On June 12, 1968 PAUL FISHER, Intelligence Division, Long Beach, California advised SA CARL L SHERWOOD that the Long Beach Telegram-Independent Newspaper reporters and members of the L.A. P.D. had been at the Long Beach P.D. collecting information concerning the associates of "SIRHAN" that had been arrested with him, "SIRHAN" at Flagstaff, Arizona. He stated that it was his understanding that "SIRHAN" had been arrested for vag. in company of PHILIP LEE CLEVINGER, aka CLEVINGER, who has a mother living in North Long Beach Apt #2 3300 block Andy St.; DAVID MYERS Jr. and RONNIE EDMAN HULEN, last known address 1740 Freeman Ave. Apt #1 Long Beach. He stated that there is no arrest record for "SIRHAN" or MYERS, however HULEN and CLEVINGER have come to the attention of the L.B.P.D. in the past.

FISHER advised that CLEVINGER had reportedly been arrested in Gary Indiana for Sodomy, convicted and judge mentally ill during 1966.

He advised that efforts to locate HULEN and CLEVINGER in the Long Beach area have been unproductive.

FISHER made available the photostatic copies of all the L.B. P.D. records pertaining to HULEN and CLEVINGER.

Attached are the records pertaining to HULEN and CLEVINGER which are self explanatory.

On this date, an attempt was made to locate DAVID MYERS, JR., at the address 1630 Turk, La Puente, Calif. MYERS was arrested 5/26/66 with MUNIR SIRHAN.

It was determined thru a physical check that there is no such number as a 1600 block on Turk. It was determined that there was no 16830 or 16930 number on Turk.

A check of the telephone directory and the cross directory reflected no party by the name of Myers on Turk St.

Subject's brothers advised on 6/13/68, that they have no knowledge of other names contained in subject's notebooks such as TYRONE CHAPMANN, GARNER TED ARMSTRONGE, T. DEUTSCH and JOHN DAYS and investigation continuing to identify and locate these persons.

Subject's family believes names such as SOL SONJUANINO, FIONA, PRINCE KHLADE and MAWLEDENOR refer to race horse names.

The name GHATEAS is a SIRHAN family name which is not presently used by any member of the family.

Concerning the Arabic writing in subject's notebook, members of the family believe practically all of it is nothing more than idle doodling or practice of writing in the Arabic script having stated that little of it makes sense.

Brothers of the subject, SAIDALLAH and ADEL SIRHAN have positively identified handwriting in English, Russian and Arabic in the notebooks as that of the subject, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN.

Most of the pamphlets found in the subjects room where identified by family members as "throw away type" such as is delivered house to house or address "to occupant" and believe none of it was received by subject through subscription. They stated that most of the material he received through the mail regarded the Rosecrucians.

On 6/14/68, Mrs. SIRHAN advised that during the latter part of 1966 while her son, the subject, was living in Norco, California and working on a horse breeding ranch, he did write her a letter in which he enclosed \$10 and asked her to take care of his mail. She stated, however, that before she could forward anything to him, he returned home the next day and picked up one piece of mail which she recalls was a pamphlet from the Rosecrucians. She stated that in this letter he did give her his address in Norco; however, she has since turned that card over to the police department and she does not remember the address of her own recollection.

FERNANDES on 6/7/68, have been placed in 1-A section of this file.

Copies of the above photo have also been furnished by SA BOGSTAD to Sergeant J. R. MAC ARTHUR, Room 803, Los Angeles Police Department Headquarters. MAC ARTHUR advised SA BOGSTAD on 6/13/68 that he recalled talking to PATRICIA NELSON on this matter at the Ambassador Hotel 6/5/68. MAC ARTHUR did not know the individual in the above photograph, and said that no action had been taken on the information furnished by NELSON.

NELSON, as revealed in the FD 302 dated 6/14/68, after further thoughts on the matter and viewing the video tape, said that she had doubts now that what she had originally speculated could have been the stock of a gun protruding from a package of the unknown person that she had observed running from the Embassy Room of the Ambassador Hotel at about 12:10 a.m. on 6/5/68, could in fact have been the stock of a gun. This conclusion is based on what she had observed on the video tape, mainly that she was of the opinion that the package pictured on the tape was the same that she had seen the man carrying, further that this package appeared to be extremely light in weight in the manner in which it was handled when presented to Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY by the man in question for autographing.

