Re FD-71 Complaint Form dated 6/24/68 of SA  
JOSEPH A. HANLON.

Dr. JAMES G. OSBORNE, who resides at 1285 East Morada Place, Altadena, California, advised on 7/1/68 that he had in his possession several books which he had obtained in a backyard sale of various items at the house located next door to his own at 1275 East Morada Place. Doctor OSBORNE advised that he had no reason to believe that these books had anything at all to do with SIRHAN SIRHAN or no member of his family, except for the fact that two or three weeks ago, or sometime after the assassination of Senator KENNEDY, inquiry had been made in that neighborhood by law enforcement officers concerning the fact that SIRHAN SIRHAN's brother had once resided in that area. He stated that based upon this prior inquiry concerning SIRHAN's brother and because these books he obtained were all "liberal in nature," he felt that it was something worth notifying the FBI.

He stated he did not know SIRHAN SIRHAN or his family and he had no reason to believe that these books had ever belonged to any of them. He stated that several of the books had a stamp on the inside cover indicating that they were from the library of JOHNATHAN TAYLOR, who used to reside next door to him on East Morada Place.

A review of San Francisco file 157-457 re GREGORY reveals he was in the San Francisco area on a speaking tour in the month of April. He spoke at Salinas, Monterey, Berkeley and San Mateo, California. He also made a brief visit to HUEY NEWTON, Minister of Defense of the Black Panther Party who is awaiting trial on charges of murdering an Oakland policeman. His speeches were covered by Bureau Agents or Informants. There is no indication in the file that GREGORY made any tapes with local television stations. No further action being taken by San Francisco.

With all respect I'm addressing myself to you to tell you the following. With all my heart's sincerity, I send my condolences to President L.B. Johnson and to the widow of Honorable Robert F. Kennedy, who died serving his nation.

Here I'm sending you the names of two persons that I told that they have to kill another important person in order that three are completed, beginning with President Kennedy, they are witnesses that I told before it happened.

I didn't tell the Government because there are persons who laugh because they don't know God, and their purpose is to kill.

Let's see if you believe in what I say to you, then you can believe what I say right away. That the policy which you have placed on the Americans is mature [?] and divided. Because of that they take advantage of this to kill those who can defend the Nation and now [they? you? very used can mean either] are up a blind alley.

1. Following telephoned information and instructions, the undersigned proceeded to interview Det. L. Turgeon of the St. Lambert City Police, regarding the telephone call he had received from one Mrs. J. Patton of 15 Argyle St. St. Lambert, P.Q. Having heard the subject of this inquiry from Det. Turgeon, the patrol was extended to the residence of Mrs. PATTON where the information contained hereunder corroborated that of Det. Turgeon.
2. Mrs. PATTON explained that at approximately 11.40 PM, of the 6 JUN 68, she was looking at Montreal T.V. Channel 10, where films of the murder of the captionally noted were being projected and commented. In one scene, just prior to the showing of the prostrate body of Senator KENNEDY, she observed the news photographs of three spectators looking at a document on a wall. These three spectators consist of a female wearing a polk-dotted dress, and flanked by two males.
3. Mrs. PATTON explained that she was reporting this fact to the police, as she did not remember having seen these films on any of the other television stations, and she thought that they may be of interest to the U.S. law enforcement authorities. She informed that she was aware that the FBI was searching for the identity of a polka-dotted female who would have made a remark immediately after the shooting incident, and that she was under the impression that the viewing of this film may be a good investigative aid.
4. Therefore, Mr. Real OUIRET of Channel 10 News Service was contacted in order to learn the source of the films projected. He informed that these films had been supplied to them by U.P.I. (United Press International) and had been projected as received. Mr. OUIRET further added that, if it was deemed important, arrangements could be made for police officers to view the films in question in their studios.
5. The above is submitted for the information of the investigating agencies, in the event such viewing may be of value in the possible identification of the persons being sought, in relation with the captionally noted incident.

SIRHAN SIRHAN reportedly employed as a horse exercise boy, Corona, California, area 1965-66. Employment with Granja Vista Del Rio Thoroughbred Horse Farm at Corona, owned by BERT ALTFILLISCH, confirmed.

