MARITAL: He has never married.

MILITARY: He joined the Navy 1/30/66, and went AWOL from Boot Camp and received an undesirable discharge, 6/22/66.


EMPLOYMENT: The subject has been moving around considerably and never works more than a month at a time. It is doubtful whether he had any real wage earnings, but rather has worked helping saw wood and has done some mechanic work along with his stepfather. He says he works at filling stations as he moves around the country in the last several years. He scores in the 77 percentile mechanical comprehension.

RELIGION: No member of his family has ever gone to any church but he states that he is a Baptist.

HEALTH: The medical examination makes no restrictions on his duty status.

SOCIAL ADJUSTMENT: The subject perhaps was a management problem at an early age and his mother says she was afraid to "hold up for him" to a stern hightempered father (stepfather), and says, it was an "all around rather cold relationship". She states he has always lied and roams around the country, and the material available indicates that he has always been very interested in cars and worldn'y on them. The interview reveals that he has little recreational interest other than "cars" and is vague about the opposite sex and discusses going "steady" for a year and a half but he later advises that this was when he was 12 or 13 years old. He evidently has not formed any relationship with anyone and has been reaming around taking his younger halfbrother with him. He does lie occasionally during the interview and has written a letter stating he wished to talk to scaebody about the fact that he felt as if no one cared about hin. The local authorities write, "Glen appears to have little concept of morality and is capable of almost any crime but not likely a crime of violence". The subject admits he was moved around in the orphanage because he couldn't get along with some of the other boys and admits he couldn't. get along with his stepfather, and was in the Navy for a brief time and climbed over a fence and left boot camp. He denies drinking at all,

EVALUATION: This 19-year-old white man is serving his first felony confinement although he has been arrested several times and has served in the state farm institution in Illinois. He is an illegitimate child that was maladjusted since an early age, and until this time has adjusted to none of the social institutions. Even though he is 19 he states his mother should have seen to it that he came back home after his stepfather threw him out. His inability to accomplish anything in the way of a human relationship or employment, as well as his preoccupation with finding someone to "take care of me", would certainly point up a great deal of inadequacy. At the same time he seems to be quite active in breaking the law and escaping jail, and demonstrates that he does not profit from experience, has no loyalties and is noted by all to be



By communication dated June 14, 1968, the United States Department of State, Washington, D. C. advised that they are in receipt of a letter dated June 11, 1968, which was forwarded to the United States Department of State by the Spanish Consul General, Alexandria, Egypt. The letter is set forth below as received from the State Department.

"Alexandria the 11 June 1968

'Dear Sir General Consul

'I have the honour to inform the Spanich General Consulate to inform the Amerikan Government guikly the following.

"The Egyptian nationality named (Aziz Taoufik Aziz Mikhail) age 25' was working in the Egyptian Intelligence Service Police till 31/11/1967 so after the Egyptian Government he sent him for business to Libanon in order to go from there to Amerika because Egyptian cannot be go to Amerika from Egypt, and so he went . to Libanon and from Libanon he arrived to Amerika on the I/1/1968 by air mail and know doing that is working there but is a spy of the Egyptian Government and the most important and dangerous is that thdw person was a friend of Sarhan Bushara Sarhan which has killed Mr. Robert Kennedy so I have the honour to inform the Spanich General Consulate to sent details to Amerikan Government as quikly as possible in order the Amerikan Government be care from this dangerous person and from any thing can be happen after and the adress which is know sitting in Amerika is exactly as follows:

He stated that the resident of apartment number A is a young man whose last name is El Dabe and El Dabe has a Lebanese roommate whose name is unknown to Schwartz.

EDMOND EL DABE, Apartment A, 2425 South Barrington, was interviewed at his home. He furnished the following information:

He was born on September 4, 1937, in Fgypt. He left Egypt in 1967, and traveled to Kuwait and then to Lebanon because of religious persecution of Christians in Fgypt and because of his inability to obtain satisfactory employment in that country. After arriving in Lebanon he again found that he was unable to obtain satisfactory employment and learned that it was possible to go to the United States by applying through the United States Catholic Conference. He arrived in the United States on February 22, 1967, and traveled to Los Angeles where numerous individuals of Egyptian descent reside. He was employed as a spot welder at the Hardman Aerospace Company 1845 South Bundy until one week ago when he was released due to a lack of work. He is presently unemployed.

