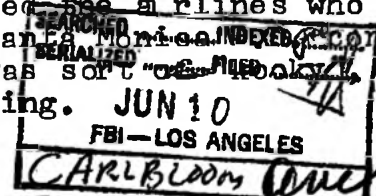

At about 9:50 PM, Sgt. HENRY CULLUM, Rampart Div., LAPD, received a telephone call from the Santa Monica P.D. advising that they had received information from one VERONICA DEEMS that one TAMARA COROVICH, a passenger on Flight 4, American Airlines, destined for New York, had some connection with the Kennedy Assassination or with SIRHAN. According to the SMPD, an attempt had been made to verify COROVICH's flight, and it was learned that she was not on the flight. However, they advised that she had been paged at the Kennedy Airport in New York, and had answered the page, and was to be interviewed by the FBI or the PD.

At 9:55 PM writer received a telephone call from Det. EDWIN WOODSON, Port Authority Police, Kennedy Airport, New York City, tel.: 656-4444, to the effect that he and his partner, Det. HARRY BRADY, had interviewed one JAFFER AHMED AL ZAKI, 1850 Taft Ave., Hollywood, Calif., an incoming passenger on Flight 4, American Airlines. ZAKI had Calif. Driver's license # [REDACTED], which described him as a male, born 10/2/36, black hair, brown eyes, 5'6"; 131 lbs, previous license expired 1965. He had an identification card from the Arabian Oil Co., in the name J. A. ZAKI, followed by the number 4010. The remainder of the card was printed in another language, believed to be Arabic. He said he was destined to the Great Northern Hotel, 118 - 57th St., New York City, where he would remain for 2 days, after which he would proceed to Saudi Arabia, where he is employed by the Arabian Oil Co. ZAKI denied any personal knowledge concerning the Kennedy assassination or of SIRHAN. Det. WOODSON said he knew of no connection between ZAKI and SIRHAN or the killing of Kennedy.

VERONICA DEEMS, 852 B, 10th St., Santa Monica, Calif., tel.: 395-9439, was interviewed on evening of 6/9/68, (at 13940 Tahiti Way, #217, Marina Del Rey) by Officers R. Phillips & W. Rathburn, LAPD, because of call from Santa Monica P.D. (see para. 1, above). DEEMS advised officers that her very close friend (PETER KALVADA) has been acting very "nervous and weird" since the Kennedy shooting. She found a note in PETER's pocket with the following message, "TAMARA COROVICH, Sunday 4:30 AAL" DEEMS was suspicious that this had something to do with the Kennedy shooting so she contacted the airlines who in turn contacted Santa Monica P.D. Sgt. TREVIS, Santa Monica P.D., contacted LAPD. Officers advised writer that DEEMS was not a Muslim, and could show no connection with Kennedy shooting.

At 10:52pm, 6/9/68, Supervisor BERNARD FITZGERALD, New York Office advised that their office had received information from the New York City Port Authority Police ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ ~~XXXXXX~~ that one TAMARA COROVICH or TMARA CARABICH who was to arrive at Kennedy Airport in New York shortly after midnight aboard American Airlines Flight 4, allegedly had some information regarding the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He advised that this individual had been paged and there was no one aboard this flight by that name. He further stated that a person named ZAKI, who was apparently an innocent party, was interviewed and considerable background had been obtained.

Supervisor FITZGERALD stated that this information reportedly originated from American Airlines in Santa Monica, California, or from the Santa Monica Police Department.

FITZGERALD stated that the foregoing information would be confirmed by teletype.

It is noted that SA RICHARD CROMWELL had called earlier indicating that a call had been received at the Rampart Division of the LAPD from the New York Port Authority Police regarding TAMARA COROVICH, pertaining to the above matter. CROMWELL said the person who furnished this information to the Santa Monica PD was one VERONICA DEEMS and that Rampart Division Detectives were going to interview her.

Re memo of SA ROBERT J. LADD dated 6/6/68.

