OWEN also had advised the police that he had not kept at least one previous appointment that he had made with the FBI. Lieutenant PINA urged OWEN to keep his appointment and to cooperate fully. He also informed OWEN at the outset of the interview of the existence of the court order in this matter that prohibited anyone from discussing this case in public, especially on TV or to news media. At no time was OWEN ever requested or was it suggested to OWEN that he not keep his appointment with the FBI. As a matter of interest, immediately upon his return to Los Angeles, Lieutenant PINA made available the results of his interview and the results of the polygraph examination which showed that OWEN was not truthful.

It is obvious that OWEN has either deliberately or otherwise misinterpreted the admonition set forth by the court that this case was not to be discussed with other than legitimate law enforcement authorities.

This is submitted for the information of the Bureau.

On July 1, 1968, Lic. Norberto Salinas Navarette, Federal District Attorney, Juarez, Mexico, advised that had been found to be psychotic and on receipt of specific instructions from Mexico City, had been interned at the General Hospital for the Insane, Juarez, Mexico. Salinas noted he had made a recommendation that be sent to another institution more adequately equipped to handle juveniles, and he was advised that any decision in this regard would necessarily have to be made by the administrator of the hospital.

Salinas recalled that on realizing what he had done by attracting so much attention to himself, openly admitted the entire story was a hoax, and he readily criticized newspaper reporters, administration officials, and police officers for being so gullible as to believe this fantastic story.

On July 5, 1968, Salinas advised that while in solitary confinement at the General Hospital for the Insane, had put together a rope from the mattress material located in his room and he hung himself. He was discovered dead at approximately 7:45 p.m. on the evening of July 4, 1968, by an attendant of the hospital.

The court ordered he be made a ward of the Juvenile Court and was retained in Los Angeles County Juvenile Hall. Attempts by the juvenile officers to locate his parents resulted in receiving a letter from his father, CRISPIN CURPEL ZAMORA. dated November 19, 1967. According to Mr. WINANDY, father resides at 353 General Nunez, Colima, Mexico.

The following is an English translation of the letter received from CRISPIN CURIEL ZAMORA, the original having been written in Spanish:

"Colina - November 19, 1967

"Mr. Howard E. Brook Los Angeles, California

"Sir:

"I received your letter dated November 10, informing me that my son was detained on October 24 and that you wish to know what should be done with him. First of all I want you to know that I was glad to have news about my son, and I want to tell you a few things about him.

"Last year I sent him to secondary school here in Colina, but because he becomes angry easily he did not get along with his school companions and he only made enemies in school. He left from school without my permission and went to my sister's in Mexico- Cuernavaca. He constantly took things from the house like: key (estilson?) remnants of cashmere, an electric shaver, and things of that kind. I know that he got to Cuernavaca asking for rides. When I found out

> where he was I went to Cuernavaca to get him and he promised me that he would behave and it was arranged so that he would return to school and not loose the school year. Five or six months afterwards he started behaving the same way as before and started taking things out of the house. For the second time his mother went to Curravaca and it was then that his mother and myself decided to take him to Los Angeles, California, to see if we could get him into a school there. His mother took him to Los Angeles and it was decided that he would go to a school located on Figueroa Street, in Los Angeles - and I think that he was even going to live there -- but he did not want to go to that school and took \$70. from his mother's purse and escaped to San Francisco. You probably know already, from his record, that the Probation Department of San Francisco took hold of him, and that his mother also, when he took the seventy dollars, went to the Probation Department of Los Angeles where I believe they also keep his record. The Probation Department of San Francisco returned him to Cuernavaca. When his mother found out that he was in Cuernavaca she went there after him. He wanted to continue studying, but his mother insisted that he did'nt finish the year because she said that he was making too much fun of the school teachers. He went to see the Director of Public Education of the state and he was excused and accepted again in school, but his mother was against Lit and she ordered that I would take him to my Rancho and teach him how to work in the field to see if in that way he could change his manner of thinking. Mr. Howard, according to the information I have here, in school he is a very intelligent boy, the only thing wrong was the lack of guidance and control. I brought him to the Rancho to work with me and for four or five

