A review by this office of the points set forth in referenced letter reflect that the suggested interviews and/or investigation have either been conducted or leads have been set forth for the completion of this investigation.

It is noted that under point two in referenced letter, the individual referred to as MISTIG is identical to GAYMOARD MISTRI and the results of interview with this individual appeared on page 869 of Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68.

In connection with item six in referenced letter, no interview is contemplated with Dr. SAMUEL W. WEAVER as a review of the medical record reflects that the apointments scheduled with WEAVER were both cancelled. Also in connection with Dr. JOHN T. GARNER, the one apointment that SIRHAN had scheduled with this doctor was cancelled.

Dr. ROBERT G. FREEMAN was the doctor SIRHAN was referred to by Dr. E. G. KIEHN for X-rays and it is noted that the report on the results of these X-rays was signed by JOHN D. RUTLEDGE, M. D., who is associated with Dr. FREEMAN. The entire X-ray report consisted of only two lines indicating no evidence of bone injury on SIRHAN. For this reason, these three doctors were not interviewed by this office and UACB will not be interviewed.

All other interviews mentioned in referenced letter are being conducted by the Los Angeles Office.

She stated her husband had an exact Itinerary of Mr. CORDELIUS while he was traveling in Europe, but the ATTALAIs are leaving Arcadia to return to their home in Plymouth, Michigan on August 3, 1968.

The writer will interview CORDELIUS on his return, and Mrs. ATTALAI has left a note for him to the effect that the FBI wants to interview him.

The envelope is addressed to the United States Senate, Committee on Labor and Public Welfare (crossed out), Washington, D. C. 20510.

The letterhead envelope reads:

The postmark is dated Mexico, D. F., June 27, 1968.

(No salutation)

This is an emblem showing the mark on a pistol similar to the pistol with which Bob Kennedy was shot. The manufacturing patent is No. 250921, letter U, registration No. 1727, semiautomatic type, .22 caliber, made at Zacatlan, Puebla State. The brand name is Trejo, which is a Mafia brand name, used for pistols in order to "disorient" insofar as the manufacturing is concerned, especially in regard to the fact that it is made in Mexico. The gun uses lead slugs.

I have had this pistol in my hands and I saw the brand name, which is the same as on the weapon which was used by the assassins of Dr. Luther King. I saw it next to the guns used against Robert F. Kennedy. I saw five of them (sic). They came to Mexico and threatened me with gouging out my eyes and cutting my tongue. They also threatened to kill me with a machine gun in front of everybody so as to give everybody a warning.

They told me that the two were paid two million dollars to kill Bob and said that they would make two million more when they kill me. They said there is only three of us alive and we would disappear promptly.

I am Antonio Albizo Ortiz and I am next as shown in the plan drawn up on the reverse side of this page; the next after the Senator, who is the last of the Kennedys.

The reverse side shows the "Secret Plan of the KKK to Assassinate Important Men in the United States." The plan was drawn up by Antonio Albizo Ortiz.

It shows that the three assassinations were planned by LBJ (Luther King, Bob Kennedy and John Kennedy) working hand in hand with the KKK (King, Kennedy and Kennedy).

The plan also shows the letters AA, which stand for the initials of the writer and also for the words "Assassination" and "Threatened with Death" (the word "threat" is "amenaza" in Spanish).



The Jordan Ambassador called on me this morning at his request to discuss the current status of the Sirhan Bishara Sirhan case in California. particularly interested in discussing the implications to Sirhan's trial should four Jordanian lawyers come to the United States to either assist the defense of or actually to defend Sirhan in the courts. He said that he was opposed to the lawyers' coming, as it would interject into the case a political element, which we have all been endeavoring to avoid. mentioned that he had sent a strong message to his Government recommending that if at all possible the lawyers be dissuaded from coming to the U. S. for the above purpose. Now that the Federation of Lawyers in Amman had apparently made a decision to do something about the Sirhan case (he reminded me that the Federation was politically oriented), there was a limit to how much influence the Jordan Government could exert on the lawyers because they were now committed to take some action. He mentioned that he was returning to Jordan for approximately a week in the next few days and that he would do what he could about the situation. The best that could be expected, however, would probably be to persuade the lawyers or the Federation to finance the hiring of a highly qualified American lawyer and to nominate one of their own members to the United States to act as observer during the trial. He was not even sure that this could be arranged.