Mrs. ~~SAMUEL~~ (DOROTHY) HUTTON, Manager, Park Plaza Apartments, 1014 West Huntington Drive, Apartment 1, Arcadia, California, furnished the following information:

Between 6:30 and 7:30 P.M. on Tuesday evening, 6/4/68, she was in her apartment which is located at the north end of a two store modern apartment building on the south side of Huntington Drive. She observed three men walking by her apartment in an easterly direction and, as she was about to go to the door of her apartment located on the east side of the building, two of the men approached the door.

The shortest of the men inquired about an unfurnished apartment and she stated that she could furnish them a key to Apartment No. 5 which was currently unoccupied and which was located on the second floor of her building directly over her apartment. This individual took the key and approximately ten minutes later returned with it. She described him as being a male Caucasian, early 20s, 5'3" to 5'5", 125-130 pounds, curly black hair, slight foreign accent, round face, sloppily dressed, wearing a Navy-type pea jacket and light colored trousers.

Mrs. HUTTON was shown three photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN and she advised that, based on these photographs, she did not feel that the individual who came to her apartment and SIRHAN SIRHAN were identical. She stated the grayish complexion of the individual who she saw personally and his round face were distinctly dissimilar to the complexion and face of SIRHAN SIRHAN.

Mrs. HUTTON advised that her neighbor, Mrs. LOMEDA ELLIS was also visited by these three individuals.

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Mrs. LOMEDA ELLIS, Manager of the Ranch House Apartments, 1008 West Huntington Drive, Arcadia, phone 445-4977, advised as follows:

At approximately 7:00 P.M. on 6/4/68, three dark-skinned male Caucasians appeared outside of her apartment on foot. She observed them from her kitchen window and they looked as though they were about to approach her apartment in order to inquire about a vacant apartment. Two of them remained outside approximately 20 feet from her vantagepoint while the third and smallest of the three proceeded toward her apartment door, which is located in an alcove on the west side of her apartment building. This individual did not knock on the door but apparently turned around and together with the other two individuals left the area walking toward the east in a normal pace. Also with her in the apartment at the time was a tenant, Mrs. BETTY BROWN, BETTY BROWN's 15-year-old son, JAY BROWN, and her (ELLIS's) 17-year-old daughter, CAROLE, and 10-year-old son, ROBERT. She advised that she thinks that each of the individuals present in her apartment saw the three dark-skinned males.

She described the shortest of the three as being a male, 24 or 25 years old, 5'7", 140 pounds, black curly hair, gray complexion, and dressed in bright colored clothing.

Mrs. ELLIS was shown three photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN and she advised that, in her opinion, SIRHAN SIRHAN is not identical to the shortest of the three individuals who appeared at her apartment although he resembled him somewhat. She also stated that the other two males appeared to be approximately 28 years of age, 5'8" - 5'9", and were distinctly dissimilar to SIRHAN SIRHAN.

Mrs. BETTY BROWN, Apartment 1, 1008 Huntington Drive, and JAY BROWN, age 15, same address, were also interviewed and they supplied essentially the same information as related above. They were shown photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN and they advised that, in their opinions, he was not identical to any of the individuals who appeared at the apartment of Mrs. ELLIS at approximately 7:00 P.M., 6/4/68.

CAROLE ELLIS and ROBERT ELLIS, same address as Mrs. LOMEDA ELLIS above, were interviewed and they supplied information essentially the same as their mother. They were likewise shown photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN and they also advised that he was not identical to the individual who appeared at their mother's apartment at approximately 7:00 P.M., 6/4/68. They also stated that the other two individuals whom they saw were likewise not identical to SIRHAN SIRHAN.

Dear Sir:

This will confirm a telephone call from Special Agent Gilbert G. Benjamin of this office with Special Agent Robert M. Barker of your office at 3:25 p.m., June 10, 1968 relating to Arlington Robert Scott.

