In the papers and notebooks of SIRHAN SIRHAN are various names. One such name is set out as TYRONE/CHAPMANN.

On 6/17/68, JOHN HANSON, TRPB, advised the writer that one TYRONE CHAPMAN, DOB 6/21/48, is a jockey. CHAPMAN was arrested 4/10/68 at Portland, Oregon on a hit-and-run charge. CHAPMAN is a full blooded Yakima Indian whose last known address is P. O. Box 104, Parker, Washington. His mother is MARY JIN/CHAPMAN at the same address.

HANSON advised that TOM_ESTMO, a horse trainer, is a brother of CHAPMAN and is currently at Portland Meadows Race Track, Portland, Oregon. HANSON believed that CHAPMAN was very possibly riding at this track and suggested contact with TRPB Agent EUGENE, DANFORTH be made for further information.

A teletype léad has been set out for Portland to determine CHAPMAN's knowledge, if any, of SIRHAN.


Los Angeles Police Departmént records do not contain any record identifiable with this person.

On 6/21/68 Mrs. HELEN GRUDER, Apt. 1, 46 North Wilson, Pasadena, advised that she is married to JESSE F GRUDER and has **EXXENX** never met SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN or even heard of him until seeing him on TV in connection with the assassination of ROBERT F. KENNEDY. She said she has never heard of any one named ELLEN GRUDER and pointed outn that her husband is the only person named GRUDER in the Pasadena telephone book. She stated that she was never a teacher and has never been in a position where she would have met the subject and has no knowledge of him whatever, and has never heard of the name "Kallellen".

STANLEY further advised that in discussion with the chief operator, he ancertained that the calling party had first attempted to contact the Los Angeles Police Department and wished to speak with the Chief of Police; however, since this line was tied up, the caller then said, "O.K., give me San Francisco".

STANLEY advised that the call was traced by the telephone company to the number 288-8392. If further information is desired regarding number 284-5544, STANLEY will furnish it.

The current Muncie telephone directory reflects telephone number 284-5544, is listed to D. D. SLOSHER, 2201 East 8th; and that number 288-6392, is listed to YD SLUSHER, 229 North Hackley.

The current Muncie city directory lists DELANEY D. SLUSHER as retired and residing 2201 East Sth; and ED SLUSHER as an investigator, County Trustee's Office, and residing 229 North Hackley Street.

On 6/28/68, AUSA CASTERLINE was again contacted and he stated he would still consider prosecution if the identity of the person who made the call could be determined and wanted either or both SLUSHERs interviewed regarding instant call.

Date 6/14/68

Chief of Police KEN HIVELY, Calistoga, California, telephonically advised on this date that one LOUIS BARDES, owner of the Green Hotel, Calistoga, has identified a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN as being identical to one BELA FOLDI, who registered at the hotel in September, 1967. FOLDI gave his address when registering as Countryside Hotel, LaGrange, Illinois. He stayed in Room 8 at the Green Hotel, and was employed at the Colonial Cafe in Calistoga. Upon departure he gave a forwarding address of 675 North Kenmore, Hollywood, California.

Chief HIVELY stated he personally did not feel there was any credence to the statement of BARDES since JOE GUERRERO, owner of the Colonial Cafe, who was the employer of FOLDI, says the photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN is not identical with FOLDI. However, BARDES made such a "stink" alound Calistoga that he felt he should call this office. Two letters addressed to FOLDI, one from Las Vegas and one from Hollywood, are in possession of Chief HIVELY if needed.


JUANITA OLMSTED, 287 Velvetlake, Sunnyvale, California, advised on June 6, 1968, that at 12:30 p.m., she was at a bus station in Los Angeles. In the waiting room of the bus station she observed a young man sitting down and reading a book. There was another young man sitting next to him, however, she did not know if these two men were together. OLMSTED described the young man in question as possibly identical with SIRHAN SIRHAN. She noted the man wore tennis shoes and blue jeans. OLMSTED said that this man appeared to possibly be identical with the KENNEDY assassin whose picture she has observed on her TV which gives a relatively dark picture.

MYRTLE OLAYTON. San Francisco Police Department Switchboard Operator, advised that at approximately 8:20 p.m. on June 6, 1968 she received a call from an unknown male who advised he was calling from Muncie, Indiana. The caller asked if the assassin of KENNEDY was being held in The San Francisco and she told him that he was not. The caller then stated "It's a good thing he isn't and in fact whoever has him should guard him closely as I intend to kill him." The operator transferred the call to one of the police department inspectors and he talked to the man for only a few seconds before he hung up. Apparently he made this same threat to the police department inspector. An attempt was made by the police department to trace the call through the Muncie, Indiana operator which was unsuccessful since the caller had hung up. It was determined through the operator .teng JAPhy Myntul to JAPhy that when the man placed the call he had given a non-existent telephone number as the number he was calling from.