I told him that we felt strongly that the Jordanian lawyers should not come to the U. S. for the very reason that he had offered. We, however, were to some extent caught on the horns of a dilemma in trying to persuade the lawyers against coming because we also did not want to open ourselves to the charge that we were denying Sirhan the right to request a lawyer of

his choice, which could include Jordanian lawyers. The Jordan Government could probably state the concern we both shared more effectively than we could. We were both interested in insuring that Sirhan received a fair trial and that no political development enter the picture to prejudice a fair trial. I told him that I hoped that he could state his case as strongly as possible in Amman. He said he would.

He asked me when the trial began. After consulting with Mr. Neuman in L, I informed him by telephone that on June 28 the defendant would have to plead, i.e., guilty, not guilty, etc. According to the law, the trial must begin sixty days after the indictment, which I was informed was around June 6 or 7. This period could be prolonged by agreement between the defense and prosecuting attorneys. I told him that the District Attorney in California ventured the guess that the trial would probably begin one-and-a-half to two months after June 28.

The Ambassador called me subsequently and said that the Jordan Honorary Consul George Zuraykat had contacted Sirhan on June 19. He said the authorities treated the Honorary Consul very well, but the interview resulted in little more than the Consul's finding out that Sirhan was in good health and was being treated well. A satisfactory conversation between the two was prevented because, according to the Jordan Ambassador, there was a glass partition between the Honorary Consul and Sirhan and the Consul had to talk to him by telephone. The Honorary Consul was enjoined that he had to speak in English or the conversation would be cut. The Ambassador wondered if this were normal procedure and if it would have made a difference if a member of his Embassy had tried to talk with Sirhan rather than the Honorary Consul. I told him I was not certain of what the law permitted, although I was somewhat surprised by the restrictions imposed. I told him that I would consult with our Legal Adviser's Office and would call him back.

On one of those two dates, the head clerk at the Grand Hotel Brno, Czechoslovakia, related to them that Senator ROBERT KENNEDY had been shot in the neck receiving a flesh wound but was in satisfactory condition. This same information was obtained from the head waiter in the dining room who related the same facts. The members of the unit attempted to purchase a German newspaper to ascertain if this could be verified as the original source stated it was heard on the radio. They were unsuccessful in locating it in an East German newspaper that was available in that city in Czechoslovakia and assumed that it was mere rumor.

Colonel BAYARD advised that this information was not obtained from any other sources in Czechoslovakia.

Colonel ROBERT F. BAXARD, Commanding Officer, U. S. Army, Markmanship Training Unit, Fort Benning, Georgia, Turnished the following information:

Colonel BAYAHD and members of his shotgun team attended the Grand Prix de Brno at Brno, Czechoslovakia, May 17 - 18, 1968. On one of the above dates, the head clerk at the Grand Hotel, Brno, Czechoslovakia, where the members of the team were staying, mentioned that he had heard on the radio news that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot receiving a flesh wound in the neck and that he was in satisfactory condition. The same information was obtained from the head waiter in the dining room of the Grand Hotel.

The members of the unit attempted to purchase some newspaper that they could read to verify the information and the only newspaper available that they could read was an East German newspaper and a review of the newspaper failed to reflect any story concerning the alleged shooting. Colonel BAYARD and the members of his unit assumed that it was just rumor and that it had no factual basis.

Colonel BAYARD had no further information concerning the statements and was unable to furnish the names of the head clerk at the Grand Hotel or the head waiter.







GERALD BEUNO, Upstate Representative of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, Room 374, Federal Building, Syracuse, New York, advised he was appointed to his present position by the late Senator KENNEDY in 1965. He said that shortly after he arrived in Syracuse, New York, to set up his office, GARY DEDEAL introduced himself and advised BRUNO that he, DEDEAL, had also applied to Senator KENNEDY for the position of Upstate Representative. DEDEAL thereafter offered his help in finding a residence for BRUNO and his family. BRUNO said DEDEAL's family operates a printing business in Syracuse, N.Y. and DEDEAL came to the office frequently to pass out advertising items such as pens, pencils and the like. BRUNO said he soon came to realize that DEDEAL was a name dropper and hanger-on and he avoided him as much as he could and finally he told DEDEAL that he should stay away from the office.