Information received today from the Central Intelligence Agency reflects that over this past weekend they received a telephone call from Arlington Robert Scott, 2919 Bedford Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (Pittsburgh telephone number 683-8063), in which he requested "assistance and equipment" from the Central Intelligence Agency. He stated he needed this help in order to travel to California to see that Senator Robert F. Kennedy's assailant was properly punished. He further stated that since Senator Kennedy was the only friend of the Negro, he wanted to make sure Sirhan Sirhan would receive proper punishment.

No further identifying information regarding Scott is available at this time. The Los Angeles Police Department and Los Angeles Sheriff's Office have been advised of the above information.

(Ser. 21).

On 6/7/68, LOUISE HALLECK, 22368 Pacific Coast Highway, Malibu, California, advised she is employed at this address as a housekeeper by Mrs. GRACE GARLAND and is currently living in the GARLAND residence.

She stated that during the evening of 6/3/68, at approximately 10:00 PM, the doorbell rang, and she called through the door, asking for the identity of the caller. A male voice replied, "It's the telephone repair man," and Mrs. HALLECK, because of the late hour, said, "Are you kidding?" The male voice then replied, "No, I am not," and Mrs. HALLECK left the door, called Mrs. GARLAND who was upstairs in the residence, and told Mrs. GARLAND to look out the window to see if she could observe who was at the door. Mrs. GARLAND was unable to see any person, and Mrs. HALLECK stated that at no time did she open the door or the window in the door and, therefore, did not see the person who was outside.

Mrs. HALLECK stated that she learned the following day that the KENNEDY family was staying at the residence next door to Mrs. GARLAND's home and for this reason feels that this matter could possibly have some connection with this case. She further stated that the Malibu Substation of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office was notified regarding this matter during the evening of 6/3/68, primarily because of the high incidence of burglaries and robberies in the area.

Various notes, books, writings, and papers were obtained from the room of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, 696 East Howard, Pasadena, California, by the LAPD on 6/5/68. These items were forwarded to FBI Laboratory for examination. The Lab is continuing to examine these items; however, the Lab advised that in one of the submitted notebooks captioned, "Pasadena City College," there is contained in that notebook the following information of value:

One of the pages consists of an undated letter written in Arabic apparently to his mother, in which he sends her \$10 to buy postage stamps for letters she will write to him and mainly for the envelopes and newspapers or magazines of the Rosicrucians and packages. He says he is waiting for the check from the U. S. Treasury. He states he has written his address on the envelope and she is to use it only to mail the letters and that she is not to reveal to anyone his whereabouts.

A second ~~page~~ contains Arabic words "~~Hotel~~ 1879" with the name "~~ROGERS~~" written in English after this notation.

The June 6, 1968 issue of 'The New York Times' reflects the following:

John M. Lawrence, chairman of what he called 'a pro-Arab radical left action group,' 'Federated Americans against Israeli Racism,' 57 West 10th Street, said his organization would offer financial support to Sirhan Sirhan.

'We're for him, although we wish he hadn't used the assassination technique,' Mr. Lawrence, a law researcher, said.

'He declared that 'there are no tears in us for Robert Kennedy,' whom he called 'the advocate of sending American jet bombers to Israel so Jews may kill more Arabs.'

On June 6, 1968, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that John Lawrence who was associated with the Federated Americans Against Israeli Racism, 57 West 10th Street, New York, New York, furnished to the Tass News Agency, the official organ of the Soviet Government, the following statement:

'Robert Kennedy, the advocate of sending American jet bombers to Israel, so Jews may kill more Arabs, is now the victim of American bullets, pumped into him by a Palestinian Arab exile. His children have come home to roost. History always has a logic of revenge. The Jewish war on Palestinian Arabs here and more will necessarily be brought to the streets of America, to torture those who, in cynical politics, support it. We in FAIR support Mr. Sirhan for using assassination methods, but we do not support checks on him.'

Re serial 69, FD71, reflecting information received from LES HORVATH, 9176 La Barca, Fountain Valley, California concerning alleged statements he heard at the Five Points Shopping Center Hardware Store, Huntington Beach, Calif.