"months he helped mc very much like anyone else would have done. When I finished my harvest I did nt have any more work and then I had to leave for the United States accompanied by my wife. I asked my son if he wanted to come with us in order to work, or if he would rather stay and study. He said that he wanted to stay and study, but his mother did not approve and asked me to take him with us. I did nt want to take him with me because I wanted to give him the last opportunity. I came to United States with his mother and he went back to school. I know that he only studied for about two weeks and then he started getting things from the house again. He broke the lock of the desk and took my pistol and other things of little value. This was the manner in which he left this place. I sent 90 dollars for the support of my sons to the girl who was taking care of them. She had spent only about 300 pesos and the rest of the money she kept in the wardrobe -- that I think were about 800 pases --. Well, my son broke the lock of the wardrobe, took the money with him when he left here. Only today, I know about his whereabouts, thanks to you, Mr. Howard. I be very grateful for this courtesy that I don't deserve.

"No, Mr. Howard, with reference to what I want to do about my son, I want you to know that right now I am doing me harvesting of my crop and I will not finish doing so probably in the a month, since I have only five or six men helping me. It is impossible for me to hire more men because I have a lot of corn, and too many people will not do the work right since it is impossible for me all by myself to control them. This is the reason why it will take me a long time to finish with the harvest. I also wish to tell you that it is impossible for me to leave right now in order to get my son because

> "my economic situation is critical. I invested a lot of money in my land because I had to get it ready (cultivated). I owe the Bank about \$40,000 (forty thousand pesos). I think that I will get twenty or twenty five from my harvest. I had in mind to go to the United States after the harvest in order to work and pay the balance of the debt. Mr. Howard, I would like for you to help me with reference to my son only until I finish with my harvest, so that you can deliver him to me then and I can have him work with me. or maybee you can help me put him in a Military college. Mr. Howard, I beg of you for the sake of what you love most, don't release my son, by himself, since God has been taking care of him until now so that he does not get into serious difficulty.

According to Mr. WINANDY on December 8, 1967 a telegraph was sent to the parents of requesting them to sign a notarized letter permitting him to travel and a copy of his telegraph was received to that request.

On June 17, 1968 at approximately 10:30 am Mr. WINAMDY received a collect telephone call from from El Paso, Texas. At that time desired to know what would happen to him if he should return to Los Angeles, hat a warrant was out-California. WINANDY advised standing for his arrest charging him with being a runaway juvenile and that he would be returned to the custody of the Juvenile Court and probably referred to the California Youth Authority (CYA). Father, JOHN DEBS, formerly owned clothing factory, Debs of Hollywood, and is well-known businessman. No indication rest of family is pro-Arab. Mrs. TIERNEY formerly resided at 1326-1/2 Catalina Street, Los Angeles, and was employed by the Debs of Hollywood factory. She voiced her concern that assailant not become another OSWALD and feels possibly GEORGE DEBS or acquaintances could be emotional enough to be a matter of concern for law enforcement authorities.

On June 7, 1968, THOMAS MULLICAN, JR., 1833 Channing Way, Berkeley, California, employed at Golden Gate Fields, Albany, California, as Head Usher, advised SA DAVID E. TODD that press reports indicated that SIRHAN SIRHAN had been employed at one time by the Rex Ellsworth-Misch Tenney Thoroughbred Breeding Enterprises in Southern California.

MULLIGAN stated that about two years ago, while he was working at Del Mar Race Track, he learned that MISCH/TENNEY had been affiliated with some radical group, believed by him to be the Peace and Freedom Party of Phoenix, Arizona, and that TENNEY had attended a convention of this group at Chicago that year, and had also passed out literature of the organization around Del Mar.