During January or February 1968, he learned that AZIZ MIKHAEL had arrived in Los Angeles and he invited MIKHAEL to reside with him until MIKHAEL could find an apartment. He had known MIKHAEL for about ten years and had attended school with MIKHAEL in Alexandria, Egypt. He had not seen MIKHAEL during the past three years, and learned that MIKHAEL was coming to the United States through the United States Catholic Conference, 1531 West 9th Street, Los Angeles. MIKHAEL obtained employment as a spot welder at Hardman Aerospace and moved to his own apartment, 2280 South Barrington, Apartment number 6, about two weeks ago.

He advised that he and all his Egyptian friends presently living in the Los Angeles area are very anti-Nasser and have disassociated themselves from Egypt and the United Arab Republic. He stated that he had no knowledge of the assassination of Senator KENNEDY until he learned of the event through newspaper and television reports. He denied any acquaintance with SIRHAN SIRHAN and stated he is certain that MIKHAEL is not acquainted with SIRHAN or in any way involved in the assassination.

AZIZ TEWFIC AZIZ MIKHAEL, apartment number 6, 2280 South Barrington, was interviewed at his home. He furnished the following information:

He was born on October 10, 1943, in Alexandria, Egypt. He lived in Egypt until early May 1967. While in Egypt he lived with his mother and attended primary and secondary school. He also attended a trade school for two years, which was a state sponsored school, where he took courses in welding and machinery. He did not receive any political instruction at the school. After completion of the trade school, he was employed for a short time as a maintenance mechanic for a textile company.

He and his relatives are of Orthodox faith and the current political situation in Egypt is such that Christians find it very difficult to obtain satisfactory employment there. For this reason he decided to leave Egypt in order to start a new life. He obtained an exit visa and traveled to Lebanon in early May 1967. After arriving in Lebanon he was employed for six months as a welder in El Dora, Lebanon. He then learned that many Christians of Egyptian descent were going to the United States from Lebanon by applying through the United States Catholic Conference. He entered the United States at New York in December 1967, and went directly to Los Angeles via commercial aircraft. After arriving in Los Angeles, he did odd jobs and worked as a welder for a short time at the Sesame Corporation in Escondito, California, and at the Fenton Industry Company in the San Fernando Valley. He was employed as a spot welder at the Hardman Aerospace Company in Los Angeles in May 1968, where he is presently employed.

He denied any knowledge of SIRHAN SIRHAN prior to the assassination of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. He stated that he is against the policies of the United Arab Republic and he dislikes NASSER very much because of what he is doing to the Arab people. He stated that he knew of KENNEDY before the assassination and "liked" him. He denied any conspiracy, involvement-or-prior-knowledge-of-the-assassination.

He stated that since arriving in the United States he has corresponded with his mother in Alexandria, Egypt, and has not corresponded with any other individual.

AZIZ TEWFIC AZIZ MIKHAEL

On July 2, 1968, J. L. Lemmons, Sr., Chief of Security, Hardman Aerospace Company, 1845 South Bundy Drive, Los Angeles advised that Mikhael was employed by that company on May 20, 1968, as a spot welder. His working hours are 4:00 p.m. - 12:30 a.m. and his home address was listed as 2425 Barrington, Los Angeles. Lemmons could furnish no additional pertinent background information regarding Mikhael and stated that the Hardman Aerospace Company does not have classified contracts with the United States Government.

The files of the Los Angeles Office of the FBI contain no additional information regarding Mikhael or El Dabe and no information indicating the Hardman Aerospace Company is a key facility or is otherwise involved in the handling of classified matter.

During June 1968, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past and who is aware of some phases of communist and related subversive activity in the Los Angeles area, was contacted and could furnish no information regarding Mikhael.

