

On 12/4/63, a meeting of the CITIZERS CO MIT HE TO TRADE VE LEGICAN TREFLOMS was ald at Baces Hall, 1528 N. Vermont Ave., L.A. The CCPAF is a cited Communist-front organization. License numbers of persons attending the meeting were taken and one of those license numbers was California License JYT-419, issued to a 1961 Volkswagen sedon, registered owner ADEL B. SIRHAN, 696 E. Howard, Pasadena.

On 1/16/66, the W.E.B.DuBois Clubs of Los Ingeles, again a cited Communist-front organization, held a meeting open to the public at Baces Hall, 1528 N. Vermont Ave., L.A. License numbers were taken of persons entering the meeting and one of those license numbers was California license JYT-419, issued to a 1961 VW seden, registered to ADEL B. SINGER, 696 B. Howard, Pasadena.

It has been determined from Pasadema P.D. that ADEL D. SIRHAN of 696 h. Howard, Pasadena, currently in custody of Pasadena P.D., is the older brother of suspect, SIRHAN BISH D. It is believed that the 1961 PW, California license JYT-419, referred to soove, as having attended meetings of left-wing organizations, was driven by someone other than DEL D. SIRHAN because Lt. Wright of Pasadena P.D. Intelligence indicates that ADEL is "too square" to have attended Communistic meetings. The identity of the occupants of the V. cannot be established; however, it is known that they attended these meetings, and it is presumed that SIRH N BISHANN SIRHAN was driving this vehicle.

His family, composed of seven persons, entered the United States at New York City on 1/12/57. At that time, he was 13 years old and was shown to have date of birth of 3/19/44. He was born in Jerusalem, Jordan.

Subject's father is DISHARA SIRHAN. There is a relative of an unknown relationship named SHARIF SIRHAN living in New York.

Subject's brother, ADEL, was supposedly arrested for attempted murder, which was later reduced to "molesting an auto." The location of arrest - jurisdiction and date are unknown.

Re Memo of ASAC RICHARD D& ROGGE dated 6/5/68, concerning statements by WILLIAM WMEELER. Los Angeles Representative, HCUA, who stated that an unidentified member of the LAPD had advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN was connected with the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs.

On 6/5/68, the writer contacted Sgt. STANLEY SMITH, Anti-Subversive Detail, Los Angeles PD, who advised that he was the member of the LAPD who had furnished information to WHEELER concerning SIRHAN SIRHAN. SMITH stated that he had furnished the following information to WHEELER:

On 12/4/63, a vehicle bearing California license JYT 417, a 1961 Volkswagen, registered to ADEL B. STRHAN. 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California, was observed in the vicinity of Baces Hall, Sunset and Vermont, Los Angeles, where a meeting sponsored by the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms was being held.

On 1/16/66, the above vehicle was also observed in the vicinity of Baces Hall, where a meeting sponsored by the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs was being held.

Sgt. SMITH advised that contact had been made with the Pasadena PD and that the Pasadena PD advised they had had dealings with ADEL SIRHAN and that they believed he was "too square" to have attended these meetings. The identity of the occupant or occupants of the vehicle on the above dates has not been established, however, the LAPD has speculated that it was possibly SIRHAN SIRHAN driving the vehicle on these dates.

Sgt. SMITH stated he furnished no further INFORMATEVINUSTIGATION to WILLIAM WHEELER and made no definite statement to him that SIRHAN was connected with the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs.

LA 4688-S, who was chairman of the Los Angeles Du Bois Clubs before it was dissolved in 1967, advised that he had no knowledge of SIRHAN SIRHAN being a member of the Du Bois Clubs.

It is to be noted that in the past, informant has furnished complete membership records of the Los Angeles Du Bois Clubs.

taken in the robbery. The victim advised the two reporters that he did not wish to have his photograph taken or to give them a photograph. The two reporters left without any incident.

