This is in reference to your memorandum dated June 14, 1968, inquiring as to whether steps should be taken by the Bureau to arrange an interview of Mrs. Ethel Kennedy by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

We understand that Los Angeles Assistant District Attorney John Howard and Sergeants Patchett and MacArthur of the Los Angeles Police Department have been in touch with a representative of the Kennedy family to arrange an interview in connection with their investigation of the pending prosecution in Los Angeles of the suspected assassin, Sirhan Bishara Sirhan. We have been advised that upon completion of any interview by the Los Angeles District Attorney's office and the Los Angeles Police Department copies of the interview will be made available. We, therefore, would hold in abeyance any decision on an interview of Mrs. Kennedy by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation until the investigation has been substantially completed, and we have had an opportunity to review the results of the interview of Mrs. Kennedy arranged by the Los Angeles authorities.

Referenced memo reflects that a Hollywood Park auto parking ticket No. 59600 was located in the car belonging to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN after the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

On 7/24/68, Mr. ANTHONY TREEBOW, Operations Office, Hollywood Park Race Track, advised that he was unable to determine by the number alone the date or approximate date when the above numbered parking ticket was used. He stated that he would have to know more details concerning the color and contents of the ticket in order to determine anything further.

It is suggested that SA R.L. LA JEUNESSE, JR. contact the Los Angeles Police Department, who is in possession of the original parking ticket above described and will determine what further investigation they have conducted concerning this matter and obtain further identifying data concerning the parking ticket.

The referenced memo also makes reference to a Richfield Credit Card which was found in the vehicle belonging to SIRHAN. On 7/24/68, information concerning this receipt was furnished to Mr. FRANK EVANS, Security Officer, Richfield Oil Company, Los Angeles, California, and he advised that the files of that company reflected no credit card issued to the name of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. He further stated that based upon the information which was furnished to

On 7-25-68, FRANK GOODPASTURE, JR., Goodpasture Motor Company, Bristol, Va., advised he has known JOHN A. JENSEN, aka "Buddy," General Motor Service and Truck Company, 386 State Street Extension, Fairfield, Conn., since 1959 and he has always found him to be a person of high morals, character and reputation. He said he attended the dinner at the Americana Hotel, Miami Beach, Fla., during the conference of the National Automobile Dealer Association, truck meeting, that JOHN A. JENSEN was present and he heard JENSEN was making remarks concerning segregation, however, since the remarks were not made to him, he could not recall any definite statements he may have made. He gathered from the remarks that JENSEN had some feelings regarding segregation as there had apparently been some trouble in Fairfield, Conn. He did not feel that JENSEN meant anything by his remarks and he put no significance in them, as he had been drinking. He recalled that ARTHUR IRWIN, Irwin GMC Inc., GMC dealer, Lima, Ohio, was present, as well as BILL WILSON, General Truck Sales, Murfreesboro Road, Nashville, Tenn., and ROBERT C. CALLAHAN, Goode Motor Co., Bristol, Tenn. After the meeting he, WILSON and IRWIN made a trip to Jamaica and they discussed the remarks of JENSEN and they put no significance to them. He said that if JENSEN is contacted he is sure he could explain his remarks.

No further action being taken in this matter and copies are being furnished to interested offices in case further inquiry is made regarding this matter.

Police Call Saidallah's Story No Hoax

Sirhan's Brother Tells of Shooting Night

The circumstances preceding the July 3 early morning shooting at Saidallah Bishara Sirhan, 36, of Pasadena, have been revealed for the first time in an exclusive interview with Saidallah by this newspaper.

Saidallah is the brother of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, 24, also of Pasadena, who is charged

with the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy last June 5.

Saidallah had reported to Pasadena police who have since agreed, that he was shot at while driving the Pasadena Freeway early July 3.

Pasadena Chief of Police Samuel H. Addis told this newspaper that "based upon the facts that we have now, there is nothing to indicate that the incident is a hoax. I believe it did happen."

In the interview, Saidallah said that the Pasadena police had given him a very rigid lie detector test. Lt. Gerald E. Wright, head of the detective bureau, verified the giving of the test, but refused to tell its result.

Saidallah also said that he was given a similar test by Enrique Hernandez of the Los Angeles Police Department. The result also is undisclosed because Hernandez took refuge

under a court order which he said prevented him from talking about the test.

Discrepancies in released reports prompted this newspaper to seek Saidallah in an effort to determine what actually happened that early morning.

