A review of the telephone directories for the Los Angeles metropolitan area for DANNY or DANIEL CORTIN failed to show any reference identifiable.

On 8/2/68 IC BERNARD P. BLAIS caused the records of the Los Angeles Credit Bureau to be searched in an effort to locate DANNY CORTIN; however, with the information available no record idenfifiable was located.

On 8/1/68 IC MILLARD T. ANDERSON caused the records of the LAPD to be checked but no record identifiable was located.

In view of the fact that there is no indication CORTIN can furnish specific information, it is suggested that efforts to interview him be discontinued.



On 8/23/68 ART RYHN, Investigator, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, (TRPB) Los Angeles, California, furnished the following information:

RYHN advised that his office has received a stop notice for one HENRY DONALD RAMISTELLA, Aka., FRANK DONNARUMMA from their New York Office, indicating that the FBI wanted to locate RAMISTELLA. He stated that RAMISTELLAs last known employment was GRANJA VISTA DEL DIO RANCH, 13200 Citris, Corona, California; Owner is one BERT ALTFILLISCH. He stated that ALTFILLISCH and an unknown female residing at the Ranch in 1967 were interviewed concerning the whereabouts of RAMISTELLA, with negative results, although the unknown female mentioned to one of the (TRPB) agents that ALTFILLISCH is either a relative of RAMISTELLA or a very close friend, and she felt certain he would know RAMISTELLAS whereabouts.

RYMN went on to say that MARTIN CRUIKSHANK, Bank of America, Tele. # 683-3591 knows the subject RAMISTELLA and could possibly be helpful in locating him.



Summary:

Subject was fingerprinted at Santa Anita under the name of FRANK DONNARUMMA. Accompanied by his employer. BERT C. ALTFILLISCH, subject later contacted the fingerprint office and confessed that he had been using the fictitious name of FRANK DONNARUMMA, and that his true name was HENRY DONALD RAMISTELLA, and that he rode as a jockey in the East for several years. He said he was set down in 1957 for inconsistent riding. He was arrested in New York during 1957-58 for grand larceny (touting) for an amount exceeding \$3,500 and was given a suspended sentence. He also mentioned that in 1958 he was arrested along with 6 others including jockey WALTER BLUM for possession of marijuana. Subject said he pleaded guilty and was given 30 days, suspended. BLUM was found not guilty. In 1958-59 he was arrested for consorting with known criminals. Subject's employer said subject had told him his true name and background, and described him as a competent employee. ALTFILLISCH said he is a horse owner and has a training ranch and had wanted subject to contact trainers at Santa Anita for horses to board and train. Subject surrendered his TRPB card and stable badge to Investigator Clifford Smith. TRPB files show that on 5/31/55 there was a Stewards' ruling at Camden, New Jersey, as follows: "Jockey RAMISTELLA presently under suspension, is suspended indefinitely; case referred to Racing Commission".

On January 25, 1966 an individual identifying himself as FRANK DONNA-RUMMA came to the TRPB fingerprint office at Santa Anita and asked to be fingerprinted in connection with his request for stable credentials and a TRPB identity card. Subject furnished the following information:

He was then fingerprinted and issued a TRPB identity card #032532.

On February 1, 1966 subject returned to Santa Anita and contacted Investigator Clifford Smith, who is handling the fingerprint program. On this occasion subject was accompanied by BERT ALTFILLISCH, whom he identified as his employer. Subject said he wanted to correct the information which he had submitted with the fingerprint application on January 25th. Subject said his true name was HENRY DONALD RAMISTELLA; and that the physical description and other information he furnished were correct. He said he had used the name of FRANK DONNARUMMA since about 1960, and that he had been married under that name. Subject said the reason he adopted the name of DONNARUMMA was because he had ridden as a jockey in the East for several years, and while at Garden State Park in 1957 he was set down for 60 days for inconsistent riding. Subject said since that time he has never been employed at any race track. Subject also disclosed he was arrested in New York during 1957-58 for grand larceny by trickery (touting) for an amount exceeding \$3,500, and was given a suspended snetence. Subject also stated during 1958 in New York he was arrested with 6 others including jockey WALTER BLUM for possession of marijuana. Subject said he pleaded guilty and was given a 30-day suspended snetence. He said BLUM pleaded not guilty and his case was dismissed. Subject also added that in 1958-59 he was arrested for consorting with known criminals, and this charge was subsequently dismissed.