The victim added that at approximately 11:30PM he heard someone kicking on his front door. He answered the door and just as unlocked the screen door suspect #1 kicked the door open, hit the victim on the cheek with his fist and then stated, "Damn-it, we're going to kill all you Arabs." The suspect then went into the livingroom. The victim sat down on the sofa and told the suspect to calm down. The suspect #1 then stated, "If you don't give your photograph to Life we're going to take it from you." At this point suspect #1 took the photograph from a small table which was in front of the sofa. Suspect #1 then exited the apartment by the front door. Suspect #2 did not enter the apartment and the victim could only see the reflection of light off his glasses. The victim did not see or hereany vehicle.

The victim added that he could identify suspect #1.

A duplicate of the photograph taken by the suspects was Xeroxed and released to Inv. HOULIHAN and SHAW.

The victim had the impression that suspect #1 at one time wore glasses due to the marks by his nose and under the eyes.

THE VICTIMS APARTMENT! ISASETMATED OVER A GARAGE AT THE WESTERN MOST PORTION OF A COURT TYPE PREMISE AND IS ONE OF TWO ON THE UPPER SECTION OF THE STRUCTURE. APARTMENT #6 IS ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE GARAGE AND THE VICTIMS APARTMENT IS ON THE NORTH PORTION. TO REACH THE VICTIMS RESIDENCE, IT IS NECESSARY TO ASCEND A STAIR CASE ALONG THE NORTH WALL OF THE GARAGE. THERE WAS NO EVIDENCE FORCED ENTRY INTO THE APARTMENT, THUS IT APPEARS AS THOUGH THE SUSPECTS KNOCKED ON THE DOOR AND WHEN THE WICTIM OPENED THE DOOR, THEY FORCED THEIR WAY INTO THE INTERIOR. EVIDENTLY ONLY ONE SUSPECT ACTUALLY MADE ENTRY INTO THE APARTMENT WHILE THE SECOND REMAINED OUTSIDE.

INSIDE THE MAIN DOOR OF THE APARTMENT ARE TWO SCREEN DOORS WHICH CLOSE TOGETHER IN A DOUBLE DOOR TYPE ARRANGEMENT AND ARE SECURED FROM THE INSIDE BY A SLIDING BOLT TYPE LOCK.

IT APPEARS AS THOUGH IT IS POSSIBLE TO FORCE BOTH DOORS INWARD FROM THE EXTERIOR, SUFFICIENT TO CAUSE THE BOLT TO BE SEPARATED FROM THE UNIT INTO WHICH IT SLIDES.

THE LOSS WAS REMOVED FROM A COFFEE TABLE ON THE LIVINGROOM WHICH WAS SITUATED IN FRONT OF A COUCH ALONG THE EAST WALL. THE ABOVE PRINT WAS TAKEN FROM THE EXTERIOR SIDE OF THE INNER SCREEN DOOR.

At about 10:15 AM on 6/5/68 Detective Lieutenant GERAID WELEHT Pasadena Police Department, advised me that the brother of the man who shot HOBERT F. KENNEDY was being interviewed in the Pasadena Police Department by Los Angeles Police Department detectives. He identified the subject to me as SIRHAN SIKHAN and his brother as ADEL STAHAN. me to immediately obtain background data on the subject and his family. Further, he instructed that I stay with ADEL SIRHAN, a ccompany him whereever he was taken by the Los Angeles Police Department and immediately call the Los Angeles Office with any pertinent information obtained.

Det. Lt. GERALD WRIGHT introduced me to Detective Sgt. WILLIAM RANDI, Rampart Division, Los Angeles Police Department and I informed BRANDT of my interest. BRANDT stated that he had already informed ADEL SIRHAN of his rights, that they were nearly through interviewing him and that they planned to take him to the Ramparts Division, Los Angeles Police Department. He then invited me into the interview room.

I introduced myself to ADEL SIRHAN, advised him of my official capacity and informed him that I was interested in obtaining some information concerning the subject and his family. I did not advise him of his rights - I was not interviewing him regarding the case but merely for general bakkground information.