BRUNO said that on June 5, 1968, he was at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Los Angeles, California, where Senator KENNEDY was taken after he was shot. Sometime during that day Direct called the hospital and asked for BRUNO. The call was answered by PETER SMITH, an advance man for Senator KENNEDY's campaign. DEDELL told SMITH that he was a friend of BRUNO and asked SMITH to find out from BRUNO whether BRUNO wanted DEDELL to bring Mrs. BRUNO and BRUNO's daughter to Los Angeles. BRUNO said this was the first time in about two years that DEDELL had tried to contact him. When SMITH delivered DEDELL's message, BRUNO told SMITH that DEDELL was a name dropper and just a hanger on and to ignore the call.

BRUNO said that his contacts with DEDELL were only casual and he had considered DEDELL to be a pest.


Reference memo Andicates an individual by the name of ESTRADA ELIAS DURAN was an employee of the Ambassador Hotel at Los Angeles. The address of 10746 Telfair Avenue, Pacoima, California furnished by the hotel records has been checked out and it was determined that ItRwas not DURAN's nor has he lived at the above address.

Officer MOON of the Ambassador Hotel Security Force advised that a further check of personnel records at the Ambassador Hotel failed to reflect any additional information concerning the identity or location of DURAN. He stated that DURAN had been hired as a "Standby" "Part-time" employee and that on his application and withholding tax statement he did not list even a Social Security Number indicating that he still had to apply for such a number. Officer MOON advised that he had no idea whatsoever how to locate or contact DURAN.

Mrs. ETHEL HEYER, US INS, advised that she could not check her files for anything identifiable with DURAN unless furnished with a birth date or at least a nationality background of the individual.

No further attempts are being made to locate DURAN at the present time.

Mr. WALTER BAKER, Producer, "Tempo" television show, Station KHJ-TV, 5515 Melrose, Los Angeles, California, addised on 7/31/68 that the brogram which was aired on 7/9/68 had Mr. RAYMOND BROSHEARS as a guest. BROSHEARS furnished his telephone number as 391-9004 and BAKER recalled that BROSHEARS mentioned something about residing in the Long Beach, Calif., area.

EAKER said EROSHEARS alleges that he is a minister or reverend and that he belongs to a religious cult that has a psychic doctrine and believes in UFO's. BAKER said BROSHEARS was invited as a guest because of this "far out" belief.

BAKER said that while BROSHEARS was being interviewed a telephone call was received in which the caller asked BROSHEARS if he was not identical with the RAW OND BROSHEARS who had been arrested for making a threat against the President of the U.S. The caller also asked if BROSHEARS was not acquainted with DAVID FERRIE who recently had been accused by New Orleans District Attorney JIM GARRISON of having part in an alleged plot in connection with the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

BAKER said the station had no prior knowledge of this information, and indicated that BROSHEARS was "really shook" by the information. He said BROSHEARS admitted, however, that he had known FERRIE. He also admitted that he had been arrested for making threat against the President of the U.S. He stated he had talked with FERRIE, and that FERRIE had told him all about the plot against President KENNEDY. BAKER said he believed BROSHEARS was a homosexual based on appearance and action.

PETE HAMILL

Lieutenant Manuel Pena, Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles, California, advised on July 30, 1968 that an article appeared in the June 6, 1968 issue of the Washington Post newspaper publication, which was written by Richard Harwood, a Washington Post staff writer.

The article mentions, in part, that one Budd Schulberg and Pete Hamill, neither further identified, weregin the immediate proximity of Mrs. Ethel Kennedy on the morning of June 5, 1968 when Senator Robert F. Kennedy was shot in the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles.

According to Leutenant Pena, it has been established that Schulberg was in the Colonial Room of the Ambassador Hotel at the time the shooting took place and not in the immediate proximity of the Kennedy entourage. Accordingly to the Harwood article, it sets forth that Schulberg and Hamill "were a little in front of him (Kennedy). His wife Ethel a few feet behind," in a crowd of campaign workers.

It has been established by the Los Angeles Police Department that Hamill is reportedly currently residing in the Versalles Hotel in Mexico, D.F., Mexico.