Mr. ALTFILLISCH, subject's employer, said subject had confided in him regarding the fictitious name and record. Mr. ALTFILLISCH said subject had been employed by him for about a year, and that he was a competent and reliable ranch hand. ALTFILLISCH said he wanted RAMISTELIA to be able to go to Santa Anita to solicit horses for his ranch. Mr. ALTFILLISCH said he has approximately 50 head of horses in training at the present time. ALTFILLISCH also mentioned that he was a licensed horse owner and that he had one of his horses racing at Santa Anita at the present time, ; which was being tained by LLOYD WALKER. ALTFILLISCH said he wanted to start RAMISTELIA off on the right foot, and when he learned that he had been fingerprinted under a name other than his own, he came with him to the track

to correct the records. RAMISTELLA then surrendered the TRPB card issued to FRANK DONNARUMMA, and also his stable credential card.

Mr. ALTFILLISCH gave Investigator Smith two personal cards, one showing the name of Altfillisch Construction Company, 1180 West Imperial Highway, La Habra, California, which was Mr. ALTFILLISCH's personal card. The other card showed the name of Granja Vista Del Rio, Box 159B, Route 1, Corona, California, which was Mr. ALTFILLISCH's ranch.

On February 1, 1966 Investigator R. B. Meyhaus checked the CHRB under the name of FRANK DONNARUMMA and could find no record. There were references to HENRY RAMISTELLA showing that on August 19, 1954 at Narragansett Park, Rhode Island, RAMISTELLA was suspended for the balance of the meeting for careless riding. There was also an entry dated May 26, 1955 at Garden State Park showing RAMISTELLA was suspended for 30 days for an unsatisfactory ride on the horse "PUT OUT" in the 3rd race May 17th.

The Los Angeles files of TRPB under dated of May 31, 1955 show a Stewards' ruling at Camden, New Jersey, as follows:

"Jockey HENRY RAMISTELLA, presently under suspension, is suspended indefinitely and his case referred to the Racing Commission."

Investigator Meyhaus verified that ALTFILLISCH was licensed. The records show Mr. ALTFILLISCH has owner's license #4281 dated January 18, 1966. There are no rulings on file for Mr. ALTFILLISCH, and he was also licensed as an owner in 1965. He was first processed on July 30, 1959 at the San Mateo County Fair.

The New York office of TRPB was asked to furnish any information in their files on the background of subject. As a result, a summary report was furnished, a copy of which is attached to this report.

On September 19, 1967, Mr. Martin Cruikshank of the Bank of America, telephone 583-3591, called the writer regarding any current information on the whereabouts of a FRANK DONNARUMMA, who had bought a 1962 Lincoln Continental and financed it through the Bank of America. Mr. Cruikshank said subject had defaulted in his payments and the bank was trying to recover the car. Mr. Cruikshank said the license number on the car was California GHH 895. He also mentioned subject gave his address when he bought the car as 13200 Citris St., Corona, California. TRPB files showed the latter address was given by subject when he was fingerprinted at Santa \nita in 1966 and later admitted his right name was HENRY DONALD RAMISTELL'. He was denied credentials because of a suspension in New Jersey.

in check with the California Horse Racing Board, revealed no additional information. The above checks were relayed to Mr. Cruikshank who said he had been in touch with Bert Atfillisch, subjects last known employer. The latter said subject was no longer employed by him and he had heard that subject was in jail somewhere in the middle east.

SUMMARY REPORT

In view of the fact that many persons bear the same or similar names it must be remembered that the person named in the title of this report may or may not be identical with the subject of your inquiry.

On September 16, 1953 at Narragansett Park, Rhode Island, a representative of the TRPB was advised by a confidential source that Jockey HENRY RAMISTELLA was using narcotics. However, investigation failed to develop information that RAMISTELLA was in any way connected with the use of marijuana or narcotics.

In August of 1953 it was reported that Jockey HENRY RAMISTELLA at Scarsborough Downs, Maine, was allegedly fixing races with other jookeys. However, allegation was not substantiated.