As soon as ADEL SIRHAN furnished the information he could make available from his recollection I immediately telephoned this information in to SA IA RUE. Thereafter I reentered the interview room, being absent for not more than five minutes and was informed by BRANDT that arrangements had been made to go the SIRHAN residence before going to the Rampart Detective Division.

I accompanied BRANDT, his partner, JIM FVANS, Central Homicide, Los Angeles Police Department and ADEL SIRHAN in the LAPD car dpon arrival at the SIRHAN residence, 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, the entire block was observed to be crowded with vehicles, perhaps twenty or more reporters were on the front lawn, neighbors and many curious people were gathered around, television cameras were being **Assume** used in interviewing anybody who wanted to be interviewed. I observed unidentified newmen examining trash in the trash cans. SIRHAN and the two detectives immediately entreed the residence of SIRHAN and I went around the back with other LAPD detectives to see if anything had been taken by newsmen from the trash cans. Whe ther anything was taken prior to my arrival there I do not know but the LAPD detectives quickly sorted out the trash. While they were engaged I was able to obtain entrance to the residence to

Detective BRANDT informed me that a search was under way in SIRHAN SIRHAN's room, located in the southeast corner of this one story forms BRANDT and his partner were quickly checking through notes, notebooks and papers in SIRHAN's room, pointing out to me three pertinent items found in two notebooks and on the front of one envelope - these items being described may via telephone to SA LA RUE when we arrived at the Ramparts Division. It should be noted that it was not pessible to telephone out of the SIRHAN home, the line was being kept open, according to BRANDT, by news sources. I did not participate in the search.

About noon we left the SIRHAN residence and via police car went

directly to the Rampart Division. Charles

After my phone call to the office, which was made as soon as I arrived at the Ramparta Divisionk I have instructed to obtain any pertinent data obtained from the police interview of ADEL SIRHAN. However, Lt. HUGHES, in charge, was on the telephone perhaps for ten minutes and when I was able to get in the room to monitor the interview being held in another part of the building the interview was pearly ending. In the office of Lt. HUGHES, where the interview was monitored, I found Mayor YORTY already there. I observed him examining the note books and documents obtained by Detective BRANDT and his partner at the SIRHAN residence.

I then requested Lt. HUGHES to make available a copy of the transcribed interview the department had with SIRHAN(Adel).

I was next instructed by SA CHESTER ST. VINCENT to obtain the originals of pertientpapers and photostatic copies of the balance of SIRHAN SIRHAN's papers as the Bureau had requested them.

Lt. HUGHES had LEE SMITH, LAPD, examined each page first; the reafter

they were inventoried and turned over to the FBI.

While in the Ramparts Division, BRANDT asked me if I was present when ADEL SIRHAN was warned of his rights at the Pasadena Police Department. I reminded BRANDT that at the time I was introduced to him and had stated my purpose for being there he told me that he had already advised ADEL SIRHAN of his rights.

BRANDT next asked me if I had been with him when arrangements were made with ADEL SIRHAN to visit the SIRHAN residence and I told him that I was not present then, that this probably occurred during my first telephone call to the Los Angeles Office because only upon my return to the interview did I them learn that arrangements had been made to go with ADEL SIRHAN to the SIRHAN residence.

It should be made noted that when BRANDT told me originally that arrangements had been made to go that to the SIRHAN residence he did not indicate to me what the arrangements consisted of. Since I never saw what papers or documents BRANDT had in his possession and in view of the questions he asked of me I must assume that only oral arrangements were made.

It should be noted that I did not participate in the search and noted only that pertinent information which had already been gathered

by BRANDT or his partner.

It should also be noted that I was instructed at the outset to stay close to ADEL SIRHAN and to report immediately any pertinent information obtained - and this was done.