This is his story, in the words in which he replied to questions asked:

"I wanted to meet Liza Williams, a columnist on the Free Press. She writes a column call-

ed 'Grey Power.' I read it every week. I met her at David Saidallah's Shop, 68 N. Fair Oaks Ave., about three months ago.

"I wanted to consult with her about the laws of publishing regarding reporters using my name for exploitation in any document.

"I phoned the Pasadena Free Press office and asked for her address the night before the shooting, and they gave me an address such as 92 Fairfax, Los Angeles.

("The address listed in the paper's masthead is 938 N. Fairfax, Los Angeles.)

"The Pasadena office also told me if I wanted more information to call the Hollywood Free Press. I was told that it was located at 65 something

street. The name sounded like a Spanish term.

"Early the next morning, about four o'clock I went to find her to avoid the traffic and exposing myself to the public during the day in an area that I am not familiar with.

"After being in that area for a while and not finding what I was looking for, I decided to come back home.

"I took Beverly Boulevard to Hill Street and on into the Pasadena Freeway where I encountered the Chevrolet and the Volkswagen bus. There were three people in the Chevrolet, and four in the Volkswagen.

"I still want to talk to Miss Williams."

Shooting Episode

Saidallah then told of the shooting episode which substantially corresponded with the report of the incident released by police. He said the Chevrolet and Volkswagen bus were the vehicles that pursued him on the freeway when the two shots coming from the bus were fired at him.

He said the entire trip from Pasadena and back took about one-and-a-half hours.

Asked whether he was given a lie detector test by police, Saidallah replied, "The Pasadena police gave me a lie detector test similar to a third degree about 9:30 that morning, and I was also given another in Los Angeles by Mr. Hernandez about three to five days later."

This newspaper asked Lt. Wright whether Saidallah was given the test, and he admitted it. Asked what was the result, Wright replied, "We do not discuss that." He also refused to tell who gave the test. Saidallah said it was a sergeant whose name he did not remember.

When asked this question, "Since you have said Saidallah did not do the shooting, after he was given a polygraph test, is it not evident then that the test cleared him?" to which Wright replied, "No comment."

In an interview Chief Addis said, "Based upon the facts that we have now, there is nothing to indicate that it is a hoax. I believe the shooting did happen."

The following is the question and answer interview with Addis and Lt. Wright:

What is the status of the alleged shooting incident?

Wright: We have made a full investigation of it. Nothing has turned up for us to hang our hats on or get a suspect. We cannot come up with anything to disprove this man's story.

Do you think that the alleged incident might be connected with the assassination?

Wright: No, not at all.

Regarding the shots being fired and Sirhan slumping aside, do you believe that:

Wright: I have to believe that.

Why do you have to believe that?

Wright: If I said I didn't believe it, I could not answer the next question you would ask, namely: Why?

(Lt. Wright then explained his personal investigation into the trajectory of the projectile coming from the location described by Saidallah. He said that his story made sense.)

Wright: We recreated the incident. It is very possible he was shot at from the Volkswagen.

Los Angeles detectives are reported to be also working on the case. Have they come up with anything?

Wright: No.

Have you learned what Saidallah was really doing in Los Angeles so early that morning?

Wright: Just what he said about looking for a woman reporter on the Free Press down on 92nd or 93rd Street.

Are you convinced and satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that the incident did happen?

Addis: I cannot say that. In cases of this kind we are never convinced or satisfied until the

facts wholly support our conviction or satisfaction, that it either happened or did not happen, but based upon the facts we have now, I think it happened.

Then you believe his story?

Addis: I have to.

If it were not for Judge Alarcon's court order, could you tell more:

Addis: No.

Is this case considered closed?

Addis: No. It is open until either we arrest the people who did it, or prove it never happened. Until then, we will have someone assigned to it.

Saidallah complained that an FBI agent and Pasadena policeman Ben Hetherington tried to treat him like a "mendicant." "They wanted me to say that I did the shooting myself, and that FBI man searched my home looking for guns without a search warrant. He was very nasty," Saidallah related.

Police Rebut Statements By Sirhan

Pasadena police officials, who gave Saidallah B. Sirhan round-the-clock protection after he said shots were fired at him, today rebutted Sirhan's remarks that he was subjected to a "third degree" and an illegal search.

Saidallah, brother of Sirhan B. Sirhan, the accused assassin of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, said the police gave him a lie detector test "similar to a third degree about 9:30" the morning of the shots.