He stated he was reporting this due to the possibility that TENNEY may have had some influence on SIRHAN's political views.

TENNEY is now a trainer of horses running at Hollywood Park.

MULLIGAN requested that information reported by him not be given to any racing or union personnel, since he was concerned that the fact he had made a report to FELENMIGHT INDEX jeopardize his job.

She said that she recalled the incident after seeing Sirhan's photo in the paper because of the intense look and deep set of his eyes. She said that she could not recall the persons with him at the time hamanam except that one was a female about 18 with brownish blond hair and the other a boy, mmm

Same info. telephonically to SA RAY RIEHLE, Sacremento office 6/29/68.

on 6/29/68 Lt. BOV KEENE, LAPD Kennedy unit advised calls had been received this date from AR AP and UPI regarding press conference called by GFORGE T. DAVIS, SF attorney representing OWEN. In substance OWEN was to be interviewed as a witness in the Kennedy case who had received threatening phone calls. He was to be interviewed in Napa county, Calif. and during interview was to be masked to conceal his identity.

KEENE telephonically contacted DAVIS and advised him of the court admonition against discussing the case. He also spoke with OWENE on the phone and OWEN stated he was returning Santa Ana next week and would contact the LAPD for interview on arrival.

OWEN previously contacted LAPD (University Div.) 6/5/68 and related an account of meeting STRHAN and selling him a horse. His story was filled with inconsistencies and it is the opinion of LAPD he has no information of value in this matter.

KEENE identified GEORGE T. DAVIS as an attorney connected with the

I left Santa Ana Menday, 6-3-68 around 1:00 PM, came in on the freeway and turned off and stopped at the Coliseum Hotel on Santa Barbara and Figueroa where a friend of mine has a heavyweight boxer who stays by the name of Rip O'Riley, and he asked me how I was getting along and to come in and see if I needed any equipment from United Sporting Goods Store on Hill Street, downtown, Les Angeles. I went down and purchased a pair of boxing shoes and was taking them out to Hollywood to have some green shamrooks sewed on each side. As I turned over from 9th and Hill Street, I stopped at one of the lights and I was waiting for the light, one fellow walked up and reached out to touch a large chrome horse (ornament) on my Chev pickup truck and he asked if I was going west and I said "yes" I was going out Wilshire over into Hollywood. They wanted to know if they could ride and the two of them jumped in the back of the pickup. When we stopped at the light at Western and Kilshire, there was three or four young kids on the corner dressed hippie style (heads).

They both got out of the truck. One fellow (susp) asked if he could rise up front with me. He appeared to be in his early 20's, I thought he was Pexican, dark bushy headed kid, looked like a Mexican, but spoke very good English. As we went out Milshire he asked me if I could stop for a little while at the big hotel and stated that he had a friend that worked there, that he'd only be a few minutes. I waited about ten minutes and was ready to go on my way when he came across the street and got into the truck and he started talking about horses. He wanted to know if I had horses and what kind of horses. In the conversation he stated that he was an exercise boy at the race track. In the conversation I to' him I was going to Oxnard to sell a Palomino horse that had been used to pony horses. I told

