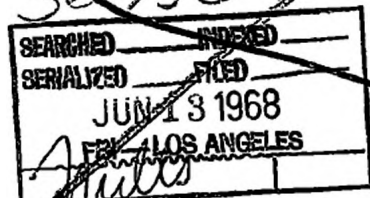

Both stated that KHALAF is unknown to them. All of the KHALAFs in San Francisco are related to their family and none of them have this name. They said that there were also families with this same name in Chicago, Detroit, and Houston, to whom they are related. They were not aware of any KHALAFs in either St. Louis or Massachusetts. They both commented that KHALAF is a very common Jordanian name.

ReBuairtel 6/12/68 requesting information as to whether or not the sale and transfer of pistol utilized by SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was in accordance with existing California laws concerning such transfers.

ROBERT BROGIO, Chief, Criminal Division, U. S. Attorney's Office, Los Angeles, advises of the following information concerning gun laws in the State of California as pertains to individuals:

California Penal Code, Section 12021, states:
"Any person who is not a citizen of the United States and any person who has been convicted of a felony under the laws of the United States, of the State of California or any other state, government or country, or who is addicted to the use of any narcotic drug, who owns or has in his possession or under his custody or control, any pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person, is guilty of a public offense, and shall be punishable by imprisonment in the state prison not exceeding fifteen years or in county jail not exceeding one year, or by a fine not exceeding \$500 or by both."

California Penal Code, Section 12072, applies to individuals with the exception of persons engaged in the legitimate sale of firearms as a business: "No person, corporation or dealer shall sell, deliver or otherwise

transfer any pistol, revolver or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person, to any person whom he has cause to believe to be within any of the classes prohibited by Section 12021 from owning or possessing such firearms, nor to any minor under the age of 18 years. In no event shall any firearm be delivered to the purchaser within five days of the application for the purchase thereof, and when delivered such firearm shall be securely wrapped and shall be unloaded. Where neither party to the transaction holds a dealer's license, no person shall sell or otherwise transfer any such firearm to any other person within this state who is not personally known to the vendor. Any violation of the provisions of this section is a misdemeanor."

The following investigation at Los Angeles, California was conducted by SAA HAROLD R. BODILY on 6-9-68:

~~RITA WHITE~~, Manager, Barclay House, 675 North Kenmore, advised she was not managing the apartment in September 1967 and that no one by the name of BELA FOLDI has lived at this apartment house since she arrived a few months ago. She was shown a photo of BELA FOLDI and said she did not recognize it. She has no records of prior tenants.

She said the only persons living at the apartment house in September 1967 were HAROLD HULBUT in 105, HAROLD VON BYERN in 209, and VELDON CORNFIELD in 311. Mr. HULBUT said he was not living at this location in September 1967 and did not recognize FOLDI's photograph; no one was home in 209; Mr. CORNFIELD said he did not recognize FOLDI's photograph and said he had never heard of him.

~~FRANCES MALONE~~, 4216 Berenice Place, owner of Barclay House, advised she remembered BELA FOLDI as a resident of Apartment 302 at the Barclay House. After checking her records, she found information indicating he occupied Apt 302 on 11-20-67. She said, however, he could have lived in another aptment prior to that time. He left 1-8-68 and she believes his address is in a book that is kept at the apartment house. She was shown a photograph of BELA FOLDI whom she identified as the person who resided at Barclay House.

The photo of BELA FOLDI shown to the above persons was obtained from Los Angeles File 26-37181 entitled BELA FOLDI, ITSMV.

FRANCE MALONE's description of FOLDI fits the description of the subject of File 26-37181.

SUBJ: KENNEDY ASSASSINATION

1. FOLLOWING IS REPORT AS BEING CONCEIVABLY OF INTEREST IN CONNECTION KENNEDY ASSASSINATION INVESTIGATION. ON JUNE 8 US CITIZEN JOHN A. SWEDE (PASSPORT [REDACTED] CALLED ON EMBASSY DUTY OFFICER TO REPORT CONVERSATION MAY 17, 1968 WITH WAITER AT AMBASSADOR HOTEL BAGDAD. DURING DINNER HOTEL WAITER APPROACHED SWEDE AND WIFE TO ASK IF THEY HAD HEARD SENATOR ROBERT KENNEDY HAD BEEN SHOT. IN SUBSEQUENT CONVERSATION WAITER ASSERTED HE HAD POSITIVELY HEARD KENNEDY SHOT IN HEAD BUT NOT YET DEAD. SAID HE HAD HEARD REPORT ON SPECIAL GOVERNMENT RADIO BROADCAST THAT DAY.