It should further be noted that KLEIN and WEAVER also identified the package in possession of the unidentified man on the video tape as the same package that they had seen in possession of the man running from the Embassy Room about 12:10 a.m. on 6/5/68, and neither of them had noted anything about the package which had caused them to believe that a gun stock was protruding from one end of it.

WILLIAM P. MC SHERRY, Television News Director, ABC, 4151 Prospect Avenue, Los Angeles, California, advised on 6/7/68, that ABC film editors in searching video tapes on the KENNEDY affair had frozen a frame of the person carrying the package and later identified by NELSON, WEAVER, and KLEIN as the man they had in question, because the ABC news editors had originally thought that this individual could have been SIRHAN SIRHAN, but after getting further identification and photographs of SIRHAN had eliminated this photograph as possibly being a photograph of SIRHAN.

MC SHERRY also voiced an opinion that the package in question appeared to be rolled up posters, and it is also the opinion of SA's LESLIE F. WARREN and LLOYD O. BOGSTAD, who viewed this video tape at the same time, that the package in question; appeared to be rolled up campaign type posters.

Based on the observations and the apparent lightness of the package in question, the possibility that this package contained a rifle or shotgun, and in fact had a gun stock protruding from it, is of sufficient remoteness that an extensive investigation in attempting to identify the unknown individual is not warranted at this time.

No further action is recommended at this time.

Dear Sir,

I have just recently returned from Israel where I spent some time researching a book which I am writing now concerning the Six Day War of last year. Because of the tragic event that occurred in Los Angeles today, I feel that I must write and hope that I can add something to the investigation in the attempted assassination of Robert F. Kennedy.

While the 'biggies' of our TV news media, Huntley, Brinkley, Cronkite, Sevaried et al, decry the hostile air in America today, and the entire nation in fact cries against the deranged mind that pulled the trigger, I would like to suggest that perhaps the mind is not so deranged. I would like to suggest that an understanding of the Arab mentality be entered into this investigation. Though it is totally abhorrent to the Western mind, assassination has long been a part of the Arab scene. It does not take too much of a stretch of the imagination to see how the Arab mind can perpetrate such a thing. It is the same mind that can place a land mine in the path of a school bus and kill two and injure 26 students; or the mentality that fires the cannon that kills a farmer while he peacefully works his fields. It is this mentality that can scream for their Jihad, their Holy War to eliminate a nation, when the rest of the world is still reeling from the effects of the genocides of World War II.

In other words, sir, this mentality which is so puzzling to our way of thinking (even the Russians cannot understand the Egyptians) could very well have been the driving force behind this man's actions. What we may consider deranged by our standards could be a perfectly acceptable, indeed even an honorable performance, by Arab standards.

I understand the suspect has been in the U.S. for eleven years and has been associated with Arab student activities. So I may not have anything to offer you. Yet, I would offer only as a suggestion that this man's possible connections with al Fatah or similar terrorist organizations from Jordan or other Arabian nations not be overlooked.

I watched the debate between Kennedy and McCarthy and the statement that Senator Kennedy made concerning our helping Israel, was by itslef innocuous. But to the Arab mentality it could easily have started the fuze that set this man off. Nasser of Egypt could easily arouse his Arabs to a frenzy of blood lust with a few words. So I am simply saying that one should not overlook the Arab mentality in trying to analyze this thing. Please consider this, and also question the suspect about possible ties with al Fatah,

