On 6/15/68, WILLIAM L. PIERCE, 8757 East Guess, Rosemead, California, residence phone AT 8-8827, advised that CHERVLE PIERCE is his 18 year old daughter. Mr. PIERCE stated that his daughter CHERVLE has recently gone to San Francisco, California where she will be employed and reside during the summer of 1968. He related that she currently resides with a friend BARBARA SHAW at 1963 Oak Street, San Francisco, California, residence phone 387-5587.

He commented that his daughter CHERYLE did recognize the name and newspaper photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN as being an individual whom she had met while an employee of JOHN H. WEIDNER at a health food store.

A teletype was dictated by the writer directed to San Francisco on 6/15/68, directing San Francisco to interview CHERYLE PIERCE at the above mentioned address for all information regarding SIRHAN.

ReBUairtel, 6/11/68, Jul 540 ZAKI/ASIAN, 1928 I Street, N.W., employed as adapter-announcer, Voice of America, U. S. Information Agency, 330 Independence Ave., S.W., advised SA ROGER D. ASHLAND on 6/13/68 his roomstate, BASSAM AKKAD, a chauffeur at Saudi-Arabian Embassy, WDC, telephoned him on day of assassination of ROBERT F. KENNEDY. AKKAD told ASLAN an employee at the Embassy said he knows SIRHAN SIRHAN, Later in the day ASLAN called AKKAD for more information about SIRHAN and was told by AKKAD that the unnamed employee at Saudi-Arabian Embassy said SIRHAN is from a village, Silwan, near Jerusalem and had been in the US for five years. Also SIRHAN is from a wealthy family. ASLAN said that the information was incorrect according to information published in newspapers, and it appears to him that the employee at the Embassy was probably indicating he knew SHIRHAN when in fact he did not. ASLAN obtained from his roommate AKKAD the name of the employee, SHUKRI A. ZAZOU, typist at the Saudi-Arabian Embassy.







Re FD-302 of Mrs. JANE AAMONT dated 6/17/68.

On 6/17/68, Mrs. JANE LAMONT, 708 East Howard Street, Pasadena, next door neighbor of SIRHAN SIRHAN telephonically advised that during the latter part of May 1968, she and her husband found a pet rabbit dead in their back yard apparently from a small head wound of undetermined type. Mrs. LAMONT advised that the SIRHAN brothers had always been antagonistic toward the LAMONT pets and in light of recent events she feels this rabbit may have been killed by the SIRHAN brothers possibly by gun shot. The LAMONT's buried this rabbit in their back yard.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEO C. BAILEY AT ATASCADERO, CALIFORNIA:

Records, State of California, Department of Mental Hygiene, Atascadero State Hospital (ASH), as made available on 6/17/68 by Mrs. M.B. PHILLIPS, Medical Records Librarian, contain the following information on HOWARD WAYNE WALCOTT, ASH # 1930608 19306:

WALCOTT was admitted to ASH on 6/12/68 on order of Judge MERRILL BROWN, Superior Court, Riverside, California. The only information of record is a court order of committment of WALCOTT court appointed for insanity with attached copy of/psychiatric report relating to WALCOTT.

Om 5/21/68 WALCOTT appeared in the above court for arraignment on a charge of violation of Section 476a, California Penal Code (NSF checks). A doubt main having arisen at that time in the mind of the court as to WALCOTT'S senity, DR'S. MIN O.L. GERICKE and P.L. CROWLEY, Patton, California were appointed to examine WALCOTT as to present sanity. With the psychiatric report being received and considered, the court found this date (6/5/68) that WALCOTT is a person presently insane. The court ordered further proceedings suspended and ordered WALCOTT be committed to ASH until he has regained his manity when he would be returned to this court for further proceedings.

The above psychiatric peport dated 5/28/68 reveals that it is the opinion of the examining doctors that WALCOTT is presently insane

and unable to understand the nature of the charges against him, and unable to cooperate with his counsel in preparation of his defense. With reasonable medical certainty it can be stated that he was also insame at the time of his alleged crime, and unable to appreciate the nature and quality of his act. He suffers from epilepsy according to his statements, but based on the nature of his thinking process he is also suffering from a schizophrenic 2mm reaction manifested by false ideas, paranoid flavor to his thinking, some effective disordered in the way of suicidal rumination, and suicidal attempts and he continues to be morose, fearful, physically subdued and in need of psychiatric care and treatment. The above doctors recommended that WALCOTT be sent to ASH.