him that I was going to sell it for \$250., and he said he would like to buy it, cause if he had his own horse he could work at the track ponying some horses, and told me that I could meet him that night. We discussed where I was going to stay. I told him that I would be going to the Saints and Sinners, and he seemed to know when I said on Fairfax, then he wanted to know if I'was Jewish and I said "no", "I'm not Jewish, I'm Welsh," and he said I have no use for Jews. He said that as a boy he lived in Jordan. He told me that he was raised in Jordan and left there when he was 13 or 14 years old. In his conversation he seemed to be opposed to Jews and trouble. He said he would have cash at 11:00 PM that night. I came to the hotel and parked and he was across the street on the corner. Across the street was a car; 57, 58, or 59 Chevy, hard top, kind of off-wht, a dirty car. He went across the street. The girl that was standing on Wilshire and "estern was there. The other fellow in the car got out. (Girl 20/21, 5/5, 140, chunky, wearing slack outfit, straight dirty bloode hair and needed a bath). He went across, talked to them, and came back and showed me a hundred dollar bill. He said he was supposed to set more money and he didn't have the rest. He said "I'll buy the Palomino from you and give you \$250." So I said I'll go over and stay in the hotel (St. Norits Hotel, 5849 Sunset Blvd, 467-2174, Wm 203). I left a call for in the morning for 8:00 AM, cause he was to have the money at 8:00 ... So I got a phone call about five minutes to eight and I came out in front and the same girl and the same guy said that he wanted the horse bad and if I could wait over until Tuesday night. He said something was happening at the 'mbassador Hotel and he would take the horse and he asked me if I could get the boy a job at the ranch because he was a good rider. He was too heavy for a jockey. I gave him a card. I left. I stayed in Oxnard Tuesday night with some friends. I left Oxnard at 12:30 PM Wednesday.

I arrived at the Coliseum hotel at exactly five minutes after three, discussed Kennedy tragedy with waitress. I began to look at Hellywood Citisen News and saw kids picture in the paper. I told the waitress that it looked like the three same kids I saw the other night.

- A. Monday afternoon at about 1:20pm or 1:30pm





Mrs. MARGE AODAK, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed at her place of employment, Motorola, Inc., 5005 East McDowell Road, Phoenix, at her request.

Mrs. RODAK advised that on the Wednesday (June 5, 1968) following the assault on ROBERT F. KENNEDY while she; her daughter, Mrs. SHERIE LYNN DJEREDJIAN; and her son-in-law, HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN, were watching television at the above 31st Street address, there was flashed on television a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, as the assailant of Senator KENNEDY. Mrs. RODAK advised that at that time HAGOP DJEREDJIAN stated "I know that man." DJEREDJIAN further stated "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. SHERIE LYNN DJEREDJIAN) two days ago that KENNEDY was going to be shot and HUMPHREY will probably be shot next and TED KENNEDY shot if he runs for office."

Mrs. RODAK advised that when she queried DJEREDJIAN regarding these statements, he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. RODAK admitted that she disliked her son-in-law intensely, advising that he never works and mistreats her daughter SHERIE and her grandson DAVID by SHERIE's first marriage.

When re-interviewed on June 14, 1968, Mrs. RODAK advised that she has never reported to anyone that DJEREDJIAN was making approximately \$70,000 a year or that he was trafficking in dope. Mrs. RODAK stated that during DJEREDJIAN's early months of marriage to her daughter, that marriage was unknown to Mrs. RODAK and at the time she believed that DJEREDJIAN had her daughter under the influence of drugs because SHERIE would no longer listen to her advice.

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Mrs. SHERIE LYNN DJEREDJIAN was interviewed at 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona.

She denied that her husband made such statements as related by her mother. Mrs. DJEREDJIAN stated that it was she who speculated two days before the actual assault on Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY that he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY and Senator TED KENNEDY would probably be shot also. Mrs. DJEREDJIAN insisted that such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of these political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will, in fact, occur.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN advised that her husband is in the United States on a visa from Beirut, Lebanon; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles. She believes that he went to Pasadena City College where he was active in American Foreign Crusade, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. She stated she married DJEREDJIAN on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against DJEREDJIAN.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN stated that she and DJEREDJIAN lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965 until the latter part of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 180 West Margaret Street, where DJEREDJIAN supported the family on infrequent perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Dr. ZOHRAB DJEREDJIAN, No. 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN stated that during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and her son DAVID drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, where she and David stayed while DJEREDJIAN drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which he returned to Phoenix June 4, 1968. She stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) regarding staying in this country

and he knows a Mr. HEBBARD LAMPKIN (phonetic) of <u>INS</u> in Los Angeles. Mrs. DJEREDJIAN advised that her husband left Phoenix June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. DJEREDJIAN advised she received a telephone call from her husband June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