Possibility SIRHAN may have exercised horses for DESI ARNAZ, TV actor-producer and owner of Corona Breeding Farm at Corona, California. ARNAZ has advised secretaries in Hollywood, California, ELAINE BRADDISH and ROSALIE BROAT at General Service Studios, that he has no personal recollection of SIRHAN and has a very limited contact with employees at the breeding farm. ARNAZ suggested that his horse trainer, RALPH WEST, and his ranch manager, CHARLES ZOELER, and his business manager and accountant HOWARD SHEPPARD, 106 East 6th Street, Corona, who has payroll, be contacted.

Re information concerning JERRY OWEN.

On 7/5/68, Supervisor GEORGE GALLOWAY of the San Francisco Office of the FBI advised that they had been unable to contact JERRY OWEN for interview as he had failed to keep any of the appointments that he and/or his attorney GEORGE DAVIS had made with that office.

GALLOWAY advised that JOSEPH HARDISTER, at whose ranch OWEN had previously been staying, had called the San Francisco Office on the morning of 7/5/68 and indicated that OWEN would probably stay in the Northern California area as he apparently did not want to be far removed from his attorney GEORGE DAVIS. HARDISTER also advised that Attorney GEORGE DAVIS was out of town and would call the FBI, San Francisco, on Monday morning next to arrange for OWEN to be interviewed in the office of attorney GEORGE DAVIS. HARDISTER also advised that OWEN had been served with an order by the Los Angeles police officers who interviewed him that he should not discuss this case publically.

GALLOWAY advised that he did not feel that it was advisable to conduct an interview with OWEN in the presence of his attorney DAVIS in DAVIS' office.

On 7/5/68, Captain HUGH BROWN of the Los Angeles Police Department, special unit investigating the assassination of Senator KENNEDY, advised that officers of his department had interviewed OWEN in San Francisco on 7/3/68.

BROWN stated that when his officers arrived at the office of attorney DAVIS they were met by the press and finally persuaded DAVIS to have the press leave the office. Following this, they interviewed OWEN for about an hour and a half and then took him to the San Francisco Police Department where they gave him a polygraph examination that lasted for approximately three hours. As a result of this test, BROWN stated that the officers are certain that OWEN

did not give SIRHAN a ride as he had indicated although he may have given someone a ride. In connection with the threatening call, there was a strong reaction that OWEN lied concerning this matter. Also, the interviewing officers advised that they had learned that OWEN is planning a tour in connection with his alleged missionary activities and that part of this trip would include a visit to Israel and they felt that this may be a publicity build-up for OWEN by his attorney DAVIS. The interviewing officers advised that they had told both OWEN and DAVIS of the court order concerning publicity in this matter and had indicated to DAVIS that he might be in the possession of a court order if he was representing OWEN in this matter.

DAVIS indicated that, in view of this, he would make no further press releases on this matter. However, Captain BROWN advised that last night, 7/4/68, on Los Angeles Television, Channel 4, at 11:00 p.m., there was a news release wherein DAVIS indicated that he was now more certain than ever that this was a conspiracy and that it appeared to him that they were attempting to use his client as a get-away driver in this matter. Captain BROWN stated that they had checked with this television channel to determine whether this was a taped interview made before Wednesday or if it had been done after their interview with DAVIS and OWEN. It was determined from the television channel that DAVIS had made this release on Wednesday afternoon and it had been sent to Los Angeles and on the program that evening.

Also, Captain BROWN stated that his office had received a telephone call from a WESLEY GARDNER, 108 East First Street, Napa, California, telephone number 707-226-5338. GARDNER indicated that he represented the Foremost Protection Investigating Agency and that he represented OWEN and advised the police department that if they were trying to locate OWEN that it could be done through him.

Supervisor GALLOWAY in San Francisco was advised of the results of the conversation with Captain BROWN of the Los Angeles Police Department and was advised that Los Angeles would furnish a teletype to the Bureau concerning this matter with a copy for the San Francisco Office.

On May 5, 1968, Mrs. STELA BROWN, age 40, maiden name, ALARCON, 135 Richmond Drive, Woodbridge, Virginia, telephone number 703-494-9844, advised that she is married to GERALD L. BROWN, Staff Sergeant, United States Air Force, presently stationed at Bolling Air Force, Washington, D.C. She was first married to HOMER CLIFFORD STRICKLAND until her divorce in 1956. She has been in Woodbridge since August, 1967. She was in El Paso, Texas prior to moving to Virginia.