2. SWEDE INDICATED HE HAD NO REASON BELIEVE THIS PREMATURE REPORT HAD ANY CONNECTION WITH SUBSEQUENT TRAGEDY BUT WORTH MENTIONING TO US AUTHORITIES. IF REPORT OF ANY INTEREST HE CAN BE CONTACTED IN LOS ANGELES AFTER HIS RETURN ABOUT JUNE 20. ADDRESS GIVEN AT 1631 CAMDEN AVENUE, LOS ANGELES 90025, TELEPHONE 4771989. Mrs. PENNA ESHOO, 405 North Palm, Turlock, California, interviewed at the residence of, and in the presence of Mrs. SAVANNAH STOKER, 330 North Palm, Turlock, furnished the following information:

On the date that the KENNEDY Election Special Train arrived at the Southern Pacific Railroad Station in Turlock, California, recalled by Mrs. ESHOO as a Sunday, date unknown, she went to the station with ELISHA (phonetic) MOOSHEY and his wife, MARTHA MOOSHEY, 315 Hollywood Way, Burbank, California. It is noted that the train actually was in Turlock on Memorial Day, May 30, 1968. They arrived at the station prior to the publicized time of arrival, at about 2:30 PM. Mr. MOOSHEY obtained a seat in a patio area away from the station platform and Mrs. ESHOO and Mrs. MOOSHEY went to the concrete platform area, between the station and the railroad tracks. There were one or two small children playing on the tracks, and no adults in the platform area. Shortly thereafter two men, who appeared to be together, appeared on the platform. Mrs. ESHOO described them as follows:

1) Male adult, nationality unknown, one or two inches shorter than Mrs. ESHOO who is 5'3", weight 120 to 125 pounds, with small build, age 20-21, hair "pitch" black and wavy, very heavy and shiny with oil with loose locks of hair hanging over part of forehead; eyebrows and eyelashes prominent and very black; noticeable pimples on face which appeared discolored, or with multiple colored patches which gave a scarred appearance, as from acne or bad facial condition. Eyes dark or black with noticeable puffiness or circles under them; nose broad and flat, face round. This person was wearing "all dark clothing", exact color unknown. She cannot describe the trousers except that they were dark. He wore no glasses or hat. Mrs. ESHOO saw no jewelry of any kind.

2) White male adult at least 6'1" in height (one foot taller than No. 1), age 20-21, weight 140-145 pounds, slender build, hair "the color of a brown paper bag", complexion light or fair, wearing a white long sleeved shirt, open at the neck, suntan pants, shoes unknown, no glasses or hat, and no jewelry seen. This man also kept his hands in his pockets.

Mrs. MOOSHEY said to Mrs. ESHOO that the man wearing the coat "looks awfully suspicious" and Mrs. ESHOO replied that he certainly did since he was wearing such a heavy coat in the very hot weather. Thereafter, Mrs. MOOSHEY departed to sit with her husband. Mrs. ESHOO stayed on the platform within five or six feet of the two men. Thereafter a girl appeared on the platform. Mrs. ESHOO described her as follows:

White female adult, young, age unknown, 5'6", 170 pounds, heavy build, bushy curly hair, unkempt, cut short at nape of neck, big head and face, light complexion, wearing white blouse with long sleeves, a straight blue skirt and gym shoes, color unknown. She was carrying a brown leather handbag with an overlapping cover, which was fringed or cut along the edges and which she described as the "cowboy type". She had some large round KENNEDY buttons about three or four inches in diameter which she was selling for 50¢ each. She thinks the girl had four of these in her handbag.

Mrs. ESHOO overheard this girl talking to the tall blond man in a language she did not recognize. Mrs. ESHOO understands, but does not speak Portuguese and Arabic and speaks

Turkish, Russian, and Assyrian, her native tongue; it was none of these languages. The girl had come from inside the train station and was overheard to comment to others in the crowd that had gathered, that the train would be late. Later, at about 3:30 PM, Mrs. ESHOO, who became "suspicious" of the girl, because she was talking to the two men, followed her in and out of the train station. The girl asked an older man behind the counter in the station when the train would arrive and he advised her it would be another hour and forty minutes. Mrs. ESHOO followed the girl outside and the girl again spoke to the tall blond man, advising him in English of this fact. The short dark man then scuffed his right foot back and forth on the ground and said in English "Lets go" and the two men walked away to the north. She did not see them again although she later looked for them in the crowd that had gathered. She observed the girl talking to a small, dark girl thereafter. She cannot further describe this girl, but believes they were also talking in the language she did not recognize. The two men were at the station from about 2:45 PM to 3:30 PM.

