On 6/11/68, Specialist Four BRUCE EDWARD FULTON was interviewed at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, concerning his acquaintance with SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN while at Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California. FULTON named three other acquaintances of SIRHAN at the college, one of them being RICHARD HUTTON.

On 6/21/68, Mr. WILLIAM HUTTON, father of RICHARD A. HUTTON, furnished HUTTON's current address as Cadet R. A. HUTTON, Company B, 6th Battalion, Second Brigade, 1968 ROTC Basic Camp, USATC Infantry, Fort Benning, Georgia.

AT FORT BENNING, GEORGIA. Will interview HUTTON for any information he has of the background of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, his nationalistic tendencies, political views, and anything suggesting SIRHAN's motives in shooting of Senator KENNEDY.

On 6/20/68, Father VINCENT TRAYNOR, Dean of Students, St. Gregory's College, Shawnee, Oklahoma, advised SA J. ROBINSON FIELD that DICK GREGORY appeared before the student body as a speaker on Sunday night, May 19, 1968. He advised that as Chairman of the Invitation Committee, he was on the speakers platform at the time GREGORY spoke and that GREGORY said nothing during his speech indicating an attempt would be made on the life of anyone.

On 6/20/68, Father DENIS STATHAM, Instructor, St. Gregory's College, advised SA FIELD that he attended a question and answer session in which students participated with GREGORY following his principal speech on May 19, 1968 and during that period GREGORY stated that one of the major political candidates would be (or probably would be) shot before the election. He stated that GREGORY appeared to have no particular source or authority for this statement, that it was not made in answer to a question and he believed it to be a statement made by GREGORY only as a possibility.

On June 17, 1968, Jose Refugio Rubalcava, Assistant Commander, Chihuahua State Judicial Police, Juarez, Mexico, advised that Crispin Curiel Gonzalez had been taken into custody on receipt of information that Curiel had possibly participated in the plot to assassinate Robert F. Kennedy at Los Angeles, California. [G-1] [W]

Curiel had in his possession, a letter written in English, which alleged that he had planned the assassination of Kennedy while under the influence of a drug which would destroy his memory. Curiel indicated he was an American citizen. [G-1] [W]

Newspaper reporters at Juarez interviewed Curiel in detail, at which time he admitted having written the letter, but without giving his motive. He then indicated that he had always wanted to do something big, and he spoke out vigorously, denouncing the Kennedy family as trying to establish a dictatorship in the United States. At this time, he stated that he would murder Edward Kennedy at such time as Edward Kennedy became a candidate for the presidency of the United States.

Curiel admitted the use of marijuana and LSD and stated he had left a juvenile detention home in Los Angeles, California.

On June 17, 1968, Curiel was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI, at which time he stated that he

considered the letter and his earlier interview with Juarez newspaper reporters as a big joke, explaining that newspaper reporters want news and this is what he gave them. He denied all specific knowledge of the Kennedy assassination, and stated that he had only seen Sirhan Sirhan on one occasion in the Main Public Library in Los Angeles, California. He described Sirhan as a "crazy Arab".

When questioned regarding his threat to kill Edward Kennedy, he emphatically denied this, and restated that he was only trying to be a "big shot with the press".

Of a background nature, Curiel stated he had been residing at the Manhattan Project, a juvenile home run by the Salvation Army, 602 South Van Ness, Los Angeles, and he identified his Probation Officer, specific nature of charges not determined, as Robert Wineandy, Vermont Avenue, Metropolitan Division, Los Angeles.

He stated that about three weeks ago he ran away from the detention home, and had been arrested by local police at Healdsburg, California while hitchhiking. He identified himself to the police as Alejandro Zaldivosqui Zamora, a Mexican citizen, born in Colima, Colima, Mexico. He was turned over to Border Patrol authorities and sent to Santa Rosa, California, and was subsequently flown to El Paso from where he was to be deported. At El Paso, he identified himself properly as an American citizen, and he was released from custody.

On June 18, 1968, Warren B. O'Neal, Chief, Investigations Division, U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, El Paso, advised that Curiel, as Alejandro Zaldivosqui Zamora, had been arrested in Healdsburg, California by Sergeant Bartoli of the Healdsburg, California Police Department, on May 31, 1968, when he noticed subject was being held forcibly inside a telephone booth.