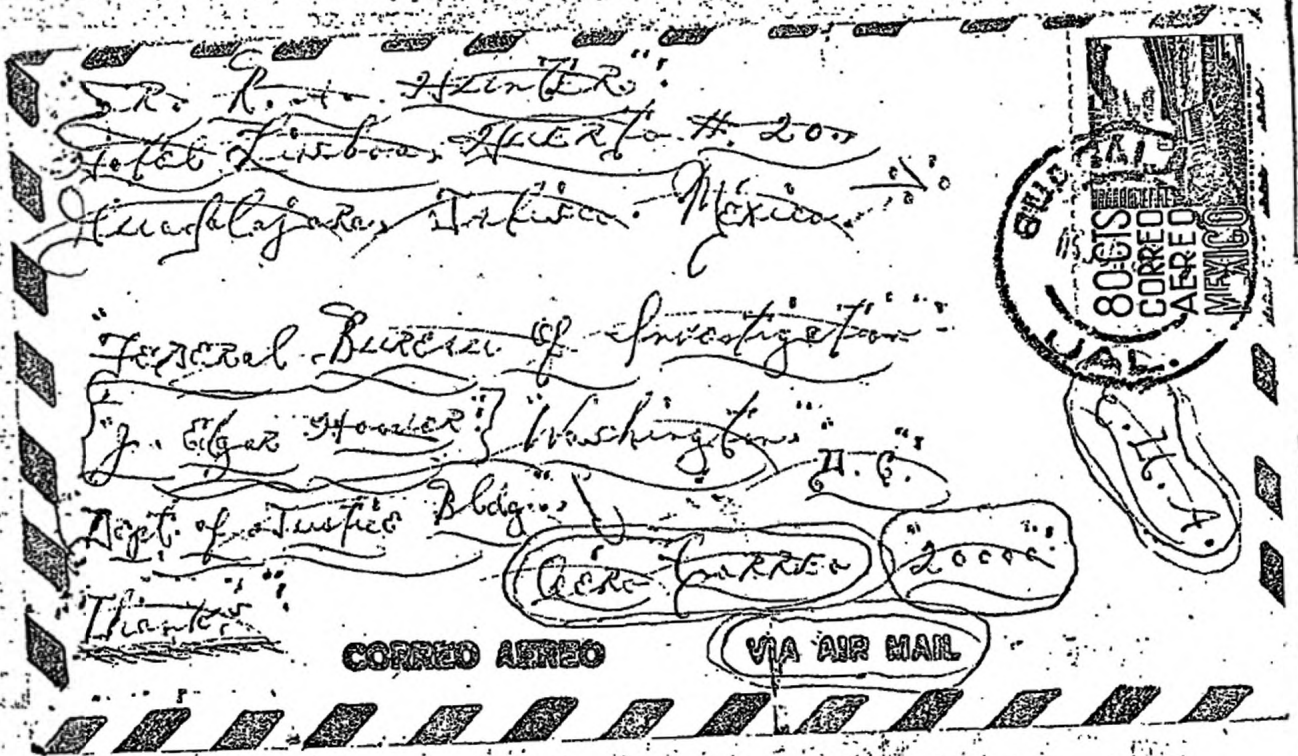

On 6/13/68, EARL OLANDIA MURPHY, 5932 3rd Street, N.W., WDC, advised that a few days before the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, he attended a rally for Senator KENNEDY at 14th and Park Road, N.W., WDC.

He stated a white male approximately 35-40 years of age, 5'6", 200 pounds, of stocky build, wearing a dark top coat and hat stood next to him as the Senator was speaking. He said this man held up a round object gray in color, approximately 2' long and 3" in diameter with an electric cord extending from it.

MURPHY said he asked the man what the object was and the man replied it was a microphone. MURPHY said this man then moved around the outer circle of the crowd and moved in toward Senator KENNEDY. MURPHY said he followed the man a short distance, the man moving in a fairly rapid fashion; however, the man disappeared in the large crowd. MURPHY stated it was

possible this man was a technician from the press and moved into a better position. He said he could not describe this individual further as the light was poor; Senator KENNEDY was then speaking at a late evening hour. MURPHY said he doubted whether he could recognize this man if he should see him again due to the limited amount of light at the time.

MURPHY stated this man appeared to be alone and MURPHY stated he could furnish no additional information. He indicated he furnished this information as it might have had some connection to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY at Los Angeles.

Mr. MURPHY's interest and cooperation in this matter were acknowledged. WFO conducting no further investigation at this time.

