Writer called on above date by CHARLES HENEERY, 12000 La Manda St/, Mar Vista, phone 390-3020 who stated he ~~is~~ is a member of the Volunteers for KENNEDY group.

Stated that he was aware of efforts being made by SA LES WARREN to locate one KHEIBER KHAN, an ~~Ar~~ Arab who along with a number of other middle easterners, had attempted to join the volunteers group a few weeks ago. Stated that KHAN had contacted ELLIE SEBERSEN who had in turn contacted the FBI after she determined that it was an Jordanian who is apparently the subject of this case.

Stated that he was contacted by KHAN, telephonically about 8:00 PM this date who advised that he was going out of town to San ~~Francisco~~ Francisco but would be back in a couple of days. KHAN stated he wished to have dinner with HENEERY when he returns.. HENEERY stated that this disturbs him as he is not well acquainted with KHAN and knows no reason why he should want to go to dinner with him.

Stated that should he learn any further re the whereabouts of KHAN he would contact the FBI.

Writer contacted SA WARREN who advised that he had an appointment in the AM, 6/6/68 to show photos of suspect to SEBERSEN in effort to determine whether suspect might have been a member of group that, along with KHAN, attempted to join KENNEDY group.

WARREN stated he would contact HENEERY.

C said she has been watching the television tapes of the events of that night. C said she recognized a man, she had attended school with at Whittier College last year. She said he graduated ~~xxx~~ last year and was a Jordanian. She said she could not recall his name. She said he was in the audience and was pictured on a film tape, shown on Channel 4, in front of the Ambassador Hotel, just after the ambulance had taken Senator KENNEDY away. A Channel 4 man was interviewing somebody there regarding what he had scene and this above described man was ~~standing~~ standing near by.

C said she understands this man ~~xxxxx~~ used to attends various types of political rallies and gatherings while a student at Whittier College. She said he is a little older than the normal student, looking to be about 30 years, 6'1-2", about 170 lbs., dark olive complexion, slender build, with dark "salt and pepper" hair. He has extremely black eyebrows and lashes, a thin face and nose. That night he was wearing a white shirt, short sleeve, and was smoking a cigarette.

He states from the physical description of SIRHAN SIRHAN, which he has heard on the radio, he feels that SIRHAN possibly was the individual he talked to.

RANDOLPH stated the conversation occurred in the restaurant area below the stands and both had coffee. The individual was accompanied by a young girl approximately 10 to 12 years of age and in the brief conversation, he indicated that his sister was at the track with him and was "upstairs". He further indicated that he had had two tickets on a recent daily double and won a total of \$600. // a OK Rand

Mr. RANDOLPH stated he would be able to state positively whether this was the individual if he saw a photograph of the suspect. //

He stated he wanted to furnish this information as a possible explanation for the source of the four \$100. bills in SIRHAN's possession when apprehended.

RANDOLPH concluded by stating that he had furnished this information to Chief REDDIN's office and also commented that he was a personal friend of Mayor SAM YORTY.



BURN said he was formerly a Baptist Pastor and served as Associate Pastor under Pastor CHARLES BELL, First Baptist Church of Pasadena, 75 North Morengo Avenue, Pasadena. He resided at 743 East Howard Street, Pasadena, from about 1960 - 1965, during which time he was acquainted with the SIRHAN family.

Burn stated to the best of his recollection, Mrs. AIDA SIRHAN and her children came to the United States from Jerusalem in about 1960. The father, name unknown, remained in Jerusalem as he and AIDA apparently had marital problems. BURN said the only sons he can recall were named, Sirhan SAIDALLAK, SHARIEF, and the youngest son MUHAMMAD. He said he believes there was a daughter who came to the United States with them but he is not certain of her name. It may have been MARY, however, she did not reside with the family in Pasadena.

BURN said he knew the family through his church, as the mother was a member and faithful in church attendance. He also saw them in the neighborhood as the SIRHAN family resided at 1647 North Lake and later at 696 East Howard, which was near his own residence.

