At 2:55 PM, 6/7/68, Mr. CARL GREENBERG, Political Editor, Los Angeles Times, telephone 625-2345, telephonically contacted the writer and furnished the following information:

GREENBERG made reference to the 6/7/68 issue of the Los Angeles Herald-Examiner wherein it is indicated one W. J. WOOD, a reported KENNEDY campaign worker, alleged seeing three swarthy men speaking in Arabic at KENNEDY headquarters. Mr. GREENBERG stated that should our investigation develop evidence that there was a conspiracy in the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, he desired this office to be in possession of the following information:

GREENBERG stated as Political Editor he receives a lot of "junk" mail and for the past several years about once a month he receives a one-page mimeographed letter which contains normally pro-Arab propagands. The letter is normally anti-Semitic and anti-KENNEDY and anti-Establishment. It allegedly is prepared by T. J. JEFF TOMA, a dentist who has an office at 510l East Florence in Bell, California, telephone 589-1236. This individual is listed in the telephone book as having a residence at 7929 East Irwingrove Drive, Downey, telephone 869-1731.

GREENBERG stressed that while he has no specific evidence that this individual had any part in the assassination of Senator KENNEDY, he nevertheless felt that based on the material he produces, he would be capable of participating in a conspiracy.

ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, JUNE 5, 1968

On June 5, 1968, Investigator Edwin Chauvin, Jr., Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), New Orleans, Louisiana, furnished to the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) a communication entitled "Biblegram (telegram) to McArthy" which was received by the New Orleans INS Office on June 4, 1968. The communication bears the typewritten name "Merle M. Matteson." No envelope was used in mailing the communication. The communication was folded and the address of "Departement of Imigration, New Orleans, Louisiana" was written on the reverse side. The communication bears the postmark of Los Angeles, California, PM, May 31, 1968.

Investigator Chauvin advised that his office has no record of a Merle M. Matteson, and he said he does not know why the communication was sent to the New Orleans INS Office.

The above-mentioned communication is as follows:

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside; your agency.

ACCUSED KENNEDY SLAYER INDICTED AND ARRAIGNED

Following an indictment handed down by the Los Angeles County Grand Jury during the afternoon of Friday, June 7, 1968, Judge Arthur L. Alarcon of Department 100 of the Superior Court of the County of Los Angeles presided at the arraignment of Sirhan B. Sirhan, accused slayer of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

In keeping with the continued intense security measures enacted by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department at the personal direction of Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess, Judge Alarcon presiding at a special session of Department 100, held in temporary court facilities provided by the Sheriff, held the arraignment at the Los Angeles County Men's Central Jail.

Sirhan, represented by Deputy Public Defender Wilbur Littlefield, was held to answer on one count of murder and five counts of assault with intent to commit murder. resulting from the events which occurred at the Ambassador Hotel during the early morning hours of June 5, 1968.

Present at the arraignment as an official observer, at the request of Judge Alarcon was A. L. Wirin, a representative of the American Civil Liberties Union.

Further court proceedings were continued until a later date.

In connection with obtaining information concerning the LAPD receiving the first knowledge of the shooting of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY, SA CARL R. SCHLATTER contacted the Central Communications Division, of the LAPD in Parker Center. Through the cooperation of Lt. JESSE PISTOLE, Assistant to Commander of the Division it was ascertained Captain through LEE R. ERICKSON who handles all tapes re incoming and outgoing calls on radio and telephone, that at 12:17 \frac{1}{2} AM, 6/5/68, a female who identified herself as the Ambassador Hotel (switch) Board Night Supervisor advised the PD about the shooting and requested an ambulance. Rampart Division Unit 2A68, which was answering a call about an illegally parked vehicle was already at the Ambassador and at 12:20 AM was assigned this urgent call, code 3 (immediate handling with red light and siren). At 12:21 AM, Unit 2A68 reported the shooting and requested an ambulance and assistance. Also at 12:21 AM, Rampart Division Unit 2A51 which had been investigating another matter at the Ambassador, also reported a shooting at 3400 Wilshire, the address of the Ambassador Hotel.

She was hostess on 5/29/68 at the Riverside Auditorium when Senator KENNEDY apoke in Riverisde, She said some time before the Senator appeared four young ment approached her and aksed if there was going to be free food after the Senator spoke. She said there would be hone and they left. A while later, two of them came back and asked for the whereabouts of the other two. Mrs. BERMUDZES told them the friends had left, although she had not seen them and only said it to get rid of them. She said another worker, a lady from San Bernardino, whose name she does not know, remarked that they acted suspactious.

Mrs. BERMUDZES continued that after she saw the TV picture of SIHRAN she though he looked familiar and wondered if he could have been one of the four men that night. She was aksed if she could definitely say one was and stated that she could not say, only that he looked familiar.