Dr. KASPWR FUCHS Staff Neurosurgeon, Kaiser Foundation, 4867 Sunset Boulevard, telephonically advised SA A: JOE HOWNING, JR. that he was the attending physician of PAUL H. SCHRADE. Dr. FUCHS stated SCHRADE sustained a gunshot wound which struck him in approximately the middle of the forehead at the hairline. At impact the bullet left an indentation between the size of a nickle and a quarter. The bullet's impact caused bone fragments from the skull to lacerate the covering of the brain. The bullet which entered the skull exited about 3½" from the point of impact at the top of the skull in approximately the center. SCHRADE was also treated for a concussion which was caused by the bullet's impact.

Dr. FUCHS stated his patient remained in the Intensive Care Unit, but he would state his condition as satisfactory. He stated that SCHRADE was uncomfortable at the present time and he felt it would be approximately two days before he was physically able to engage in an interview.

BURKE indicated that BOUKAKIN implied that he knew something of the assassins background and activities.

BOUKAKIN is a student at Cal-Poly, Pomona, and is presently taking final examinations to be completed 6/6/68. BOUKAKIN is employed as a head waiter at the Sez restaurant, 1508 North Vermont, Los Angeles, and is due to return to work Friday night, 6/7/68.

Captain BURKE advised that he relayed the above information to Captain COLWELL, Los Angeles Police Department Intelligence Unit at 12:30 p.m., 6/5/68, and was told the information would be followed up.

He stated that if an indictment was immediately forthcoming, there would be no preliminary hearing for the subject.

Sergeant JORDAN stated he did not recall the exact date of preliminary hearing set by Judge KLEIN but that the law requires that the suspect must be afforded a preliminary hearing within ten (10) days after arraignment.

SIRHAN said he was from Pasadena and that he was her boy friend. She advised SIRHAN appeared surprised when she ran into SIRHAN in the waiting room, but later said that he had come to give her a ride home. She saw him meet SHAHLA one other time.

SHAHLA supposedly resides at 655 D, South Indian Hill Boulevard, Claremont, California, telephone 624-6959. She is 19 years old, very small, wears about size eight clothes, hair is cut short, and is an attractive girl.

DAISY advised that she was calling from Parkview Hospital, number 688-2211, and after viewing the scheduling for working on the weekend, advised that SHAHLA was not due in Riverside until Sunday. At the time of the receipt of the above information, Riverside City College was closed.

On 6/7/68, Mr. DALLAS VALLO FRANKE, GS-12, Electronics Engineer at Point Mugu, who resides at 501 Deodar Street; Oxnard (date of birth, 4/14/22) came into Mr. MISNER's Office and advised him of the following:

Mr. FRANKE has been employed with the United States since 1/1/68 and formerly was an employee at Hughes Aircraft, El Segundo, California, except for a period of time in 1965 when he was on leave of absence due to health reasons when he was confined at Wadsworth Veterans Administration Hospital, Los Angeles. At that point, Mr. FRANKE began rambling and became disoriented in his conversation and talked of being harassed for the past ten years by members of a "syndicate".

In his conversation, he mentioned having been visited at the Wadsworth Hospital by a girl friend, JEAN DENYEER, who displayed a newspaper clipping concerning a Mr. WIEDNER (phonetic) dated December, 1966. This clipping Indicated Mr. WEEDNER operated a health food store in Pasadena. California, and Miss DENYEER told him she worked at the store.

Mr. FRANKE advised that he further believed Miss DENYEER worked for the "syndicate" and was also in conspiracy with his doctor and lawyer. He advised that when he observed the television coverage of the ROBERT KENNEDY shooting, he realized that JEAN DENYEER might possibly be identical with the unknown woman wearing a polka dot dress, who is being sought in connection with this crime.

According to Mr. MISNER, no additional information or details could be furnished by Mr. FRANKE to link Miss DENYEER with captioned matter and, in view of Mr. FRANKE's position and access to classified information, the United States Navy intends to afford Mr. FRANKE a complete physical and provided the EBI.