On 6/7/68, SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS, JR. interviewed ~~JESUS PEREZ~~, an employee in the kitchen at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles. PEREZ was interviewed in the Spanish language in an attempt to obtain from him a statement concerning the events that he saw in the hotel in connection with the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

PEREZ stated that he would not make any statement or furnish any information to anyone concerning this matter inasmuch as he had been instructed by the Los Angeles County Grand Jury Foreman that he was not to divulge any information to anyone concerning the things he testified to at the Grand Jury. He stated that the only way he would furnish the FBI with an account of what he saw was if he were to receive information from the Foreman of the Los Angeles County Grand Jury to release this information.

On 6/12/68, JESUS PEREZ was reinterviewed by SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS, JR. and SA JAMES CAGNASSOLA, JR., at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles and he was again interviewed in the Spanish language and he once again advised that he would not furnish any information concerning the events he saw or the testimony he gave in connection with the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He stated that if he should obtain permission from the Foreman of the Los Angeles County Grand Jury he would be willing to furnish the FBI with any information they desired. Arrangements were made with PEREZ to pick him up at his residence, 1451 South Burlington Avenue, Los Angeles, at 8:00 a.m., on 6/13/68, and take him to the Grand Jury Room in the Justice Building in Los Angeles, to obtain the permission of the Grand Jury foreman for him to be interviewed by the FBI.

Mr. ~~JOHN ROBERT SOPKO~~, ~~Freelance~~ Newsreel Photographer, 835 North Benton Way, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed on 6/7/68 by SA's RICHARD M. FOX and CARL E. PILKVIST. He advised that on 6/5/68, he was watching CBS television while Senator KENNEDY was making his victory speech. He noticed two men standing behind Senator KENNEDY holding 35mm cameras in their hands. They looked suspicious to him since it appeared to him that they did not know anything about photography. He advised that they held the cameras in such a position that it would seem that they were not familiar with handling cameras. On at least two occasions, the Senator appeared to look around at these individuals.

Mr. SOPKO was shown a photograph of Senator KENNEDY which was taken during the Senator's victory speech. After looking at this photograph, Mr. SOPKO could not identify the individuals who were standing behind KENNEDY. He described these two men as being attired, one in a blue denim jacket and the other in a white shirt. He could furnish no other information regarding these individuals other than the fact that they looked suspicious to him.

Mr. SOPKO said that if the FBI desired to review the film presented by CBS that night, they could do so by contacting CBS studios at Beverly and Fairfax in Los Angeles.

Miss ELSIE BAER, 418 South Normandie, Apartment 216, Los Angeles, was contacted by the writer and SA ROBERT H. MORNEAU, JR. on 6/11/68 at her residence and furnished information as follows:

On Tuesday, 6/4/68, BAER and Mrs. LILLIAN LIBBY, age 84, whom BAER describes as being in a weakened state, both mentally and physically, entered Sandy's Restaurant located on the northeast corner of St. Andrews Place and Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, at approximately 6:45 P.M. Upon entering the restaurant, BAER and LIBBY sat in a circular booth located in the northwest corner of the southernmost section of the restaurant. BAER explained that she sat facing south toward Wilshire Boulevard and related that in the adjacent booth to her left she observed a white male with shoulder length brown hair and a goatee, whom she described as a hippie type and a white female. She advised that, after initially noting these two individuals, they were joined by another white male whom she described as being clean-cut. She stated that, in approximately a half hour period, the hippie left the table and returned; the other white male left the table and returned; and once again the hippie left the table and returned. She stated that she did not observe the female speak any words and noted that she continued to stare straight ahead the entire time she was in the restaurant. BAER continued that later she observed the hippie passing a roll of currency under the table to the other white male. Thereafter, the hippie departed the restaurant, walked east on Wilshire to St. Andrews, and thereafter north on St. Andrews out of sight.