MICHAEZ SLOMICH was contacted at the residence of his father, 2000 Flores Avenue, San Mateo, California, during the evening of June 5, 1968. He was interviewed in the presence of his father, SIDNEY SLOMICH. He stated that he is at present a graduate student at San Francisco State College, San Francisco, and resides at 2464 California Street, San Francisco, California.

MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he attended Pasadena City College approximately one and a half years and subsequently attended University of California at Los Angeles from approximately February, 1966, to December, 1967, at which time he graduated.

MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he is aware that there is a Syrian-Lebanese Cultural Center, possibly known as the Syrian-Lebanese-American Cultural Center, located on Hollywood Boulevard near Sunset Strip. He stated that this group is a far right group, and he has knowledge that in the past the organization has permitted the American Nazi Party to utilize their headquarters to hold meetings and conduct action against "peace" demonstrators and to "eliminate traitors." These meetings occurred in approximately August 1967.

SLOMICH stated that he may have seen SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN at some of these meetings or in connection with this group. SLOMICH said he is not positive at all that he has seen SIRHAN and states he has no acquaintance with him.

SLOMICH further advised that in Pasadena, California, on Colorado Boulevard, across the street from Pasadena City College, a bookstore known as the Americanism Book Store was formerly located. This store is now out of existence and has been gone for approximately two years. MICHAEL SLOMICH stated this book store was operated by a former Navy Petty officer whose name he does not recall, and it is his impression that in its stock it carried the far right Arab literature which was strongly anti-Semitic. He stated that he felt this could

be significant in that SIRHAN was from Pasadena.

Further interview with MICHAEL SLOMICH elicited from him the fact that he attended DuBois Club meetings at the University of California at Los Angeles from approximately February, 1966, to December, 1967. He stated that he was very friendly with one WALTER CROWE, who was one of the significant individuals in this group. SLOMICH requested that in the event CROWE were contacted for any reason that his (SLOMICH's) identity be completely concealed. SLOMICH stated that in his association with the DuBois Club, which also included three city-wide meetings and twelve city-wide parties, he had never observed SIRHAN at any of these affairs. He indicated that he considered the DuBois Club to be a conservative-type organization composed of middle-class students who were rebelling against their parents. It was a non-militant, nonactive group interested principally in theory. He advised that the DuBois Club at Pasadena City College was never active to any extent.

In addition, MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he was in the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) at the University of California at Los Angeles from February, 1966, to December, 1967, and attended many meetings of this organization. He expressed the opinion that he knew everyone in the SDS in Southern California, including students from University of California at Los Angeles, Pasadena City College, Los Angeles City College and University of Southern California. He stated that he does not recall SIRHAN as ever being in attendance at any of these meetings, nor was he known to him in any way through these activities.

SLOMICH advised that he is presently active in the SDS at San Francisco State College and has been one of the activists protesting the Naval ROTC unit on the campus, and that he has been involved in the current demonstrations at this school. DIRECTOR, FBI (62-587)

<u>RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER</u> age 52, was located and interviewed on June 26, 1968, at Room 57 of the Lisboa Hotel, Calle Huerto 20, Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico. His letter dated June 5, 1968, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation was acknowledged. HUNTER explained that he had desired to express his sorrow concerning the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and for this reason had sent the letter.

HUNTER said that ERNESTO OSWALD, age 57, a U. S. Army veteran who resides at the 18 peso (\$1.44 U.S.) a day Lisboa Hotel, had caused him trouble in the past, and he wanted to "report him." OSWALD's lady friend, EDITH V. FLUSSER, of Calle Emiliano Carranza 87, Zapopan, Jalisco, was Identified by HUNTER as a former resident of Germany, with whom OSWALD had spoken of opening a hotel at Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco.

HUNTER was assured that his letter would be kept confidential.

Vice Consul GEORGE HIRAGA of the American Consulate General at Guadalajara, Jalisco, on June 26, 1968, stated that RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER receives a Social Security check at the Consulate. He advised that inasmuch as HUNTER is not old enough to receive a retirement check he apparently receives a check for health reasons, possibly mental.

The files of the Mexico City Office contain no previous reference to RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER or ERNESTO OSWALD.

Inasmuch as inquiries show that HUNTER's letter to the Bureau does not have a direct bearing on this case, no further action concerning it is contemplated.


Sandra Mettetal by phone was questioned for details about above group,7-3-68. She said she did not know if the group of singers she had previously mantioned was an organized group. They were kids hanging around the area where Sen. Kennedy was scheduled to speak in the Embassy room at the Ambassador Hotel, 6-4-68 pm. The group came up to Sandra and asked her if it was ok for them to get up on the podiumand sing. She informed the group,2 white males,1 white female and 1 male negro, they would have to get permission from some one in Kennedy campaign party. She later saw the group talking to Karen kline of the Kennedy Campaign staff. Kline is still working at the Kennedy campaign office 561 Wilshire Bl., L. A. which is now devoted to gun control campaign.