She has never met SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and knows nothing about his background, associates or activities. During April 1968, she and her husband, EDWARD M. KRISS, were in the cocktail lounge known as "Harper's Corner" in the Hilton Inn Hotel, Dallas, Texas. Their waiter was named "MOE" and in conversation with him he stated that he was a "Persian" and that he had a cousin also known as "MOE." who resides in Pasadena, California. The cousin was a waiter at a hotel believed by this individual to be the Ambassador Hotel. The man then wrote the name of his cousin, SIRHAN SIRHAN, of the Pasadena address, however, Mrs. KRISS was unable to find this piece of paper. She stated that she took the name and address in the event she was in the Ambassador Hotel at any time she would look up this individual. She was never in the Ambassador, however, and therefore had no contact with SIRHAN SIRHAN.

Mrs. KRISS advised to the best of her recollection the waiter "MOE" in Dallas told them that he was attending Southern Methodist University in that city.

In this regard, she desires to furnish the following information:

Residingd some the second floor of the same duplex in which she is living is a GERARD GRAU, a white male, age about 17, born in Algeria of French parents, a school dropout, and, according to his father, previously involved in narcotics use in Quebec, Canada. GERARD GRAU periodically resides with his parents at this address. A school dropout, he apparently only comes home when he desires. Several months ago, his mother, JEANNIE GRAU, Requested that Mrs. MARCOTTE copy down the license of any automobiles which brought GERARD GRAU home.

In early April 1968, complaintant observed GRAU had in his possession an old model car of some sort, pink in color.

GRAU told her that the car belonged to a girl-friend of his who lived in Alhambra.

Complaintant stated that, on 4/17/68, GRAU made a collect call on her telephone to a Sierra Madre number of 355-3633.

Complaintant stated that she had no information to tie in wither the KENNEDY assassination other than the pink car episode described above.

He pointed out that the person he had talked with was much smaller than SIRHAN appears to be and had light brown straight hair, thinning on top. He said this person was either Cuban or Mexican and spoke with some type of accent.

on6/7/68, an attempt was made to contact GAYOMARD MEHERGI MISTRY at his residence at 825 E. Del Mar, Pasadena, California, however he was not at home. One Mrs. GUETT, tenant at this address, stated MISTRY was presently unemployed, and had left with a friend to look for work. She did not know when he would return. She furnished the telephone number at this residence as 796-7449, and suggested he be called before further trips were made to contact him. She believed he might go to the races on Saturday afternoon. Mrs. GUETT was aware MISTRY had called the police to tell them he was acquainted with SIRHAN, and stated she believed MISTRY was very honest and cooperative.

At 6:15 PM, a call was made to the above telephone number, however MISTRY was not in. Mrs. GUETT stated he was not expected until late in the evening. She agreed to try to obtain the telephone number of a close friend of MISTRY's, JOHN _____, to ask himtto call the writer, and to give her his itinerary for Saturday, as someone would attempt to content him.

At 12:07 PM, 6/5/68, a female voice telephonically advised an SA in Los Angeles, "This is San Francisco, I want to tell you about the KENNEDY shooting." At first she refused to identify herself, but later when assured her identity would be kept confidential, stated she is Mrs. GERALDINE MC GRATY. 1082 Langton Street, San Francisco, California ZIF Code 94103, phone number (Area Code 415) 626-4445.

She then went on in a rambling way, to say that President JOHNSON, when Vice President, stated he wanted to be President; and later President JOHN F. KENNEDY was killed. She then pointed out that JOHNSON gave up the Presidential candidacy because he "knew" ROBERT KENNEDY would win. Then she asserted that "money was paid," and added knowingly, "If you ask the two brothers you may find out who paid the money." She went on briefly, in a somewhat irrational manner, implying that President JOHNSON was behind the attempted assassination, so that he could re-enter the Presidential race.

When asked why she phoned Los Angeles, instead of calling the FBI in her home town, she stated she has been in touch with that office on numerous occasions and offered to solve numerous cases, but that her assistance was not accepted. She was advised that her identity would be kept in confidence, and that her call would be made a matter of record.