Previously, at about 3:20 PM, she had heard the taller blond man say "Here it comes" when a freight train went through the station.

After the KENNEDY train arrived at about 4:50 PM or thereafter, Mrs. ESHOO and the MOOSHEYs returned to Mrs. ESHOO's home.

Mrs. MOOSHEY again stated that the short dark man looked awfully suspicious and Mr. MOOSHEY stated "OK honey, you are FBI".

When Mrs. ESHOO observed the television pictures of the shooting, she saw a full face picture of the arrested suspect. She immediately yelled to her children that this man had been at the Turlock railroad station.

Photographs of FLORENCIO L. MATIONG, California A 37614; HAROLD OTTO MONTOYA, California A 52037, and ALFRED ARTHUR MONTOYA, California A 51909, were individually exhibited to her. She emphatically stated that none of these individuals were the person she saw. Xerox copy of California driver's license [REDACTED], issued to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN in 1964 was exhibited to her with only the face of the driver shown. She immediately positively identified this person as the shorter of the two men she saw. She stated emphatically that there can be no question; that this is the photograph of the person observed by her. She stated she is confident he would recognize her also since they frequently were face to face, within five or six feet of each other during the period of time she was at the station.

Mrs. ESHOO, who speaks rapid but broken English, advised she entered the United States as an immigrant from Persia, now Iran, in the early 1930's and is a naturalized citizen.

On 6/12/68, LLOYD HAGER, Manager, San Gabriel Valley Gun Club, 4001 Fish Canyon Road, Duarte, California, telephonically contacted this agent and advised that EVERETT BUCKNER was "shooting his mouth off all over the place." HAGER stated that he, HAGER, had gone to San Diego, California, on 6/11/68, and it was his understanding that several newspaper reporters and a "Life" magazine reporter had come to the range and talked with BUCKNER. HAGER stated that he did not know what BUCKNER had told them.

He further advised that in his office at the time that he was in telephonic contact with this agent, was two officers of the Los Angeles Police Department, who were going to talk with BUCKNER regarding this matter.

Sergeant CADINA, Intelligence Division, Los Angeles Police Department, also talked with this agent at that time, and he stated that he personally was going to read to BUCKNER a copy of the court order restricting any comment concerning the Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY assassination, be sure that BUCKNER understood its meaning, and if possible, get BUCKNER to sign a statement to the effect that he had read and understood its contents.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs WILLIAM C. RYAN, JR. and ORLEY A. LEESON, JR.

AT LAKEWOOD, CALIF.

On 6/11/68, Mrs. BEVERLY BRONS, 6003 Deerford St., Lakewood, advised she attended a luncheon and rally at the Lakewood Country Club for Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY on 5/28/68 which was sponsored by the Lakewood Democratic Club and the Lakewood Kiwanis Club.

She stated that she was seated at the table in the left rear corner of the main dining room with several other persons including: Mr. POLACHEK, owner of Brand Jewelers; Mr. BIRNBAUM, owner of Zale's Jewelers and Mr. and Mrs. DICK HORNER, owners of the Dutch Village Bowling Alley, all of Lakewood. About 1:25 PM, following the luncheon, Senator KENNEDY and his party entered the dining room and were followed by members of the press. She stated the Senator shook hands with the persons at her table and she shook his hand and kissed his neck. As the Senator proceeded to the front of the group, the press went up the left side of the room and an individual who resembles SIRHAN SIRHAN followed the press group in and sat on a serving table which was directly to the left of her table. She described this male as follows:

Mrs. BRONS stated that when she left the Country Club she saw a 1956 faded dusty rose DeSoto parked near the entrance to the Club. She noticed the car because it was backed into the parking ~~xxx~~ space and because it resembles her son-in-law's car which is the same year except tan in color. She stated the car had an antenna on the front left fender which had a blue flag on it and the left front hub cap had a large smear of royal blue paint on it. She believes the car was a solid color trimmed in cream.

Mrs. BRONS was shown a photograph of SIRHAN's 1956 DeSoto and she stated this car was not identical to the car she saw.

