHONDA GREEN, in May, 1968. During May he was employed for a week at the Scanbe Mfg. Corp., 1161 Monterey Pass Rd., in Monterey Park. While employed at this location he was driven home on occasions by a co-worker he called BOB. This BOB drove a blue valiant. BOB and WILSON would occasionally stop at the Golden Garter and drink a few beers. He stated that this BOB was a weirdo and a strong believer in politics and often would spend all day talking about politics.

5 Mr. Wilson indicated he was carrying a portable television
6 camera on his shoulders and was approximately one or two
7 paces outside the double doors going from the stage to the
8 kitchen. He recalled hearing the first shot but did not
9 react. On the second shot, he turned on the camera and
10 went through the double doors. The electrician, John
11 William Lewis, III, who was working with him stated,
12 "They're shooting." He recalled that the crowd parted and
13 he moved forward with his camera. The first time he saw
14 the Senator, he was down. He indicated his path of vision
15 was limited as he was looking through the sight on the
16 camera. This prevented him from being able to see more in
17 the room. He ran out of film, dropped his camera, and
18 helped contain the crowd. Also working with him at the time
19 was his soundman, Robert F. Funk. As he recalled Lewis,
20 his electrician, was to his left as they entered the room,
21 and the soundman, Funk, was to his right or right rear.
22 He indicated that both Funk and Lewis lived in Virginia.
23 They could probably be contacted in Room G-329, New Senate
24 Office Building, and are both presently working for NBC.
25 Wilson indicated that in moving forward after turning on his
26 camera, he moved between Paul Schrader and the petition. He
was directly in line with the Senator's body between his
head and the petition.

4 Mr. Witcober stated he was on stage with Senator Kennedy
5 and exited the stage on the left side. He was proceeding
6 from the Embassy Room to the Colonial Room via the kitchen
7 and were between the end of the steam tables and the door
8 to the Colonial press room. He heard one pop, a pause,
9 and then rapid fire. He first thought the shots were
10 firecrackers. He reacted to the rapid fire by turning to
11 his left and observed a scuffle where four or five people
12 were wrestling with someone. He observed Rosie Grier
13 running towards this group. He stated when he first heard
14 the shots and turned, he had a clear field of vision to
15 the area where the scuffle was. Although there were other
16 people walking in the same direction, he does not recall
17 any of them at that particular time. He stated he was
18 walking fairly close to the tables and did not see the
19 suspect prior to the shooting.

Mr. Wood stated he was working at the Kennedy Hdgs. (5615 Wilshire Blvd.) on 6-3-68. During the course of the day he overheard 3 men talking arabic and one of the men stated "if we can't catch him today, we'll catch him tonight." Mr. Wood desc. the man who spoke as follows: M, Arab, 20/25, 6-0, 160 Long Dk. Hair, Dr. Eyes, Yellow and Brn Checkered Bell Bottom pants, Blue velvet shirt multi color ascot blk (boot type shoes) and was unable to desc. the other two men other than being 2 arabs, 20/25, Male.

Mr. Wood was shown a photograph of Susp. Sirhan Sirhan and we definitely could not id him as being one of the three mean at the hdqs. He was shown photos of Sirhan Adel and Sirhan Munir, he stated Sirhan Munir resembled one of the men but he could not be sure. Mr. Wood stated a Mr. William Meyers, who was working with him, also obs. the three men and could Poss I.D. them.

15 he was not working but that he had gone to the Ambassador
16 Hotel in the hopes of getting some pictures of Senator
17 Kennedy. He states he arrived at the Hotel at approximately
18 10:45 P.M. He went directly to the Press Room (Colonial Room)
19 and when the Senator arrived in the Embassy Ballroom, he went
20 in and, while the Senator was making his speech, took about
21 ten photographs. He then went into the pantry area of the
22 kitchen to wait for the Senator to pass through. It was his
23 intention to photograph the Senator as he passed by.

24 Mr. Yaro was accompanied by a Richard Drew who is a
25 reporter for the Pasadena Independent Star News. They were
26 both standing just inside the double doors of the pantry. He
had his camera up and was attempting to focus it when Dick
Drew stated, "You missed him." At this time, Mr. Yaro states
he looked and saw the Senator had passed him and he started
to follow behind approximately five or six feet. He again

1 put his camera up and at this time heard two shots. He stated
2 they sounded like firecrackers. And then three more shots.

3 At this time, he stated there were two men standing
4 next to the Senator. When the shooting started, they moved
5 off to the right. He observed the Senator take several steps
6 back and he had his hands and arms up to his head. The sus-
7 pect was lunging at the Senator and shooting. Then two male
8 Caucasians, one of whom could have been Bill Barry, pounced
9 on the suspect. The gun fell out of the suspect's hand. "I
10 grabbed it but as I did someone grabbed it out of my hand.
11 I then turned and started taking pictures of the Senator. I
12 shot about five more pictures and then left to make sure that
13 I got them to the paper in time to beat the deadline."

Officers re-interviewed Young, at her residence on the above date and time.