BROWN advised that while watching channel 9 Television Station, she observed a photograph, front and profile view, of a man, and the commentator asked for anyone who recognized the man to contact the television station. She called the TV station in Washington, D.C. and left her name and telephone number.

BROWN advised that she recognized the photographed man as a person she first met in the last part of 1955 or the first part of 1956, in Los Angeles, California. She was visiting a friend, MARGUERITA GONZALES, in an apartment located on the corner of First and Olive Streets. The apartment was located in the second building off of First Street on Olive.

The young man said his name was ADEL SIRHAN or SIRHAN, and that he was 16 years old. He was associated with a gang of young "hoods" who were known to be dope addicts, robbers, and a real rough bunch. The other boys around him laughed when he gave his name. He then stated his name was ANGEL LUIS CALDERON. He said that he was from Puerto Rico and had not been in the United States very long. He was in Los Angeles looking for work and his family was living in Pasadena, California. BROWN advised that CALDERON was living in the same apartment building as GONZALES. She visited GONZALES for two weeks and saw CALDERON in the area everyday. She has not seen or heard of him since.

BROWN advised that while she was in Los Angeles, a young boy named PULITO was killed by a knifing by the gang which CALDERON was a member. She was sure the Los Angeles police investigated this matter.

BROWN advised that she was positive the photograph of the man she observed on television was the same man she described above. He looked older on the television photograph, but had the same facial characteristics.

Mrs. Charles SMITH was interviewed at her residence 522 Vine Street, San Jose. The interviewing agents identified themselves to Mrs. SMITH through display of FBI credentials. Mrs. SMITH advised as follows:

She stated that she is a friend of LUZETA CORDOVA who is also known as LUZ ELENA CORDOVA - IZURIETA. She advised that she met CORDOVA in August of 1966 when CORDOVA was a resident at the De Anza Hotel in San Jose where she, Mrs. SMITH, was employed in the housekeeping department. She advised that she saw CORDOVA occasionally from August of 1966 until March of 1967 when CORDOVA left San Jose to return to New York City. She stated that CORDOVA is from Ecuador and is an alien having come to the United States in approximately 1961. She has corresponded with CORDOVA on several occasions. During May of 1968 CORDOVA advised her by mail that she was returning to San Jose and since Mrs. SMITH has recently been involved in an auto accident in which she was injured. She suggested that CORDOVA might come to San Jose and live in her home temporarily. Mrs. SMITH explained that CORDOVA obtained employment as a nurses aid or practical nurse and she thought CORDOVA could be of some assistance to her.

CORDOVA returned to San Jose during the first or second week of May 1968 and has been living at the SMITH residence since that time. She has been unable to find work which suited her. She obtained one job which she held for 2 days and then quit informing SMITH that her employers at attempted to steal some of her personal belongings.

SMITH stated that CORDOVA has been acting in a rather strange fashion since coming to San Jose. She has difficulty sleeping and will not retire without placing a number of small religious statues on the floor around her bed. SMITH stated that CORDOVA will not leave the home without secreting small religious charms and artifacts in her hair and beneath her clothing. She stated that CORDOVA spends much of her time both day and night writing letters. She is secretive

about persons to whom she is writing and has refused to allow SMITH to enter the bedroom she is occupying. SMITH stated that she is quite concerned regarding CORDOVA's mental and emotional condition. She stated CORDOVA is pleasant and usually nice to be around. She further advised that she is suffering from some rather severe emotional upset and suggested that CORDOVA may be experiencing menopause. Mrs. SMITH was quite concerned that the FBI was interested in CORDOVA. She stated that CORDOVA has been somewhat agitated since the death of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. She advised that CORDOVA has spoken of this event on numerous occasions. Mrs. SMITH was asked if she knew of any fraternal organization in which CORDOVA was interested. She replied that CORDOVA has told her of her interest in Rosicrucians Order which group has their international headquarters in San Jose.

In conclusion Mrs. SMITH stated that she expects CORDOVA to leave her residence within the next two or three weeks after she obtains permanent employment in the area.