Mrs. BRONS was shown a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN and stated the photograph resembled the man she saw at the rally although she could not be sure due to the nature of the photo and the fact the man she saw was wearing a suit and tie.

Mrs. BRONS stated she advised WREN FLYNN (ph), CBS. News of the above and also furnished it to one of WREN's staff. She stated she did not trust any of the local authorities and proceeded to criticize the LAPD, LASO and the Lakewood PD. She stated she had contacted the FBI in the past to report a possible racial incident and gambling activities and had recently contacted the Long Beach RA regarding her views on gun control legislation.

Mrs. BRONS was extremely emotional during this interview and wept on several occasions. She felt she contributed to the Senator's death as she wrote him a letter last November requesting a picture of former President JOHN F. KENNEDY and expressing her desire that Senator KENNEDY seek the presidency of the US.

Mrs. BRUNS expressed extreme concern of the current condition's in the US. During interview Agents observed several photos of Senator KENNEDY in BRON's living room as well as a KENNEDY poster on the front door of her residence.

On 6/12/68, L. CHARLES BARON, 4507 Palo Verde, Lakewood advised he and his wife, JACKIE BARON, are Lakewood Democratic Club workers and on 5/28/68 they arrived at the Lakewood Country Club about 10:30am to oversee preparations for the KENNEDY luncheon and rally. BARON advised his wife spent her time insuring the speaker's table and area were in order and he spent his time insuring all guests had tickets for the luncheon and checking persons seeking admittance to the dining area until after Senator KENNEDY arrived, when he accompanied KENNEDY and his party to the speakers table. He stated he took numerous photos of KENNEDY's arrival and his greeting numerous guests. BARON stated he has viewed his photos several times and he does not recall anyone fitting the above descriptions in the photos. BARON made the photos available for viewing by the Agents and examination of the photos failed to reflect any individuals meeting the above descriptions. BARON advised there were numerous young persons in attendance including his 17 year old daughter, [REDACTED], and her boyfriend. He stated his daughter was wearing a yellow dress with a large brown collar around the neck. He stated there were several Latin-American individuals in attendance including a Democratic Party worker FERNANDO HERNANDEZ who is a slightly built person with rather long dark curly hair as who was attired in a suit and white shirt and tie. BARON was shown a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN and stated he did not see SIRHAN at the luncheon or rally. He said that HERNANDEZ slightly resembles the photo of SIRHAN.

BARON voluntarily made available four slides depicting scenes at the 5/28/68 luncheon and various individuals in attendance. One of the slides depicted FERNANDO HERNANDEZ and others depicted various guests.

On 6/13/68, the above slides were displayed to Mrs. BRONS at her residence and she stated FERNANDO HERNANDEZ appeared to be identical with the individual she saw at the rally who she thought might have been SIRHAN SIRHAN. She stated she felt relieved that this person had been identified and that she felt HERNANDEZ was the person she saw.

In view of the above no further investigation is being conducted.

Mrs Lou Robinson aka, Mrs. Dale Robinson 10801 Winnetka, Chatsworth, Cal. # 360-4947, 6-11-68 by phone advised Dale Robinson, TV Actor, was enroute to Lake Tahoe and would not return till Friday 6-14-68. She did not know where was to stay there but he was to call her tonight and give her the address and phone.

Lou said Life Magazine Rep. call and talked to Dale last night re any knowledge of Sirhan and Dale informed the rep. he did not know Sirhan nor had he ever employed him as a horse handler or otherwise. Further having observed pictures of Sirhan on TV and in the press Dale did not acknowledge any recognition what so ever. Lou handled the books for Dale's horses and is sure Sirhan never worked for Dale and she had no recollection of Sirhan.

She will advise Dale tonight of the call from the FBI and if he comes up with any affirmative info she will have him contact FBI.