A memo and three FD 302's re the above were dictated on June 7, 1968. In essence JAMESE. JAYCOCKS, an employee of the above store admitted he made statements concerning SENATOR KENNEDY but he denied knowing anything about the assassination of Senator Kennedy, stated he did not know anyone who was going to kill Senator Kennedy, and said the statements he made were as the result of information he heard from an unknown customer of the store. This customer stated he had been at the VA Hospital, location unknown but probably Long Beach, California, and he said that the patients there were angry at Senator Kennedy for his Vietnamese War statements. This man did not say that anyone at the hospital would kill Senator Kennedy, but he said that some of the patients said that if Kennedy were President, someone ought to shoot him.

JAMES E. JAYCOCKS has been described by his employer, WENDELL T. PIERSON, as a "big mouth" when it came to discussing politics. He stated that he talks politics constantly and that he keeps him only because of the lack of suitable employees. Mr. PIERSON never heard JAYCOCKS make any statements similar to the above.

Mr. HORVATH, the man who made the original complaint, stated he thinks JAYCOCKS was "just talking", and that he has a "big mouth" and talks too much.

It is noted JAMES E. JAYCOCKS has no criminal record at Huntington Beach, California PD or the Orange County Sheriff's Office, Santa Ana, California, but the indices of the Los Angeles Office reflect a possible 42 case re JAMES EUGENE JAYCOCKS, 42-10327, an old case. JAYCOCKS is WMA, date of birth 11/24/26, residence 7602 Taylor, Huntington Beach, Calif.

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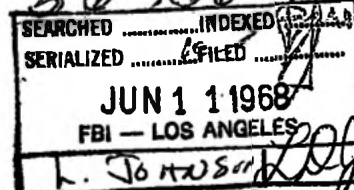

Mr. JAMES ALLEN HENDERSON, Apt. 8, 5242 Cahuenga Boulevard, North Hollywood, telephone number 762-1300, was interviewed on the evening of 6/10/68.

Mr. HENDERSON advised that he was previously employed by the Sawyer Business Schools in North Hollywood and downtown Los Angeles from May 1964 until January, 1967, at which time he suffered a nervous breakdown and had to spend five days in Los Angeles County General Hospital. He stated that from 10/64 to 8/66 he served as the Registrar for the Sawyer Business Schools in the downtown office, 747 South Hill Street. He states that in searching his memory, he feels that he has interviewed SIRHAN SIRHAN regarding a course in data processing. He said that he cannot be sure if SIRHAN ever enrolled in the SAWYER Business School or not.

Mr. HENDERSON advised that he is currently employed at the Programming and Systems Institute of Los Angeles, 12224 Victory Blvd, North Hollywood, as Director of Field Counseling. He expressed a desire his name not be mentioned if the FBI desires to contact the Registrar at Sawyer. He was assured that his name would remain confidential and that a discreet inquiry would be made at the school to ascertain if SIRHAN SIRHAN ever did apply as a student.

Will ascertain from the Registrar at the Sawyer School of Business, 747 South Hill Street, if SIRHAN SIRHAN was ever enrolled or made application for any type of training offered by that school.

A telephone call was received 7:11 p.m. 6/8/68, from SA WILEY DAVEY of the San Francisco Office, who advised that the San Francisco Division received a teletype lead set out for them to obtain original check from the Argonaut Insurance Company, Menlo Park, California, which was the payment in settlement for a claim for injuries received by SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

DAVEY advised that the San Francisco Division had been unable to locate anyone at the Argonaut Insurance Company and inasmuch as the lead instructed that Argonaut be contacted immediately, he wanted to know if it would be permissible to wait until Monday morning in order to obtain the check and forward same to the FBI Laboratory.

DAVEY was advised that as all their efforts had been unsuccessful in order to attempt to locate someone at Argonaut to obtain the check, they should obtain the check early Monday morning and forward it to the Laboratory.