Healdsburg Police Department records indicate that Zaldivosqui was being detained by Mischa Hain Karioff, 141 Cardiff, Los Angeles, California, telephone 271-4803, date of birth February 21, 1951, and by Byron

~~Samuel Gamberg~~, 3748 Westwood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, telephone 836-5572, date of birth October 7, 1951.

After subject made his claim to be of Mexican citizenship, he was turned over to Border Patrol officials and lodged in the Juvenile Detention Home, Santa Rosa, California, for one day, and was then transferred to Livermore, California, where he stayed three days prior to being airlifted to El Paso.

In El Paso, Zaldivosqui identified himself as Crispin Curiel Gonzalez, an American citizen, born November 10, 1951, at Ephrata, Washington, of Crispin Curiel Zamora and Maria Cruz Gonzalez.

O'Neal caused a check of birth records at Olympia, Washington, and verified the information as furnished.

Based on this, Curiel was released from Immigration custody at El Paso on June 6, 1968.

On June 18, 1968, "El Fronterizo", a Spanish language daily published at Juarez, Mexico, carried an extensive front page article including a photograph of Curiel, and captioned "Dangerous Yankee who says he is a conspirator in the Robert F. Kennedy crime advises the next one will be Edward Kennedy." This article sets out in detail, the information furnished by Assistant Commander Rubalcava, and the results of interview with Crispin by newspaper reporters.

For information of receiving offices, CURIEL was consigned to the Agente Del Ministerio Publico Federal (Federal District Attorney), Juarez, Mexico, and preliminary inquiry indicated CURIEL will be deported to the U. S. at El Paso, Texas.

For the possible interest of the Bureau and San Francisco, subject was fingerprinted on 5/31/68 by USINS at Livermore, California under the name of ALEJANDRO ZALDOVOSQUI ZAMORA, giving his date of birth as 5/3/51, Cuatemoc, Colima, Mexico.

Leads to interview KARIOFF and GAMBERG as described in the LHM, are being left to the discretion of Los Angeles.

El Paso contemplates preparation of a subsequent LHM in the immediate future.

Re interview of LOWELL J. BEAN, Assistant Professor of Anthropology at California State College, Hayward, California, and Los Angeles airtel to San Francisco, dated 6/13/68.

BEAN interviewed and the following is a summary of the results:

Subject SIRHAN was student in Cultural Anthropology class which he taught at Pasadena City College approximately Spring, 1964. There were many foreign students in the class. He recalls Subject as pleasant, polite, reliable, and a good student except for two emotional outbursts during discussions with other students on the Israeli-Arab Conflict.

At the request of BEAN, Subject gave an informal report to class on Arabic culture. Subject discussed Pan-Arabanism, a joining together of all Arabic nations into a dominant cultural and political block which will become a major political power in the Near East. An American-Jewish student in class either asked Subject a controversial question or made a negative remark about the Arabs involved in the conflict which caused Subject to become very emotional, almost to the point of violence in his defense of the Arabs. The eruption almost became a fist fight before it was stopped by BEAN.

Either after this incident or on another occasion within a short time later, Subject again became involved in a very heated discussion in the hall at school with a student on the Arab-Moslem-Israeli Conflict. He had almost an uncontrollable temper in defense of Arab National Unity.

On two occasions in 1965, after Subject had left Pasadena City College, he stopped in to see BEAN at school and had lunch with him on one visit and dinner with him on the other visit. BEAN was teaching night school during the latter visit. BEAN cannot recall any of their conversation during these two visits. Neither can he recall identity of other student in his class with whom Subject argued, but may be able to identify this student if he saw a roster of the class.

Mrs. BEVERLY B. REMMEL, 5144 Cantrell Road, Little
Rock, Arkansas, furnished the following information on
6/21/68:

She had on infrequent occasions, possibly six or
eight times during the last two or three years seen an
individual in Little Rock, Arkansas, resembling the newspaper
photograph of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. She described this individual
as a white male in his early 20's, short in stature, slender,
dark bushy hair, "Shepherd-boy type", dark complexion, wiry
build, usually dressed in dark plaid shirts and slacks. She
had no idea as to the identity of this individual or the young
man who was his usual companion other than the companion was
taller and may have been older. Mrs. REMMEL is an artist,
and her attention had been drawn to this young man because
of "his sympathetic face." She could not furnish any specific
times or circumstances under which she had seen this individual
other than it was usually in the summer time and at restaurants
at lunch time. The restaurants were the Cowshed and Bard's.