BAER was displayed four photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN after which she advised that he is definitely neither of the white males she observed in the restaurant. She stated, however, that she contacted the FBI inasmuch as she felt that the trio appeared conspiratorial and the

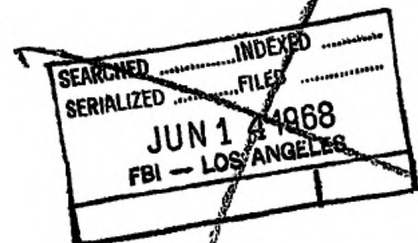

female had blond hair. She noted that this girl could possibly have been the blond girl who was observed after the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

C. advised he is a doctor at the VA Hospital, W. L. A., and last night (6/12/68) he was on duty in the admitting office, from 8:00 to 12:00 Midnight. One of the hospital's employees, a young woman of about 23, came to him for treatment, because she was too nervous and distraught to work. She would not reveal to him the cause of her nervous condition, and he did not pursue the matter. But, because of her state, he sent her home, and advised her to go to her ~~parents~~ parents' home, because she was in no condition to take care of herself.

C. advised that this lady is employed in the Dietary kitchen at the hospital. He does not know her name, but it would appear on the list of persons who were admitted for any kind of treatment ~~during~~ during that period of time, and there were only about 18 or 20 of them.

C. did not pay much attention to the girl until after he had gotten off work, and then he read in the newspaper about the "girl in the polka dot dress" that is being sought in connection with KENNEDY's murder. From the description that is in the paper, he feels that there is the possibility that she is the girl. C. has nothing to go on other than her actions and description.

C. described the girl as being about 23 years of age, with dark hair that hung to just above her shoulders. He was unable to determine whether she was of Mexican or Mediterranean descent, but on final analysis, he feels that she is probably Mediterranean, because

The following investigation was conducted by  
SAs THOMAS G. MANSFIELD and WILLIAM R. WHITLEY:

On 6/9/68, DOROTHY WEAKLEY was interviewed at her residence 847 Exposition Boulevard West, Harris Plaza Apartments. WEAKLEY added that she is a master's degree candidate at the University of Southern California (USC) where she is studying Occupational Therapy. WEAKLEY acknowledged that she personally appeared at the Los Angeles FBI Office on 6/7/68 furnishing information that she believed a classmate by the name of HARRIETT SCHMALZ might be involved in the killing of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. WEAKLEY acknowledged that she also had furnished information to the Los Angeles FBI Office about 1½ months ago which information implicated SCHMALZ in the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

WEAKLEY advised she believes that SCHMALZ might be involved in the death of Senator KENNEDY for the following reasons:

On 5/22/68, she attended a shower at SCHMALZ' apartment at 309 South Alexandria. Six people attended the shower. During conversation with SCHMALZ at the shower, SCHMALZ stated that she had a friend who had a ticket to the KENNEDY campaign headquarters and SCHMALZ indicated that this friend was going to obtain a ticket for her to the KENNEDY campaign headquarters. SCHMALZ also indicated that she was going to wear her "new party dress". SCHMALZ also stated that it was a polka dot dress.

WEAKLEY advised that on another occasion, SCHMALZ had stated that she had eaten dinner at the Ambassador Hotel with her roommate ELLEN KEYSER. SCHMALZ stated that after they had finished their dinner, they had inspected the kitchen of the Ambassador Hotel. She did not recall the reason for SCHMALZ and KEYSER inspecting the kitchen.

WEAKLEY stated that to her knowledge, SCHMALZ has never worked in any political campaigns nor has she ever expressed any anti-KENNEDY views. In summation, WEAKLEY stated that she thought SCHMALZ might be involved in the killing because she has been to the Ambassador Hotel, has seen the kitchen, had mentioned that she has purchased a polka dot dress, and had indicated that she might have a ticket to visit the KENNEDY campaign headquarters.

On 6/9/68 and 6/10/68, efforts to locate and interview HARRIETT A. SCHMALZ at Apartment 216, 309 South Alexandria were unsuccessful.

On 6/12/68, HARRIETT A. SCHMALZ was interviewed at her residence Apartment 216, 309 South Alexandria, by SA MANSFIELD. SCHMALZ advised that she is on leave of absence from the Veterans Administration Hospital at Waco, Texas. She stated she is a graduate student at USC where she is studying for a master's degree in Occupational Therapy.

