INFORMATION: (WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY & HOW)

Mr. Aubry works part-time for the Negro Press Bureau. He had been assigned to cover the Kennedy Campaign since the Oregon Primary, approx. 3 weeks prior.

On the 4th of June he arrived at the Hotel during the early afternoon. Spent most of the evening wondering about the Hotel gathering information. As Senator Kennedy began his speech, Mr. Aubry "floated to the back of the crowd."

He accounts for his time as follows:

After I walked across the back of the room, I walked forward to the Anteroom, right of the stage. I went into the Anteroom, paused for about 20 seconds. Then I noticed Sen. Kennedy coming off of the side of the stage. I walked ahead into the kitchen to stay ahead of the crowd.

As I walked toward the press room, I noticed a man kneeing on the metal table. He was getting down as I pasted him. I bumped his knee.

Described as Male Cauc 25/26 Short Wearing dark sport coat. I walked a few feet further then heard one shot, a pause, then five rapid shots. Two girls in Kennedy dresses brushed by me from between the tables. I turned and saw Senator Kennedy falling down. I stood there for about 30 seconds. I saw Rosie Grier come up with Rafer Johnson and grab the suspect. When they grabbed him, I turned and went into the Colonial Room. I yelled for someonel to help--"We need a doctor and a priest." I spun around and went back into the kitchen. I went to the area of the scuffling. Rosie had the suspect by the neck. I yelled at him to let up a little--"Take it easy." I went around the table and saw Booker (Booker Griffin) trying to hit the suspect. I yelled at him; telling him not to do that. There was lots of yelling. I went over by Kennedy and knelt beside him. Barry grabbed me by the neck and threw me back. I moved over by the Employment Eating Area (indicated on mock-up) for 2 or 3 minutes. (Con't)

I saw the police arrive and take the suspect out chrough the kitchen (indicated the same direction as Kennedy was removed).

When I first saw the struggle, I saw a guy name George striking at the suspect. He works for a Culver City outfit. I'll get his name for you.

My photographer shot pictures; about 15 or 20 minutes after the shooting. He was not in the kitchen when the struggle was going on.

His name is Cliff Hall

I think Booker was in the Ballroom when the shots were fired.

Officers interviewed the above person on the above date & time & ;at the above location. Badran stated that he has known Sirhan for 22 years. He met Sirhan in 1965 at an Arabian festival in Glendale. Sirhan was only an acquaintance, not a friend. Badran stated he never saw him in 1967. In '68 saw him in several Coffee Shops. Had coffee with him.

Two months ago Sirhan started coming to PCC Library to read. He saw Sirhan there a couple of times. Had no lengthy conversations.

Badran is a member of Internil Club, & he never saw Sirhan at any functions as Sirhan was not a student & ; he couldn't participate.

On 6/4/68 Badran was studying at Campus Center with Abdo Malki & Anwar Sayegh. This was approximately 5:15 p.m. At approximately 6:45 P.M. Badran, Malki, Sayegh went to cafe for coffee. Just a few minutes after they sat down, Sirhan & an Indian named Mistri came to the table & said "Hello". Then a girl by the name of Nora came up & asked him to help her carry some paintings to a class (art-C-Building). Badran did &: then on his way back to the Library he saw Sirhan & Mistri leaving. He said "Good Night"/ & that was the last time he saw Sirhan. This was approximately 7:05 p.m.

In the $2\frac{1}{2}$ years that Badran knew Sirhan, he felt Sirhan was a quiet person. He never mentioned politics or religion. On one occasion he mentioned he stated he was unhappy about the outcome of the war. On the 4th of June 1968 Sirhan seemed hormal. Badran noticed nothing different in his actions although he only saw Sirhan for about 2 minutes.

When Badran left the cafe, all of the other persons mentioned were still there.

A check with CII and LAPD Intel. Div showed no rec. or file on this person.

This is information is ated to Captain Hugh I Brom from Bill Curtin over the telephone on June 27, 1968 at 4 P.M.:

They told us that the U.S. Consulate General in Jornalez had vica applicant records on three of these individuals. The three of them are the two brothers and MALKI. I will give you the information on each one of those three.

The first one is BADRAN MAROUF and they have the same date of birth that you gave me. Address of POB 123, Jorusalca, black heir, brown eyes, height 177 cm. - I den't know what that breaks down to. We applied for a student vica on January 14, 1953 to study at Pasadena City College. He never did complete processing at Arman for the visa. He stated that his uncle, and he didn't give the name of the uncle, would help to support him. He said his uncle was moving permanently to Beirut, Lebanan. The card his noted that the brother's vica, that would probably be GHALEB, had been extended in the United States from February 15, 1963 to January 31, 1964. There was also a notation on the card that an inquiry had been received from the U.S. Consul in Valencia, Spain, on the subject on MAROUF, indicating that as of August 9, 1963, MAROUF was studying there. Have you seen Kennedy before. A. Yes, several times. How long has Kennedy been staying in the hotel and/or where is he staying. Witness did not recall the answer to this question. Witness recalled a fireman entering the room and the suspect engaging him in conversation, as to what he was and what he did. Witness felt the suspect was not aware that the fireman was a fireman. Witness recalled no conversation with the suspect during the fireman's absence, as he was working. Also, he recalled no conversation between the suspect and the fireman when he returned. I was assigned to cover the election returns for Kennedy at the Ambassador Hotel. I arrived at the hotel at 10 PM and went immediately to the 5th floor, Kennedy's suite of rooms. I stayed there and took some pictures until the Senator was ready to go down stairs and make his speech. When Kennedy left his room and took the elevator down stairs, I ran down the tairs hoping to take his picture as he came off the elevator. He apparently took a different elevator so I went to the main entrance of the Ballroom hoping to catch him when he made his entrance. But instead of coming through the main doors, he entered by an entrance next to the podium. I forced my way up on the stage directly behing the Senator and his wife, Ethel. The crowd kept serging forward and I kept bumping Mrs. Kennedy with my cameras. Rosie Grier finally put his arm around my waist to hold me back.

After the speech, I followed the Senator off the stage and out the rear door. As he started down the corridor toward the kitchen area, I was directly behind him and not more than a couple of feet. We entered the kitchen area, and I was still right behind him. All of a sudden I heard 3 shots in rapid succession. I ducked for the floor. About this time, the guy next to me went down; he was shot (Paul Schrade). I ducked around a partition in the room and when the shooting stopped, I got up and started to take pictures. I ran over and jumped on the table where they were struggling with the suspect. I kept taking pictures until someone shoved me off the table. I think it might have been Jesse Unruh who pushed me off. 

Arrived at Hotel 6 PM. Took photos for Fire Prevention Bureau of any fire safety regulation violations. In the employee's eating area, seated at a table (n/w corner), at the time of shooting. Looking out at crowd, but did not see Senator. Saw about three flashes and heard 6 or 8 pops. Not positive about seeing susp. Crowd starts moving back, then surges in. Walked to opening into pantry area, couldn't see Senator. Had awareness of people trying to subdue someone. Went back to table and got camera (strobe light takes 10-15 seconds to charge before picture could be taken). Took five photos from different positions and angles. Camera knocked from hand, caught it but accidently put safety on. Wasn't aware safety was on so no more photos taken, also people were shouting "No more photos" and shoving photographers around. Put camera Then assisted with crowd control.

Testified at Grand Jury. Stated he saw Sirhan with poster following Kennedy in. Shown pictures from LIFE of Michael Wayne. Stated he now thinks that was the person, rather than Sirhan.