The last time she saw this individual was on or about 5/29/68 at Bard's Restaurant when he was accompanied by his usual male companion. Mrs. REMMEL was accompanied by her 17 year old daughter, Mrs. JOE MILLER. On this occasion, Mrs. MILLER told Mrs. REMMEL that she had briefly met the individual at a public meeting at Little Rock University at sometime in the past. Mrs. REMMEL had some recollection that her daughter had also stated that this individual was from Jerusalem.

A photograph of SIRHAN was shown to Mrs. REMMEL, and she stated that there was a strong resemblance between the SIRHAN photograph and the individual she had seen in restaurants.

Mrs. JOE D. MILLER, 4400 West 10th Street, Little Rock, Arkansas, furnished the following information on 6/21/68:

She recalled the incident described above by her mother, but after viewing a photograph of SIRHAN stated he definitely was not identical with the individual she and her mother had seen at Bard's Restaurant in May, 1968. She explained that about Christmas, 1967, she attended a public meeting at Little Rock University sponsored by the campus fraternities attended by the public. Some person not recalled had simply introduced to her the same individual who was seen by herself and her mother later in May, 1968, at Bard's Restaurant. She described this individual as being a white male, about 22, 5'5", slender build, dark complexion, dark bushy hair. She could not furnish the names of any persons who might have known this individual. She assumed that this individual was a Little Rock University student.

For the information of the Los Angeles Office, if the whereabouts of SIRHAN cannot be established for the date 5/29/68, it is possible that through extensive investigation at Little Rock University the identity of the individual seen by Mrs. MILLER and Mrs. REMMEL could be established.

Specialist IV **BRUCE EDWARD FULTON**, RA 19878345, Maintenance and Support Division of "HAWK Project", Directorate of Arsenal Support/Operations, U. S. Army Missile Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, was reinterviewed for the purpose of ascertaining any additional information he may have recalled since the previous interview on June 10, 1968.

FULTON advised that he had given the matter a great deal of thought but it was very difficult for him to remember because it has been almost three years since he last saw SIRHAN.

FULTON stated that he recalled that **CRAIG BLISS**, a former student at Pasadena City College, was an acquaintance of SIRHAN. He said that BLISS, a Navy veteran, worked as a bartender at night while attending Pasadena City College. FULTON stated he did not know the name of the bar but it is located at the intersection of North Lake Street and Altadena Drive, Altadena, California. FULTON stated that he remembered a pretty girl he believed was a member of the same foreign-type club (name unknown) as SIRHAN. FULTON advised that he did not think that this girl was SIRHAN's girlfriend but just an acquaintance. FULTON said that he believed the girl's name was SONJA (phonetic). He could not recall her last name. FULTON described the pretty young lady as 19 years of age, 5'4", 115 pounds, with black hair and dark complexion, and possibly an Arab.

FULTON advised he could recall no additional information other than what he had just mentioned and the information furnished in the previous interview on June 10, 1968.

Missile Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, was apprised
of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature
of the investigation. FULTON furnished the following in-
formation:

FULTON stated that he is acquainted with SIRHAN BIRSHARA SIRHAN. He advised he first met SIRHAN at the "Student Union Coffee Shop" on the campus at Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California about September 1964. He said that he could not recall the last time that he saw SIRHAN but it was sometime prior to December 1965 because this is when he (FULTON) left City College. FULTON described his relationship with SIRHAN as a "campus acquaintance" in that he did not socialize with SIRHAN off campus, advising that he did not go to SIRHAN's house, nor did SIRHAN ever come to his house. He advised that his conversations with SIRHAN were usually held in the coffee shop during breaks or between, after or before classes. During these conversations, FULTON recalls discussions of Arab and Israel conflict, at which time SIRHAN had expressed his dissatisfaction with the administration and the newspapers because he believed that they sided with Israel. FULTON described SIRHAN as an introvert and a loner. He advised that SIRHAN never exhibited a tendency towards violence while in his presence. He advised that SIRHAN's reaction was that of an individual who was loyal to his country. FULTON advised that SIRHAN was very devoted to Jordan and it was his (FULTON's) opinion, based on conversation with SIRHAN, that SIRHAN eventually wanted to return to Jordan.

FULTON said that he is sure that politics were discussed during conversations with SIRHAN but he could not recall SIRHAN mentioning his political views, party or specific political candidate.