On 6/17/68 Mr. ED BIRD, Psychiatric Social Worker, ASH advised that HOWARD WAYNE WALCOTT appears to be in good contact, and who could be interviewed by the FBI.

On 6/17/68 HOWARD WAYNE WALCOTT, patient, ASH, confined at this institution following arrest for issuance of NSF checks in Riverside/ County, C\_lifornia furnished the following information:

He has been in trouble all of his life, but none of it involving violence and he is intently against the use of violence in connection with EXIMX commission of a crime for for any reason. While confined in jail at Indio, California during the time of the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, he observed a picture on television of the suspected assasin named SIRHAN SIHHAN. He recognized the picture of SIRHAN as a person he had seen at the Los Angeles Greyhound Bus

Depot at about two or three in the morning about three or four weeks before WALCOTT's arrest which would have made it about April 1, 1968. xxxx At the time he observed SIRHAN, he, WALCOTT, was on the run from his parole officer, was waiting to catch a bus, and was walking around outside the bus depot.

The person he observed at the bus deppt who he believes to have been SIRHAN, came up to WALCOTT and said in a loud and boistrous manner words to the effect "Do you remember the Watts riot. If you think that was something wait until you see what I'm going to do." WALCOTT tried to walk away as WALCOTT thought the man was a nut, but the man caught up to WALCOTT and remarked "wait until you see what I'm going to do to KENNEDY." After making these statements, the person WALCOTT believes was SIRHAN, kept hollering at WALCOTT, but WALCOTT paid no further attention to him, although he did see this person talking to othersat the bus station, none of whom are known to WALCOTT, and the content of any other conversation is unknown to WALCOTT except he believes he heard the word "Watts" mentioned to some male Negro.

WALCOTT stated he does not know SIRHAN, did not know if SIRHAN was armed at the time of the above incident, and so far as he could tell them person resembling or identical to SIRHAN was alone. He does recall that the person he believes to have been SIRHAN did talk with a foreign accent, and there was a person standing in the bus station observing SIRHAN, but WALCOTT does not know that he was or was not with SIRHAN and he can not now describe this person.

WALCOTT advised that the actions of the person he thinks was SIRHAN reminded him of one of the Los Angeles winos or homosexuals so he did not pay any further attention to him. WALCOTT did not know if the person xapxaxantingxisxkaxWAKKATT resembling SIRHAN was there to catch a bus or not. WALCOTT can not recall how this person was attired other than wearing dark clothes and a black coat which was nearly knee length. WALCOTT observed no vehicle in the pessession of this person, and the person mentioned nothing about his place of or elaboration residence nor any further information/to WALCOTT's knowledge on akf what he was going to do to KENNEDY.

WALCOTT, born 6/16/42 at San Angelo, Texas advised that he has a federal hold on him for interstate transportation of stolen travelers checks which charge is against him in Phoenix, Arizona.

Investigation to date has established no Arab Club or Organization of Arab Students on the campus at Pasadena City College. On 6/18/68, MUSTAFA BAHTISHI stated he knew there had been such an organization on the campus at CSC, LA, but believed it had been disbanded.

1) Determine if there are Arab clubs at CSC, LA, USC, and UCLA. Due to policy at CSC, LA, if it cannot be determined whether there is a club, ask school officials to advise officers of such a club to contact this office.

2) Determine officers of such clubs, and interview them concerning SIRHAN, as several reports have been received that SIRHAN belonged to such a club.

At 1:45 a. m., 6/17/68, an individual identifying himself as Doyle Truman Chaney advised he was calling from the suburbs of Galveston, Texas, and was following a car which contained three individuals who he suspected were involved in captioned murder. Chaney appeared to have been drinking, gave conflicting information during his conversation and would furnish no identifying information regarding himself beyond his name.

Chancy related that he had followed a 1951 Ford convertible bearing no license plates, from Houston to Galveston at speeds up to 120 mph. He had overheard the driver, a Negro male, state in a Houston gas station that he had just returned from participation in the poor people's demonstration in Washington and he, Chaney, suspected that the car's occupants, 2 Negro males and I Negro female, were armed with rifles and pistols and that one of the pistols, a . 22 caliber, was used in the Kennedy murder. He could not explain how he reached the conclusion that the gun or the individuals were involved in instant matter and his answers to questions posed in that regard were non-responsive.

