Miss LEONI PEPERIS, Office of Security, Department of State advised SA KENNETH J. HASER on 6/25/68, that a search had been made of the Visa Office, Department of State but no record of GILDERDINE OPPENHEIMER could be located. It is noted that the Visa Office maintains files on fewer than 1% of all aliens to whom U. S. visas are issued throughout the world, in view of the fact that the visa files are maintained by the issuing consulate.

IC HUGH L. KNIGHT caused a check to be made of the files of the Central Office, INS on 6/25/68, but no record of OPPENHEIMER could be located. It is noted that if she entered the U. S. recently as an alien, it might well be too early for the I-94 form reflecting her arrival to have reached file.

Mrs. VERDE CRENSHAW, Passport Office, Department of State advised SA HASER on 6/25/68, that a search had been made of the files of that office but no record of a U. S. passport application by OPPENHEIMER could be located.

It is suggested that Los Angeles check the INS office in Los Angeles concerning this individual.

Mrs. TESS WHITEHOUSE was contacted at 415 East  
Broadway, Apartment 4, San Gabriel, California, telephone  
2854794 on 6/17/68 by SA BENZ.

WHITEHOUSE advised that during 1961 - 1964 she  
was employed as a case worker for the Catholic Welfare  
Bureau, 115 North Rose, Compton, California. WHITEHOUSE  
stated that during that time the SIRHAN family (father,  
mother and children) had come into the office and that they  
had been assigned to her. She could not recall the specific  
year or month in which this happened. WHITEHOUSE stated  
that the reason she remembered the SIRHAN family was that  
they had recommended to her that she read two books, one  
entitled "Secret Doctrine" and "Talk at the Foot of the  
Master".

WHITEHOUSE stated that the Catholic Welfare Bureau,  
115 North Rose, Compton, California, telephone 639-4583,  
would have the record of the contacts that the SIRHAN family  
made with the Catholic Welfare Bureau and that this record would  
also contain WHITEHOUSE's diagnostic impressions at the time.

SA BENZ telephonically contacted Mrs. VIVIAN THOMAS,  
Supervisor, Catholic Welfare Bureau, 115 North Rose, Compton,  
California, telephone 639-4583, on June 17, 1968, to request  
that she locate the record described by WHITEHOUSE, so that

THOMAS stated that she would contact WHITEHOUSE to obtain more information to assist THOMAS in locating a record that the Catholic Welfare Bureau might have on the SIRHAN family.

THOMAS telephonically contacted SA BENZ on 6/21/68 and advised that THOMAS had telephonically contacted WHITEHOUSE, but that WHITEHOUSE had not provided her any information which could assist THOMAS in locating any records that the Catholic Welfare Bureau might have on the SIRHAN family. THOMAS stated that on the basis of what information she had it was her best judgement that the Catholic Welfare Bureau had never given any assistance to the SIRHAN family.

Re complaint form dated 6/5/68, from SA THOMAS R. JUDD (56-156-58).

This complaint concerns a telephone call from JERRY LEWIS, Columbia Pictures Corporation Studios, regarding a call he had received from one FRANK CULLEN, a security guard at the Sportsmen's Lodge Hotel, who claims he had seen the suspect, SIRHAN SIRHAN, on an elevator with Senator KENNEDY sometime during the campaign in California.

Inquiry at the Sportsmen's Lodge, 12825 Ventura Boulevard, North Hollywood, California, disclosed that FRANK CULLEN was not known at the Sportsmen's Lodge Hotel (see FD 302 of SA's LESLIE F. WARREN and LLOYD O. BOGSTAD).

FRANK CULLEN was identified as FRANCIS D. CULLEN, 455 Laurel Canyon Drive, North Hollywood, telephone 761-2637, through a current Los Angeles telephone directory. On 6/21/68, CULLEN was interviewed by SA's LESLIE F. WARREN and RICHARD M. WOOLF (see FD 302 dated 6/27/68).

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

SYLVIA WRIGHT was interviewed in Room 3003, Time and Life Building, Rockefeller Center, New York, New York. She stated that she is employed as a writer for "Life Magazine" and that she resides at 42-10 Golden Street, Flushing, Queens.

WRIGHT stated that she travelled continuously as a writer for "Life Magazine" with Senator ROBERT KENNEDY during his campaign to seek the Democratic Party Presidential nomination from March 14, 1968 through June 5, 1968, other than two weekends and four other days. She was acting as a writer on June 4-5, 1968, in Los Angeles, California. She stated that during the entire period of Senator KENNEDY's campaign, she never observed SIRHAN SIRHAN.