ANNA B. WILLIAMS, WF of White Plains, Charles County, Maryland upon hearing early broadcast 6/5/68 of caption made report to sheriff's office, Charles County, Maryland of a remark made to her, and her 19 year old daughter 5/16/68 by one STUART JOHNSON, an attorney in Washington, D. C. that "If BOBBY KENNEDY wins the nomination he will be killed before November."

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter, FRANCES D. WILLIAMS - 19, interviewed 6/5/68 by way of background related as follows:

Both Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter have been extremely interested in current political campaign, both are strong supporters of Senator EUGENE MC CARTHY.

In May, 1968 Mrs. WILLIAMS went to Charleston, West Virginia to help campaign for MC CARTHY in the 5/14/68 Primary. About 2 A.M. of 5/10/68 she was at the MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters and took a phone call from a STUART JOHNSON, whom she did not know. JOHNSON sounded as though he was intoxicated and commented that he had been fired by the National Headquarters for MC CARTHY in Washington, D.C. Mrs. WILLIAMS then ascertained from a worker at the MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters that STUART JOHNSON had been sent out by the National

MC CARTHY Campaign Committee in Washington, D. C. to prepare ground work for the MC CARTHY Campaign in West Virginia.

Mrs. WILLIAMS returned to her home on or about May 16, 1968. She had a feeling there was some unexplained friction in the MC CARTHY Campaign, so she called Attorney JOHNSON for an appointment in order to discuss this matter. An appointment was made for 3:00 P.M. 5/16/68 in Attorney STUART JOHNSON's office, 910 17th Street N.W., Washington, D. C.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter met with Attorney JOHNSON in his private office. They discussed for about one half hour the political campaign in general. JOHNSON acknowledged he had been discharged from the MC CARTHY National Campaign Committee in Washington due to a personality conflict, but that he was still for MC CARTHY, and was now working with another pro- MC CARTHY group (not further identified) in Washington, D.C., and that he was going to California 5/21/68 to campaign for MC CARTHY.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter stated that during the meeting with Attorney JOHNSON, the latter did not discuss Senator ROBERT KENNEDY personally nor did he make any derogatory remarks about the Senator. However, Attorney JOHNSON did say there was a lot of hatred for KENNEDY throughout the nation, and stated If BOBBY KENNEDY wins the nomination he will be killed before November.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter stated that Attorney JOHNSON did not elaborate on the statement, but made it sound as though it was a matter of fact and a foregone conclusion that KENNEDY would be killed.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that following the conference in Attorney JOHNSON's office, the latter escorted Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter to MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters in Washington where he introduced them to a number of party workers.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that she can furnish no additional information and can not explain the specific significance behind JOHNSON's statement.

Mrs. WILLIAMS and daughter described STUART JOHNSON as a white male, age about 45, 5'11" - 6'0", slender build, graying hair, wore reading glasses.

As there does not appear to be any connection with captioned matter, this is submitted for information of Bureau, Los Angeles and WFO.

Re Memo by SA WILLIAM D. COSTIGAN dated 6/7/68.

The writer and SA JOHN E. BEAMER contacted hotel manager CHARLES SMITH. Miramar Hotel, Santa Monica, California, and reviewed a registration card of one Miss MARGARET FETTE who registered for room 236 on 6/5/68, indicating she would depart on 6/9/68. The card contained the residence address as being Manhattan, New York. Mr. SMITH said the only other information he had concerning this individual was her room assignment 236 and a telephone call placed by her earlier today to local number 451-5911 (determined to be Ios Angeles County local number Santa Monica area in County building).

Mr. AARON HULTMAN, Bell Captain, advised that the individual presently occupying room 236 checked in on 6/5/68 between 4:00 and 6:00 P.M. He stated he could not furnish more information regarding this individual other than this person was a female who has utilized room service on several occasions and he himself had picked up a black haired womans wig and had delivered it to the hotel beauty parlor. HULTMAN said there has been nothing particularly unusual about the activities of this person other than they whave not been observed by other hotel employees. HULTMAN inquired among his bell men, showever, was unable to obtain additional information.