WOOLF on 6/17/68 that the video tape of "Tempo I" which was aired on Wednesday, 6/5/68, has been erased. Mr. BAKER said this is routine practice. He noted that the addio tape of t he show, however, is retained.

Mr. BAKER said the show on 6/5/68 was devoted to the assault on Senator KENNEDY. Guests on the show were a Rabbi KRAMER and a neuro-surgeon Dr. ERNST JOHN PENKA, both of whom were not at the Ambassad or Hotel, and the following who were at the Ambassador:

<u>Miss LEONI PERERIS</u>, Office of Security, Department of State, advised SA KENNETH J. HASER on 6/17/68, that a check had been made of the files of that office re HAGOP HARUTIUM DJEREDJIAN. aka, but no additional information had been developed. She referred the FBI to CIA for additional data. She also advised that the general correspondence files of the Department of State had been checked with negative results.

The files of the Visa Office, Department of State, reviewed by SA HASER on 6/17/68, disclose that on 2/20/62, the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) at Los Angeles, California, requested the American Consulate at Beirut, Lebanon, to furnish certain info concerning HAGOP DJEREDJIAN, aka HAGOP JACK DJEREDJIAN. that his Lebanese passport 9181 issued at Beirut on 7/12/58, had been revalidated to 7/17/63, and that his stay in the U.S. as a nonimmigrant had been extended to 1/17/62.

The following information has been classified Confidential-Group I and any reporting must be protected:

CCNFIDENTIAL

The Embassy at Beirut on 3/19/62, forwarded to the Department of State the INS form mentioned above and enclosed the visa file of this individual, who had been issued a student visa by that Embassy on 9/10/59. DJEREDJIAN, having married an American citizen, was applying for adjustment of his status to that of a permanent resident. On 4/3/62, the Visa Office transmitted the Beirut visa file to INS at Los Angeles. [5-1][C]

On 4/30/62, the Embassy at Beirut informed the Department of State that it had received no further info from CIA and that its source was no longer available in this matter. 5-17/27

CIA, Beirut, Lebanon, on 12/5/58, informed the Embassy at Beirut as follows:

"A usually reliable source reports that the entire family was deeply involved in pro CP activities in recent months and was most active in the recent insurrection; source assumes subject was also so occupied, but is making a check".

On 4/30/62, CIA informed the Embassy that it had no objection to the forwarding of that info to INS. [5-1] [C]

Los Angeles may desire to check with INS, Los Angeles, to determine if portion of DJEREDJIAN's INS file is located now at Los Angeles.

### HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN INFORMATION CONCERNING

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Marge Rodak, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed at her place of employment, Motorola, Inc., 5005 East McDowell Road, Phoenix, at her request. Mrs. Rodak advised that on the Wednesday (June 5, 1968) following the assault on Robert F. Kennedy while she; her daughter, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian; and her son-in-law, Hagop H. Djeredjian, were watching television at the above 31st Street address, it was flashed on television a photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, as the assailant of Senator Kennedy. Mrs. Rodak advised that at that time Hagop Djeredjian stated "I know that man." Djeredjian further stated "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian) two days ago that Kennedy was going to be shot and Humphrey will probably be shot next and Ted Kennedy shot if he runs for office."

Mrs. Rodak advised that when she queried Djeredjian regarding these statements, he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. Rodak admitted that she dislikes her son-in-law intensely, advising that he never works and mistreats her daughter Sherie and her grandson David by Sherie's first marriage.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian was interviewed at 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona. At this time she denied that her husband made such statements

as related by her mother above. Mrs. Djeredjian stated that it was she who speculated two days before the actual assault on Kennedy that he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Vice President Hubert Humphrey and Senator Ted Kennedy would probably be shot also. Mrs. Djeredjian insisted that such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of these political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will, in fact, occur.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband is in the United States on a visa from Beirut, Lebanon; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles. She believes that he went to Pasadena City College where he was active in American Foreign Crusade, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. She stated she married Djeredjian on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against Djeredjian.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised that she and Djeredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965 until the latter part of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djeredjian supported the family on infrequent Perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Dr. Zohrab Djeredjian, No. 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djeredjian stated that during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and her son David drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, where she and David stayed while Djeredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which he returned to Phoenix June 4, 1968. She stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) regarding staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lampkin (phonetic) of INS in Los Angeles. Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband left Phoenix June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma

State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. Djeredjian advised she received a telephone call from her husband June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

On June 13, 1968, Special Agent Robert Keyser, U. S. Secret Service, Phoenix, Arizona, was advised of the above.