SUBJECT: KENSALT

On 6/11/68, STEVE SMITH, Southern California Kennedy Campaign Coordinator, was interviewed at Kennedy Headquarters, 5615 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles. Mr. SMITH was advised that the FBI was attempting to determine the itineraries of Senator KENNEDY and his campaign party in Oregon and California during May and June, 1968. He was also advised that the Bureau was attempting to identify members of the official KENNEDY traveling party.

Mr. SMITH, through a clerk, LUCY SALINGER, made available copies of itineraries in their files; however, Mr. SMITH commented that they could have been subject to change.

Mr. SMITH stated that JOE DOLAN and JERRY BRUNO were both "advance men" for the Senator and would have been in charge of all scheduling. He further advised that one DICK TUCK, FRED DUTTON and BILL BARRY would have been with the Senator in most of his travels and should have most specific knowledge as to itineraries and also would be able to identify the official members of the party. Mr. SMITH indicated that he approximated that the party would approximate 100 individuals, 12 to 15 of them being staff members and the balance members of the press. Mr. SMITH said that the whereabouts of these individuals could be ascertained through KENNEDY Headquarters in Washington, D. C. and contact with them should be arranged through that office.

SMITH stated that BRUNO normally associated with the Syracuse Office but he believed he was still in Washington. Mr. SMITH stated that FRANK MANKIEWICZ, PIERRE SALINGER and JESSE UNROH would have traveled very limitedly. STEVE SMITH, the brother-in-law of the late Senator, did not travel at all according to Coordinator SMITH and like MANKIEWICZ, spent most of his time at KENNEDY Headquarters on Wilshire Boulevard.

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STEVE SMITH, the interviewee, not Senator KENNEDY's brother-in-law, advised that he was in the Ambassador Hotel the night of the assassination but was located on another floor at the time of the shooting and could furnish no information concerning it. He did recall, however, that two or three weeks ago, exact date unknown, at approximately midnight, he had received a telephone call from an individual identifying himself as an FBI agent to the effect that some liquor store owner, either in Balboa or Newport Beach area of Orange County, had overheard a customer, not identified, say something to the effect that the Senator should be assassinated. SMITH could not recall the names of any of the parties involved nor did he recall the identity of the agent; however, he did advise that the following day, he had called the FBI Office in Los Angeles to verify that there was an agent by the name used in the telephone call the previous night and told someone, possibly Advance Man JOE DOLAN, about it but did nothing further.

Dear Mr. Davis:

I had a telephone call from my brother, R. T. Williams (Jr.) who lives in Pasadena, California, at 111 Linda Vista. He works for the Adult Education Division of the University of California at Los Angeles.

He reminded me of some past history and tied together some personalities which I had not connected.

As you know, I was formerly married to the former Evangeline Mae Lillenas, who still carries my name, not having remarried since our divorce in 1964. She lives at 6901 S. W. Oak, Portland, Oregon, 97223. Her telephone Number is 244-1497. She teaches at the Sherwood Union High School.

Her late father, ~~Haldor Lillenas~~, was a noted protestant hymnologist and composer, and was an ordained minister in the Church of the Nazarene - of which my late father, R. T. Williams, (Sr.) was General Superintendent from 1916 until his death in 1946.

Some years ago, after Lillenas' retirement from active participation in the Nazarene Publishing House, for which he had been music editor for years, he moved to Pasadena, with his second wife (Evangeline's mother having died during WW II), ~~Lola Lillenas~~. They lived on East Mountain Street there. I believe that the address was 1945.

He and his wife started making a series of trips abroad every year or so, shipping their car over by the boat on which they were passengers. Lillenas, being a native of Norway, favored the steamship lines of that country. They made two or three trips through the Scandanavian countries; and one year went into Central and Southern Europe, driving down from Denmark through France and Spain, across southern France and into Italy; and they ferried the Mediterranean for a trip into the Holy Land.