Mrs. CHARLOTTE LAPPIER, Housekeeper, checked her records and advised that room 236, according to her schedule would have been vacated this date. She inquired of a maid responsible for the hall and determined that the "room should be vacant". Mrs. LAPPIER proceeded to the room, 236, unlocked door at which time it appeared

the room was still occupied in that pieces of luggage, various items of personal apparel as well as two female wigs were readily observed. Mrs. [APPIER examined a ticket type lable attached to one of the pieces of luggage upon which the name of "Miss PETROUCHKOWICH" appeared. Mrs. LAPPIER also checked the closet and advised it contained a plain white dress, a short vest type sweater, a pair of female type light tan dentmapants. Mrs. LAPPIER after closing the door made additional inquiries of her maid personnel and was advised that the room in question had been occupied on at least one night by two females, one of which departed earlier this date.

In view of the above information, there is no indication or nothing to substanciate or associate this situation with the KENNEDY assassination.

YVONNE ECHEGARRUA, secretary for the Grancolombiana Shipping Company, Incl., 729 Whitney Building, advised that her maiden name was YVONNE MUNOZ. She stated that her home address is 231 36th Street and her home telephone number is 482-7732.

ECHEGARRUA advised that she graduated from Fortier High School in 1964 and that she was a classmate of Mrs. MICHAEL STONE. She advised that during this period of time she was residing with her uncle, PEDRO TRUJILLO at 605 Josephine Street. She advised that Mrs. STONE was a casual acquaintance of her's and they were not close friends. She stated she is a displaced Cuban and entered this country in 1961 and established residence in New Orleans in 1963. She stated that because of her recent arrival in New Orleans she did not have many friends while going to high school during the 1963-64 school year. She advised Mrs. STONE is a member of the Mormon Faith and asked her to come to the Mormon Church on several occasions merely to meet people her own age. She stated she went to the Mormon Church on several occasions but when she was approached to join this faith she did not go back and added that any visits made by Mrs. STONE to her residence during the 1963-64 school year would have been made concerning the Mormon Church. She stated she cannot recall more than two or three visits by Mrs. STONE to her residence.

The description furnished by Mrs. STONE was read to ECHEGARRUA and afterwards she advised that this description does not fit any individual that she currently knows or would have known in 1963-64.

She advised that when she was going to Fortier High School she was engaged to her present husband, VINCENTE ECHEGARRUA and he spent a great deal of time at her residence. She advised that he is a displaced Cuban and at that time his family was still in Cuba and therefore he spent most of his time at her apartment.

Mrs. MICHAEL STONE, Apartment 503, 6440 South Claiborne Avenue, advised that after viewing the photograph of the individual suspected to have shot Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY she believed that she may have met this individual once or twice and thought the face of the man was associated with a former classmate of her's by the name of YVONNE MUNOZ. She advised that she saw this photograph on television and her identification is based on a very quick glance at this photograph.

Mrs. STONE advised that she was a classmate of MUNOZ at Fortier High School and they both graduated from this high school in 1964.

Mrs. STONE advised that she felt she saw this individual at the residence of MUNOZ during the 1963-64 school year as she and MUNOZ were students in a Spanish class during that year.

Mrs. STONE advised she could not be sure if the photograph of the assailant is the same man she met in 1964 and further advised she may be wrong in her association of this man with MUNOZ. She advised she only saw the photograph once when it was exhibited on television and she viewed this photograph for a very short period of time.

She described the individual whom she saw at the apartment of MUNOZ as a Cuban male approximately 19 to 20 years of age, 5'8" tall, very thin build, dark wiry hair and blue eyes. She further stated that this individual stuck in her mind due to the fact that she thought it was extremely unusual for a Cuban to have blue eyes.