Kline by phone 7-3-68 said she recalled the group of singers dressed in orange and white and described by Sandra above. The group did not sppear to be organized or have a name and in her opinion was a pick up group from kids who hang around rallies seeking to capitalize on them. The group had ask her her if it was alright to get up on the podium and sing and they were informed they could not do this but no objection was voiced to them standing of on the floor in front fo the podium and singing. Kline did not know any of the group or where they were from, their name or any thing about them. She had no knowledge of this group singing frequently at Kennedy rallies.

Action: In view of the above info.No further attempt will be made to try to identify the singing group in question.

Sandra was phoned 7-3-68 for detail.She said the above employee drove a large white auto with"Continential Recordings"in blue letterson each side.He had a press pass. She saw him with recording equipment on the podium during Kennedys speech 6-4-68 at the hotel.She later saw him during the Sirhan hearing in the press area.

ArM. Mazzone, Public Affairs, IAPD, 7-3-68, said press pass indices of his dept. revealed a let.8-17-67 requesting press passes for <u>Carlton Werner, DOB, 11-4-49</u> and Lew Werner age 15,5641 Babbitt Av., Encino, Cal.# 344-5055. They claimed to represent Continential Recordings who did Work for Sta. KPOL(5700 Sunset Bl. #466-4123-phone listing Mr. Brent, News Div. They listed a box # 5539, Sherman Oaks, Cal.as a mail add.

Bob Sobtt, program director, KPOL, 7-8-68 said Jeff Brent # 784-5488 was the Continential Recording_employee who had covered the Kennedy party, 6-4-68.

Cliff Piedler, Continential Recordings, Div. of Continental News, 15300 Ventura Bl., Sherman Oaks, Cal., room 211, phone 784-5488, 7-9-68, said Jeff Prent and Ira Goldstein were only employees who had covered the Kennedy party at the Ambassador, 6-4/5-68. Ira was involved and of course been interviewed by FBI and Brent had not been interviewed by FBI as far as Cliff knew.

Brent phoned Agent L.Warren 7-9-68 said he was working in the same area with Sandy of City News Pervice at the Kennedy party at the Ambassador 6-4-68 but did not witness the actual shooting nor did he see Sirhan himself at any time. He had a friend, Ted Charach# 462-3421 who said had pictures of persons thought to be Sirhan and the girl in the pokadot dress, taken at the Ambassador Hotel. Further he had heard the FBI was just finding the witness Kadar, in past 2 or 3 days, who was interviewed at some length on TV following the shooting. Ted has some detail on this. See Separts FD-30V

Ted Charach, 5712 La Mirada Av., Hollywood Apt.# 25 #462-3421, by phone said ne was a free lance communications (voice) man who worked with some of the

free lance recorders and phothographers including Jeff Brent.He was at the Ambassador inthe Embassy room behind the stage during Kensalt and did not witness the actual shooting or see Sirhan.He had been interviewed by the IAPD at the scene.He claimed to have later called the FBI and the Police offering certain observations.

Re films of Sirhan and the girl in the polka dot dress Ted said the films in question had been shot by some of his free lance photographers. He knew of no films showing Sirhan. He had observed at least one girl in a polka dot dress in film shots of the crowd at Kennedy's party 6-4-68. He will remain alert for any one who comes up with film shots of Sirhan.

Immediately after Kersalt, Ted had taken the names of several persons in the crowd who claimed to have seen the shooting. George Green, a negro, Phone # 753-330 and Jim Love # 296-3506. Ted in reviewing his notes had the name of Mike Mayne, who had a Webester # but full number not obtained. He was not sure just what Mike saw.

Ted talked to one Frank Conte who was known to John Milman of the L.A. Times about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after the shooting and Conte had claimed he saw a "wild eyed" man running out of the kitchen after the shooting. This statement apparently had no connection as revealing a possible suspect as Ted said it appeared the man running was trying to get to a phone to call an ambulance. Ted did not know if Conte was an eye ball witness or not.

Ted said he had a bumpersticker referring to a J.F. Kennedy conspiracy which was being distributed in the parking lot and around the Ambassador hotel at the Sen. Kennedy party Mort Goodman, of Mort Goodman Co., a <u>public relations</u> man for the Ambassador Hotel had taken the bumper sticker away from him as he was against the circulation of it. Goodman was in the press room at the time

Ted sait it was hearsay, original source not recalled that Sirhan and some of his buddies had been interviewed on a Joe Pyne TV Show, produced by Marv Gray about a year ago during the middle east war

Ted had learned from <u>Gebor Kedar</u>, Bresident of Diplomatic Sales, 309 N.Odgen Dr., L. A., 90036 #934-2168, a witness to the Kennedy shooting, the FBI had interviewed hill a few days ago.