WRIGHT stated that Senator KENNEDY always spoke to the press after he had made his speeches to his supporters and volunteers of his campaign. She said that she did not know of any planned route Senator KENNEDY was to make from the Ambassador Room to the Colonial Room or visa versa. She said that it was generally known that Senator KENNEDY in the spur of a moment, would change the route cleared or suggested by members of his staff. WRIGHT stated that Senator KENNEDY had, on several different occasions, detained his staff to meet, shake hands and converse with individuals along his route while campaigning.

WRIGHT stated that she had telephonically contacted the Rocket Messenger Service in the afternoon on June 4, 1968, and requested a messenger to be available at the Ambassador Hotel. She said this messenger was to deliver the film taken that day by BILL EPPRIDGE, photographer for "Life Magazine", regarding the events at the Ambassador Hotel. The film was to be taken to headquarters. She said for some unknown reason she thought that Senator KENNEDY's victory speech would be at approximately 8:00 pm and for this reason requested that the messenger from Rocket Messenger Service report to the Ambassador Hotel at approximately 6:30 pm.

She said that at approximately 7:00 pm, when she first saw the messenger from Rocket Messenger Service, the messenger informed her that he had had no supper. She furnished him with a blue press identification card so that he could enter the Ambassador Hotel later that evening. WRIGHT said that she returned to her room, 348, at the Ambassador Hotel at which time she observed the messenger attempting to enter a room across the hall from her room. She remarked to the messenger "I thought you wanted to eat." The messenger replied, "It's too crowded". WRIGHT said that the messenger appeared to be familiar and knew his way around the hotel as it would be difficult for a person to leave the Colonial Room and get to the 3rd floor in the area of Room 348 in that short period of time.

WRIGHT said that she went to her room to change to a dress from a suit because it was too warm for a suit. She also picked up the envelope for the film of EPPRIDGE to be placed in for the messenger. She said that shortly afterward she joined the KENNEDY staff members and close friends in the suite on the fifth floor.

WRIGHT stated she gave the messenger the film at approximately 9:15 pm to be delivered to the airport and to be sent on a flight at 10:00 pm. She informed the messenger to return to the Colonial Room for another delivery to the airport after Senator KENNEDY's speech. WRIGHT said that the messenger appeared to be very excited and wanted to know would he get to see Senator KENNEDY. She said that she did not give the messenger any answer. WRIGHT stated that she did not see the messenger again until after Senator KENNEDY was shot.

WRIGHT said that DICK HAYWOOD, of the Washington Post, informed her at approximately 10:00 pm that Senator KENNEDY had just informed him that after his, KENNEDY's speech, a party was to be held at the "Factory" a discotheque, for the traveling press and close friends of the KENNEDY staff. She said HAYWOOD told her that he was requested by Senator KENNEDY to inform the traveling press of the party.

At approximately 11:00 pm on June 4, 1968, she went down to the Ambassador Room to locate CHARLES EVERS, as Senator KENNEDY had previously requested her to do so. She said she went down and located CHARLES EVERS in the Ambassador Room and they returned to the KENNEDY suite on the 5th floor. She said that as Senator KENNEDY departed from the 5th floor suite to proceed to the Ambassador Room to deliver his speech she escorted Senator KENNEDY to the elevator. KENNEDY pulled her head to his and whispered, "Don't go to the Ambassador Room as there will be a lot of commotion during my victory speech." WRIGHT also said that Senator KENNEDY asked her if she was going to join the party at the "Factory." She said she informed Senator KENNEDY that she thought she would join the party.

WRIGHT said that she watched Senator KENNEDY deliver his victory speech on television and near the completion left the suite by the way of the stairs to go to the Colonial Room. She said when she got to the Colonial Room the doors were closed and she was denied entry until the police officers checked her credentials. WRIGHT stated it appeared that Senator KENNEDY had been shot as she descended the stairs.

Upon entering the Colonial Room through the main entrance she observed the messenger at an exit of the Colonial Room nearest to the one that Senator KENNEDY appeared to be heading for prior to him being shot. She went to that exit and looked into the passageway where the Senator and the other individuals had been shot.

WRIGHT stated that at approximately 12:30 am on June 5, 1968, she signed the receipt requested by the messenger in the Colonial Room which covered the period of time the service of the messenger was used. She said she also obtained the receipt from the messenger regarding his delivery of the film she had given him at approximately 9:15 pm on June 4, 1968.

WRIGHT described the messenger as a skinny, well tanned white male, who was approximately 45 years of age with grey hair. She said that is all she can recall of the events that took place on the evening, night and early morning of June 5 and 4, 1968.