When re-interviewed on June 14, 1968, Mrs. DJEREDJIAN advised she had been mistaken about the dates of her husband's traveling to Los Angeles. She now stated that DJEREDJIAN traveled to Los Angeles on May 27, 1968, and returned the following day, May 28, 1968. Mrs. DJEREDJIAN attributes her error in the dates to her faulty memory.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN stated that it was she who made the statement that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was going to be assassinated prior to the actual assault on him. She still insists that such prophecies as that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY would be killed and the possibility of Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY and Senator EDWARD KENNEDY in the future were based exclusively on her cwn evaluation of the political times and not because she has any knowledge that such assaults will, in fact, take place.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN stated that her husband fell asleep while sunbathing approximately May 29, 1968, in Phoenix after his return from Los Angeles but that she did not obtain a prescription for him from Blane's Pharmacy, 3100 East Bell Road, Phoenix, until June 3, 1968, because she believed it was only a slight sunburn.

Mrs. DJEREDJIAN denied she has ever taken any drugs and insists her husband has never trafficked in drugs nor does she have any knowledge regarding a statement by her mother, Mrs. MARGE RODAK, to the effect that her husban was making approximately \$70,000 per year and not declaring same for income tax purposes.

A copy of a photograph of ABDELAZIZ XOUSIF KHALAF, born August 19, 1947, Saudi, Arabia (Hayel), was shown to DUDLEY L. DEEDLE, 100 North 81st Street, Belleville, Illinois, who was acquainted with the individual giving the name SAMIR M. KHALAF. DEEDLE advised that due to the quality of the photograph he could not definitely state whether or not it is the person with whom he was acquainted. He advised he now reachled that this person claimed to have just become 21 prior to their first meeting two years ago and claimed to be studying to be an eye doctor at St. Louis University, St. Louis, Missouri.

DEEDLE advised that the name appearing on the card furnished by the individual apparently was not his full name as during conversation he had spoken his full name which was lengthy but due to his rapid speech and accent, DEEDLE was unable to recall the name.

DUDLEY L. DEEDLE, 100 North 81st Street, advised about two and one-half years ago he met a young Arab at the Steeple Chase Room, Chase Park Plaza Hotel, St. Louis, Missouri, and after conversation, mentioned that he was going to the Playboy Club, St. Louis, and the young man asked to go along. DEEDLE stated that over the next year he saw this young man fairly frequently at the Playboy Club where he was not admitted as a member, but was allowed to use the facilities on a cash basis. He stated he knew the man only as "Sammie" but furnished a business card given to him by the man which bore the name SAMIR M. KHALAF, A.S.P., St. Louis University, 3630 West Pine Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri, 63108.

He stated he enjoyed conversations with this young man who stated that his father was Consul General or Ambassador from his country to the United States and indicated that the family lived in Washington, D. C., and that he had a sister there also. DEEDLE stated that the man was a "little windy" and he looked up the name of the real ambassador from the country, not specifically recalled, and believed the real ambassador's name was FARHAN.

He stated the young man quit coming to the Playboy Club about one and one-half years ago and he has not seen him since. The man gave the impression that he was in the Army Reserve or some similar organization in his own country and might have to serve in the Armed Forces and he assumed he had returned to his country during the Arab-Israli conflict.

The young man had no automobile and was described as white nale, 21 or 22, 5 feet 8 inches, slender build, olive complexion, black hair, clean shaven. He spoke fast and spoke fairly good English but with an accent. He also indicated he was engaged to a girl believed also from the Middle East, possibly residing in Washington, D. C., and commented that he had made one or more trips to Jordan or Arabia during DEEDLE's acquaintance with him. He was always well dressed and claimed that his father owned some supermarkets in Ohio, probably Akronal

DEEDLE stated he gave the man a ride to his dormitory on two occasions and he got out at the St. Louis University dormitory on the south side of the street one block south of Lindell and halfway between Spring and Grand Avenue and claimed to be a student at St. Louis University but did not mention what course he was taking.

