On 6/7/68, at approximately 2:00 p.m., RICHARD L. SMITH, General Sales Manager, Be-Wise Manufacturing Company, 1111 Valley Boulevard, El Monte, California, telephonically advised that he is acquainted with CIRUOS (phonetic) MAHAYAHA (phonetic) who is of Jordanian descent. SMITH stated he could not spell this individual's true name but claimed he is employed at Chandler Shoe Store on Lake Avenue in Pasadena. SMITH stated he was talking to MAHAYAHA who advised that he was at the Ambassador Hotel the night of the shooting and had observed SIRHAN SIRHAN and in fact had talked to him.

SMITH stated he was furnishing this information in the event the FBI was desirous of talking to MAHAYAHA.

Bureau Instructions
Re: Witnesses

This will record that commencing at 12:53 PM on 6/6/68, Mr. DE LOACH from the Bureau telephoned. Among other things, he gave the following instructions:

(1) All witnesses and persons with pertinent information are to be interviewed by the FBI. We are conducting a full investigation by the FBI of this murder and its many possible ramifications. The investigation should be as thorough and penetrative as humanly possible so that years from now dissident individuals or groups will not be able to adversely criticize the FBI and its investigation.

(2) We should, of course, get copies of all reports, examinations, any ballistics tests, etc., miscellaneous documents, etc., in existence and authored by any law enforcement agency, individuals, etc., that pertain to this investigation.

(3) We should "button down" any and all contacts between the subject and CROWE or others who are in the Communist Party. We previously furnished such data to the Bureau by teletype. The same is true with possible membership in the Du Bois Club. It was agreed that it might be a good idea to consider having other pertinent California offices contact their informants, review indices, etc., as to possible information linking the subject with any subversive groups or individuals.

(4) Information was received at the Bureau today on an All Points Bulletin issued by the LAPD. I had the answers to the question as we are in possession of that APB and explained that the LAPD was seeking possible information.

The question above came up as to the allegation a woman was at the Ambassador Hotel during the pertinent period who was wearing a polka dot dress. She allegedly ran from the place yelling, "We have shot him." This appeared in the local

DANIEL VICTOR GAMBERONI, 22937 Enadia Way, Canoga Park, California 91304, telephone (213) 88-70954, a student majoring in Management at Woodbury College, 1027 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California 90017, telephone (213) 482-8491, was interviewed in the office of the Dean of Men at the college. He furnished the following information:

GAMBERONI is a Swiss National and entered the United States on April 26, 1967, under a student visa. He has Alien Registration Number [REDACTED]. His godfather is Mr. ROBERT JEAN GIMDROZ, an Assistant Chef at the Ambassador Hotel (3400 Wilshire Boulevard), Los Angeles, who owns a 1959 Chrysler, two-door sedan, blue over white in color.

On Tuesday, June 4, 1968, after his last class, he proceeded from the college to the Ambassador Hotel to visit Mr. GIMDROZ. He arrived at the hotel at 2:00 p.m. At about 4:30 p.m. at the request of Mr. GIMDROZ, GAMBERONI walked from the hotel to a Chevron Service Station located on the southwest corner of West Sixth Street and Alexandria Avenue. There he obtained Mr. GIMDROZ' Chrysler sedan which he drove down to near the end of the block where he parked it, unlocked, on the west side of South Alexandria Avenue, facing south, about five or six cars north of Wilshire Boulevard, facing the Ambassador Hotel and across the street from The Brown Derby Restaurant. He then walked back to the hotel where he arrived at about 4:50 p.m. There he returned the keys to Mr. GIMDROZ. GAMBERONI remained in the hotel until about 6:20 p.m. when he walked to the Gamma Sigma Pi Fraternity house located at 726 South Harvard Boulevard. Subsequently, he did not return to the hotel.

According to GAMBERONI, he and his wife own a 1966 yellow Falcon, two-door, bearing California license FRS 654.

He recalled that he has used Mr. GIMDROZ' Chrysler on four previous occasions; the last time being about three weeks ago when the water pump in the Falcon broke. According to GAMBERONI, the ignition switch on the Chrysler is faulty in that the key will turn on the ignition when the key is not completely inserted into the ignition.

GAMBERONI was shown two photographs of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN which were taken at the Ambassador Hotel during the early hours of Wednesday, June 5, 1968. GAMBERONI stated he does not know this person and cannot ever recall seeing SIRHAN.

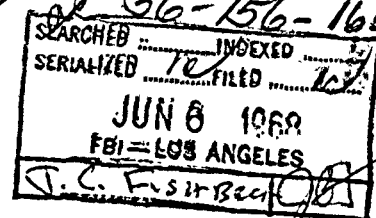

On 6/5/68, BERT ALTFILLISCH, Manager and Part Owner, Granja Vista Del Rio Farms, 131200 Citrus Avenue, Norco, California, advised from records and memory SIRHAN SIRHAN employed as exercise boy with thoroughbred race horses raised at this farm from 6/2/66 to 12/10/66. He recalls SIRHAN as being intelligent and speaking very good English with slight accent and claimed to be originally from Jordan. Stated he was very interested in politics and claimed to be political science major in college but was going to work in horseracing business until obtained additional money.

Employer had very few problems with SIRHAN but recalls he attempted to organize other exercise boys to only work certain number of hours per day and to do only exercise boy work.

He does not recall any organizations that SIRHAN belonged to or attended and recalls no mail received by him. He was laid off because of apparent dissatisfaction with job.

Employer advised that SIRHAN received injury when thrown from horse on 9/25/66. He was taken to Corona Hospital and treated by Dr. RICHARD A. NELSON.