1. A usually reliable source whose previous reporting has been accurate revealed to our Beirnt representative that on 22 June 1968 Salim KAWZI, publisher of Hawadith, a newspaper in Lebanon, told Anwar JAMAL, Press Counselor and Information Officer of the United Arab Republic (MAR) Embassy in Lebanon, he was obtaining good results in raising funds for the defense of Sirhan SIRHAW, with more Christians than Muslims contributing. IAWZI further said he had met with Shafiq UMBARIT, Yusuf SAIOH and Walid KHALIDI to study and organize SIRHAN's defense. They had decided to meet with SIRHAN's father and send "some people from our place" to SIRHAN's brother in Los Angeles to "shake the matter from the name of the SIRHAN family and give it its proper importance on the international plane." They had also decided to tour Arab countries collecting money. IAWZI said he had received promises of 10,000 Lebanese pounds from Kamil AND-AL-RAHMAN and 5,000 Lebanese pounds from Hani SALEM and expected to collect between 200,000 and 300,000 Lebanese pounds in Lebanon alone. (Note: Approximately three Lebanese pounds equal one U.S. dollar.) LAWZI indicated these activities were not related to those of the Federation of Arab Lavyers.

2. Our files contain the following information on the above individuals:

a. Salim IAWZI, according to a reliable source, is considered by the UAR to be a strong pro-Nasirist--although it is recognized he sometimes streys for opportunistic reasons--and his magazine is considered by the UAR Embassy in Lebanon and Cairo authorities to be the most articulate and important exponent of Masirism in the Middle East.

IAWZI reportedly received a subsidy of about 8,000 Lebanese pounds monthly for this widely read publication from Anwar JAMAL, the UAR Press Counselor noted above. This source states that after the June war, however, IAWZI wrote a series of articles critical of the UAR, and JAMAL and other UAR Embassy officials thought he had turned pro-U.S. JAMAL reportedly was furious with IAWZI. In this connection, IAWZI told another reliable source in September 1967 that he no longer considered himself a Nasirist. IAWZI said Nasir obviously erred in the

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way he handled the June 1967 Arab-Israeli crisis, that the swiftness and enormity of the UAR defeat demonstrated the inherent weaknesses in Masirism, and because of this LAWZI has returned to espousing a more classical brand of Arab nationalism. In addition, in September 1967 LAWZI said he had seen quite a bit of the Soviet Press Attache in Lebanon before the latter was transferred from Lebanon, and that the Press Attache, both before and after the June 1967 crisis, tried to get LAWZI to accept articles for publication in Hawadith, for which LAWZI would be paid. LAWZI implied he refused this offer. It has also been reported by a reliable source that Chinese Communist diplomats from Demascus, Syria have visited the office of Hawadith, reportedly in connection with their subscription to this newspaper.

- b. Shafiq UMBARJI was described in 1963 as chief local employee of ARANCO Overseas Corporation, Beirut; has always been close to Egyptians and prominent Palestinian radicals; is himself a prominent Palestinian Arab politician.
- c. Yusuf SAIGH (SAYEGH, SAYIGH) is probably identical with an individual of the same name who is professor of economics at American University of Beirut and who "confessed" Arab Nationalist Movement (ANM) connections to a reliable source in February 1968. SAYEGH participated in a Mid-East Institute conference in Washington, D.C. in early May 1963 and was a delegate to the Palestine Entity Congress held in Jerusalem May 1964.
- d. Walid KHALTDI is a professor at American University of Beirut and in 1966 was appointed to the Arab League office in Paris. He was a Leader Grantee to the U.S. in 1959 and taught at Princeton in 1960. In May 1965 he was described as violently anti-U.S. Other information shows he is a very active member of the ANM and was suspected of having connections with British Intelligence.
- e. Kemil ABD-AL-KAHMAN is possibly identical with one Kamal AEDUR-RAHMAN who, according to May 1946 information, was a Palestinian partner in the Trading and Contracting Company, Ltd. in Lebanon. He is probably identical with an individual of the same name who, according to January 1968 information, is owner of the CCC Engineering firm in Beirut and is also an ANM leader.
- f. Hani SAIAM is probably identical with Hani SAIAM who in 1959 headed the Middle East Development Corporation in Kuwait. In September 1966 he was described as a civil engineer and vice-president of the newly-formed Bank of Lebanon and Arab World. In November 1967 he was reported to be on the Board of Directors of Intra Bank in Lebanon and president of Doha Company (Real Estate Development Company)



3. Since SAIGH, KHALIDI, and ARD-AL-RAHMAN are reportedly connected with the Arab Nationalist Movement (ANM), we are attaching herewith a copy of CIA Special Report No. 0003/68A issued 19 January 1968 on the ANM. This Special Report is classified SECKET/NO FOREIGN DISSEM.