"The polygraph test came in the afternoon after routine questioning," replied Lt. Gerald E. Wright, of the investigative section. "We do not use the 'third degree.'"

The "third degree" refers to quizzing accompanied by physical maltreatment of the subject.

Saidallah complained that after the July 3 incident, his home was searched by an "FBI man ... without a search warrant" and that Saidallah was subjected to insult.

"We do not know of any FBI man being involved," said Lt. Wright. "Saidallah gave me his personal permission for our Sgt. Ben Hetherington and a Los Angeles detective to go with him to his house to look for evidence."

SNYDER took photographs during Christmas season, 1965, when rally was held for WALTER REUTHER by farm workers union in Delano. On May 20, 1968, THOMAS E. JOHNSON, San Diego County Sheriff's Office, El Cajon Substation, telephonically contacted the San Diego Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and furnished the following information:

JOHNSON advised that he had been contacted by a fourteen-year-old boy named KEITH KING, 781 Monserate Avenue, Chula Vista, California. KING told him that while he was getting ready to leave the area in front of the Chula Vista library where ROBERT F. KENNEDY had just spoke, he was approached by a man who resembled JAMES EARL RAY. This man asked KEITH where and when KENNEDY was to speak again. When told that he did not know where and when KENNEDY was to speak, this individual then asked him the location of a good place to eat with a telephone. KING felt that the man with whom he spoke looked very similar to a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY appearing in a recent issue of the Chula Vista "Star News."

Mr. WILLIAM DOBREVIR, "Citizens for Kennedy," KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters, San Diego, California, was contacted on May 20, 1968, at which time he advised that ROBERT F. KENNEDY had departed the San Diego, California, area en route to Los Angeles, California.

Mr. DOBREVIR was advised of the information furnished by KEITH KING and he stated that he would relay this information to the KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters at Los Angeles, California.

Deputy Sheriff THOMAS E. JOHNSON, San Diego County Sheriff's Office, El Cajon Substation, El Cajon, California, was recontacted on May 21, 1968 and advised that he had no further information to relate concerning information furnished to him by KEITH KING, except to state that KING resides in his immediate neighborhood and considers him a highly reliable young man.

KEITH KING, 781 Monserate Avenue, Chula Vista, California, was interviewed on May 21, 1968 and he advised as follows:

KING had occasion to be present at the campaign speech of ROBERT F. KENNEDY at the Civic Center, Chula Vista, California, on May 20, 1968. A short time after the speech by Mr. KENNEDY ended, which was then approximately 5:20 to 5:30 p.m., an individual closely resembling JAMES EARL RAY approached him and asked him if KENNEDY had made his speech yet. When told that he had, this individual appeared surprised and then asked where KENNEDY was going to speak next.

KING stated that he had a schedule of Mr. KENNEDY's appearances in the San Diego area and told this individual that his next appearance would be at San Ysidro, California.

This individual asked KING where there was a good place to eat where he could obtain a telephone. He also asked him if there was a telegraph office in San Ysidro, to which KING replied he could not furnish this information as he did not know.

KING described this individual as approximately forty years of age, white, male, American, five feet eight inches to five feet nine inches, 160 to 170 pounds, hair medium brown, complexion fair to medium, wearing a blue coat, light-colored slacks and brown shoes.

KING advised that prior to seeing this individual he had read an article in the Chula Vista "Star News"

On May 21, 1968, Mrs. ELSIE ZUNIGA, Manager, Western Union Office, San Ysidro, California, advised she usually closes the Western Union office at 5:00 p.m. on a daily basis; however, on May 20, 1968 she closed the office at 4:45 p.m. in order to go to the campaign speech of ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were displayed to Mrs. ZUNIGA and she advised that she has not seen anyone fitting his description in the San Ysidro, California, area.

A flier entitled "Organizing Committee for Clemency for Sirhan," 57 West Tenth Street, New York, New York, telephone number 212 Gramercy 7-1826 reflects that John M. Lawrence is the Executive Secretary, Abdeen Jabara, 1217 First National Building, Detroit, Michigan, is the Attorney, and Al Matthews, 14416 Victory Boulevard, Van Nuys, California, is the Associate Counsel. This flier bears a picture of Sirhan and refers to him as Sirhan B. Sirhan, Palestinian Arab refugee. This flier states, "If death is to be the penalty for Sirhan's misguided political act, then what penalty shall world justice and Arab military might deal out for the genocidal massacres and exiling of Palestinian Arabs from their native land?"