LUZ ELENA CORDOVA-IZURIETA, who is also known as Luzeta Cordova, was interviewed at the residence of Mrs. CHARLES SMITH, 522 Vine Street, San Jose, California. The interviewing Agents identified themselves to CORDOVA through display of FBI credentials. The interview was conducted in both the English and Spanish languages. CORDOVA advised as follows:

She was born on November 20, 1918 at Guaycul, Ecuador. She was admitted to the United States at Los Angeles, California, as a permanent resident alien on October 1, 1961. She exhibited alien registration card [REDACTED]. She resided in Los Angeles, California in 1961 and 1962 and was employed in that city as a nursing aid at the Community Hospital, View Hospital, and Doctors Hospital.

She moved to Panama City, Republic of Panama in February, 1963, and was self-employed as a private nurse in Panama City. While living in Panama City, she became interested in the Rosicrucian Order also known to her as AMORC. She did not become a member of the organization at this time. In February, 1964, she moved from Panama City to New York City, New York. While in New York, she stayed for a time with a friend, one ALICIA A. WATSON on East 23rd Street in Brooklyn. She later moved to her own apartment at 308 East 90th Street, New York City, Apartment 1-B. She worked as a babysitter and housekeeper for several families in New York and in August, 1966, she traveled from New York City to San Jose, California.

She also recalled that during the period of her residence in New York City she left the United States on one occasion to visit some friends in Peru, South America.

After arriving in San Jose in August, 1966, she lived at the Deanza Hotel on West Santa Clara Street for one month and then moved to the Terry Hotel, 286 West San Carlos Street. It was during this period that she visited the Rosicrucian Park in San Jose and furthered her interest in

the Rosicrucian Order. She noted that San Jose is the International Headquarters for the Rosicrucian Order. She pointed out that while she was in New York, she had affiliated with the Rosicrucian Order, and she displayed a membership card for AMORC No. 385-700S65 in the name of Miss LUZETA CORDOVA, 308 East 90th Street, Apartment 1-B. She stated that she is still a member of this organization.

She remained in San Jose working as a practical nurse and housekeeper for various people until March 26, 1967 when she returned to New York City and again took up residence in the apartment mentioned above. She obtained private case work with a Mrs. STONE and Mrs. ROBINSON, working both as a private nurse and housekeeper for these people. On May 11, 1968, she returned to San Jose and took up temporary residence with Mrs. CHARLES SMITH at 522 Vine Street. CORDOVA stated she is unemployed and presently is seeking employment.

CORDOVA stated that she has written many letters over a period of many years to prominent people in the United States. She stated that she has corresponded on more than one occasion with the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. She advised that she wrote a letter to Senator KENNEDY in November, 1967 from New York City, and in this letter she mentioned the Rosicrucian Order. She stated in the letter that she believed the Rosicrucian Order planned to kill the KENNEDY family.

CORDOVA was asked to give her reasons for this conclusion. She stated that she has no particular reason for making this statement, and she seemed confused when asked this question. The question was repeated several times and in several different ways. CORDOVA was unable to respond to the question except to state that RALPH LEWIS, the present leader of AMORC in San Jose, "is a spy for Russia."

CORDOVA stated that all of the other people connected with AMORC are honest and loyal, explaining that the only person in the organization that she was concerned about was

Mr. LEWIS. She was unable, however, to give any specific reason for her concern. CORDOVA recalled having advised Senator KENNEDY to write to an organization known as Silent Unity, Lee's Summit, Mississippi, and she stated that this is an organization that accomplishes much through prayer. CORDOVA was asked if she thought AMORC or any member of that organization was responsible for the death of Senator KENNEDY. She replied that she did not know, stating that she thought that Mr. LEWIS' action were suspicious.

She could not further explain this remark.

On 6/5/68 SD 1155-C advised that he considered subject MIKE VEJVODA as possibly identical to person who shot Senator ROBERT KENNEDY at Los Angeles, California, the night of 6/4/68 inasmuch as VEJVODA closely resembled the physical description of the individual in custody for the shooting of KENNEDY. Informant further reported that VEJVODA was known to carry a small caliber pistol in his belt on frequent occasions. Informant was requested to attempt to determine VEJVODA's whereabouts the night of 6/4 and 6/5 and the morning of 6/5/68. Informant subsequently determined that VEJVODA was in San Diego, California, on the morning of 6/5/68. Informant further indicated that he had considered VEJVODA possibly involved in the KENNEDY assassination inasmuch as he had been trying very hard to obtain some hand grenades through sources in San Diego prior to the assassination.