On May 17, 1955, "PUT OUT", who finished third in the 3rd race at Garden State, was found to have been stimulated. This horse was trained by WALTER D. CARBOLL and ridden by Jockey H. RAMISTELLA. Jockey RAMISTELLA, who had ridden "PUT OUT" regularly, and who exercised horses for CARROLL, when interviewed, denied stimulating horse or any knowledge of stimulation.

On May 26, 1955 the Stewards at Garden State had carefully and closely scrutinized recent photographs and moving pictures taken of races in which the horse "PUT OUT" ran and came to the conclusion that Jockey RAMISTELLA had given the horse "PUT OUT" an excellent ride in its races but an unsatisfactory ride on "PUT OUT" finishing third in the 3rd race May 17, 1955.

On May 26, 1955 the Stewards suspended Jockey RAMISTELLA for thirty days for an unsatisfactory ride on the horse "PUT OUT" following its finishing third on May 17, 1955.

Throughout the investigation of the instant stimulation case the Stewards charged RAMISTELLA with not telling the truth when questioned. RAMISTELLA changed his story in numerous instances and finally admitted he had previously lied to questions regarding exchange of telephone calls and other messages he was to have exchanged with PAUL KARNEMIDES at the Victory Grill, Old Orchard Beach, Maine, claiming that PAUL's sister CALLIE was an ex-girlfriend of his who wanted to resume relationship with RAMISTELLA. The CALLIE girl claims she could never be considered a girlfriend of RAMISTELLA and she had not heard from RAMISTELLA for over two years.

The following rulings appear in the files of the TRPB:

Lincoln Downs, Rhode Island, March 28, 1953, Jockey RAMISTELLA is fined the sum of \$50 for failing to maintain his position after leaving the gate in the 3rd race, Friday, March 27.

By Order of the Stewards.

Northampton Fair, September 12, 1953 for crossing over sharply and causing "COTTON TAIL" to fall at the turn in the running of the 9th race of September 11, Jockey HENRY RAMISTELLA is suspended ten racing days (September 14 to September 24 inclusive).

By Order of the Stewards.

Narragansett Park, Rhode Island, August 19, 1954, Jockey RAMISTELLA is suspended for the remainder of the meeting for careless riding with "STARZ" in the run through the backstretch in the 5th race Wednesday, August 18.

By Order of the Stewards.

Garden State, New Jersey, May 26, 1955, Jockey HENRY RAMISTELLA is suspended thirty days (May 26 through June 24) for an unsatisfactory ride on the horse "PUT OUT" in the 3rd race May 17.

By Order of the Stewards.

New Jersey Racing Commission, June 10, 1955, HENRY RAMISTELLA is suspended for forty-five days (May 26 through July 9) for an unsatisfactory ride and for giving false testimony before the Stewards. The Commission ruled that he be permitted to exercise horses and he was not denied access to the grounds.

During the fall of 1955 and the spring of 1956 it came to the attention of the TRPB that the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office at Hackensack, New Jersey was conducting an investigation of SILVERIO SULPIZZO and IRVING G. LICHENSTEIN on suspicion of bookmaking. SULPIZZO was subsequently convicted of bookmaking on December 12, 1955 and sentenced to one to three years in New Jersey State Prison. The Bergen County Prosecutor's Office has been unable to make a case against LICHENSTEIN to date. However, it is known that there was telephonic contact between someone using the home telephone of IRVING LICHENSTEIN at Fairlawn, New Jersey and HENRY RAMISTELLA at Miami, Florida.

On October 1, 1956 HENRY RAMISTELLA was arrested in a rooming house at 40 Savoy Avenue, Elmont, New York, where he was residing. The charge was possession of marijuana. The subject was arraigned on October 2, 1956, pleaded not guilty and was released on \$500 bond to obtain a lawyer. The arresting officers have disclosed that RAMISTELLA has "track marks" on his forearms indicating hypodermic injections although no injectives were found in his possession. The arresting officers also noted that RAMISTELLA's wife also has the tell-tale track marks on her forearms. No charges are currently pending against RAMISTELLA's wife.

On September 3, 1956 HENRY RAMISTELLA was arrested for possession of marijuana at Jamaica, New York.