Dr. NELSON made available his records and information regarding SIRHAN. He recalled SIRHAN as a person who appeared "as though he was afraid someone was going to do him harm and he was very nervous and apprehensive about any treatment being given to him." He would not stay in the hospital but one day although the doctor recommended four days. He returned to work and his injuries were only of a laceration type and were not serious. He later complained to Dr. NELSON of an impairment in his vision from the left eye. Dr. NELSON referred him to Dr. MILTON A. MILLER, an ophthalmologist in Corona.

Dr. MILTON A. MILLER, 824 South Main, Corona, California, advised that his office had visits from SIRHAN on 11/8/66; 11/22/66; and 12/20/66. On 12/20/66, Dr. MILLER noted on his own records that he believed SIRHAN was a "malingerer." Dr. MILLER would not expand on injuries for SIRHAN and would not write letter showing the injury to be serious. His vision was 20-20 in each eye and he could find no field of vision problems.

Dr. MILLER recalled that after SIRHAN left the office, he telephoned him on the same day and told Dr. MILLER that if he would not write the letter, "I'll get you." SIRHAN did not say how he would do this and hung up before the conversation could be continued.

Dr. MILLER said he noticed SIRHAN was a very nervous and odd acting person but he never saw him after that and thought no more of the threat. He made no report of the threat.

On 6/6/68, Mr. DEAN PACK, 1404 North Tustin Avenue, Apartment B-2, Santa Ana, California, telephone number 835-5128, furnished the following information:

On Saturday, 6/1/68, PACK and his son were hiking in the area of Rancho California, Temecula, California. This ranch is located approximately 18 miles south of Elsinore, California, on Highway 71. At this time, PACK came upon three persons who were target shooting in the ranch area.

These individuals had a .22 rifle with a scope-site and a .22 pistol with an eight to ten-inch barrel. They were driving a small sports car, smaller than a Volkswagen, dark black or blue in color, two-door, and with California License Plates. PACK did not obtain the California License Plate number.

When PACK came on these three persons, they acted very suspicious and he got the impression that he was intruding. The younger of the two men and the female appeared to be Arabs and appeared to be from that part of the world. The other man did not have the Arabic characteristics. All three of them were drinking beer and shooting at beer cans and bottles in the area.

PACK stated that when he observed the picture of SIRHAN SIRHAN in the paper, he believed that the younger individual whom he observed on 6/1/68 definitely looked like SIRHAN. Also, the physical description is approximately the same. PACK stated he would recognize these three individuals if he observed them at a later date and that he knows the exact location where these individuals were shooting.

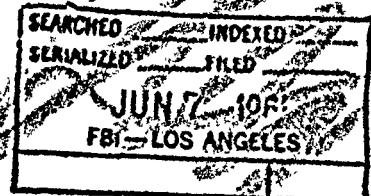

Mrs. PRESTWOOD said that Granja Vista Del Rio is owned by BURT ALTFILISH and is located in Norco, California.

Mrs. PRESTWOOD said that she took her thoroughbred horse, Jet Spec, to Granja Vista Del Rio for training and SIRHAN exercised the horse. Mrs. PRESTWOOD said that she went to Granja Vista Del Rio about twice a week to check on her horse and she would talk with SIRHAN each time. She said that SIRHAN was always courteous and polite and appeared not to be excitable. She said that her conversations with SIRHAN were confined to her horse or horse racing in general. She said that SIRHAN never spoke of his political views, friends or associates. She said that SIRHAN had mentioned that he resided in Pasadena, California with his mother.

Mrs. PRESTWOOD said that she had never seen or visited with any of the subject's family. She said that Mr. PRESTWOOD had less contact with SIRHAN than she did and would not be able to furnish any additional information regarding SIRHAN.

On 6/6/68, Lieutenant R. A. SLAGHT, Pomona, California, Police Department, made available a copy of a police report dated 6/6/68.

This report states that a GILBERT RICHARD LE BEAU, 1712 East Princeton Street, Ontario, California, telephone number 986-2822, was contacted at 7:10 p.m. by Detective STAUDERMAYER at Robbie's restaurant, 390 Pomona Mall East, where he is employed as a bartender.

LE BEAU reported that after observing photographs in the newspaper of SIRHAN SIRHAN, he recognized this person to be the same as a man who had been present in the restaurant during the period that Senator KENNEDY had given a luncheon speech in recent weeks. The report indicated that this person and a female companion had attempted to get into the area in the restaurant where the luncheon was held but had been stopped by him, LE BEAU. LE BEAU reported that the woman indicated that she and the man were with the Senator's party. They were not allowed in as they did not have tickets for the affair.

LE BEAU reported he recalled seeing these two a second time in the luncheon room while Senator KENNEDY was making a speech. He indicated that the man had at that time carried a coat draped over his right forearm.

LE BEAU indicated that he was positive that the man referred to in the above incident is the same as the person pictured on the front page of the local newspapers.

The above information was relayed to Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office Intelligence Unit, 6/6/68 by *Pomona PD*

AT 10:10am, 6/5/68, Mrs. FRANCHELLE ASHBY, 4420 San Andreas Ave., Los Angeles, 65, Calif., advised that some time ago when MARK LANE appeared as a guest on JOEL SPIVAK's program on radio station KLEC, Los Angeles, she called in and asked LANE why Bob & Edward Kennedy did not back up JIM GARRISON in his inquiry-- she asked if this would be because they would then be taking their lives in their hands. He answered by saying, "There are guns between Robert Kennedy and the White House". He stopped after making this comment, and went on to another line of conversation. It is the opinion of Mrs. ASHBY that MARK LANE may have known someone was out to kill BOB KENNEDY. She felt it might be worthwhile to try to obtain the tape of above program for the exact comments.