On 6/19/68 Lt. EARL J. COCHRAN, Intelligence Unit, San Diego Police Department, advised that he had been contacted by the Los Angeles Police Department and at their request had interview MICHAEL VEJVODA concerning his present and recent activities. Lt. COCHRAN advised that the Los Angeles Police Department had determined that VEJVODA was reported to be acquainted with SIRHAN SIRHAN and might possibly be involved in the KENNEDY assassination. Lt. COCHRAN said that VEJVODA was interviewed for four hours during which time a search was also conducted of his residence and automobile. It was reported that several weapons and explosive devices were located during this search.

On the night of 6/19/68 SD 1155-C advised that he had been contacted by VEJVODA who indicated that he was interrogated by the San Diego Police Department and that as a result of this interrogation he intended to do something drastic, without indicating what his plans were. Informant subsequently advised that VEJVODA also contacted several other acquaintances on the night of 6/19/68 and made similar representations indicating that his name would probably be in the newspaper in the near future regarding something he was about to do.

VEJVODA's activities have been closely followed at San Diego through contact with SD 1155-C and no further activities on his part have been noted since the interview on 6/19/68.

LEONARD L. EDWARDS

At 2:00 P.M., on June 24, 1968, Assistant Chief of Police ROBERT SCHATZ, Mountain View, California, Police Department, advised that on June 22, 1968, his department received a telephone call from GEORGE BAKIE MARWICK, 2400 El Camino Real, Space 10, Mountain View, California, in which MARWICK stated as follows:

One of his neighbors, LEONARD L. EDWARDS, white, male, American, 2400 El Camino Real, Space 40, Mountain View, was acting strangely and made some peculiar remarks to him about a week ago. At that time he observed that EDWARDS had two handguns in his possession, one in each hip pocket. One of the guns was a luger P-38 and the other was a .38 caliber S & W. They were talking in the trailer court about weapons, and the subject of shooting and politics came up. MARWICK said it was too bad that BOBBY KENNEDY had been shot, and that since he was gone, his brother TED would probably now run for the Presidency. At that point EDWARDS said, "Well, we will kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs." EDWARDS further indicated to MARWICK that he had been in the Watts Area at the time of the riot, and at that time they had numerous weapons in their possession and were ready to use them against any Negro people in the area if they came in. MARWICK said he did not know whether or not EDWARDS had any intention of committing a crime, but he thought by the way he talked he might be connected with some organization of the type that would commit such offenses. MARWICK said EDWARDS is employed as a painter and owns a 1964 Chevrolet pickup truck, green in color, California license S54392, which is registered to him and VIOLA FAY EDWARDS at the above address.

Special Agent LARRY NEWMAN, U. S. Secret Service, San Francisco, was advised of the above at 3:15 P.M., June 24, 1968, by Special Agent GEORGE HARTLEY.

Mr. GEORGE B. MARWICK, Vagabond Trailer Village, 2400 El Camino Real, Space 10, Mountain View, was interviewed on June 24, 1968, and advised as follows:

He is acquainted with LEONARD L. EDWARDS, who lives in Space 40 at the above address. EDWARDS resides there with his wife, VIOLA FAY, and they have been there about a year and a half. EDWARDS is semi-retired and a painter by trade. His wife sells real estate.

On Saturday, June 8, 1968, the day of ROBERT KENNEDY's funeral, he (MARWICK) watched the funeral on television and was particularly moved by the eulogy given by Senator KENNEDY at the funeral service. Some time during the morning he saw EDWARDS in the street outside the trailers and they began talking about politics. The shooting of ROBERT KENNEDY came up. At that time EDWARDS made some strange remarks which he (MARWICK) thought should be reported. MARWICK mentioned that it was too bad that BOBBY KENNEDY had been shot, and that he had just seen EDWARD KENNEDY on television, and that EDWARD KENNEDY probably now would run for the Presidency. EDWARDS then said, "When we don't like them in California, we kill them," and then mentioning Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, said, "We'll kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs."

