The Agent asked Buteau if she had ever been in a mental institution and she hung up. In a few minutes, Linda Slater called back and stated that Buteau had been upset by asking her that question. However, Slater stated that Buteau told her that she had never had any mental problems.

Buteau advised that she called the FBI in Hartford and they expressed no interest. She also stated that she called the Hartford Police Department, who responded with three cars. After hearing her story, the Officers called it "garbage" and left.

On 7/9/68, Cadet RICHARD A. HUTTON, Company B, 6th Battalion, 2nd Brigade, U. S. Army Training Center, Ft. Benning, Ga., advised he originally met SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN some time between September of 1962 and June of 1965, when he was attending Pasadena City College, Pasadena, Cal. He met SIRHAN through his cousin, BRUCE EDWARD FULTON, who also was a student at the college. To the best of his recollection he met SIRHAN around 1963-64 and had a very casual acquaintance with this man. He has no recollection of talking to him since 1965. He recalls that he was a student at the college but did not have any classes with him. His relationship with SIRHAN was drinking a cup of coffee with him and being involved in "small conversation" concerning campus activities and things of that nature. He had no recollection of ever hearing SIRHAN discuss his nationalistic tendencies, although he knew he was a Jordanian. SIRHAN did not mention his political views and he can recall nothing that would indicate he was violent in nature or would indicate he was associated with any persons who might advocate violence in any manner. He has had coffee and possibly sat at the same table at lunch with him in the Campus Center of the college. He was unable to offer any additional information concerning him or his background.

An individual identifying himself as JOE HARRISON, 5464 North Hartford Place, Tulsa, Oklahoma, FI S-7348, called the Tulsa Resident Agency and asked to speak to the Agent in Charge of the Resident Agency. This individual furnished the following information:

He is an employee of Knotts Rambler Ranch in Tulsa as a Service Writer. He talked to a customer on that date named MAC SPADDEN who works at Sinclair Oil Company, telephone LUTHER 4-0411. MAC SPADDEN left his car at Knotts Rambler to be repaired and he was "hard" to get along with.

HARRISON said during some conversation with MAC SPADDEN, this customer stated he had just come to Tulsa from California, the previous afternoon. He said he knew the assassination was going to take place, and that there were two brothers involved. One SIRHAN brother was supposed to "get" KENNEDY, and the other was supposed to "get" Senator MC CARTHY. He said MAC SPADDEN claimed he was connected with the Civil Liberties Union.

HARRISON described MAC SPADDEN as a white male, age 45, 5'2", 155-160 pounds. He said he does not know where this individual resides. HARRISON said he had no further information regarding the conversation or the whereabouts of MAC SPADDEN.

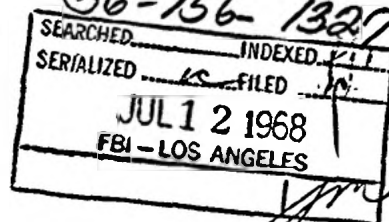

JACK B. COURSEY, Service Manager, Knotts Rambler Ranch, 2800 E. 11th Street, furnished the following information:

JOE HARRISON was a Service Writer for Knotts Rambler Ranch, however, he did not show up for work on June 7, 1968. He went to work on Monday, June 3, 1968, and worked Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. He worked until about 9:30 AM, Thursday, June 6, 1968, when he left stating he was going to see his lawyer to clear up some family problems, after which he said he was going to head for Houston. The records of Knotts Rambler show HARRISON's address as 5464 N. Hartford Place. COURSEY does know that HARRISON formerly worked for Wilkerson Chrysler and Plymouth for about 2 weeks. COURSEY said WILKERSON let him go for no good reason and to his knowledge, they were "not quite happy with him". He did not know the reason HARRISON was released at Wilkerson.