FULTON denied he commuted to and from college with SIRHAN. He said that he did recall riding on one or two

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occasions, in an old model Cadillac (year and color unknown) owned by SIRHAN but was unable to recall where he went during these rides with SIRHAN or the circumstances involved. FULTON stated that he enrolled in Pasadena City College in September 1963 and quit college (without a degree) in December 1965. He said that while attending college, he resided at 2446 East Washington Boulevard, Pasadena, California with his mother, JANE H., and younger brother, DOUGLAS.

FULTON advised that he usually took a bus to and from school although on occasion his cousin, RICHARD HUTTON, would pick him up or drop him off at home. FULTON stated that he did not know where SIRHAN lived.

He said that he recalled that SIRHAN worked at a service station at night while attending college. He could not recall the name of the station but it is located on a main street, one block north of Colorado Street, running parallel to Colorado Street, and east of the front entrance of Pasadena City College. FULTON further advised that he believed that SIRHAN was a member of some type of foreign club (name unknown) on the campus of City College.

FULTON stated that after he quit Pasadena City College, he enlisted in the United States Army and entered on duty February 21, 1966 at Fort Polk, Louisiana for boot camp. He completed his training on April 30, 1966 and then returned home on a fourteen-day leave. He then, after the leave, reported to Redstone Arsenal, where he arrived approximately May 14 and has been there ever since. FULTON advised he was at home on leave from March 6, 1968 through March 18, 1968, his most recent return to California. FULTON said that he did not see or talk to SIRHAN during his leave in 1968 or in 1966.

FULTON stated that usually the conversations with SIRHAN were in the company of other students. FULTON advised that it is possible that the following persons could recall something more specific about SIRHAN:

On 6/23/68 at 11:50 P.M. Mrs. EVELYN WOOD, telephone 793-1924, Pasadena, Calif. who refused to furnish her address, telephonically contacted the office. She advised as follows:

That the FB I should check out the Jewish Men's Club in Portland, California for information concerning the Kennedy tragedy in Los Angeles.

She said she desired to speak with an agent of the FBI on 6/24/68 and would furnish additional information in this regard. She said she would call the office in the morning of 6/24/68.

She also advised that she had had a dream one night recently concerning a decapitated man, and that all she saw was the head. She would not furnish additional information.

EVIDIO PEREIRA ACOSTA was interviewed at his place of employment, the Mutual Type Company, 3838 North Kedzie Avenue. He advised that he has been living in an apartment of EVIDIO HERNANDEZ, 5707 Ridge Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. He furnished the following information:

On May 21, 1968, a meeting was held at 3800 Amesbury, Hollywood, California. At this meeting a talk and slides were shown concerning life in Cuba which was slanted in favor of the current FIDEL CASTRO government. He attended this meeting along with a number of other anti-FIDEL CASTRO Cubans. During the meeting he spoke against the present Cuban government and a number of those present took exception to his remarks. An individual seated to his left and near the platform challenged him on several points he made including the fact that life in Cuba today is not as pleasant as the slides at this program would tend to portray. This individual, who challenged him, said that those Cubans who attempted to return to Cuba during the "Bay of Pigs" invasion were mere mercenaries and that the displaced Cubans in the United States were mostly a bunch of "bums".

He stated after viewing a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN that he was 70 per cent sure that the individual referred to above, who challenged his statements at this meeting, was SIRHAN. He concluded by stating that he could not be certain of this but thought that others present at this meeting might have had a better view of this individual. He suggested that one FRANK GUTIERREZ, a Cuban known to other members of his group at this meeting, might be able to identify this individual. He added that he could not be sure but he thought that SIRHAN may have been with one or two other individuals at this meeting.

This was the extent of what Mr. White heard. Mr. White described the subj. as approx. 5'10"; Med. Bld.; Dark, short hair; DARK OLIVE complexion; AND WEARING A HANDLED BAR moustache AND Lt. BLUE SUMMER suit.

The subj., who appeared to be alone, THEN left the bar.

On 6/21/68, Captain DON BURKE, Pomona, California, Police Department, made available a copy of information taken by his department on 6/20/68. This related to information furnished by MICHAEL EDWARD WHITE, 1879 Shirley Place, Pomona, California.