PEEL advised she departed New York on the evening of 5/13/68, via Transworld Airlines, Flight 840, and arrived in Tele Aviv on the afternoon of 5/14/68. She remained in Tele Aviv through 5/16/68, and then departed by bus en route to Haifa, Israel. She indicated that the guide for this tour during this portion of the trip was JACOB HENIGMAN. PEEL advised on the morning of 5/17/68, she and members of the tour were on a full-day excursion and were en route to Tiberas. While at a rest stop she recalled that a member of the tour, whose identity she did not recall asked her if she heard that KENNEDY had been shot. Hiss PEEL stated this was the first time that she had heard this remark but that later it seemed that the rumor then spread like wildfire and the tour members were questioning each

other as well as the guide for further details. Miss PEEL indicated that she could only assume that possibly the tour guide. JACOB HENIGMAN, had told the director of the tour, Mr. JACK KEARNS, that KENNEDY had been shot. Miss PEEL stated unequivocally that at no time did she hear either the director or the tour guide, JACOB HENIGMAN, make a direct statement concerning KENNEDY.

Miss PEEL stated she was not aware of the original source of the information that KENNEDY had been shot however, she assumed that possibly the source was a broadcast over the Israeli radio. PEEL advised that tour members did question the guide, JACOB HENIGMAN, for further details however, the guide indicated he had no further information. Miss PEEL advised that the guide upon subsequent questioning the next day after periodically listening to the news broadcasts over the radio replied that "No news is good news."

Miss PEEL advised that on the morning of 5/18/68 tour members continued to question the tour guide for any further details regarding KENNEDY, however, the tour guide indicated again that he had no information. She stated that the tour guide did periodically listen to news broadcasts on the radio and upon questioning would indicate to tour members that the broadcast contained no news concerning KENNEDY. Miss PEEL advised she can only assume that possibly there may have been some error in reporting a news item concerning KENNEDY.

San Antonio indices checked on 7/3/68, prior to interview of PEEL, disclosed no reference identifiable with Miss ALICE DEXTER PEEL.

Mrs. CRAY paid no attention to any further conversation from this female.

Mrs. GRAY advised that she did not further notice this female after she had boarded the plane but believes that she sat in the first class section. She did not see the female after they arrived in Los Angeles at approximately twelve midnight, same date.

Mrs. CRAY pointed out that the female was talking so loud that there were bound to be other persons who would have heard the same remarks. She did not notice this female carrying

As you will recall, Special Agent R. J. La Jeunesse, Jr of this Bureau recently discussed with you one Crispin Curiel Gonzalez, an individual formerly under the supervision of your agency.

For the completion of your files, the following information is being made available:

On July 1, 1968, Lic. Norberto Salinas Navarette, Federal District Attorney, Juarez, Mexico, advised Special Agents of the El Paso Division of the FBI that Gonzalez had been found to be psychotic. On receipt of instructions from Mexico City, Gonzalez had been interned at the General Hospital for the Insane in Juarez, Mexico.

According to Mr. Salinas, Gonzalez admitted to him that the story he presumably related to the press, administration officials, and police officers was a hoax. He also criticized those responsible for being so gullible as to believe such a fantastic story.

On July 5, 1968, Mr. Salinas again advised Special Agents of the FBI that Gonzalez was discovered dead in his solitary confinement quarters at the General Hospital for the

Re: OLIVER B. OWEN, aka Jerry

Referenced teletype reflects that at the outset of the interview of OWEN he advised that upon the conclusion of his interview by Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Officers at San Francisco on 7/3/68, he informed them that he was to see representatives of the FBI, and they stated they would rather he did not talk to the FBI but could not stop him if he desired to do so.

As the Bureau is aware, there is currently in force a court order issued by the Superior Court at Los Angeles in connection with this matter prohibiting witnesses and potential witnesses, police and attorneys, from discussing this matter other than with legitimate investigative personnel. The extent of this order is such that a copy was served upon the Mayor of Los Angeles, SAMUEL W. FORTY, in order to preclude the Mayor from making any statements regarding SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

Concerning this particular matter, Lieutenant MANUEL PINA, LAPD, who conducted the interview with OWEN, was contacted, and he advised that at the outset of the police interview with OWEN on 7/3/68, OWEN informed him that he had an appointment with the FBI to also discuss the assassination of Senator KENNEDY.