She advised she has never visited the campaign headquarters of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. She disclosed that on 6/4/68, the evening Senator KENNEDY was shot, she was home alone at her apartment typing a monograph. She became sleepy at 11:00 p.m. and went to bed, and set her radio alarm clock for 2:00 a.m. 6/5/68. She awoke at 2:00 a.m. and heard on the radio that Senator KENNEDY had been shot. She advised she does not own a polka dot dress and she offered to let the interviewing agent inspect her wardrobe for a polka dot dress. SCHMALZ stated that she recently did buy a new white colored "play dress" which is the type of dress that is usually worn over a bathing suit. She advised she has never been inside the Ambassador Hotel. She said that when she arrived in Los Angeles in September 1967, she took a drive through the driveway of the Ambassador Hotel so she could observe the hotel as she considered it a tourist attraction inasmuch as the famed Cocanut Grove was located at the hotel.

She was exhibited photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN. She advised that she has never seen this individual and knows no one by that name.

Concerning DOROTHY WEAKLEY, she mentioned to WEAKLEY previously that she had been interviewed by the FBI concerning the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. WEAKLEY at that time, admitted that she had called the FBI about her (SCHMALZ) and WEAKLEY stated she felt bad about KING's death and figured this was the way she could relieve her tensions. SCHMALZ stated that she knows WEAKLEY feels very strong about civil rights matters and she had worked in Cleveland, Ohio, in the political campaign for Mayor STOKES.

In view of the above information, no further action is contemplated in this matter.

# DEATH THREAT TO KENNEDY

Sen. Robert F. Kennedy was struck in the head by small stones three hours after police received an anonymous telephone call warning of a threat on his life last night.

Van Nuys police placed all their units on alert after a 7 p.m. telephone call came from an unidentified man who said his brother told of plans to kill the Massachusetts senator.

Then, as Kennedy and his aides drove away from Los Angeles Valley College, Van Nuys, where he had made an appearance, a shower of rocks was thrown into his open convertible.

The rocks "apparently were thrown from an overpass near

BOBBY's arrival —

the college," said press aide Jerry Maher. After being hit, Kennedy ducked for cover. One of Kennedy's national staff members, Fred Dutton, also was hit by a number of small rocks which police believe were thrown by several youthful persons on the overpass.

There was no sign of blood on Kennedy, a witness said.

Maher said the death threat, which was a "surprise" to him, and the rock-throwing incident

wouldn't change Kennedy's plans.

"We're going to make all the appearances we're scheduled for," he said. Kennedy, who didn't require medical treatment, was whisked to the Ambassador Hotel.

After the anonymous telephone call, Van Nuys officers placed themselves in strategic positions at the college and dispatched their cars only on emergency calls.

"A police sergeant said, "All we know is, we got a telephone call from somebody who said he was afraid his brother was going to try to kill Sen. Kennedy. Nobody has been arrested yet, but our investigation is continuing."

On 6/11/68 JOHN H. WEIDNER, 933 Country Road, Monterey Park, California, (57344947), advised he is the owner of three health food stores, namely, Organic-Pasadena, 1380 North Lake Avenue, Pasadena; Monterey Nutrition, 105 North Garfield, Monterey Park, California; and Nutriville, 7822 East Florence, Downey, California; and that he employed SIRHAN SIRHAN as a stock boy at the Organic-Pasadena store from 9/24/67 through 3/7/68. As part of his employment, SIRHAN made deliveries to WEIDNER's health food stores in Monterey Park and Downey, California.

WEIDNER indicated that the following employees at both the Organic-Pasadena store, and his stores in Downey and Monterey Park, would have been acquainted with SIRHAN:

1. RETTA DRAKE, 2516 Strathmore, Rosemead, California, who managed the Organic-Pasadena store for WEIDNER from 2/25/68 to 3/7/68, quitting on the same day as SIRHAN. WEIDNER described DRAKE as approximately 35 years of age, and noted that both DRAKE and SIRHAN filed a petition for wages due against WEIDNER with the Labor Commissioner, Division of Labor Law Enforcement, Los Angeles State Office Building, in mid-March, 1968. WEIDNER does not know whether DRAKE and SIRHAN previously agreed to petition the Labor Commissioner at the same time.

2. CHERYLE PIERCE, 8757 East Guess, Rosemead, California, 17 or 18 years of age, who worked approximately one month for WEIDNER in January, 1968.