The following is information furnished by WHITE to the police department and obtained through personal interview by SA KELLISON, 6/21/68:

At approximately 10:45 PM, 6/20/68, while WHITE was in the Mardi Gras Bar, 903 East Mission Boulevard, Pomona, he observed an individual enter the bar, obtain change for a quarter and make a telephone call while in the bar.

WHITE related that he paid no attention to the individual until he heard him use the word "assassination".

He then listened to the man's conversation, which took about five minutes, and overheard him say that he was taking a girl to Palm Springs and that he did not want to get involved in the assassination anymore. He heard the man advise the other party that he could be reached at a telephone number in Indio, California. WHITE recalled the telephone number as EXpress 9-2227.

WHITE described the man as a male Caucasian, 25 to 30 years of age, 5'10", medium build, dark hair, cut short, dark olive complexion, having handbar mustache and wearing a light blue summer suit.

After the man left the bar, WHITE said that he saw him no more.

HADDAD stated he was born May 5, 1931 in Basra, Iraq. He is a graduate civil engineer and he came to the United States as a visitor in April 1960. He applied and received a student visa and he has attended

several graduate engineering courses at the University of Southern California, Los Angeles. His present status is permanent resident and he has alien registration number [REDACTED]

HADDAD said about two weeks back, he did make inquiries as to what procedures were required for travel across the border into Mexico. He stated he asked some people he knew and they referred him to the Immigration Office.

HADDAD advised he was merely interested in travel to a border town to see what the people and the country was like. He would like to visit Mexico City someday.

He stated he called the Immigration Office and was told his alien registration card would permit him re-entry into the United States if he was to cross the border. He was told a visa was required if he intended to visit the interior of Mexico, since he did not have citizen

HADDAD said he was interested in Mexico only as a vacation spot. He intends to apply for citizenship as soon as he is eligible. He stated he is presently not employed, but have an offer for an engineering position.

HADDAD presented his alien registration card for identification which showed that he has registration number [REDACTED] His birth-date was indicated as May 5, 1931. The card was issued at Los Angeles, California, on May 4, 1966, which revealed his classification as Z-2.

DICK ROMO, telephone 657-1333, staying at the Cessa-Marque, which he pronounced as Sessa markee, in Hollywood, called the office at 11:45 PM. He said he was in the crowd of people at the Ambassador Hotel on the night that ROBERT F. KENNEDY was killed. He wants to talk to an agent on 6/24/68.

ROMO advised that he wants to handle the assassin of KENNEDY himself. He wants to put syrup and red ants and two tarantulas on the assassins body. He also desires to get into the jail where SIRHAN is being held and take a doll in there and place on the doll the syrup and red ants and the two tarantulas so SIRHAN can "go crazy". He desires to do the same thing with the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

He stated something to the effect that SA ANDERSON was "talking to 38 million dollars."

He added that "They", whom he did not identify further, had killed three of his little nieces in Mexico, in Guadalajara, and he wanted "them" to pay for that, and that they would not kill anymore.

He added that all it would take from him would be a telephone call and the NAACP, the American Legion, the Navy and the Marines would take over the jail and turn SIRHAN over to him for himself to handle.

On 6-18-68, Mrs. PHILLIP L. WOOD, 4036 Hurley Court, Toledo, Ohio, telephonically furnished the following information to the Toledo Resident Agency:

Since the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY she has recalled a former Toledo, Ohio resident who had the reputation of being bitterly anti-Semitic and was considered by her to be the most anti-Semitic person she has ever encountered. In view of the fact that this person has now moved to California, she wanted to bring his name to the attention of proper authorities. She has no reason to believe that he is in any manner associated with captioned matter but did feel that he would be the type who would become very emotional about the Israeli-Arab situation.

The person she referred to is MICHAEL VALENTINE, white, male, about 40 years of age, wife - WANDA, two children, of 250 North Mountain Trail, Sierra Madre, California. As of 1964, this was VALENTINE's address; however, she has had no correspondence with the family since that time. VALENTINE was employed by Sears-Roebuck in Toledo and left this area in 1963 to secure employment with Sears in California.

Subject has an aunt, Mrs. MARY PRINCE, 61 West State Street, Pasadena, California, who should know the current location of the VALENTINE family should this become necessary.

HORVATH, 9176 La Barca, Fountain Valley, California, telephone 962-5082, advised on June 7, 1968, that on June 5, 1968, he called the FBI Office in Los Angeles and related a conversation he had with the owner of a hardware store at the Five Points Shopping Center in Huntington Beach, California, on June 1, 1968.