Records of Knotts Rambler show a customer named R. R. MC FADDEN, 4126 S. Birmingham Place, telephone RI 3-3681, left his 1967 red American Rambler on June 6, 1968, for air conditioner repairs. The mileage on this car was 1577. MC FADDEN was in on a previous day and talked with HARRISON about the repairs. He talked to COURSEY on June 6, 1968, when the car was left. COURSEY had no conversation with MC FADDEN when he left the car regarding the KENNEDY assassination.

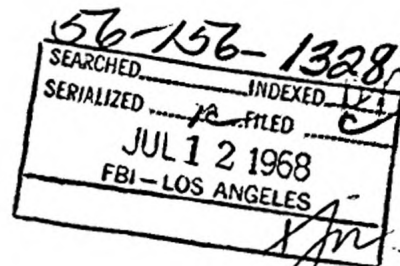

LARRY E. MC SPADDEN, 1813 S. Maplewood, Tulsa, Oklahoma, was interviewed during the evening hours at his home. He furnished the following information:

He has a 1962 Chevrolet automobile which he exhibited to the interviewing Agents. He said he had not been to Knotts Rambler Ranch in Tulsa on that date and had not left his car at any garage to be repaired. He stated he does not know anyone named JOE HARRISON and did not talk to any garage employee concerning the assassination of Senator KENNEDY.

MC SPADDEN said he is an accounting clerk with the Sinclair Refining Company, Tulsa. He is the only MC SPADDEN listed in the telephone directory for the Sinclair Company. He does not know any other MC SPADDEN working for the company, and has never heard of a MC FADDEN working there.

He has not been in California for about 9 years and certainly did not return to Tulsa from California in the recent past. He has had no conversation with anyone wherein it was mentioned that it was known that the shooting of Senator KENNEDY was going to take place.

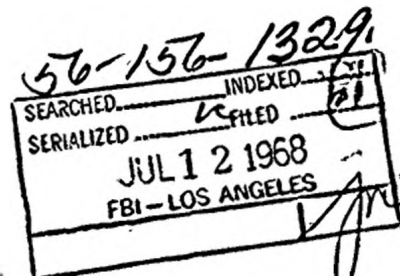

An individual named JOE HARRISON called the Kennedy Headquarters and said there was a conspiracy to kill Senator MC CARTHY. He claimed he obtained this information from a customer of Knotts Rambler Ranch, one MC SPADDEN or MC FADDEN. HARRISON claimed to be a Service Writer for Knotts Rambler. According to HARRISON, this MC SPADDEN works for Sinclair Oil Company, as an Auditor, telephone LU 4-0411, and resides at 5654 59th St., Muskogee, Oklahoma.

HARRISON claimed the assassin of Senator KENNEDY had a brother who was supposed to kill Senator MC CARTHY.

HARRISON claimed this MC SPADDEN was a member of the Civil Liberties Union.

RONALD R. MC FADDEN, 4126 South Birmingham Pl.,  
Tulsa, Oklahoma, furnished the following information:

He retired from Sears, Roebuck and Company on January 6, 1968, after 26 years of employment. He was a Merchandise Manager for Sears prior to his retirement.

MC FADDEN went to Knotts Rambler Ranch automobile agency on June 5, 1968, to leave his car for repair of the air conditioner. He was at Knotts sometime around 2 or 3 PM. He first talked to DUANE HOLLOWELL, the salesman who sold him the car, and then to the Service Manager and another individual named JACK in the service department. The individual named JACK had one eye which was slightly crossed.

MC FADDEN was very much perturbed about having had the car back to Knotts on three previous occasions to have the air conditioner repaired. It first smoked and after repair, worked reasonably well. He was assured by JACK that he could be fixed by the agency.

At no time during the conversation with JACK on June 5, 1968, did the subject of the shooting of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY come up, and MC FADDEN did not mention to anyone that he had just returned from California. In fact, he has not been to California recently, and the last time he was on the west coast was during the Fall of 1967 when he was in Seattle, Washington. MC FADDEN said that JACK is not the person with whom to carry on a conversation. He described him as an unimpressive individual and a person about whom it is hard to associate him with the responsibility which he had. He was not aware of the fact that JACK became angry with him during the conversation, if such could have happened. He does recall that JACK asked the Service Manager to ride with MC FADDEN to check on the gear shift selector.