Investigation of the subject reflects that he resides at 57 West Tenth Street, New York, and that he is the President of the Federated Americans Against Israeli Racism, Incorporated (FAIR) and that his wife is the Secretary and Treasurer of this corporation. The address of this corporation is 57 West Tenth Street, New York, New York.

It was determined that this corporation does not have any meetings and has no other members other than the subject and his wife, Marjorie Lawrence, nee Friedlander.

In October, 1967, it was determined that the purpose of this organization was to obtain information from the Arab Information Center, New York, New York, and to sell these pamphlets on stands which are operated by the subject.

On June 1, 1968, Harry G. Kaplan, Detective Lieutenant, Nassau County Police Department, Mineola, New York, furnished the identification record of John M. Lawrence, born December 4, 1921 and who is also known as John L. Pawluk. This record reflects information set out in the identification record of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

JENINE PARR, Patient Records Section, Colorado State Hospital (CSH), summarized information from the Cardex and Patient File concerning patient JOHN M. LAWRENCE, also known as JOHN LAWRENCE PAWLUK and JOHN L. PAWLUK, as follows:

LAWRENCE was born [REDACTED] and also furnished 1931 as the year he was born. He was born at Fort Worth, Texas and is described as follows:

LAWRENCE was committed on May 8, 1962, in Denver County Court, their number P-27006, and was admitted to the CSH on May 10, 1962.

He was thereafter on special leave from the CSH to appear in Denver District Court and at the Denver General Hospital, Denver, Colorado, for trial and safekeeping purposes on several occasions prior to discharge from the CSH on August 23, 1962. His discharge from the CSH was based on mental condition of "Improved" under special conditions of the court order.

The Denver County Court entered an order on July 18, 1962, in their matter No. P-7006, setting forth that the jury returned the verdict that "Respondent does not, by reason of mental illness, lack sufficient control, judgment and discretion to manage own property or affairs...sufficient to require confinement for his own welfare or welfare and safety of others".

The court then ordered the defendant discharged as to mental action. The CSH file indicates, however, that the defendant was returned to jail at Denver, Colorado, for Contempt of Court.

Original Medical Commission findings of May 8, 1962, at Denver, identified Dr. ROBERT L. SHERE, and Dr. L. E. DANIELS as having reached a diagnosis of "Hypomaniac psychosis with paranoid mechanisms", which results in the court ordering LAWRENCE sent to the CSH.

JOHN L. GRIFFITH, Esq. appears to have been the court-appointed attorney for the respondent, LAWRENCE, in the sanity matter.

During confinement at the CSH, LAWRENCE was diagnosed on presentment to staff conference May 16, 1962, by Dr. BIYIKSEZOGLAR, CSH, Pueblo, as "Schizophrenic reaction, paranoid-type 000 X 24".

LAWRENCE basically refused to provide background or history to the CSH, but stated he was arrested in 1942 on a draft card violation and in 1949 for being drunk in Los Angeles.

CSH files contain lengthy Denver General Hospital Discharge Summary, dated May 10, 1962, which includes data that LAWRENCE turned out numerous legal petitions and directed voluminous letters to persons in high places, such as Chief Justice WARREN and ROBERT KENNEDY. He mentioned things he had done in New York against great political and legal odds. He had expertise on a number of fields, including law, especially constitutional law, and civil liberties law. He eventually asserted he had never been in law school or a member of any bar. The description of his activity in legal work was indistinguishable from that of a special attorney. He was born to a Russian immigrant family, and he has been a crusader who was in frequent contact with authority on all levels.

The CSH file indicates that LAWRENCE was a psychopathic patient in an unidentified hospital, San Diego, California, in approximately March, 1949.

In addition to the Cardex and General Patient file, information summarized above from the CSH, Pueblo, Colorado, possesses voluminous "Special Confidential Files" on LAWRENCE, principally relating to U. S. District Court, Denver, Colorado, Civil Action No. 8112, in a 1963 case involving JOHN M. LAWRENCE, Plaintiff, pro se, Vs. RICHARD BATTERSON, ET AL, with numerous additional defendants, including Dr. WILLIS BOWER, former superintendent of the CSH, Pueblo, who filed to recover damages in redress for deprivation, denial of equal protection under color of law of the rights of the plaintiff, growing out of an alleged restraint of his liberty, resulting in imprisonment and confinement against his will.