She described the four men as all about the same, white, 21 to 25 years, about the same haight, one about 5'5", all between 135-140 pounds, abbe was dressed in blue jeans but cannot recall the others.

She said she just wanted to report this since the photo of Sihran looked familar but cannot really associate him with the group described above.

This will record that at 3:15 PM on 6/7/68, SAC GRAPP spoke to Sheriff PETER J. PITCHESS. I inquired about the availability of a jail log as well as a medical report.

DATE: 6/7/68

Sheriff PITCHESS stated that the jail log, which is of an administrative nature, reflected the subject had no visitors at any time except A.L. WEREN, ACLU attorney. Mr. WERIN visited the subject on three occasions. His purpose was to insure the defendant had legal counsel. WERIN reportedly stated he would not be the defense attorney. The subject has had an attorney appointed for him, Mr. WILBUR LITTLEFIELD, the Deputy Public Defender of Los Angeles County, who has not visited the subject as yet. Sheriff PITCHESS stated that previously another attorney had contemplated taking the case, Public Defender RICHARD S. BUCKLEY. Sheriff PITCHESS stated BUCKLEY has never talked to the defendant in jail. As of this time, no attorney has talked to the subject.

The log will also show that on this date Deputy Attorney General WARREN CHRISTOPHER; Departmental Attorney WILLIAM LYNCH, and USA MATT BYRNE approached the area of the cell and looked over the facilities. They did not talk to the defendant.

According to Sheriff PITCHESS, the medical report reflects only the following information that is pertinent:

Upon receipt at the jail, a blood sampling was taken of the defendant, and he was given six x-rays. The x-rays reflect one broken finger which was put in a splint. In addition, the defendant had a left sprained ankle upon receipt at this facility, which has been bandaged. This medical attention was given by the medical director of the Los Angeles County Jail and his staff. Such needs were administered at the jail.

At 9:30 this morning, a meeting was held in the office of United States Attorney W. MATTHEW BYRNE, Jr., at Mr. BYRNE's request. Present were Assistant Attorney General WARREN CHRISTOPHER, Departmental Attorney WILLIAM LYNCH, myself, and Supervisors NOLAN and ST. VINCENT. The meeting lasted until 10:20 AM.

CHRISTOPHER stated he had read the 39 page communication submitted by this office on June 5 and a four page communication furnished him yesterday. The following topics were discussed:

The shooting of Senator KENNEDY, the evidence, the autopsy report, the subject's background and character, the background of the family, the other victims assaulted at the time of the shooting, the current incarceration of the subject, the pros and cons of a proposed interview of the subject by FBI agents, and the indications of a conspiracy on the part of the subject with others, and the lack thereof.

CHRISTOPHER stated he had read in our communication that one of our security informants indicated subject had supported some Communist Party ideals. He also stated that he is aware from newscasts that Mayor VRTY has indicated some possible connection with the Dr. Bois Clubs of America. CHRISTOPHER stated he was concerned that if information developed by our investigation indicated a possible subversive tie-in and was furnished to the Police Department or the District Attorney, it could well be transmitted to Mayor YORTY and thus become the subject of further press releases. He added this, of course, could well expose the FBI's source of information.

At the conclusion of the conference, CHRISTOPHER indicated he was most pleased with the briefing and he was

Mrs. OTTO also furnished following additional information to DE LOSH:

She said that SENATOR FULBRIGHT will be the next victim of an assassination attempt. DE LOSK is unaware of the basis for her statement in that regard. However, he said that Mrs. OTTO told Dr. ROBERT NARA, a dentist, on 5/31/68, that SENATOR ROBERT KENNEDY would be killed. On the night of the assassination she was watching TV, and when her husband told her that she should go to bed she said she wanted to continue to watch, ask she felt that KENNEDY was going to be killed. Mrs. OTTO has furnished information to FULLBRIGHT's office concerning her "prophecy" of his having been slated for assassination.

Mrs. DE LOSH said that JACK RUBY's brother comes to Houghton, Michigan every 6 weeks, in connection with some business in which he is engaged. (Significance of above not known by DE LOSH).

DE LOSH indicated to Mrs. OTTO that the F.B.I. might wish to talk with her, and she said she was frightened. She said that if she is contacted that she does not want the local Police Department notified that she is being contacted, or notified of above information.

DE LOSH said Mrs. OTTO is a highly intelligent person of Armenian background, and that he did not regard her as being mentally disturbed.





Where do you get your wisdom? from tobbaco packages -- Alcoholic Catholic liquor or bar girls. While the help is underpaid, the girls get the gravey. A few wisely placed \$\$ to the help would bring the better grooms and more winning horses. GOD say ye strain at a gust and swallow a Camel (Matt 23:2k). The Soul of Al Jolson is in the goat."