Officers asked Young about the alleged fight between Jamila Sellem and an unidentified Male Arabian, which took place at the Fez Restaurant in late December of 1967 or early January of 1968 (I-2649).

She told officers she was not aware of that particular fight but that there had been several arguments and fights in the Fez Restaurant while she was employed there and the police were not usually called.

Young told officers that Louis Shelby, a co-owner of the Fez Restaurant has called her since she talked to the police about the Fez. She stated he was antagonistic with her and accused her of being "a fink" for the police.

Fred Shelby, another co-owner of the Fez Restaurant has called Young and asked her to come back to work, but she told officers she is fearful of the Fez and will not return to work at that location.

Mrs. Young stated she is a cocktail waitress and part-time dancer and was formerly employed by The Fez Restaurant, 1508 North Vermont, telephone number 5-2722. The date after the Kennedy assassination she resigned her position because in her words, "I was in fear of my life after what happened the night of the assassination." Mrs. Young went on to relate that she was working in The Fez the night of the assassination.

Mike Mockmoon or Mocmun (phonetic) and a man by the name of Sam (last name known) were the bartenders on duty that night. When Mike and Sam heard of the assassination, they danced and sang; and one of them stated, "It's a great thing that Kennedy has been shot." (Sam and Mike are of Arabian descent are Lou Shelby and Fred Shelby, co-owners of The Fez.)

Mrs. Young stated she is of Jewish descent, and as long as she had worked at The Fez, which is about two and a half years, there has always been a certain amount of friction between her and the Arab employees. Mrs. Young denied that she understood Arabic or knew how to speak Arabic; and when Arabs frequented The Fez, she did not understand what they were saying and therefore had no knowledge whether politics was ever discussed in the place or not.

She stated that she knew Adel Sirhan; that she had seen him approximately five times in the past three months; and on two occasions Adel brought one of his brothers to The Fez, and she was introduced to them. However, she could

not identify photographs of Adel's brothers. She stated that she was busy waiting tables and was just a brief introduction. Mrs. Young stated that Tuesday night at The Fez is the night when all the Arabs of the community come together, sing and dance, and socialize. She denied knowing anything about the political background of any of those who frequent The Fez but did state that a Sheila Peacock, of Jewish descent and who had been associated with various Arabs for approximately five to seven years, told her, Young, on one occasion that a Mohammed, Asa or Isa, was a big shot in the Arab political underground. This Isa or Asa frequents The Fez and approximately one month ago Young observed him with Mike and Sam in close conversation, and they stayed after The Fez was closed in conference; but she denies she knew what they were conferring about.

Mrs. Young stated that she had been asked to return to work by Lou Shelby, and she thought she might return to work at The Fez on the weekend of June 15th and 16th, but she stated she had not yet decided what to do; that she would talk to her father first. Mrs. Young stated that she usually worked for The Fez on Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday nights. She liked working at The Fez because the tips were very good; however, the Arabs were poor tippers, and the American tourists tipped the best.

Mrs. Young denied that she knew Sirhan Sirhan, and to her knowledge had never met him. She stated that the only law enforcement agencies she had talked to briefly were detectives from Rampart Division. She maintained that she had never been interviewed by any member of the press, magazines, or any other periodicals.

PERSONAL OBSERVATIONS OF MRS. YOUNG

Mrs. Young is the mother of two small girls, one approximately 18 months old, the other 5. She was very cooperative and indicated that she would speak to no one regarding the case unless instructed to do so by members of L.A.P.D. She lives in an apartment that is well-furnished, probably furnished beyond her immediate income. While reporting officers were interviewing her, the phone rang several times; and from her part of the conversation, it appeared all of them were men of Arab descent. It appears that she has a wide circle of friends among male Arabs, but according to her purely social. Mrs. Young does not appear to be politically oriented and did not display any great interest in any phase of political life.

PHYLLIS HAZEL YOUNG, who resides at 14414 Addison Street, apartment 1, advised that she began working as a cocktail waitress at the Fez Restaurant on Vermont in Los Angeles, in August 1965. She advised that this was when she first met ADEL SIRHAN, the brother of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. He stated that ADEL was working at the Fez as a musician at that time.

YOUNG advised that ADEL became a good friend of hers and that he used to take her home after work quite often, out for breakfast and on other social engagements. She stated that approximately one year after having met ADEL, he introduced her to one of his brother's, who was at the Fez Restaurant, and to her recollection this brother was SIRHAN. She stated that she saw this individual about two more times, each time at the Fez Restaurant. The last time was approximately April 1968.

YOUNG advised that during the time she knew ADEL, she never had any occasion to discuss politics with him and she never heard him express any anti-American or anti-rich sentiments. She stated that she knew ADEL to be a kind, generous person and thought a great deal of him.

She said that in her few encounters with ADEL's brother, SIRHAN, her conversations were always short and very light, never discussing anything such as politics or ideologies. She stated that she never remembers his brother to display any sign of temper or violence in her presence.