They went to the front of the restaurant, saying in a rather jubilant manner, "Did you hear what happened to Kennedy, did you hear what happened to Kennedy." She said they paraded about the room, giving no sign of being the slightest bit remorseful and left, without purchasing anything. She said they entered a dark car, possibly a blue color, make unknown, that had been parked in the lot at the Union Oil Station there on the corner. She said they did not act like they knew anyone in the ~~building~~ restaurant, and C along with everyone else in the place thought it a little strange they should come in the way they did.

C described them as follows: The male, was young, about 22-23, dark brown curly bushy hair, light olive complexion, swarthy looking, with a pointed chin and nose. He was wearing a white T-shirt and green colored levy pants. She said the girl was young looking, possibly 18 years. FILIBERTO RIVERO, publisher of the semi-monthly Spanish-language newspaper, "La Prensa de Los Angeles," 822 N. Van Ness Avenue, Los Angeles, advised telephonically that he had learned from ALBERTO VELASCO, Cuban barber residing at 1409 North Edgemont St., Los Angeles, the following:

VELASCO and several other local anti-Castro Cubans, attended including JOSE ANTONIO DUARTE, their leader (who resides at Apartment 15, 6643 DeLongpre Ave., Los Angeles), attended a meeting in a private residence somewhere in the Los Feliz district of Los Angeles about five weeks ago. The meeting was sponsored by an unknown organization but apparently American pro-communist organization. It was a meeting to which the public was invited and featured an American student who allegedly had recently been to Cuba. The student explained to those present how favorable conditions are in Cuba and exhibited photographs supposedly taken there to illustrate progress there under the Castro regime. DUARTE personally confronted the student, claiming both his remarks and photographs were "phoney" and presented a false picture. This caused a young man present, believed by DUARTE and the others to closely resemble if not actually be SIRHAN, to vehemently defend the student and the Castro regime against DUARTE's statements.

DUARTE made or was to have made a full statement of the above incident to the LAPD on 6/6/68.

SUGGESTED LEADS: Verify DUARTE made statement to LAPD. If not, consider interview with him. Also consider interview with VELASCO. DUARTE speaks English fluently.

Attached is a copy of an FD 302 setting forth interview of RODERICK LYNN MAC KAY at Santa Monica, California.

On 6/6/68, RODERICK MAC KAY was interviewed by Sergeants W. J. ZANONE and L. F. GOFORTH, Intelligence Division, Los Angeles Police Department, concerning the address of 696 East Howard, Pasadena, California, which appeared on several documents in his possession. These documents related to draft counselors and anti-draft functions which were allegedly attended by MAC KAY. MAC KAY could not furnish the significance of the address of 696 East Howard and was not acquainted with SIRHAN SIRHAN, but felt that the address was furnished to him as a location where draft counseling could be obtained.

The original of these documents were obtained by Sergeant ZANONE and copies have been furnished to the FBI which are attached.

MAC KAY was subsequently interviewed by the writer and SA ORLEY A. LEESON, JR., and results of same are attached.

MAC KAY appears identical with Los Angeles File 100-59001-1191.

It is suggested MAC KAY be reinterviewed by an agent familiar with Du Bois Club and anti-draft activities in an effort to identify JOANN (LNU) or JOE HANDY.

Will also contact LA 4891-S (currently assigned to SA FRANCIS G. KAHL) concerning any information that source might have regarding the address of 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena.

At approximately 1:25 this date, the writer was telephonically contacted by Officer LLOYD HILAIEL, Santa Monica Police Department, who advised that he received information from a confidential source that a young female, approximate age 18 years, had checked into the Miramar Hotel, Santa Monica, at about 1:10 AM, 6/5/68. This individual registered in the name of MARGARET PETTE, gave residence address as Manhattan, New York. She was furnished Room 236. According to HILAIEL's information, this individual has not been out of the room since checking in. She has received room service, getting hamburgers, cheeseburgers and Coca Cola on numerous occasions. At approximately 11:30 this AM, the individual requested room service to purchase panty-hose from the hotel women's shop. The employee of the shop contacted the individual and asked concerning size, in particular the height of the woman, and was advised the hose was for a female, 5'6½" tall.

HILAIEL said that his source indicates the individual in Room 236 has paid cash to the bellboy responding to her calls and that no one in the hotel has information of a descriptive nature.

Writer anticipates contacting personnel at the hotel and, thereafter, interview occupants of Room 236 to determine identity.
