(3) At approximately 1:00 A.M. this date at the Ambassador Hotel the victim was struck by a bullet fired during an assassination attempt of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. Mrs. Evans was taken to Central Receiving Hospital where she received first aid. She was transferred to the Huntington Memorial Hospital by Goodhew ambulance. Mrs. Evans' private doctor, L.A. Williams, is resident of the Huntington and this is the reason for the transfer. Mrs. Evans was admitted by Dr. Ravelo, who is assisting in the absence of Dr. Williams. Mrs. Evans was admitted to the Huntington Hospital at 2:35 A.M. Dr. Cuba, the emergency doctor, examined Mrs. Evans. He found that she had been shot. The bullet entered the scalp of the forehead, just below the hair line, off center to the right and traveled upward to approximately one inch above the hair line. The bullet did not exit or penetrate the skull. X-rays indicate that the bullet flattened itself against the skull. Dr. Ravelo also examined Mrs. Evans. He decided to leave the bullet in the scalp and have a surgeon remove it later that morning.

Vict was a campaign worker for Senator Kennedy. On evening of election he & Wit-1, Esquith were guarding the door adjacent to the podium in the Embassy Room of the Ambassador Hotel. Around midnite Senator Kennedy & party arrived and entered Embassy Rm. thru this door. After a short talk by the Senator, the party exited thru the rear curtains behind the podium and proceeded to entry the kitchen area. Vict Stroll joined the group & was with the rear of the party along with Mrs. Kennedy & Rosie Grier. Just after above Vict Stroll entered kitchen area, the group came to an abrupt halt and Stroll heard what he thought was a string of firecrackers go off. He felt as if someone kicked him in the knee at the same time he observed smoke and the people in front turned and victim Stroll was pushed back into the other room where he discovered he was shot in the left leg. Victim Stroll accompanied by Wit-1, Esquith was transported to Cent. Rec. Hosp. by Unk. yellow cab. where it was discovered he had been shot in the left leg. He was transported by Goodhue Amb. to Midway Hosp. 5975 San Vicente L.A., where under care of Dr. Corzen.

SIRHAN said he got on the Freeway from Hill St. and at that time had noticed the two suspect vehicles as they appeared to blow the car horns at each other and began changing lanes. At that time, the victim was in the number three lane, but sensing that he was possible being followed by the two vehicles in question, he changed to the number Two lane (Center) in an attempt to allow the vehicles to pass. According to the victim, the vehicles did not pass, but instead the V.W. Bus fell in behind the victims car and remained there until they were approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile from the end of the Freeway.

SIRHAN went on to say that as his vehicle approached the end of the Pasadena Freeway, (N/O Orange Grove Blvd. overpass) the V.W. Bus pulled alongside in the number three and the Chevrolet made the same movement in the number one lane. It was the opinion of the victim that the two vehicles were attempting to box him in, in an attempt to slow his car. As the V.W. pulled alongside, SIRHAN said he thought he saw a hand gun being pointed out the drivers window, but couldn't determine if the driver had the weapon or if it was in the hand of the passenger in the front seat.

When the first shot was fired through the right wind wing, the victim leaned to his right in an attempt to avoid being hit and he then heard the second shot which followed immediatel- after the first shot and also came through the right wind wing. After the secondshot had been fired, the three vehicles were at Glenarm St. and the Chevrolet turned left on Glenarm St. and the V.W. turned right. The victim continued north and came to this department to report the incident.

The projectiles fired by the suspects were recovered by the undersigned and taken as evidence. See attached physical evidence form.

The victims vehicle is a 1955 DeSoto, 2dr, White top/Lime body with primer on fenders and left portion of body, '68 Calif. Lic. OTP 455.

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ALERT DURING THE ASSASSINATION  
OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY, JUNE 5, 1968, 12:10 A.M. TO  
JUNE 6, 1968, 2:30 P.M.

On June 5, 1968, 12:10 A.M., Senator Robert F. Kennedy of New York was shot in the head and the shoulder after delivering a speech at the Embassy Room, Ambassador Hotel. The suspect, Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, was immediately apprehended by members of the Senator's party and transferred to the custody of the Los Angeles Police Department. Senator Kennedy died at Good Samaritan Hospital on June 6, 1968, 1:44 A.M.

From the moment of the shooting, the responsibilities of the Los Angeles Police Department became three-fold. First, the follow-up investigation of the crime and security of the prisoner. Secondly, the supervision of crowd control at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Ambassador Hotel, and other major points of crowd interest. Thirdly, security for the remainder of Senator Kennedy's party and other dignitaries in the Los Angeles area.

Additionally, the Department had to greatly expand its press relations capabilities to match the influx of news media to the Los Angeles area.

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF EVENTS OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ALERT DURING THE ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY, JUNE 5, 1968, 12:10 A.M. TO JUNE 6, 1968, 2:30 P.M.

SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY OF NEW YORK SHOT

On June 5, 1968, 12:10 A.M., after delivering a victory speech to his campaign workers in the Embassy Room, Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Blvd., Senator Kennedy proceeded to his suite through a narrow passageway in the kitchen area. In this passageway, Sirhan Bishara Sirhan fired 8 shots at the Senator from an Iver-Johnson blue steel, 2 inch, 8 shot, 22 caliber revolver. Two shots hit the Senator and other shots wounded five other persons in his party. The suspect was immediately disarmed and captured by members of the Senator's party and transferred to the custody of the Department. Senator Kennedy was rushed to Central Receiving Hospital and at 12:45 A.M., he was transferred to the Good Samaritan Hospital. The Senator underwent brain surgery for 3 hours and 40 minutes, but died in the intensive care unit on June 6, 1968, 1:44 A.M.

FIELD COMMAND POST ESTABLISHED AT THE AMBASSADOR HOTEL

On June 5, 1968, 12:25 A.M., a Field Command Post was established at the hotel. Deputy Chief Davis ordered the dispatching of all response units to Rampart Station for assignment to the field task force. All egress routes from the hotel were secured and, after the initial investigation and interviewing of witnesses, the hotel was cleared of all persons except registered guests and the news media. The crowd problem at the hotel was enormous. Thousands of persons were attending campaign parties, not only for Senator Kennedy, but for Senatorial Candidates Allen Cranston and Max Rafferty. All persons, upon learning of the shooting, surged toward the Embassy Room. Panic was in evidence everywhere. Assistance to the Department was received from one Sergeant and 24 Deputies of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, who were on duty at the I.B.M. office where Los Angeles County Primary votes were being counted.

CROWD PROBLEMS AT CENTRAL RECEIVING HOSPITAL AND GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL

Los Angeles Police Department personnel were immediately rushed to Central Receiving Hospital to maintain security and to control the crowd. When the Senator was transferred to Good Samaritan Hospital, a Field Command Post was established in the lobby of the hotel. A crowd of 500 persons maintained a vigil outside the hospital. Although orderly, the crowd seriously hampered the flow of traffic in the area. The dispatching of patrol units depleted Patrol Division

strength and for several hours, radio calls were backlogged. Metropolitan Division mobilized, formed 12-hour watches, and maintained a unit of 1-Lieutenant, 3-Sergeants, and 26-policemen at Good Samaritan Hospital.

At approximately 12:40 P.M. on June 6, 1968, Senator Kennedy's body was removed from Good Samaritan Hospital and taken by motorcade to Los Angeles International Airport for the flight to New York. One thousand persons were at the Hospital at the time of removal. Security was the responsibility of the Secret Service with assistance from the Department. A crowd of approximately one thousand persons assembled at Los Angeles International Airport, and Venice Division established a Field Command Post, staffed by 40 officers.

#### ARREST OF SUSPECT

The assassin was identified as Sirhan Bishara Sirhan aka Sirhan Sharif Bishara, booking number 495139, 187 P.C. (Murder). He is a male, Jordanian, date of birth 3-12-44, 5-2, 115, black, brown. After interrogation at Rampart Division, he was transferred to Central Jail Division. Tight security immediately went into effect at Parker Center with guards placed at all entrances. At 7:00 A.M., June 5, 1968, Sirhan was arraigned in Court where bail was set at \$250,000. The suspect was then placed in the custody of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and detained in the County Jail.

#### COORDINATION OF DIGNITARIES ARRIVING IN LOS ANGELES

Immediately after the shootings, members of the Kennedy family, doctors, and official dignitaries began arriving in Los Angeles. The Department coordinated the transportation of these persons from the airport to Good Samaritan Hospital. Both Los Angeles Police Department and Los Angeles Fire Department helicopters were used for this purpose.

#### TACTICAL ALERT INITIATED AND E.C.C. ACTIVATED

On June 5, 1968, 3:00 A.M., a tactical alert was initiated. This alert remained in effect until 12:00 P.M. The Emergency Control Center was activated on June 5, 1968, 1:30 A.M. by the Commander, Business Office Division. The E.C.C. coordinated the assignment of personnel to the field task force. All information regarding the assassination was imputed to the E.C.C. from where it was relayed to Rampart Detective Division and Intelligence Division. The E.C.C. was ordered deactivated by Deputy Chief Gates on June 6, 1968, 2:30 P.M.

#### EXPANDED DEPARTMENT PRESS RELATIONS POLICY

Upon learning of the assassination, the Public Affairs Division was alerted and the Department Press Relations officer and the radio and television liaison officer established a receiving desk at Parker Center. One hundred thirty-five temporary press passes were issued to press representatives from all over the world. Press conferences were also established in the Parker Center Auditorium for the Chief of Police.

A large volume of incoming phone calls from the news media was transferred to the E.C.C. where the E.C.C. answered all inquiries. Public inquiries became so great that Communications Division established a "Police Citizen's Information" board, manned by police recruits and student workers.