Action: Kensalt indices revealed deo.Green and Jim Lowe have been interviewed and leads out on Mike Wayne and Gabor Kadar to SA J. K. Crowe and R.F. Pickard resp. Pickard was orally advised of the address of Kadar. No other action recommended.

A review of available records of Centéral Receiving Hospital failed to indicate any treatment for any person who was injurged by a blow of a camera, on 6/5/68.

A further review of Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68, indicated that the person who was struck by a camera was attempting to stop the movement of Senator KENNEDY so that he could photograph the injuried KENNEDY. On July 9, 1968, Mrs. WILLIAM DAVIDSON, 349 Peach Grove Lane, Santa Barbara, California, telephonically contacted the Santa Barbara Resident Agency and furnished the following information:

DAVIDSÓN identified herself as a member of the Democratic Central Committee for the State of California. She advised that on July 8, 1968, while at Democratic Headquarters, 135 East DeLaGuerre Street (963-1604) at approximately 1:30 p.m. she answered a telephone call and spoke to a woman who refused to identify herself. The caller inquired whether or not she had anything to do with the current "recall REAGAN campaign." She advised the caller she did not and that FRANCES GLEDHILL, a local Santa Barbara resident, was concerned with this activity. The caller then began to berate Mrs. DAVIDSON using foul and disjointed language. At one point in the conversation, the caller stated that she knew ROBERT F. KENNEDY was going to be shot weeks prior to his having been shot. The daller also stated that she was only sorry that JESSE UNRUH had not been killed also and a number of other people whom she failed to specifically name. Mrs. DAVIDSON advised in her opinion the caller must have been mentally unbalanced and that she, Mrs. DAVIDSON, was furnishing this information to the FBI not as a request that the caller be identified and prosecuted but only for future reference in the event the caller's identity becomes known to her, DAVIDSON. If such becomes the case, Mrs. DAVIDSON stated she would advise.

Mrs. DAVIDSON was thanked for furnishing the above information at which time she was advised of the jurisdiction of the FBI in this matter.







In connection with this investigation, HETHERINGTON contacted a <u>LINDA MASSRY</u> of 911 Alta Vista, Altadena, who was a friend of the SIRHAN family and apparently knew that SAIDALLAH possessed firearms, having seen a rifle in his possession.

The investigation conducted by HETHERINGTON further developed a woman by the name of <u>LINDA LVE DAVIS</u> of 1164 Duarte Road, Arcadia, California, Apartment 14, telephone number 446-8041. This woman is a female Caucasian, age 23, who is divorced and has two children. This woman was a friend of SAIDALLAH and was apparently with him when SAIDALLAH visited ABRAHAM ALEX approximately a week or two prior to the assassingtion.

DAVIS was interviewed by the Pasadena PD and indicated that she knew SAIDALLAH but did not have information concerning his possession of firearms.

This investigation further developed that LINDA ANN POSEY of 2109 Summit, Altadena, California, was also a friend of SAIDALLAH. This woman is also a Caucasian, is divorced and has two children and is currently living with an individual by the name of <u>DAVID MORFLEET</u>. POSEY was interviewed by the Pasadena offices and indicated that she had never dated SAIDALLAH, did go to his an artment the



AL-AKHRASS further advised that he personally telephoned the president of the local chapter of OAS at Pasadena, California, and was advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN has not been a member of the local Fasadena chapter of OAS.

AL-AKHRASS stated that the National OAS made a press release, dated June 5, 1968, disclaiming any knowledge of SIRHAN SIRHAN and this press release states that SIRHAN SIRHAN has not been a member of the national or local organization of the OAS. AL-AKHRASS furnished a copy of the press release which will be included in the FD 302 which will follow.

The following is furnished for your information:

At 3:44 p.m. 6/28/68 the subject called the White House. She was extremely upset and a <u>Linda Slater</u> took the phone and carried on the conversation.

Slater related that Buteau knew a person who assisted Sirhan in killing Senator Kennedy. She related that Buteau was walking on Congress St. on 6/27/68 when this person, who identified hivself as Merrill Rogers, came up beside her and followed her home and into her apartment. Futeau claims that she was afraid of Fogers and engaged him in conversation.

Buteau asked Regers about hirself and he told her that he was a Commist. Buteau related that she then asked him a question about Senator Kennedy and if he knew that Kennedy had been killed. Regers told her that he knew President Kennedy and Senator Kennedy and that he helped Sirhan kill Senator Kennedy. He then left a pocketknife on the table. Buteau stated that there are some stains on the knife that look like dried blood. The knife is the type that has a can opener, a screwdriver, and a blade. On the side of the knife is the inscription "Palmdale Service Station, P.O. Box 1200, PH 2-3631. 56. 156. 156. 1320
