On 6/6/68, PCI ALLEN MICHAEL FITZGERALD, a reliable source, furnished the following information to writer:

He was employed at the Green Hotel, 50 East Green Street, Pasadena, California, from approximately May 1967, to the first part of January 1968. The owners at this time were SELMA YOUNIS, her husband JOSEPH GEORGE, and YOUNIS son, FREMIPAULOS. YOUNIS gave her husband half interest in the hotel, but when her son and her husband could not get along, she bought back the half interest from the husband for \$46,000. These individuals no longer own this hotel.

YOUNIS is a white, female, age approximately 68 years old, who lives in Beverly Hills, extremely wealthy. Her business address is 1533 South Hoover, phone DU 3-2891. The son is a white, male, age approximately 40, who also lives in Beverly Hills on the corner of Camden and Carmelita, exact location unknown. JOSEPH GEORGE is not his true name but has an Italian sounding last name but was born in Jerusalem. He is described as a white, male, age approximately 38, 5'10", weight 200 pounds. Although GEORGE is YOUNIS' husband and claims to reside with her, he very seldom can be reached at home. GEORGE attempts to be a "fence" and has approached informant on several occasions if he has any "gems" to sell.

While working at the Green Hotel, GEORGE made it known in uncertain terms that he is pro-Arab and anti-Jewish.

Informant recalls numerous meetings at the Hotel of persons who appeared to be of Arab extraction with GEORGE. These individuals would meet at the hotel and then go up to a room. Some of these meetings were in the afternoon, possibly between noon and 6:00 p.m., but for the most part between 6:00 p.m., and 9:00 p.m.

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Informant described GEORGE as a "violently fanatic pro-Arab." In fact, if anyone would come out in the paper expressing their views for pro-Israel, he indicated that they should be shot. Informant recalls quite specifically that the individual who murdered Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY attended these meetings on numerous occasions. Informant was never in attendance at these meetings but saw them before they went up to the meetings. Informant recalled that these meetings were being held two or three times a week between May 1967, and to the first part of January 1968. Informant does not recall any names of any of the individuals who attended these meetings.

Informant stated that the son has talked to the informant regarding conversations between him and his step-father. To informant's knowledge, the son and the mother are not fully implicated or have any feelings such as GEORGE does. Informant recalls that GEORGE has talked about getting guns, swords, etc.

At 1:20 p.m., 6/5/68, Mrs. CHARLES WEINER, 1482 Shennandoah, Los Angeles, California, telephone 657-3569, telephonically advised the Los Angeles Office as follows:

While observing television on the morning of 6/5/68 concerning captioned matter, a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN was shown with a commentary that the motivation of SIRHAN in shooting Senator KENNEDY was unknown. Further that investigation to determine a motive was being conducted.

Mrs. WEINER stated that in conversation with her husband, CHARLES, they concluded from observing SIRHAN's photograph that he appeared to be of Arabic origin. They concluded that a possible motive for shooting Senator KENNEDY could be the cause of Senator KENNEDY's apparent endorsement of the Jewish people and the country of Israel.

Mrs. WEINER stated that the reason she was furnishing this information is that she wanted to "go on record as having proposed this as a possible motive for the shooting."



Mrs. BISHOPP advised that she had been watching television of 6/5/68, and saw the televised talk of the late Sen. ROBERT KENNEDY. On the screen she observed a female, dressed in a light dress, pass in front of the chairs on which persons present in the room were sitting. Mrs. BISHOPP felt the woman might be the one being sought as having a possible kix connection with this case (the woman in the polka-dot dress). Mrs. BISHOPP said she could not recall whether the woman was wearing a polkadot dress, but suggested that film of above be reviewed and persons in audience be interviewed for any information they might have concerning the above-described female.

The following is submitted for your information.

On 6/5/68 at approximately 1:30 p.m. the writer contacted <u>District Director GEORGE C. ROSENBERG. INS.</u> to determine the availability of their files on the SIRHAN family. Mr. ROSENBERG advised that all information in his possession concerning the SIRHAN family was available to the FBI to the point of removing the files from INS custody and taking them to the Bureau office.

Mr. ROSENBERG stated that there was one problem in connection with the Bureau having access to the files at the moment. He said the Attorney General's office had requested that a summary on the SIRHAN family was to be prepared by INS and Mr. ROSENBERG's orders were to prepare the summaries and dispatch them to Washington in the custody of a commercial airline pilot.

In further conversation with Mr. ROSENBERG and in conveying to him the urgent need for the files by this Bureau. he made the file available on each member of the family as he completed dictation and arranged for the use of INS personnel and equipment to duplicate the file for FBI use.

In view of the demand placed on Mr. ROSENBERG, the above arrangement appeared to be the most reasonable and expeditious for the benefit of this Bureau.

At approximately 4:00 p.m. Mr. ROSENBERG advised that he had received a phone call from the Commissioner's office, INS, Washington, D.C., advising him that that office had received a complaint from this Bureau to the effect that the Los Angeles office of INS was not cooperating. The writer explained to Mr. ROSENBERG that the statement apparently was not founded on fact in view of the arrangements which had been worked out.

Mr. ROSENBERG stated that having as many years of Government service as he has, that he can readily understand how misunderstandings may happen. He appeared to hold no animosity and took the entire matter as normal operating difficulties.

It is noted that as the files were made available and duplicated, information was hand carried to the FBI office during the afternoon from approximately 2:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m., when the last and largest file concerning MUNIR SIRHAN had been duplicated.

It is also to be noted that after the suspect in the KENSALT case was identified, it took some time for INS to locate the files and deliver them to Mr. ROSENBERG's office since several of the files were in the storage center in San Pedro.

In your conversation with Mr. ROSENBERG in the future, you may wish to make reference to this affair and indicate to him our appreciation for his cooperation under the circumstances.

HARRIET GOLDSTEIN, Age 19, 1917 South Corning Street, Los Angeles, was interviewed in the presence of her parents, SAUL and EDITH COLDSTEIN by SA's MORRISON and ROBERT E. SAGE. She advised that about 3:30 p.M., 6/6/68, her mo ther was driving through the alley located at the rear of the Daylite Market, 1830 South La Cienega Blvd., when her mother observed a green May Co. shopping bag lying in the middle of the alley. Upon checking the bag, her mother observed it contained a woman's polka dot dress along with miscellaneous items of women's undergarments and cosmetics. Mrs. GOLDSTEIN took the bag and contents home which she described as follows:

one polka dot dress, white dots with dark grey background, low waistline, sleeveless with pleated front sash, size estimated les des ques as 9-11

one pair of black patent shoes

one black slip

one brassiere, padded, size 34

girdle with nylon stockings attached

cosmetics including lipstick, eyebrow pencil, bobby pins

The above items were in new or almost new condition and contained no indication of owner ship. HARRIET was aware of the publicity being given the unknown lady in the polka dot dress and after getting no response from the LAPD, notified the LA District Attorney's Office. Between 5:30 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., two detectives from the IAPD, names unrecalled, stopped by and picked up the above items. The detectives stated they were working out of the office of the Chief of Police.

BURN said it was, therefore, SIRHAN SIRHAN that he had several discussions with regarding God, but SIRHAN SIRHAN held firm to his belief as an atheist.