Mr. and Mrs. RICHARD L. HINELINE, 606 Circle Drive, Solana Beach, California, on 6/25/68, examined pictures of ADEL, SHARIF, MARY, SAIDALLAH, MUNIR and SIRHAN SIRHAN, and both were unable to identify any of these people as being a person they saw while in the Lock Stock and Barrel Gun Shop, San Gabriel, California, on 6/1/68.

Mr. HINELINE said he was in the gun shop on 6/1/68, from about 12 noon until about 2 or 3 PM, and during this time he did not pay any particular attention to anyone who entered the shop and there was no unusual happening while he was there which might have caused him to pay any particular attention to any customer. He said Mr. HERICK and an employee named LEE (LNU) were the employees in the store while he was there. He said he returned to the shop with Mrs. HINELINE about 4 PM and they remained there until about 6 PM.

Mrs. HINELINE said she did not pay any particular attention to anyone who entered the shop during the time she was there and nothing unusual happened which might have caused her to pay any particular attention to anyone in the store.

Mrs. HINELINE said her daughter told her SIRHAN SIRHAN had been in the store about six weeks prior to 6/1/68, with one or two other men who did not speak English. She said her daughter told her she had mentioned this information to agents of the FBI at Los Angeles.

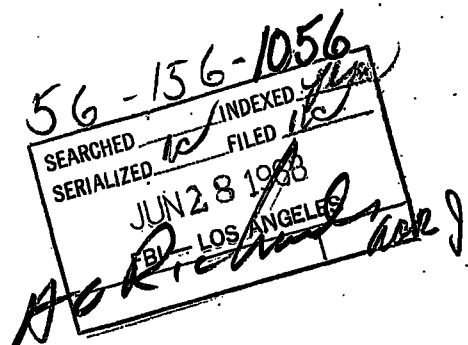

# Judge's Accuser Gets Contempt Jail Order

John M. Lawrence, 40, of 1950 Broadway, was sentenced to Denver County Jail Tuesday for an indefinite period for accusing District Judge Don D. Bowman in open court of "committing crimes of misdemeanors and felonies."

Lawrence, a self-proclaimed expert on the law who never went to law school, was the star of another fantastic court hearing which culminated in his conviction for contempt of court.

Although told in a hearing a week ago to stop harassing the court with petitions in the Metropolitan Capital Improvements District tax case, Lawrence topped his previous efforts with new motions to disqualify Judge Bowman and to intervene as "attorney pro se for defendants."

It was also disclosed during the hearing that Lawrence Monday filed a \$10,000 libel suit in U.S. District Court naming Judge Bowman, the Rocky

Mountain News and five of the newspaper's employees.

Judge Bowman patiently attempted for 90 minutes Tuesday to hear Lawrence's arguments on why the court should disqualify itself from handling the \$3 million tax refund case.

Lawrence's argument went this way:

- Lawrence has sued Bowman for \$10,000.

- Bowman's ruling on Lawrence's participation on the MCID case is an issue in the libel suit.

- Therefore, Bowman has "a definite interest" and should disqualify himself from the MCID case.

"By this thinking this man could disqualify every judge in the state of Colorado," objected Atty. Charles Ginsberg.

The accusation of crimes being committed by the judge was contained in the disqualification motion Lawrence presented to the court.

The judge first denied Lawrence's motion, saying this was the first time in his life he had been accused of not being fair and just. He then denied Lawrence's request to intervene. (Lawrence claims everybody is doing everything wrong in the MCID case.)

"I hereby put the court on notice that any further proceedings are null and void and you will be liable for civil damages," Lawrence asserted.

Judge Bowman charged that Lawrence had shown "flagrant disrespect" to the court and other state officials.

"You are in the most contemptuous position of any individual I have ever seen," the judge said. "It is the court's order that you be held in County Jail until you purge yourself of contempt."

Bowman said the court wants to be sure Lawrence is mentally responsible for his conduct, and the judge appointed Dr. Charles Rymer, Denver psychiatrist, to examine Lawrence in jail and report back to court.

# 'Pro Litigant' Handling Own Sanity Case

John M. Lawrence, 40, controversial "professional litigant," was returned to Denver Friday to begin his fight to prove he isn't a mental case and that state officials actually are all wrong in handling the "Metropolitan Capital Improvement District tax case."

In two and a half hours of argument before County Judge David Brofman, Lawrence gained success in one area.

He was permitted to take over complete control as his own attorney and relegated Joseph Marranzino, court-appointed counsel, to the status of "assistant."

Lawrence, after arguing numerous motions, was given a trial date of July 10 for a jury to decide if a county court medical commission was correct in branding him mentally incompetent.