On September 28, 1956 RAMISTELLA appeared in Queens Felony Court to answer the charge against him which was made on September 3, 1956. After appearing in Court the charges against RAMISTELLA were dismissed.

On November 20, 1956 RAMISTELLA entered a plea of guilty to possession of marijuana in First District Court, Nassau County, New York. This plea arose from his arrest on October 1, 1956 at Elmont which referred to the above. RAMISTELLA was sentenced by Judge Albert Moore to sixty days in the County Jail but the sentence was suspended.

Subsequent to the above arrests, the Stewards at the New York tracks barred RAMISTELLA from employment. However, no formal ruling to that effect was issued.

HENRY RAMISTELLA was fingerprinted at Delaware Park Race Track on June 16, 1964, when he was an applicant for an Exercise Boy's license. At that time the following description was noted:

In July of 1957 at Suffolk Downs Race Track, an investigation was conducted into the background of owner applicant THOMAS FRANK DENOTA and it was learned during this investigation that DENOIA had available cash of less than \$500.00 and a weekly income of \$150.00, although he claims he ran his stable from his current income. Information developed that HENRY RAMISTELLA and FRANK ACCEPTA, both undesirables, were involved in the purchase of the horse "SYFE" by the applicant. DENOIA stated that one SONNY, apparently HENRY RAMISTELLA and FRANK, apparently FRANK ACCETTA introduced him to trainer CHARLIE REYNOLDS, who sold him the horse "SYFE". The applicant displayed complete lack of knowledge as to how his horse "SYFE" was shipped to New England and how his trainer ORLANDO MASSARELLI was engaged. He claimed not to have known SONLY or FRANK prior to the sale of the horse and has not seen them since. Signed statements obtained concerning the circumstances of the sale from the applicant and his brotherin-law whom DENOIA admitted, had impersonated him in the call to the TRPB were obtained and they contradict one another.

On July 18, 1957, the Stewards at Narragansett Park advised the TRPB that the ownership of the horse "SYPE" had been transferred from DENOIA to one JOSEPH ACCORDINO.

On July 16, 1957, information was received from a confidential source that the subject was arrested on July 12, 1957 in company of two admitted narcotics addicts. The charge was petty larceny. The two addicts pleaded guilty and were sentenced. RAMISTELLA pleaded not guilty and was released in \$500.00 bail. It was also learned that at the time of this arrest, RAMISTELLA was out on bail on a charge in New York City of consorting with known criminals. It was learned that this charge against RAMISTELLA in New York City is a misdemeanor charge and that the general disposition of such a charge is a dismissal.

On July 29, 1957, RAMISTELLA appeared in First District Court in Mineola, New York to plead to the charge of petty larceny

for which he had been arrested on July 12, 1957. appeared with legal counsel and entered a plea of not guilty and his case was set for jury trial in October. Subsequent to his court appearance, the TRPB attempted to interview the subject in the presence of his lawyer. At the outset of the interview, RAMISTELLA was questioned concerning the sale of a race horse which recently came to the attention of the TRPB. Information had been developed from three persons who were present at the sale that RAMISTELLA was also present. To the question concerning his knowledge of this sale, he immediately denied that he knew anything about the sale of the horse or that he was present when this sale was arranged. He was then told that three witnesses placed him at this sale; he then admitted that he had been lying and that he was at this sale and questioned. During this interview, he evidenced a very uncooperative attitude and stated that he was aware that he "is through" insofar as racing is concerning. With regard to his use of narcotics, he indicated that this was the result of bad company and he appeared to place full √blame for his addiction on others.

An article contained in a New York Newspaper, NEWSDAY dated January 30, 1958 stated that RAMISTELLA was a free man to-day because two men who were arrested with him last summer have disappeared after serving jail sentences for the theft of food from a supermarket. The same charge against RAMISTELLA was thrown out of court when the prosecution couldn't produce the other two men to testify against the defendant.

A newspaper article contained in the PROVIDENCE JOURNAL dated July 27, 1957, stated in part that HENRY R. RAMISTELLA, 24 of East 80th Street, Bronx, New York, was placed on probation in District Court after he pleaded no contest to a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. RAMISTELLA had been charged with violating the banking laws, a more serious count but the Judge reduced the charge because the former jockey had made restitution.