DEEDLE stated KHALAF did not discuss politics to any degree but occasionally expressed a distaste for NASSER but was generally complimentary toward American officials and claimed he had met a lot of prominent people in Washington, D. C., due to his father's position.

Mrs. Alice Allen, Assistant Registrar, Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, a dvised SA/Phillip J. Reilly on 6-10-68 a publication captioned ""The Orinion" and an institution called Simpson were of no significance to her and that a check of available records concerning these items was negative.

Special Agent Martin Philphott, IRS Intelligence, 300 N. Los Angeles, Room 5016, advised the writer this date that he would research available information in the IRS files regarding Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, SSN and make available for inspection by the FBI the information located. He advised that this might conceivably take several weeks, and possibly less time, but that he would advise SA Francis J. Mullen, Jr. when he research was completed.

Los Angeles indices negative on "The Opinion", and XXXX indices / have no references identifiable with an institution called "Simpson".

Rememo of SA JOSEPH C. ALSTON dated 6/5/68.

Item 4 of rememo reflects that telephone number "548-2136" was found by the Los Angeles Police Department An a wire-bound lined notebook from the residence of SIRHAN SIRHAN.

SE LLOYD H. DUDLEY ascertained from CSLA \$178-S that this number is/a published listing for G.C. KELLUM, 330 16th Place, Costa Mesa, California.

A review of the photographs of the notebook mentioned above was made after the investigation which is set out below. This review shows that the telephone number as originally carried in rememo should have been SY 8/2136, which has been reported to be the phone at the SIRHAN residence. This memo is being written to show the investigation conducted for information purposes. It is conceivable that the LAPD could independently pursue the same investigation . and this is set out to show our investigation.

On 6/10/68, the writer and SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS, JR. interviewed Mrs. GILBERT C. KELLUM at her residence, and were advised she did not know/SIRHAN B. SIRHAN and had no knowledge of how her phone number had come to be in the possession of SIRHAN. She stated that prior to the arrival of the SAS at her home, she had telephoned her husband at his employment, and he was equally at a loss to understand how this came to be.

She stated that she recalls that a neighbor at her rear had her number and explained that this person, a CLARA HOFFELDER, formerly of 327 Ogle, has not been seen by her for approximately one year. She continued that HOFFELDER had rented a portion of her home to some "Arabs" and they were still in residence. KELLUM stated that a Dr. COMAN in Costa Mosa might know the present whereabouts of HOFFELDER.

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Dr. W.J. COWAN, 1525 Superior Avenue, Newport Beach, California, was then interviewed by the SAS and advised that Mrs. HOFFELDER recently departed for a three (3) month visit to Germany.

SAS then proceeded to 327 Ogle Street, and determined that there are presently seven male Arabs from Yemen renting this residence. They are listed below; all POB's in Yemen.

- 1. ALI ZABAM, DOB 9/15/39; 3 years in the U.S.; 2 years at this address.
- 2. MOHAMED AHMED, DBO 10/15/50; less than one year in U.S.; months at this address.
- 3. ALI HUSSEZN, DOB 3/12/36; 4 years in U.S.; 7 months at this address.
- 4. MOHAMED MOSE, DOB 1/10/50; less than one year in U.S.; 6 months at this address.
- 5. MOHAMED ALI HUSSEIN, DOB 11/15/41; 2 years in U.S.; 7 months at this residence.
- 6. ALI AROBYTE, DOB 1/2/37; approximately 2 years in U.S. 12 months at this residence.
- 7. AHMED ALI HOKES, DBO 6/8/37; 3 years in U.S.; 42 months at residence.