Judge Brofman, acting on that finding May 10, sent Lawrence to the State Hospital at Pueblo. Colorado law permits the alleged mentally ill person to demand a jury trial on the sanity issue.

The commitment climaxed earlier turbulence in Denver District Court in which Lawrence was held for contempt and sentenced to County Jail for accusing Presiding Judge Don D. Bowman, of "committing crimes and felonies" in the \$3 million MCID tax refunds.

## LIBRARY WORK

In asking Friday to take over as his own lawyer, Lawrence told Judge Brofman, "I have special knowledge through intensive study, including 6,000 hours of library work."

Lawrence said the upcoming sanity trial will include highly complex matters and issues of constitutional law which he felt handle, even

though he never has gone to law school.

Judge Brofman termed Marranzino fully qualified to handle the case, but Lawrence insisted on doing it himself. The judge then consented but directed Marranzino to stand by as Lawrence's assistant.

The judge was unsuccessful in limiting Lawrence in his argument. At one point Lawrence said the end of the hearing "will depend on at what stage I get a favorable ruling from the court."

When Judge Brofman entered his first order denying Lawrence's request for personal use of a law library, Lawrence charged the judge with bias and prejudice and demanded him to disqualify himself from the case. "There is no prejudice, and the court will not disqualify itself," Brofman replied. "There is a strong endeavor on the part of the court to protect your rights."

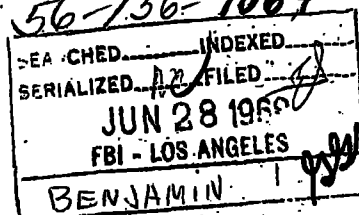
## CUSTODY REQUEST

Lawrence requested that his custody be placed with someone in Denver pending the trial, rather than at the State Hospital, so he can research the law and retain "several psychiatrists" for his side.

"I am my own attorney, and I should have the same freedom as an attorney," he claimed.

Wallace McCamant, assistant city attorney, said Lawrence's commitment was based on medical opinions of mental incompetency and that the medical recommendation on custody should remain as ordered. The judge agreed.

Lawrence came to Denver early last year and lived at a hotel at 1940 Broadway. His chief occupation was filing suits and petitions in the various Denver area courts—until ruled in contempt for attempting to take over the MCID case.

Mr. Art Kevin, Director of Special Events, KHJ -AM Radio, 5515 Melrose Av., L. A. # 462-2133, phoned and asked if Agent if FBI had any thing on Toofik Simon, a local man who reportedly was a close friend of Sirhan Sirhan and was involved with radical Arab organizations in L. A.

He had no address or physical description on Simon nor name of any organization with he allegedly was associated. He had no specific allegation that Simon was involved in the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. He had learned from sources he did not disclose that ~~Simon~~ was reported close to Simon and there was speculation as to whether Simon might be.

Kevin was advised of the confidential nature of FBI records and no commitments or promises were made to him.

Kevin said if Simon had come to the attention of the FBI in this matter and any interest in Simon had not been resolved, he would remain alert for any additional information on him.

Kevin was advised the FBI was interested in any specific allegations.

Kevin had been interviewed 6-27-68 on the Kensalt. FD-302 rough drafted 6-28-68

1. ROBERT HEALY, Boston Globe, Boston, Massachusetts, advised he represented his paper in the coverage of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY's campaign in the California primary election.

HEALY stated he did not know the reason why Senator KENNEDY changed his plans concerning his going to the Ambassador Room after his speech following the June 4th primary.

HEALY stated he observed SIRHAN B. SIRHAN when he was seized immediately after the shooting. He stated he had never seen SIRHAN on any previous occasion.

HEALY stated that earlier on that evening, he observed an individual who resembled SIRHAN but who definitely was not SIRHAN. HEALY stated he met this individual just after Senator KENNEDY began his talk in which he thanked his workers and the voters for the victory.

HEALY stated that he could not hear the speech very well and entered the Colonial Room so he could watch it on TV. He stated the room contained about 12 working press and TV men. HEALY stated that there were two security men at the door of the Colonial Room checking press credentials.

He stated that just inside the door of the Colonial Room he was approached by a young man who asked HEALY if he would give the young man the press credentials HEALY had hanging around his neck on a chain. HEALY said that he could not do that and the young man wanted to know what HEALY intended to do with the credentials after the affair was over. HEALY gave him some answer and got rid of him, but noted that the fellow was very persistent and even wanted to know where he could get similar credentials.

HEALY did not observe this man again. He recalled the young man's description as follows:
