On May 19th Mr. Alfred Shollhamer, Steward representing the CHRB, forwarded an unsigned envelope addressed to BRENT COLCORD, Stewards Office, Hollywood Park. The message, copies of which are attached hereto, is set forth as follows:

Big mouth Bass - - - Habit 1:14
Inglewood, Calif. Ecc 9:12"

Written on front of envelope:

"Use the Jew-Roman Code book the King James Bible

On May 20th Investigator R. B. Mayhaus interviewed BRENT COLCORD concerning the anonymous message. COLCORD, after perusing the envelope, stated he thought HERLE HARTON HATTESON could have written the letter because on May 10th he had an argument with him. COLCORD said HATTESON let a hot horse drink a half-pail of water, which was contrary to the training methods practiced by COLCORD. HATTESON was terminated on May 11th and went to work for Robert Wingfield the same date.

Investigator Mayhaus interviewed HATTESON on May 20, 1968, at which time he admitted writing the unsigned message. HATTESON said he felt BRENT COLCORD was negligent in handling his horse and failed to feed his dog. HATTESON said he felt this letter was one way he could let people know how he felt about BRENT COLCORD. HATTESON said he has worked with thoroughbred horses for about three years and has been licensed in New York, Ohio, Kentucky, Illinois, and California. Subject denied writing any other anonymous letters. It was Investigator Mayhaus' opinion that subject is suffering from a mental illness of some kind.

TRFB files in Los Angeles show subject was fingerprinted at Santa Anita on March 12, 1968, with the return showing one arrest by the Reno, Nevada Police Department on April 9, 1963; charge, disorderly, \$30 or 30 days, fine paid, CII #2325510. According to CIRD records, subject is described as follows:

On May 21, 1968 Gordon Glisson, who handled the stable mail at Santa Anita, was shown the envelope from HATTESON, and was sure he recognized the handwriting and the style of writing as being identical with letters that had been posted at the stable mail room during the Santa Anita meeting. Glisson said these letters were addressed to such people as the President of the United States, Secretary of Defense, and the Roosevelt Memorial. Glisson said he mailed the letters, as they had been properly stamped and addressed. Glisson said he did not know the author of the letters.

(Anthony Sherman, Secret Service, Los Angeles)

Mr. Sherman said he would communicate with their Washington office to determine whether similar type messages had been referred there from the office of the U.S. Presidency. Mr. Sherman later called back and asked that the original of the envelope described in this report be submitted to him for examination. Mr. Sherman indicated he was checking on several communications of the same type that had been written anonymously on envelopes with red and blue ink. Mr. Sherman said when his examination was completed, he would return the original to the TRFB office in Los Angeles.

Earlier in the Hollywood Park meeting a similar type anonymous message written on a large plain white envelope was received at Hollywood Park addressed to the Stewards. This envelope was either lost or misplaced, as it is not presently available. This message contained numerous references to biblical quotations, etc.

MERLE MARION MATTESON was interviewed outside of Tack Room Number Two at Barn Number Three, Hollywood Race Track, where he lives. He advised he is a white male, born October 14, 1913, in Canada, is 5' 8" tall, weighs 140 pounds, and has balding brown graying hair and blue eyes. He advised he is a groom and a hot walker. He has a married daughter and a son serving in Vietnam. He was shown photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and stated he cannot recognize him as anyone he knew.

MATTESON continued that he had predicted President KENNEDY's assassination because President KENNEDY was once Commander of PT Boat 109 and there is a verse in the 109th Psalm which bears on this situation. MATTESON continued that there is a quote in the newspaper stories, especially editorials, which is influenced by Jews, that is a key to parts of the Bible that explained world problems.

JOHN HANSON, Special Agent in Charge, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB), 1709 West 8th Street, Los Angeles, California, advised that the records of his office reflect that FRANK DONNARUMMA had been fingerprinted by TRPB at Santa Anita Race Track in 1966 as the result of his application for track credentials. DONNARUMMA later admitted that his true name was HENRY DONALD RAMISTELLA. He was denied credentials for Santa Anita because of a former suspension by the New Jersey Racing Commission for making an unsatisfactory ride as a jockey and giving false testimony before the track Stewards.

Mr. HANSON said at the time of the application for Santa Anita credentials on January 25, 1966, RAMISTELLA indicated that he was then employed as a ranch trainer by Granda Vista Del Rio at 13200 Citrus Avenue, Corona, California, and he was described as a white male born in Bronx, New York, March 25, 1932, 5'7", 130 pounds, brown hair, blue eyes.

Mr. HANSON further stated that RAMISTELLA in former years rode as a jockey on the East Coast. On October 1, 1956, he was arrested in Elmont, New York, on a charge of possession of marijuana, and on November 20, 1956, he entered a plea of guilty to this charge and was sentenced to 60 days in the County Jail, sentence suspended. He had been previously arrested on September 3, 1956, at Jamaica, New York, for possession of marijuana, and this charge was later dismissed.

RAMISTELLA was fingerprinted at Delaware Park Race Track on June 16, 1964, as an applicant for exercise boy license.

On September 19, 1967, MARTIN CRUIKSHANK, Bank of America, telephone 683-3591, telephoned TRPB Agent R. H. WILLIAMS regarding any current information as to the whereabouts of FRANK DONNARUMMA. According to CRUIKSHANK, DONNARUMMA had purchased a 1962 Lincoln Continental, California license GHH 895, giving his address as 13200 Citrus Street, Corona, California, and financed this vehicle through the Bank of America. Mr. CRUIKSHANK indicated that the payments on this vehicle are delinquent and that the bank desired to repossess this vehicle. Mr. CRUIKSHANK said he had been in touch with the California Horse Racing Board, and they could furnish no information indicating the current whereabouts of DONNARUMMA.

STEVEN SMITH, Southern California Coordinator for the KENNEDY Campaign, made available through a clerk, LUCY SALINGER, copies of proposed itineraries to be utilized by the Senator and his party in their West Coast Campaign.

These itineraries cover the dates of March 23 through March 25, 1968, April 18 and 19, 1968, May 6, 7, 15, 16, 20, 21, 22, 24, 28, 29, 30, and 31, 1968, and June 2, 3, and 4, 1968.

SMITH advised these schedules normally would have been prepared by the "Advance Men," JERRY BRUNO or JOE DOLAN. BRUNO would have been more concerned with the travel during the latter part of May 1968, while DOLAN was more active in the earlier dates and, he believed, particularly in the Oregon travel.

SMITH stated further that these itineraries were subject to change and that more specific information should be available through the KENNEDY Headquarters in Washington, D. C., as to any alterations that may have occurred in the original schedule.