MC FADDEN said he did not leave the car there on June 5, 1968. He made arrangements to take it back and did take it back to the agency on Thursday, June 6, 1968, after 3 PM, and it is still at the agency being repaired.

MC FADDEN said he has absolutely no information regarding the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, and has no information regarding the individual responsible for this shooting. He has not told anyone that he has any such information. He knows nothing about any supposed plan to harm Senator MC CARTHY, and he has never told anyone he has any such information. He has never told anyone he knew the assassination was going to take place.

Mrs. JUNE CANARY, 5464 North Hartford Place, Tulsa, Oklahoma, office supervisor, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, Northland District, 801 E. 36th St. North, Tulsa, furnished the following information:

She was formerly married to JACK E. HARRISON, and married him in about 1964 in Houston, Texas. They were divorced about six months later in Houston. After Mrs. CANARY came to Tulsa from Houston, HARRISON followed her to Tulsa.

Mrs. CANARY said HARRISON is an alcoholic and there would be no reliability to anything he says. She continued that he has been in the Oklahoma State Mental Hospital, Vinita, Oklahoma, on two occasions during the last two years for alcoholism. The first time he was there, he may have stayed about a month or longer. The second time he was there, he may have been in the hospital for three weeks or longer. She does not know the diagnosis, other than he went there for alcoholism. She believes he voluntarily committed himself.

She said he has a tendency to exaggerate on everything, and likes to rephrase anything which is said.

Mrs. CANARY said the last time she saw HARRISON was on the previous day, at which time he was drinking excessively. She does not know where he is living, however, believes he has a room near 5th Street. When she got home the evening of June 6, 1968, he was in her home and she does not know how he got in unless she did not close her door securely.

After she arrived home, HARRISON called on Mrs. CANARY's telephone to Houston, Texas, to the residence where he has three children, and talked to the girl's step-father. She finally made him hang up the telephone. She does not know the telephone number to which this call was placed, however, it will be on her next telephone bill.

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN, Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, furnished the following information:

DJEREDJIAN advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanon. During this period, he worked with a Mr. LAMPKIN, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, United States Department, Los Angeles, California. During this time, he submitted numerous reports to LAMPKIN concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations including the Arab Student Association. He stated that in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after the assassination of ROBERT KENNEDY, he saw a picture of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law that the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadena City College or Pasadena High School while attending school in Pasadena. He did not and still does not recognize the name SIRHAN SIRHAN. It was his opinion that of all the organizations at Pasadena City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would come from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. LEWIS, Present Dean of Admissions, and Mr. WELDON, ex-Dean of Admissions of Pasadena City College, might have more details concerning such individuals and/or organizations.

DJEREDJIAN stated the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 20, 1968, he had picked up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Michigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 2:10 PM, where he turned in the car, received a cashiers check on the Bank of America for approximately \$113., cashed this

check at the bank across the street, and took a bus to Los Angeles, California. In Los Angeles, he went to the office of Mr. LAMPKIN in the Federal Building where he arrived at approximately 3:00 to 3:15 PM. He talked with Mr. LAMPKIN concerning a possible trip of his back to Lebanon caused by his father's illness and departed at approximately 4:30 PM. He walked several blocks to the Greyhound Bus Depot where he purchased a ticket to Phoenix, Arizona, and departed on this bus to Phoenix at approximately 7 - 10 PM. DJEREDJIAN stated he had not been back to Los Angeles, California, since that time for any reason. He stated he had not seen nor talked with any other person on that occasion in Los Angeles, and that he has no friends or acquaintances currently living in the Los Angeles area with whom he has visited recently or with whom he corresponds.