EDWARDS also mentioned that he had been in the Watts Area at the time of the riots, and that they all had guns ready to go in case the Negroes came into their area, but the police told them to hold off.

At various times during the past several months he has seen EDWARDS walking around the streets of the trailer court with handguns in his hip pockets. One of the guns is a German luger while the other is a .38 caliber Smith and Wesson. EDWARDS did not have any guns with him on the morning of June 8 when they were talking about the KENNEDYS. He has not seen the guns recently.

He knows of no criminal activities of EDWARDS or that he has any criminal or undesirable associates. He knows of no organizations that EDWARDS belongs to, although EDWARDS' wife once said she belonged to the John Birch Society.

EDWARDS has a boat, and he and his wife go camping quite frequently for several days at a time. They go by themselves.

He has no knowledge that EDWARDS was in the Los Angeles area at the time ROBERT KENNEDY was shot, and no information to indicate that he had any connection with that shooting.

EDWARDS does not drink except on occasion, but he does not believe EDWARDS was drinking on the morning of June 8, 1968.

He described EDWARDS as white, male, American, age 55-60, 5'10", weight 200 pounds, build stocky, hair brown, eyes brown, complexion dark. EDWARDS owns a 1964 Chevrolet pickup truck, California license S54392, which is registered to EDWARDS and his wife.

On June 26, 1968, LEONARD LAWRENCE EDWARDS, 2400 El Camino Real, space 40, Mountain View, advised as follows:

He and his wife, VIOLA FAY, live in a trailer at the above address, having moved there in the Spring of 1966. Prior to that they lived in a trailer in Torrance, California. He is semi-retired, having reached the age of 65. He formerly was a painting contractor at Sunnyvale, California. He now works only at odd jobs on rare occasions. His wife is a real estate saleswoman employed by Fred Miller Realty, Mountain View. She handles sales of trailer parks in Northern California, and they take frequent trips throughout Northern California in connection with her business.

He recalled that early in June, 1968, on the day that Senator ROBERT KENNEDY was shot, they left Mountain View for a trip to Trinidad, which is located in the extreme Northern portion of California. They returned at the end of that week to Mountain View.

He has no recollection whatsoever of making any statements concerning the death of ROBERT KENNEDY or any threats to the life of Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. He specifically does not recall saying "When we don't like them in California, we kill them," and "We will kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs." He feels certain he made no such statements to anyone, and he would not go around making such statements as he does not believe in violence.

He does not belong to any organizations of any kind, nor does he associate with any individuals engaged in criminal activities or who believe in violence. He has never been arrested.

He and his wife were living in a trailer court in Torrance, California, at the time of the riots in Watts. He and other men organized a defense group under the supervision of the local sheriff to defend the trailer camp in case rioters came to their area; however, no action was taken as nothing happened in that vicinity. He did consider it to be a frightening experience.

He owns several guns as follows:

An old 30-03 modified Army rifle which he formerly used for deer hunting.

An Ithica 16-gauge shotgun which he used for hunting pheasant and ducks.

A .38 caliber Smith and Wesson Cobra five-shot detective-model revolver which he used for target shooting.

A 9-millimeter German luger pre-World War II which he has as a collector's item.

A .45 DA Smith and Wesson which he used for target shooting. He last used the gun in Oregon in 1964 when he went pheasant hunting.

He keeps the above guns in the trailer but does not carry them around in the open.

ARNOLD BIRGERS, residing 13276 Foothill Boulevard, Apartment 1, Los Angeles, California and owner/operator of The Liquor Market, 13116 Foothill Boulevard, Los Angeles, telephone 365-5750, furnished information as follows:

BIRGERS was apprised of a statement that a male had been in his liquor store on the weekend prior to the assassination of Senator KENNEDY and was asking several questions such as what would happen if he were to hold up a store, murder somebody or if he were to be arrested. BIRGERS advised that no one had been in his store making statements of that nature. He stated that on a Saturday or Sunday prior to the assassination a male entered his store and inquired how he could get on an ammunition ship going to Vietnam. Mr. BIRGERS stated this was at approximately 7:00 a.m. He indicated that this was an easy way to make money and he needed money to stay out of jail. BIRGERS stated that the questions struck him as being peculiar inasmuch as he felt the man was going to hold him up. The man later departed after buying a pack of cigarettes, in a green 1958 Ford. *OK*

BIRGERS viewed photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and stated that he had never seen him in his store and that he definitely was not the person who was asking the questions referred to above.