RONALD R. HUNTLEY was interviewed at 374 N.E. Edison, Hillsboro, Oregon, where he was visiting. He resides at 2902 E. Burnside, Portland, Oregon, and is employed as an interviewer at the Employment Center, Mead Building, Portland, Oregon. He stated that during the Primary campaign in Oregon, he was working as a volunteer worker for Senator ROBERT KENNEDY and on the evening of May 28, 1968, he was with Senator ROBERT KENNEDY at about 11:40 p.m. when Senator KENNEDY appeared at the ballroom of the Benson Hotel, Portland, Oregon, and made a statement to his supporters assembled there conceding the Primary election in the State of Oregon to Senator MC CARTHY. HUNTLEY preceded Senator KENNEDY from the platform which they stepped off from the left side and to the rear, going a short distance to a kitchen door with the intention that Senator KENNEDY go through the kitchen and come up to the elevator on the back side and avoid the crowd. As he stepped off the platform which was about two feet high, he saw two men standing in front of the kitchen door and as the party proceeded towards the door, the two men stepped back into the kitchen. He had the impression that one of them spoke to the other and assumed they were together. One man was heavy set and the other had a medium-slender build. As HUNTLEY came into the kitchen, he put his hands against the back of the heavy set man and pushed him against the wall so that Senator KENNEDY and the party could go on through. He assumes that the slender man stepped out of the way as he did not see him again. As he pushed the heavy set man against the wall, he felt something under his coat which could be a weapon or a thick, wide belt. He told the man to stand still while the party passed through. He then turned away from the heavy set man to offer aid to Representative EDITH GREENE who was also in the party, and to keep her from being pushed by the crowd.

Mr. HUNTLEY stated that he thought he should inform the FBI of this incident inasmuch as the news broadcast in the early morning of June 5, 1968, described the individual who shot Senator KENNEDY as being similar to the slender man that he had seen at the kitchen door in the Benson Hotel. He also was similar in appearance to a photograph

Mrs. FRANCES HOLLAND, 552 Eldorado Drive, Escondido, California, advised as follows:

She is the Southern California Grand Counsellor of the Rosicrucian Order, also known as the Ancient Mystical Order Rosae Crucis (AMORC). She advised the state and international headquarters of AMORC have designated her to handle any inquiries concerning SIRHAN SIRHAN's membership in AMORC. She stated SIRHAN is a member of the Supreme Grand Lodge, San Jose, California, which is a corresponding membership and to her knowledge he did not attend meetings but received correspondence and instructions by mail from San Jose, California, and in turn submitted his lessons by mail to San Jose, California.

Mrs. HOLLAND advised the San Jose office maintains a complete file of correspondence with all members, which file contains the members original application form. She understands that FBI Agents at San Jose, California, were permitted to review SIRHAN's file and were given a duplicated copy of his application blank.

AMORC has local lodges and chapters to which some members belong, although membership in a local club is not required. Mrs. HOLLAND stated she has checked and determined that SIRHAN was not a member of the Pasadena Chapter or any other lodge or chapter. SIRHAN, however, did once and only once visit one of these subordinate bodies. He attended the weekly meeting of the Pasadena Chapter on the evening of June 4, 1968. Mrs. HOLLAND made available a page of the guest register of the Pasadena Chapter, which bears the signature SIRHAN SIRHAN, 696 East Howard, Pasadena and reflects that he is a member of AMORC, with membership number 8-413-477. On the date column of this form SIRHAN entered the date April 16, 1968. Mrs. HOLLAND stated that this is an error and SIRHAN probably used this date because the last previous registration was on that date. Mrs. HOLLAND confirmed by talking to the supervisor of the Pasadena Chapter, that SIRHAN visited that chapter on the evening of June 4, 1968.

In signing in, SIRHAN showed he was a first degree member. Mrs. HOLLAND stated that this is a beginner's degree which would indicate membership of less than one year.

AMORC has no full time hall in Pasadena. The chapter meets every Tuesday night. Master of the chapter is THEODORE R. STEVENS, 886 Pullman Street, Los Angeles, California, telephone number 257-9368.

Mrs. HOLLAND stated she would call Mr. LIVINGSTON and Mr. STEVENS on the evening of June 12, 1968, to instruct them to cooperate in answering inquiries from the FBI. She stated the wives of both of these individuals are upset with the bad publicity given AMORC in the press and LIVINGSTON and STEVENS should be contacted by telephone to arrange an appointment.

Mrs. HOLLAND subsequently telephonically contacted the FBI Office, San Diego, California, on June 12, 1968, and advised as follows:

She was in telephonic contact with Mr. LIVINGSTON and discussed the matter of being interviewed by the FBI at Los Angeles. She stated that Mr. LIVINGSTON reviewed his notes and indicated that he had attended the Pasadena meeting on May 28, 1968, rather than June 4, 1968. Therefore, Mrs. HOLLAND assumes the appearance of SIRHAN SIRHAN at the Pasadena meeting was on May 28, 1968, rather than as previously reported on June 4, 1968.