DJEREDJIAN furnished a tube with a prescription on it which indicated it had been issued by BLAINE's Pharmacy, telephone 944-9441, on June 3, 1968, prescription number 68592, with pharmacist's initials BSK. DJEREDJIAN stated this was a medicine prescription to him for a severe sunburn he received by sleeping in the sun in Phoenix, Arizona. He said when he originally observed the photograph of the assassin on television, he had considered contacting the FBI, but his wife had persuaded him not to because of this severe sunburn and because he had been involved in trouble in the past concerning deportation from the United States.

DJEREDJIAN could not locate his ticket from Los Angeles to Phoenix, but did produce a contract with the Ace Automobile Transportation Company to deliver a Cadillac to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. This contract indicated that the vehicle was picked up on May 20, 1968, in Detroit, Michigan, and was due on May 27, 1968, in South San Gabriel. This form indicated that after his arrival in South San Gabriel, he could be reached in care of ROSE AVAKIAN, 13158 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California. DJEREDJIAN stated he did not even

know if AVAKIAN still resided at that address or not; that he had not contacted her and that he only used her name because it was required on the contract to have a contact point in California.

After his return to Phoenix, he obtained a copy of his marriage license on May 31, 1968, and talked with Mr. ISREAL (phonetic) in the Immigration Office concerning a possible trip back to Lebanon.

DJEREDJIAN provided a copy of a reissued Greyhound Bus Company ticket, dated June 9, 1968, number 0665653 for travel from Dallas, Texas, to Wilburton, Oklahoma, in the amount of \$43.00. This ticket was marked as a reissue. DJEREDJIAN said it was the only bus ticket remaining in his possession for any of his travels from Los Angeles to Phoenix and from Phoenix to Wilburton, Oklahoma.

DJEREDJIAN denied that he had ever made any comments concerning the possible assassination of Vice President HUMPHREY, or anyone else, and stated he had never commented about talking with anyone in Los Angeles about any assassination. He stated that when first married, his mother-in-law had notified the FBI in Phoenix that he was bringing in dope and was making approximately \$70,000 per year which he was not declaring for income tax purposes.

DJEREDJIAN advised he was running his own import-export business in Detroit, Michigan, prior to his departure in May of this year.

DJEREDJIAN advised that his ex-wife, SHAKEY KASPARIAN, current location unknown, a natural born American citizen, had previously complained in Los Angeles to the police about his taking nude photographs.

He stated he had applied to the FBI for a position as translator in Dallas, Texas, on one occasion, but had not been hired because he was in the country on a student visa.

DJEREDJIAN stated that while in Detroit, Michigan, he had produced the Armenian Radio Voice Radio Program and published a national weekly newspaper, "Hye Serant".

DJEREDJIAN stated he would cooperate with the FBI in any manner possible and if desired, he might be able to provide helpful information in this matter if he could review his old reports as submitted to Mr. LAMPKIN.

For the further information of Los Angeles, extensive investigation was conducted by numerous offices concerning HAGOP DJEREDJIAN, presently residing in Wilburton, Oklahoma. Letterhead memoranda have been disseminated concerning DJEREDJIAN and pursuant to Bureau instructions, contained in Bureau airtel to Oklahoma City dated 6/25/68, no security investigation is being undertaken regarding DJEREDJIAN.



Senator John L. McClellan (D., Ark.), Chairman of the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, announced today the beginning of a preliminary inquiry into certain aspects of the Foreign Aid Program. At the present time the inquiry is expected to deal primarily with the administration and the effectiveness of United States aid to Iran.

Yesterday the Subcommittee heard in executive session the testimony of The Khaibar Khan, leader of the Bakhtiari Tribe of Iran, who is temporarily living in the United States and who spoke for a group he described as "K. K. United Patriots for Justice." During the course of his secret testimony, The Kha. described Foreign Aid operations in Iran and surrendered to the Subcommittee voluminous documents in his possession in full substantiation of the testimony he gave the Subcommittee. These documents, if corroborated, point to gross corruption and misuse of funds in excess of \$100,000,000.00 in connection with the administration of United States aid to Iran. The current inquiry will follow avenues of investigation suggested by the documents and by the testimony of The Khaibar Khan. Future action by this Subcommittee will be determined by the facts developed during the preliminary inquiry.