The following ejections are on file for the subject:

Rockingham Park Race Track - August 9, 1957, convicted narcotics' user. Permitted to remain for the balance of the day but warned not to return".

Rockingham Park Race Track - August 17, 1957, convicted narcotics user. ejected and warned not to return!

Rockingham Park Race Track - September 18, 1957, convicted narcotic user. ejected and warned not to return.

Narragansett Park Race Track - November 8, 1958, convicted narcotic user, ejected.

Barrington Fair - September 17, 1964, narcotic conviction, ejected and instructed not to return.

ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

This is impreference to our letter of June 14, 1968, requesting advice as to whether the FBI should interview Mrs. Ethel Kennedy in connection with captioned matter. The Criminal Division on July 18, 1968, advised that authorities of the Los Angeles Police Department had indicated an intent to arrange such an interview and, accordingly, a decision as to FBI action in this regard would be held in abeyance.

We have been advised by our Los Angeles Office that attempts by the Los Angeles Police Department to arrange an interview with Ethel Kennedy had been unsuccessful.

Although Los Angeles Police Department has now requested this Bureau to interview Mrs. Kennedy we have not attempted to in view of your previous advice.

On August 15, 1968, Mrs. RACHEL WHITE, South 2503 Teko, Spokane, Washington, and Miss BONNIE LOUISE WHITE, South 1303 Crestline, Spokane, Washington, advised that on August 13, 1968, they were en route from Milton Freewater, Oregon, to Spokane, Washington. Upon leaving Walla Walla, Washington, they observed a young man hitchhiking near the outskirts of town. As it was approximately 11:30 PM, they decided to give the man a ride as they felt sorry for him being out so late hitchhiking. The man gave his name as PHILLIP ETHRIDGE and advised that he was going to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, to work in a lime plant.

ETHRIDGE got into the back seat of the 1967 Chevrolet two-door hardtop, being driven by RACHEL WHITE. ETHRIDGE sat behind BONNIE WHITE, who was sitting in the passenger side of the front seat.

RACHEL WHITE and BONNIE WHITE advised that approximately three miles from Colfax, Washington, ETHRIDGE said something to the effect that he had a gun pointed at BONNIE WHITE's head and that he was naked and for neither girl to look back or he would shoot. He told RACHEL WHITE to keep driving the vehicle but he did not give any directions. RACHEL advised that as they entered Colfax, Washington, she turned toward Pullman, Washington, instead of turning toward Spokane. She stated that she knew the traffic would be heavier between Colfax and Pullman and there were more farm houses in the event ETHRIDGE left the girls in the country as he was indicating he planned to do. assured the girls that he did not intend to molest them but did intend to take their money and their vehicle. RACHEL WHITE and BONNIE WHITE stated that as they proceeded toward Pullman, Washington, ETHRIDGE told them that he had killed two policemen and had wounded other men. He then

asked them if they had heard of the KENNEDY assassination and the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. The women said that they had and ETHRIDGE told them that he had been in on these killings so he wasn't afraid to use a gun. Both women stated that he did not indicate which KENNEDY he meant but they assumed that he meant the killing of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY due to the fact ETHRIDGE had told them that he wasonly 19 years of age.

RACHEL WHITE and BONNIE WHITE advised that they thought that ETHRIDGE was not telling the truth when he informed them that he had killed two policemen and had participated in the assassination of KENNEDY and KING. They stated that they got the feeling that he was attempting to frighten them and at the same time to build up his own ego. ETHRIDGE informed them that he did not kill women but instead planned to leave them in the country, and take their money and the 1967 Chevrolet.

ETHRIDGE made RACHEL WHITE turn off the highway on a road leading to Albion, Washington, and proceed down that road until out of sight of the highway. He then ordered both women out of the vehicle and ordered them to completely undress. RACHEL WHITE stated that as she was undressing she noticed that ETHRIDGE had a gun in his hand and did not have a shirt on, although he had a pair of dark trousers on. After having both women undress, ETHRIDGE ordered them to walk down the road to Albion. The women proceeded down the road until out of sight of the car headlights at which time they hid in a side ditch beside the road. A short time later ETHRIDGE drove past them in the vehicle proceeding toward Albion, Washington. The women then proceeded to a nearby farm house where they. obtained clothing and notified the Whitman County Sheriff's Office.