According to Mrs. HOLLAND, the date of appearance of SIRHAN SIRHAN can be verified by contacting Mr. STEVENS, the Master of the Pasadena Chapter.

On June 5, 1968, Joseph Willard "Pappy" Luke, age 61, owner of Pappy's Stew House, General Delivery, Highway 90, Raywood, Texas, telephone 587-9059, advised around 11:00 AM on Thursday, one and one half weeks ago (date of May 23, 1968) a lone male came into Luke's restaurant and had a Coke and bowl of stew. The man, believed to be named John (Last Name Unknown) stated he was a salesman for the Broker Food Company and traveled all over the United States. The man stated he had just left Houston, Texas and was traveling to New Orleans, Louisiana. Luke told the man about Luke's copyrighted Mulligan Stew and offered the man \$1,000 to promote the stew. The man declined and stated he was going to California. The man then made the following statement; "My life isn't worth two cents. I am going to the campaign meeting in California and straighten that s---- out there I am going to turn California upside down. I am going to get one of those Senators. I am going to kill them sons-of-b-----." Luke inquired why. The man replied, "Because they are killing the Communists. I want to make it good for the Communists".

The man was not carrying any papers or other articles. He never displayed any identification. Nothing was observed in the man's car. Luke tried to get the man to take his coat off as the restaurant was quite hot but the man refused. The man paid for his food with a roll of bills approximately three inches in diameter. The man spun his wheels and drove east on Highway 90 at a very high rate of speed.

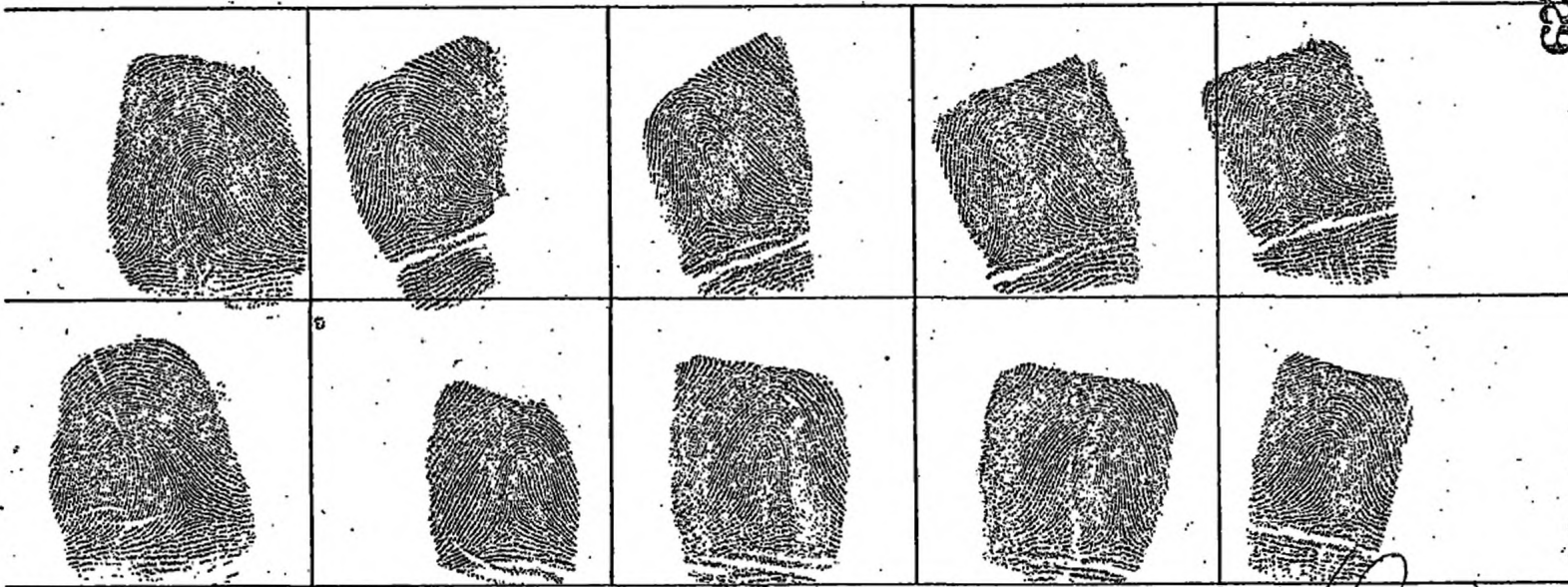