While on this trip, they met (so I have heard them tell) a Jordanian who was able to communicate with them in broken English. He seemed to be an ardent Christian, interested in the work of a small Christian-oriented orphanage. He attached himself to them as a sort of a guide,

and added to the pleasure of their trip. With him along as guide, they were able to indulge their hobby of photography - mostly colored slides and 8 mm movies.

Through this connection with them, Lillenas was finally persuaded to make the usual guarantee to the Immigration Service that this man, his wife and three children, would not become public charges. On this basis they were permitted entry into the country. Upon their arrival, Mr. and Mrs. Lillenas put these people up in their own very nice home.

On one visit the Lillenas' made up here while these people were living in their home, Mr. Lillenas expressed to Evangeline and to me the fear that he may have made a mistake; that it was quite difficult for the father of this family to get work which he was willing to take; he enjoyed the comfortable living in the Lillenas home which must have seemed like paradise itself after the squalor of their home in Jordan. Lillenas expressed the fear that he might have a sort of "man who came to dinner" situation on his hands.

By the time Evangeline and I next visited Mr. and Mrs. Lillenas in Pasadena, the "visitors" were gone. Lillenas had gotten some work for them. The girl either then, or later, became a maid in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Malcolm Maguiar, also of Pasadena - one of the owners of the manufacturers of Mirror-Bright automobile polish, and quite well-to-do people. Maguiar's father had been a close friend of my father; and the younger Maguiars are close friends of my brother.

The daughter in this Jordanian family died of Lukemia, while still working for Madge (Mrs. Malcolm) Maguiar, I understand.

At the time this Jordanian family came to live with my late then father-in-law, the youngest boy was 13 years of age, Mrs. Maguiar told my brother this morning. The papers give his age as 24. So this must have been 11 years ago.

That boy is the one who has been identified as the assassin of Senator Kennedy, for whom I voted in the recent Oregon primary.


I know that all agencies will want to communicate with anyone who had any contact or connection, however remote, with this assassin and his family.

It is for this reason that I am telling you what little I know of this.

I have been quite shaken, since about 11:00 this morning, when I learned through my brother, that my late former father-in-law was responsible for the entry into the United States, of this character.

I do not remember just when Haldor Lillenas died. It must have been in the middle-to-late '50s, or the early '60s. His widow, Lola Lillenas, so far as I know, still lives in the Pasadena area, but, I believe, has an Altadena address. My brother will know it. His home telephone number is (213) 792-6173. His office telephone number is (213) 478-9711, Extension 4016.

Mrs. SMITH stated that her son, ROBERT, had gone to the SIRHAN residence in the past for the purpose of working on television and stereo equipment. She also stated that ROBERT'S present address is 12421 Rush, El Monte, California.

In view of past information received that SIRHAM SIRHAM had a close acquaintance who worked for RX Delivery in Pasadena, named "BOBBY", ROBERT GARNETT should be interviewed.

FLOYD ARMSTEAD, Instructor, Mathematics Department, Olympic College, Bremerton, Washington, advised on June 6, 1968 that on the morning of June 6, 1968 while he and some Olympic College students were in a discussion with a student named SULAIMAN NOSAYAN, the latter made some statements concerning the assassination of New York Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY in Los Angeles, California, June 5, 1968.

Mr. ARMSTEAD stated that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN said the assassin of KENNEDY was "justified in doing what he did". He said that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN further said he knew the assassin personally, having met him in San Francisco. However, he did not indicate the closeness of their relationship. Mr. ARMSTEAD said that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN also remarked "you must remember that this took place one year from June 5" (of last year). Mr. ARMSTEAD said further that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN was apparently well informed concerning the statements of Senator KENNEDY and pointed out that Senator KENNEDY had recently made statements supporting the shipment of arms to Israel. Mr. ARMSTEAD said that he, ARMSTEAD, told SULAIMAN NOSAYAN that "you (Arabs) will not get anywhere by blood shed" whereupon SULAIMAN NOSAYAN said "we'll be back again" (apparently referring to the Arab-Israeli dispute).