A former resident came to the house during our interview and he was interviewed. He is:

ISMAIL HUSSEIN RIEAL, DOB 12/25/41, 2 years in country, lived at this residence approximately 4 months, but left about 6 months ago and presently resides at 308 32nd Street, Costa Mesa, California.

All persons stated that they have never had any knowledge of SIRHAN SIRHAN prior to seeing his picture in the papers and on TV after the shooting of SENATOR KENNEDY. They were all shown photographs of SIRHAN and stated that they did not know him.

They explained that they were all from Yemen, and had no knowledge of SIRHAN, pointing out that he is a Jordanian and that these countries are very distant to one another.

ALI ZABAH, who has been residing at this residence for the longest period of time, stated that Mrs. HOFFELDER had moved out of the house about one year ago, and had subsequently sold the property. He said that prior to this, she had a phone at the house and that they have their own phone at the present. This number is 714 642-4946.

They expressed deep sorrow at the shooting of Senator KENNEDY and said the event was tragic.

There was a great deal of difficulty in conducting these interviews of these persons due to their extreme lack of English language ability.

Re Memo to the SAC of SA Joseph C. Alston dated 6-5-68.

Martin R. Philphott, Special Agent, IRS, Intelligence Section, 300 N. Los Angeles, advised the writer on this date, 6-10-68, that Secret Service had made an official request last Thursday, 6-6-68, for information in the IRS files concerning Sirhan and members of his family. He stated that the possibility exists that the results of the research would be sent over to Secret Service by another section of IRS, in which case it would not be possible for him to notify the writer and make available the material before it is sent over to Secret Service. Philphott advised that in such event, it would be necessary to contact Secret Service for the information.

Philphott further advised that his investigation had disclosed Sirhan Bishara Sirhan and filed a tax return for the year 1967, and had a refund due. He stated that Sirhan had owed money to IRS prior to this, and that this amount would be deducted from the amount of the refund due Sirhan. Philphott speculated that the windowed U.S. Treasury Department, IRS is envelop obtained from the residence of Sirhan by the LAPD was probably correspondence between Sirhan and the U.S. Treasury Department regarding the above.

SA Emmett E. Doherty was requested by the writer to contact either Tom Sherman or Stewart Knight of the Secret Service, stationed at LAPD Rampart Division regarding the making available to the FBI upon receipt, the file or a copy of the file of the results of the IRS research of its files on Sirhan Bishara Sirhan.

Item #5 of the list of items, numbers and names contained in the wire bound lined notebook obtained by the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) in the SIRHAN residence contains the names TOM WALTER and TOM WATHKE.

On 6/10/68, JOHN H. HANSON, Chief, TRPB, Los Angeles, advised SA MOOREHEAD that one WALTER THOMAS RATHKE, 8372 Stansbury Avenue, Panorama City, California, had made an application for stall space in Hollywood Park in 1962.

On 6/11/68 SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS and SA MOOREHEAD interviewed Mr. and Mrs. LAWRENCE MOORE at the above address. They advised that they have resided at this location for (9) nine years and WALTER THOMAS RATHKE, better known as Tom Rathke, is the newphew of Mrs. MOORE. RATHKE has used their home as his permanent residence even though he spends a good deal of his time traveling in various parts of California in connection with his work as a trainer and handler of horses.

They said that RATHKE is presently working at the Pleasanton, California Fairgrounds and resides at the Track Room at the Fairgrounds.

Mrs. MOORE said that her newphew had spoken of knowing SIRHAN SIRHAN in connection with some work he was doing at Santa Anita Race Track over a year ago. She said that RATHKE had referred to SIRHAN as "SOL".

RATHKE had recently written to his aunt using P.O. Box 1055, Livermore, California, as his return address. He stated that he would be in Los Angeles after June 16th. Mrs. MOORE's unlisted phone number is 892-7858.

The above information was telephonically furnished to SA RICHARD BUCARO and a lead set out for San Francisco.