On June 13, 1968, Hagop H. Djeredjian was interviewed at Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma. He advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanon. During this period he worked with a Mr. Lampkin, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, U. S. State Department, Los Angeles, California. During this time he submitted numerous reports to Lampkin concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations, including the Arab Student Association.

He stated that in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after the assassination of Robert Kennedy, he saw a picture of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law that the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadena City College or Pasadena High School while attending school in Pasadena. He did not and still does not recognize the name Sirhahn Sirhahn. It was his opinion that of all the organizations, at Pasadena City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would come from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. Lewis, Dean of Admissions, and Mr. Weldon, ex-Dean of Admissions at Pasadena City College, might have more details concerning such individuals or organizations.

Djeredjian stated that the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 20, 1968, he had picked

up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Michigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. He stated that he had driven this automobile from Detroit to Phoenix and on May 27, 1968, from Phoenix to South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 2:10 p.m., where he turned in the car, received a cashier's check on the Bank of America for approximately \$113.00, cashed this check at the bank across the street and took a bus to Los Angeles.

In Los Angeles, he went to the office of Mr. Lampkin in the Federal Building, where he arrived at approximately 3 to 3:15 p.m. He talked with Mr. Lampkin concerning a possible trip of his back to Lebanon caused by his father's illness and departed at approximately 4:30 p.m. He walked several blocks to the Greyhound Bus Depot where he purchased a ticket to Phoenix, Arizona, and departed on this bus to Phoenix at approximately 7:10 p.m. that date. Djeredjian stated he had not been back to Los Angeles since that time for any reason. He stated he had not seen nor talked with any other person on that occasion in Los Angeles, and that he has no friends or acquaintances currently living in the Los Angeles area with whom he has visited recently or with whom he corresponds.

Djeredjian could not locate his ticket from Los Angeles to Phoenix but did produce a contract with the Ace Automobile Transportation Company to deliver a Cadillac to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. This contract indicated that the vehicle was picked up on May 20, 1968, in Detroit, Michigan, and was due on May 27, 1968, in South San Gabriel. This form indicated that after his arrival in South San Gabriel he could be reached in care of Rose Avakian, 13158 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California. Djeredjian stated he did not even know if Avakian still resided at that address or not; that he had not contacted her and that he only used her name because it was required on the contract to have a contact point in California.

Djeredjian denied that he had ever made any comments concerning the possible assassination of Vice President Humphrey or anyone else. He stated he had never commented about talking with anyone in Los Angeles about any assassination. He stated that when he first married, his motherin-law had notified the FBI in Phoenix that he was bringing dope in and was making approximately seventy thousand dollars per year which he was not declaring for income tax purposes.

Djeredjian advised he was running his own importexport business in Detroit, Michigan, prior to his departure in May, 1968.

Djeredjian advised that his ex-wife, Shakey Kasparian, current location unknown, a natural born American citizen, had previously complained in Los Angeles to the police about his taking nude photographs.

Djeredjian stated that while in Detroit, Michigan, he had produced the Armenian Radio Voice radio program and published a national weekly newspaper, "Hye Serant."

On June 14, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian and Mrs. Marge Rodak were re-interviewed. Both advised they had been mistaken about the dates of Hagop H. Djeredjian's traveling to Los Angeles, and both now agree that Djeredjian's travel dates coincided with dates reported by him above.

Hibbard Lamkin, Special Agent in Charge, U. S. Department of State, Office of Security, Los Angeles, advised on June 14, 1968, that Hagop H. Djeredjian, also known as Jack Djeredjian, last visited him the afternoon of May 27, 1968. Djeredjian requested Lamkin to intervene in Djeredjian's behalf regarding Djeredjian being departed by INS. Lamkin refused any assistance. This was the sole purpose of his visit, although Djeredjian mentioned he may visit his father in Lebanon. No mention was made of politics at this time.

Djeredjian First came to the attention of the State Department in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1959 where he served in informant capacity regarding fraudulent visas. Djeredjian subsequently came to the United States and attended Pasadena City College )PCC) starting September, 1959.

Since coming to the United States, Djeredjian has often visited Lamkin and also telephoned and written to him from all over the United States, mostly regarding visa fraud information, none of which information has ever been truthful. Lamkin stated Djeredjian cannot be believed and he will "feed" you anything if he thinks you will believe him. Djeredjian is a glory seeker and would welcome an interview by the FBI; however, he should be considered extremely unreliable.

Djeredjian last contacted Lamkin telephonically on June 12, 1968, from Wilburton, Oklahoma, where he attends Eastern Oklahoma State College. Djeredjian stated the FBI had talked to his wife, Sherie, and he assumed the FBI would contact him regarding Sirhan Sirhan. Djeredjian told Lamkin

Sergeant JOHN KENNEDY, San Diego Police Department (SDPD), San Diego, California, advised SA ARNOLD W. O'BRIEN as follows 5/20/68:

Approximately one week ago Lt. JACK COCHRAN, Intelligence Division, SDPD, received a telephone call from the Intelligence Division, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) requesting investigation by the SDPD to locate MIKE VEJVODA allogedly residing in the San Diego area.

Upon location, LAPD desired to be notified so that they could send LAPD Officers to San Diego to participate in interview.

LAPD indicated NIKE VEJYODA developed as possible associate of subject SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

Upon location of VEJVODA, Lt. COCHRAN telephonically contacted LAPD and determined LAPD no longer interested in being present at interview of VEJVODA.

Sgt. KERNEDY has no information why LAPD no longer interested and Lt. COCHRAN who is not presently available would be only person to know. ARANHEY suspects LAPD subsequently determined that MIKE VEJVODA no longer considered as possible associate of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

MIKE VEJVODA detained by SDPD and seach of premises and automobile located a carbine rifle semi-automatic and two cherry bombs covered with a plastic substance with carpet tacks imbedded therein and one cherry bomb unaltered.

VEJVODA questioned by SDPD re any association with SIRHAN B. SIRHAN and denied any association whatsbever. Investigation by SDPD failed to develop any information to indicate an association between them.

Pertiment details of papers found in possession of VEJVODA will be set forth under caption MICHAEL VEJVODA, IS -HISCELLANEOUS (MINUTEMEN).

In view of lack of request by LAPD for investigation concerning any association between VEJVODA and SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, no further investigation being conducted by the San Diego Division.

> On 6/17/68, Mr. HILTON VAIR, 1727 Lyndon Street, South Pasadena, California, telephone SY 9-7052, advised that he is a gun fancier and sports fishing enthusiast. About a month ago he had occasion to be in the Lock, Stock 'N Barrel Gun Shop above and talked at some length with the owner, BEN or BOB HERRICK, who has since been featured in the SIRHAN case as the proprietor of the shop who sold SIRHAN the .22 caliber ammunition used in the fatal shooting of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Mr. VEIR simply wished to say that on the basis of his conversation with HERRICK, Mr. VEIR got the distinct impression that HERRICK was a holder of extreme right wing opinions. HERRICK gave VEIR a pamphlet entitled "American Opinion" published and written by an individual known as GARY ALIEN of Belmont, Massachusetts. This pamphlet contains a narrative description of events leading up to and following the Watts riots and other riots and places the blame squarely on the black militant groups in the United States. VEIR said that during his conversation with HERRICK, the latter started talking about an ex-military officer in the San Gabriel Valley who is trying to get some official backing to form a para military organization which would be a back up force to the local police departments in the event of further racial outbreaks.

VEIR said he would keep this office advised of any further contacts he may have with HERRICK. Copy of this memo is designated for new 157 file on VEIR as potential racial informant regarding extremist groups.

The photograph of individuals struggling with SIRHAN was shown to Ambassador Hotel employees. Mr. KARL ENCKER identified himself and Mr. UNO TIMANSON identified himself in the photograph. The photograph has been marked as to the identities of the individuals developed so far.

Mr. EUGKER and Mr. TIMANSON identified GEORGE PLIMPTON, as marked, HENRY CARRILLO, ROSIE GRIER, and JOHN <u>O HANESIAN</u>. The individual struggling with SIRHAN, along with GEORGE PLIMPTON, is unknown at the present time. Lieutenant HUGHES advised that this might be JACK GALLIVAN, a KENNEDY aide; however, information was received that this individual may be an unidentified advance man for Senator KENNEDY who works on the staff of JERRY BRUNO.

The colored individual, Number 3, has not been identified. Mr. PAUL HONSTON of the "Los Angeles Times" advised that he believes that this is RICHARD AUBREY, a representative of the Negro Press Bureau of Los Angeles. Mr. HOUSTON stated that he had interviewed AUBREY shortly after the shooting.

The unidentified individuals in the photograph are numbered 3, 5, 6, and 9.