Dear Mr. Wells:

This is to acknowledge your letter of November 16, 1964, suggesting the possibility that information contained in the files of our Subcommittee was made available by some means to the Iranian Ambassador.

As you know, our Subcommittee has been in communication not only with the Iranian Embassy in Washington but also with the Department of Justice and the Department of State concerning this matter. Although there has not been the free exchange of information between our Subcommittee and the Iranian Embassy, there have been occasions when it was necessary to be in touch with them. With the Department of Justice, of course, and the Department of State, it has been found desirable to exchange information, particularly since the Department of State undertook some investigation in Iran at our request.

I am not convinced that the mere possession of your letter by the Ambassador from Iran indicates that the integrity of our Subcommittee files or Subcommittee personnel had been violated. No Subcommittee member or employee has any interest in this matter other than to learn the truth. Nevertheless, I am causing an inquiry to be made in an attempt to determine what transpired.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of September 17, 1963, with which was enclosed an amendment to your registration statement filed under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended.

In your letter you advise that you do not anticipate any further activities on your part on behalf of the Khaibar Khan or his organization which would necessitate notice to the Registration Section. It is presumed from this statement that you wish to have your registration terminated under the Act. In order to accomplish this, it will be necessary for you to amend Item 5 of your original registration statement indicating that as of June 12, 1963, the date of your registration, you performed no further services for your foreign principals. If you have performed services for the foreign principals subsequent to June 12, 1963, it will be necessary pursuant to Rule 260 under the Act to file a final statement for the final period of the agency relationship not covered by the original registration statement.

Amendment forms and forms for a final statement are enclosed herewith. The appropriate set of forms should be filed in duplicate with this office as soon as possible.

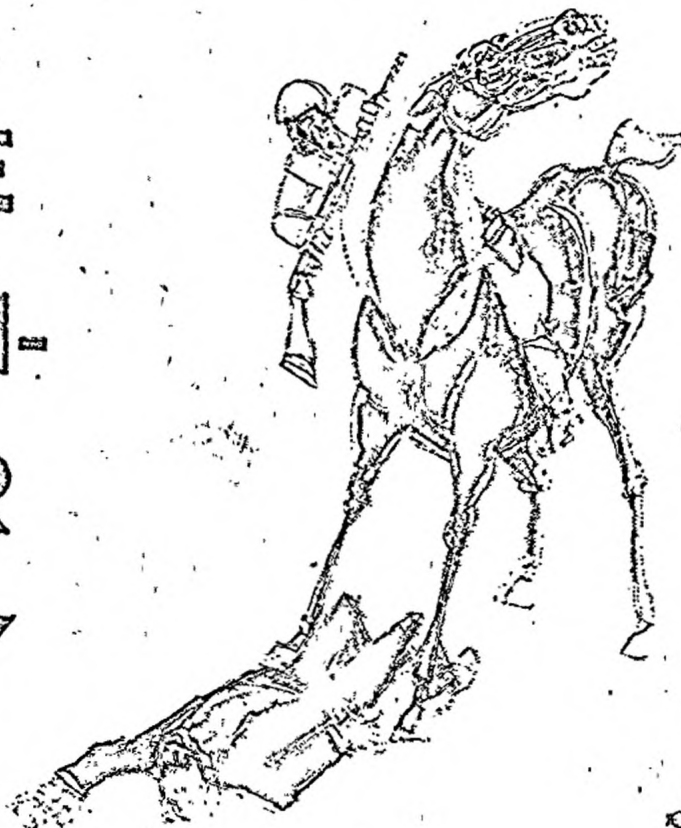