Mr. HORVATH stated that on June 1, 1968, he went to the above hardware store to buy some paint and while he was there, one of the employees, whose name he does not know, but who fits the description of JAMES E. JAYCOCKS, asked him what he thought about the election and asked him who he thought would win. Mr. JAYCOCKS stated that as far as he was concerned, the only one acceptable would be Mr. HUMPHREY. Mr. HORVATH did not answer his questions directly but stated he liked President JOHN F. KENNEDY. Mr. JAYCOCKS stated that if Senator KENNEDY got elected president, in a couple of days they are going to shoot him. He said JAYCOCKS stated he knows four guys in the Veterans Administration Hospital who are going to shoot him. Mr. HORVATH stated that that was ridiculous and mentioned the fact that the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY was stupid. JAYCOCKS replied "Well as far as I'm concerned it wasn't soon enough." Mr. HORVATH said that JAYCOCKS then stated "Maybe I shouldn't have said that. I shouldn't talk about the death".

Mr. HORVATH at the time felt that Mr. JAYCOCKS "just talks too much" but after Mr. HORVATH heard of the assassination of Senator KENNEDY and before he knew that the suspected assassin had been identified, he thought that he should contact the authorities with the above information so that the assassin's photograph could be shown at the Veterans Administration Hospital. Mr. HORVATH said that JAYCOCKS did not state which Veterans Administration Hospital he had reference to but he assumes it was the Long Beach, California, installation.

JAMES E. JAYCOCKS, an employee of the Five Points Hardware Store, was interviewed on June 7, 1968. Mr. JAYCOCKS stated that he resides at 7602 Taylor in Huntington Beach.

him He said that about the middle of May, 1968, an occasional customer of the hardware store who has been in on approximately six occasions over the past two years started talking to Mr. JAYCOCKS about the upcoming elections. This person, whose name Mr. JAYCOCKS does not know, mentioned the fact that he had been to the Veterans Administration Hospital. He did not state which city, but Mr. JAYCOCKS assumes that it was the Long Beach, California, installation and that the "fellows at the VA were hot at Senator KENNEDY because of the way in which he was aiding the enemy". He said that the Veterans Administration patients stated that Senator KENNEDY by his actions and speeches about Vietnam was aiding the enemy while they were over there giving their lives for their country. This person said that some of the patients at the hospital said that if KENNEDY were president, someone ought to shoot him.

Mr. JAYCOCKS denied making any statement indicating that he knew four individuals in the Veterans Administration Hospital who were going to shoot Senator KENNEDY and he said that he knows absolutely nothing about Senator KENNEDY's assassination.

Mr. JAYCOCKS said that he repeated the conversation he had with this unknown individual on three or four occasions with customers of the hardware store and also with his wife.

CHARLES SHIRO, Spring Lake, New Jersey, was interviewed on 6/21/68, and advised the following:

SHIRO heard DICK GREGORY's speech on the campus of St. Gregory's College, Shawnee, Oklahoma, and also part of his speech at the Commons. SHIRO stated that he did not hear GREGORY say LINDSAY or KENNEDY of New York would be shot before elections. He stated GREGORY's talk was a racist-type in that the theme was the difference in color and I, GREGORY, should have things my way. He also stated that the whites owed the colored a lot.

SHIRO stated that he heard from his history teacher, Father MYRON JULY, that GREGORY said DALY, LINDSAY or KENNEDY were going to be assassinated before the elections in the fall.

This was said by GREGORY in DAVID CANTON's home in Shawnee, Oklahoma. CANTON is an English professor at St. Gregory's College. SHIRO stated he actually did not hear GREGORY make any remarks regarding assassination of anyone.

BEN HANSEN, Associated Press, telephone 746-1200 or 746-1201, telephoned the office at 1:37 PM, 6/21/68, concerning the same report of threats against PARSONS, and was also told we have no comment concerning PARSONS. HANSEN desired to know who would make a comment on it and who would have the information if we did not. He was told of course local authorities would be the ones to offer protection, and insofar as the FBI is concerned we have no comment.

HAROLD EDWARD HUGHES, Political Editor, "The Oregonian", Oregonian Building, who resides at 8050 SW Wareham Drive, furnished the following information:

HUGHES was with the Kennedy Party at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California on the night Senator KENNEDY was shot. He did not see SIRHAN prior to the shooting and does not know why Senator KENNEDY changed his original plan to go directly to the Colonial Room (which was the press room) immediately after his speech that night. He furnished the following account of his knowledge of the shooting.