This 19-year-old white male is currently serving three years for Tampering With a Motor Vehicle.

This man apparently is illegitimate and has been bothered by the fact that he has no rightful father. Although he is lawfully called Marghlin he nevertheless goes by Duncan. He indicates that Duncan is the name of a stepfather. The stepfather is a man with whom he has had a great deal of trouble, yet he indicates that the man has apparently done him a lot of good. He indicates that when he started to school he had little interest in it and preferred to horse around. He has a grade achievement of only 5.4, despite a Revised Beta IQ of 105. He indicates that he did go as far as the 10th grade but that he quit at that age. He denies much use of alcohol, denies truancy, running away from home. He indicates that he left home after he was given an ultimatum by his stepfather at the age of 16. He then enlisted in the Navy but decided to go AWOL and subsequently got himself into some trouble. He states that he was performing adequately in the service except that he did no studying and failed a written test. He can give very little reason why he went AWOL. Subsequent to that time he has held many jobs for short periods of time, has been frequently involved in anti-social activity. He seems to have the idea that his poor parental upbringing is in large measure the reason for his difficulties.

This man presents as a well-developed male who looks his stated age. He speaks clearly and coherently and answers questions well. Despite the fact that he has previously been disturbed by much of the familial problems he speaks of these problems now in a flat manner. There is very little variation to the way that he expresses himself about anything. There seems to be a marked emotional flatness to this man. There is no definite thought disorder, there are no associational difficulties. His intellectual functioning is well within the range of normal.

It would appear that the main form of acting this man does would classify him as a sociopathic personality at this time. However, it is apparent that there is a great deal of emotional instability, dependence and lack of identification in this man. One thing that appears to have characterized him since his early days is his utter lack of interest and motivation. At this time it would appear that he has a paucity of positive attributes with which to work with. It would appear that he would make an adequate adjustment in the Department of Corrections, however.

**CRIMINAL HISTORY:** There is no verification but the subject was in the Navy at age 17 and went AWOL while in Boot Camp and was later given an undesirable discharge. He admits that while AWOL from the service he was charged with auto theft and it is shown as his first arrest on the FBI. He apparently was subsequently given a state farm sentence in Illinois for that and the FBI shows a three-month sentence. He moved around the country a lot and in August of 1967 he was arrested in California along with a brother for Burglary and Auto Theft but was later released and he said it was a mistake. He was returned to his home county where he was involved in the instant offense.

**PRESENT OFFENSE:** The charge of Tampering With a Motor Vehicle included a charge that the subject had stolen three or four drive shafts in order to fix his car to leave town. The subject is said to have had several vehicles and that he frequently kept them up with stolen parts. The report further stated that two juveniles who accompanied him gave information regarding the thefts. After being put in jail after returning voluntarily from Indiana to face the felony charges the report states that he attempted to cut plaster from the windows and was put into a better security area. He received hacksaw blades and sawed his way out and was picked up at his home two hours later after breaking jail. There is no information on the juveniles and the subject states they were in jail and might be prosecuted. He states the name of one and says he had only met him in jail.

**Accomplices:** None shown.

**Detainers:** None.

**FAMILY:** This 19-year-old white man was born in Vallejo, California, on 1-30-48. The mother suggests that she was married at the time of the subject's birth although the subject states that she was 16 at the time of birth and that she was not married and the man was a 38-year-old truck driver. He states his mother left home and went to California where the subject was born and has been living with a man and later married him, had an additional child and was married for twelve years. At the time of the divorce he was 12 and went to live with a maternal grandmother who kept him six months and placed him in an orphan's home because of financial difficulty. His mother then married and had two additional children and was divorced more recently, although the subject did return to live with her and a stepfather. He states that his stepfather chased him off when he was about 17. He spent two years earlier at the Missouri Baptist Children's Home and says he liked to stay there well enough. The mother apparently has remarried again, although the subject states he doesn't think so. The mother further states "He holds against me the fact that he has no legitimate father".

**EDUCATIONAL:** He quit school after the 9th grade his mother says because he wanted to work and get a car. Although he has average intelligence