Mr. ARMSTEAD said that in some previous discussions with SULAIMAN NOSAYAN, whom he described as a soft-spoken individual who is "nice to talk to", SULAIMAN NOSAYAN had indicated that he does not hate the Jews as individuals but is against the aggression of Israel and that he holds it against the United States and Britain for helping Israel. Mr. ARMSTEAD said that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN has also said that NASSER is a great man and we (United States) does not understand him.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

BERGER went on to say that he is not certain who made this statement but feels certain that if WARNIE TIPPIT, Assistant Pastor, First Church of the Nazarene, was to be contacted, he could furnish the necessary information concerning this. BERGER added that TIPPIT's home address is 1768 Casa Grande, Pasadena, California, home telephone 355-2286.

BERGER advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN was unknown to him.

This is to record a telephone call received from former PSI JOHN DONALDSON COLE at approximately 1:00 p.m., instant date.

COLE advised that JOSE RAMON VILLA, business telephone number 385-0347, business address 3204 West 6th Street, Los Angeles, residence telephone 242-9352, had advised him that ALBERTO FELAZCO had some information regarding SIRHAN SIRHAN attending an anti-U.S., pro-communist meeting approximately one month previously.

COLE recontacted the writer and advised him that Major PEPI DUARTE, 6643 De Longpre Avenue, Hollywood, ALBERTO FELAZCO & ARIEL DE LE FUENTE (PH), had attended a meeting of an organization known as the Free Student Committee, at an unknown address in Griffith Park, approximately three or four weeks previously. Large pictures of CHE QUEVARA, Cuban revolutionary, were on the walls of the house where the meeting was held. According to COLE, Major DUARTE and SIRHAN SIRHAN got into altercations. Major DUARTE advised COLE that slides were being shown depicting how nice it was to live in Cuba. Major DUARTE attempted to refute this information and when he did SIRHAN SIRHAN became offended.

SIRHAN SIRHAN, according to COLE, attending the meeting with one other individual who appeared to be in Arabic dress.

In connection with interview of ELMER M. BOOMHOWER, 10156 Collett Avenue, Granada Hills, an employee of the Ace Guard Service (FD 302 previously submitted), BOOMHOWER stated that WILLIAM F. GARDNER, Security Officer at the Ambassador Hotel had displayed an orange colored pamphlet with black lettering on the evening of 6/4/68. The leaflet bore the caption, "Kill KENNEDY." BOOMHOWER advised that he could recall no other specific details concerning this pamphlet except that it had some kind of insignia indicating the source of the pamphlet. He mentioned that GARDNER showed this to him and instructed him to not permit the passing of such pamphlets in the area where he BOOMHOWER was to be guarding on the evening of 6/4/68.

BOOMHOWER also stated that among the persons he had permitted into the KENNEDY suite (the Presidential suite of the Ambassador) earlier on the evening of 6/4/68 were the following CBS and newspaper men:

Re Memo of SA JOHN M. CALLAGHAN, dated 6/8/68.

It was ascertained on 6/9/68 that records of the Pasadena Police Department re SIRHAN B. SIRHAN would not be available until 6/10/68 but that the arrest referred to in re memo was not the arrest of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN but that of his brother SHARIEF SIRHAN ~~for~~ who was booked 2 - 3 years ago for 317 PC (Attempt of Committ Murder) for blowing up a car of his girlfriend. This charge was later reduced to a minor offense of Tampering with a Car.

It was further ascertained on 6/10/68 that the Pasadena Police Department had furnished to the FBI all records pertaining to the entire SIRHAN family which records included the abovementioned 317 PC. It was also ascertained that SHARIEF SIRHAN was represented by attorney CHARLES HOLLOPETER, 234 E. Colorado Blvd., Pasadena, Calif., Tel. #681-6532 and that HOLLOPETER had succeeded in reducing above 317 PC to a minor offense as stated above.

In view of the fact that above Pasadena Police Dept records are already in possession of the FBI and that the above-mentioned arrest involved SHARIEF SIRHAN rather than SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, no further investigation is being conducted in this phase at this time.