HUGHES was in the Colonial Room (which was the press room) at the Ambassador Hotel on the night of the shooting at 12:00 midnight. He and other correspondents watched Senator KENNEDY's speech on closed circuit TV in the Colonial Room. They had been informed by members of the Kennedy Staff that Senator KENNEDY would come directly to the Colonial Room after his speech for a short press conference. Therefore immediately upon the conclusion of the speech, ROBERT HEALY of the "Boston Globe", opened the door from the Colonial Room into the kitchen (where the shooting subsequently took place) to facilitate Senator KENNEDY's entrance in the Colonial Room. A few moments after HEALY opened the door, HUGHES heard what he thought were two series of shots, possibly 3 or 4 in each series, but thought at the time it was balloons popping or perhaps small firecrackers. He and other members of the press corps rushed out the door and into the kitchen. There HUGHES saw RAYFORD JOHNSON and ROOSEVELT GRIER wrestling with the individual later identified as SIRHAN. SIRHAN still had the gun in his hand, which appeared to HUGHES to be a snub nosed revolver, similar to that carried by detectives. Someone shouted "Break his arm!".

JESS UNRUH jumped up on a table and shouted "Don't kill him, he has to stand trial".

HUGHES stated that since it was obvious that

SIRHAN was under control and was not going to get away, HUGHES went to where Senator KENNEDY was lying on the floor. He saw no blood and Senator KENNEDY appeared conscious and HUGHES was optimistic at this point.

HUGH McDONALD of the Kennedy Staff was on a table shouting "no pictures" and other members of the staff urged everybody to stand back and give Senator KENNEDY air.

HUGHES therefore left the scene, since he could do nothing to aid, and went back to the Colonial Room to telephone his paper. On the way he noticed that ROOSEVELT GRIER by that time had the gun in his possession. HUGHES estimates that this was about 3 minutes after the shots were first heard.

After HUGHES had telephoned his paper, which took about 5 minutes, he returned to the kitchen at which time SIRHAN was on his feet and uniformed officers were arriving to take SIRHAN into custody. At that time HUGHES got his first and only good look at SIRHAN's face, but is positive he can identify him if he sees him again.

HUGHES saw the police take SIRHAN out and saw Senator KENNEDY removed from the kitchen on a stretcher. HUGHES then ran out of the hotel through the lobby, saw Senator KENNEDY loaded into an ambulance and the ambulance leave. He looked at his watch at that time and noticed that it was exactly 12:30 AM.

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN
MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Marge Rodak, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed by Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. She advised that on the Wednesday immediately following the assault of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, while she, her daughter Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djerredjian and her son-in-law Hagop Djerredjian, were watching television and when the photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan was placed on the television screen, Hagop Djerredjian said, "I know that man". Djerredjian further stated, "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. Djerredjian) two days ago that Kennedy was going to be shot and Humphrey will probably be shot next and Ted Kennedy shot if he runs for office?" Mrs. Rodak further stated when she queried Djerredjian regarding these statements he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. Rodak admitted she dislikes her son-in-law intensely, saying he never works and mistreats her daughter, Sherie, and her grandson, David, by Sherie's first marriage.

Mrs. Djerredjian was interviewed at 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, at which time she denied her husband made such statements as related by her mother above. Mrs. Djerredjian further stated it was she who speculated two days before the actual assault on Kennedy he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Humphrey and Ted Kennedy would probably be shot also. Mrs. Djerredjian insists such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will in fact occur.

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN

Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband is in the United States on visa from Beirut, Lebanon; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles, California, and believes he went to Pasadena City College where he was active in the American Foreign Crusade, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. Mrs. Djeredjian stated she married Djeredjian on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against Djeredjian.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised she and Djeredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965, until the latter week of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djeredjian supported the family on infrequent perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Doctor Zohrab Djeredjian, Number 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djeredjian stated during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and son, David, drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, Arizona, where she and David stayed in Phoenix while Djeredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which time he returned again to Phoenix on June 4, 1968. Mrs. Djeredjian stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with Immigration and Naturalization Service regarding his staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lampkin of the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Los Angeles.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised Djeredjian left Phoenix on June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. Djeredjian advised