ETHRIDGE was arrested on August 14, 1968, during the early morning hours near Lewiston, Idaho, following a high speed chase from Pullman, Washington.

On August 6, 1968, Mrs. SONIA HOWARD, Medical Records Library, Chicago State Hospital, 6500 Irving Park, Chicago, advised NORMAN SYDNEY WEXLER was committed to their institution on March 28, 1950, as being mentally ill. Her records indicated WEXLER was discharged April 30, 1950, marked as recovered, incremission, which indicates his symtons had disappeared. WEXLER was discharged into the custody of his mother living in Chicago at that time.

WEXLER was brought to Chicago State Hospital as a result of his arrest by Chicago Police Department at Midway Airport, where he was attempting to board an airliner. WEXLER indicated to the airline people he had connections with the gansters, and was carrying a toy gun at the time. His explanation was that he was working on an undercover story for the newspaper.

WEXLER was diagnosed as a manic-depressive. WEXLER's history indicates he has had previously marked breakdowns, one while attending high school, and one serious breakdown when he was a senior at Harvard. His records indicate he did not graduate, and was placed in a private hospital at that time. During his interviews at Chicago State Hospital, WEXLER made various anti-semitic statements indicating that as a group these people were taking advantage of the world WEXLER indicated that he had a newspaper job in Chicago which could not be varified, Her records indicate he was seeing a psychiatrist in Detroit.

No contact is registered with the Chicago State Hospital since WEXLER was discharged. Mrs. HOWARD advised had WEXLER been committed to any mental hospital in the state of Illinois, their records would indicate that fact.

However, no one visible is pointing any object at Senator KENNEDY.





The stated that on Saturday, 14 Nov 64., a subject had come to the home and asked for Samuel Sutler and Carlos Eutler; stated that she had not seen this man before; however in the light blue vehicle was seated who was believed to be Cliver Jery Owen and his wife.

On Sunday, 15 Nov 64. Samuel Butler had come to the home at 1714 M.Alder and told his wife Juana Butler and Lydia Massey that he had been offered a thousand dollars to sign some papers for Oliver Jerry Owen and in return for signing this Carlos Butler would also receive six thousand dollars.

Ch 16 Nov 64., a George Butler of 9231 Tanford Street, Pico Rivera, California, 699-1685, had called Mrs. Butlerr and stated that he had been called by Carlos Butler and advised that Samuel Butler was en route to California and would errive on a plane on this date. Mrs. Butler was unaware of it as that tise ______ was en route to California, however she contacted Lydia Massey immediately after this.

After talking to me, Mrs. Butler states that she received a phone cell from Samuel Butler in Phoenix, and that he stated that he was dressed very cell; that he had plenty of money and that he hadn't signed any papers yet, he ever he was on his way to California and would leave at 9:45 P.M., (2145hr.)

Lydia Mansey states that she feels that these papers are probably papers dealing with the case and confiction against Oliver Jerry Owen on three counts of Arson and that perhaps are related to his testimony. I was unable to obtain any further information at this time. Hrs. Mansey and Mrs. Butler stated that they would contact this department if they obtained any future information.

On August 2, 1968, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), a flyer bearing the heading "Organizing Committee for Clemency for Sirhan, 57 West 10th Street, New York City, New York 10011, telephone number 212 GRamercy 7-1826".

This flyer solicited support for the "just fight for clemency for Sirhan Sirhan". This flyer identified John M. Lawrence as the Executive Secretary; Abdeen Jabara, 1217 First National Building, Detroit, as the attorney and Al Matthews, 14416 Victory Boulevard, Van Nuys, California, Associate Counsel for this Committee.

A copy of this flyer is attached.

Concerning Abdeen Jabara, a second confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on October 4, 1967, and November 28, 1967 that Abdeen Jabara, a Detroit attorney, attended three weekly meetings of the Detroit Committee to End the War in Vietnam (DCENV), Detroit, Michigan. The dates of these three meetings were August 30, 1967, September 6, 1967 and October 4, 1967.

The DCEWV is a Detroit organization which has sponsored frequent protests regarding the United States involvement in Vietnam.