She stated that she left the employ of the Fez Restaurant earlier this year inasmuch as she was of a Jewish background and she did not wish to put up with some of the comments or insults of some of the Arab patrons of the restaurant. She said that the upper floor of the Fez Restaurant was a very pro-Arab nationalist environment. On the night that Senator KENNEDY was assassinated, several of the individuals there, whom she did not know by name, indicated that they were glad that the "Jewish lover" was dead. She stated also that she sensed, among many of the Arab people at the Fez, the strong feeling of anti-Americanism.

not identify photographs of Adel's brothers. She stated that she was busy waiting tables and was just a brief introduction. Mrs. Young stated that Tuesday night at The Fez is the night when all the Arabs of the community come together, sing and dance, and socialize. She denied knowing anything about the political background of any of those who frequent The Fez but did state that a Sheila Peacock, of Jewish descent and who had been associated with various Arabs for approximately five to seven years, told her, Young, on one occasion that a Mohammed, Asa or Isa, was a big shot in the Arab political underground. She lives in an apartment that is well-furnished, probably furnished beyond her immediate income. which was somewhere around a period of about 1½ years I had many conversations with SIRHAN. We both belonged to the PASADENA CITY COLLEGE INTERNATIONAL CLUB, The club was composed of about 150 foreign students. I would say that from my own personal observations SIRHAN's best friend was another Arabic student by the name of MOHAMAD (M-Arabic-Tall-Good looking-Fair complexed).

As far as any of the teaching Staff knowing SIRHAN, I believe that there was a member of the Political Science program that I believe knew SIRHAN quite well (M-C, has only one eye-wears artificial eye and glasses). I do remember that MISS NICELY who is the head of the International Students talked with SIRHAN and so did MR. RUDE from the ENGLISH DEPT. MISS ELDER also was the Foreign students English teacher and talked with SIRHAN.

Socially I did not know SIRHAN too well. I know that he did not drink liquor and I believe that he was a MOSLEM, He never told me this, but this is what I believe. I also believe that his friend MOHAMAD was a Moslem.. SIRHAN was a heavy bettor at the race track. I know that he used to go to SANTA ANITA a lot. I myself go to Santa Anita but not as much as he did, every time that I did go, I used to see SIRHAN there. He used to make big bets 60-80 dollars on a race. One time when we were at Santa Anita a middle aged woman gave him a good tip on a horse and he gave me the tip, the horse came in and he made a lot of money on his bet.

No, SIRHAN did not have any girl friends that I know of, he was a very quiet type of man and the only time that I remember him talking to any girls was during our meetings at the International Club. I remember seeing him talking to a girl by the name of "SUZIE" and another girl by the name of "SHARON" but I don't remember their last names. But to my knowledge he didn't have an girl friends and I never saw him with a girl.

No, I truthfully can't say where SIRHAN got his money. I remember that at one time he was working in a gasoline station in Pasadena. After he left school somewhere around the middle of 1964 I believe, I think it was 1964, anyway I heard that he was working horses in Del Mar. I think that his brother the one that wears a beard and works at the FEZ as a musician got him the job in Del Mar. His brother is a much bigger bettor than SIRHAN was, and I think that he is the one that told me that SIRHAN was working in Del Mar and that he had had an accident.

When I saw SIRHAN at Santa Anita in February or January of this year I told him that I had heard about his accident, I asked him how he was feeling and he told me that everything was alright. He was real happy. He told me he felt fine but that he was suing those people and that he was going to get some money from them.

Yes, during the time that I knew SIRHAN he had two cars first he had a 1952 or 1953 black cadillac and then the last car that he had was a real big one, it was a huge reddish DeSoto but I am not sure of the year. Once or twice he drove me home when I was walking from school.

To my knowledge SIRHAN didn't return back to Jordan or anywhere that I

know of. I remember seeing him in the track in Santa Anita during 1964 and 1965.

Well Politically I know that SIRHAN was very much against the Jewish people. He hated the Jews. In fact he stated to me many times that he was for Hitler and the way that he handled the Jews. He used to say that he couldn't understand the Americans, that they let the Jews suck the blood of the nation and keep putting the money in the banks, and the Americans let them get away with it.

SIRHAN was usually very quiet, he used no profanity, except sometimes he used to swear in Arabic. Once a man spilled some coffee on his brother in a restaurant in Hollywood and SIRHAN called him a Mother Fucker in Arabic. But most of the time he was polite, helpful and quiet but he was very much Anti Jew.

No, I never myself heard SIRHAN mention KENNEDY.

Interview of Phillis Young, continued.

Beverly Corey was a dancer at the Fez approximately 2 months ago. She may use the name of Linda or Janani. She (Bev Corey) may be working at the Greek Village, unknown location.

Miss Young stated that the night of the shooting the manager (Mocmun) and the bartender (Sam) heard of the shooting they were very happy, dancing and kissing the floor.

Miss Young identified Sirhan, Bishara as frequenting the Fez along and with his brother Adel. The last time he was seen was approximately 2 month ago. She didn't know him by name.
