It was determined that the foregoing is a book entitled "Assassination" by one BEN ABRO and published by the William Morrow Company of New York. The book in question was found in a trash can at the Conejo Community Park, Thousand Oaks, California, between May 20 and May 24, 1968. The book was found by Park Ranger CHARLES EDWARD CRANE, who resides at 2477 Calle Noreho, Thousand Oaks, California, telephone 495-2226. The book was turned over by Park Ranger to the Ventura County Sheriff's Office on 6/5/68, and subsequently turned over by that agency to the Los Angeles Police Department on 6/10/68.

Also accompanying was a campaign poster bearing a photograph of the late Senator KENNEDY and a political advertisement entitled "I run for the Presidency because I want the United States to stand for hope, for the reconciliation of men, for new policies".

A copy of the photograph and political advertisement is also attached hereto.

On 8/6/68, Detective Sergeant SANDLIN, Los Angeles Police Department, currently assigned to the SUS Unit of the Los Angeles Police Department advised as follows:

On 8/6/68 MUNIR B. SIRHAN, one of the brothers of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, was interviewed in connection with the continuing investigation being conducted by the Los Angeles Police Department. MUNIR SIRHAN was specifically questioned concerning the DAVID MYERS mentioned in referenced memorandum. MUNIR SIRHAN advised SANDLIN that following his arrest in Flagstaff, Arizona, in 1966 with MYERS, they returned to Los Angeles. Subsequent to their return to Los Angeles, MUNIR SIRHAN has not seen or heard from or about DAVID MYERS. He has no information regarding his possible whereabouts and could suggest no manner in which MYERS could be located. MUNIR SIRHAN stated that when he was briefly associated as a hitchhiker with MYERS in 1966, MYERS mentioned something to him to the effect that he, MYERS, had at one time been in custody of a juvenile camp somewhere in the Los Angeles County.

ARTHUR IRWIN, 2629 Shoreline Drive, advised that he is the President of the Irwin GMC, Inc., 2320 St. Johns Avenue, Lima, Ohio, and that he had in May, attended a conference of the National Automobile Dealers Association truck meeting at the Americana Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida. He recalled around May 18, 1968, he had attended dinner and at this dinner "BUDDY" JENSEN, GMC truck dealer at Fairfield, Connecticut; FRANK GOODPASTURE, JR., of the Goodpasture Motor Company, Birstol, Virginia; a BILL WILSON of Nashville, Tennessee, and a man from Bristol, Tennessee, attended. He stated he could not recall the name of the man from Bristol, Tennessee. Mr. IRWIN said there were about 14 people who sat at a long table at this dinner and that a large number of persons attended the conference at the Hotel. Mr. IRWIN said that he had a place at the table about 4 to 6 persons from "BUDDY" JENSEN. He said he does recall that in general conversation someone, he did not know who made the remark, said something about some group possibly being behind the KING matter.

He stated he could recall no further details. He said he had placed absolutely no significance in this and that those had been quite a bit of drinking going on. Mr. IRWIN said that he has known "BUDDY" JENSEN for about 6 years and he described him as a very reputable man of good reputation. Mr. IRWIN said it was his belief Mr. JENSEN was the type of man who would possibly have rather strong opinions and just go ahead and say something.

Mr. IRWIN said further that during the dinner, someone also made a remark to the effect that after what had happened to JACK, something might happen to BOBBY. Mr. IRWIN could not recall any specific words, other details, nor could he recall who made this remark.

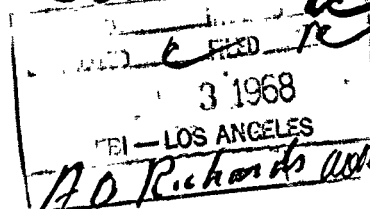

GARY MICHAEL PARIZEK, 1299 California Street, San Francisco, California, furnished the following information on 8/30/68:

On Sunday, June 2, 1968, about 1:00 or 2:00 P.M., a female acquaintance, KASS LITZENBERG, 1537 Lardner Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, called him on the telephone. During the course of conversation she mentioned she had either heard something on the radio or some rumor predicting that some political figure was going to be killed. No mention was made as to the identity of the political figure or when the killing was to occur. What she said was very vague and PARIZEK didn't pay much attention to it at the time. Two days later when Senator ROBERT KENNEDY was killed, he recalled the conversation and wondered about it. In a subsequent telephone conversation with LITZENBERG she referred to her previous conversation in regard to the prediction that a political figure was to be killed, and made a remark to the effect that she guessed whatever the rumor was she had heard must have been correct.

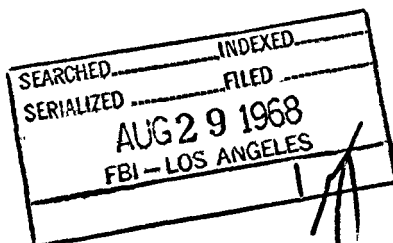

Lieutenant PENA stated that his department also received information that FRED DUTTON and/or FRANK MANTE were likewise present in the ambulance.

In addition to the above information furnished by Lieutenant PENA, the Los Angeles Office received information that WARREN ROGERS of "Look" Magazine may also have been in the ambulance.

One of the ambulance attendants interviewed advised that two individuals were riding in the front of the ambulance with the driver, one of whom was WILLIAM BARRY.

On september 3, 1968, at approximately 3-25pm, the writer was summoned to the reception room for the purpose of talking with Mr.'s, MICHAEL McCOWAN, and RONALD ALLEN, who identified themselves as, "defense investigators for Defense Attorney, RUSSELL E. PARSONS, who is acting in behalf of accused assassin SIRHAN SIRHAN." (See business card).

UPON taking the men into an interview room, they stated they had come to the Los Angeles Office hoping to see and interview the "Agent" assigned to the SIRHAN case. They were advised the "Agent" handling the case was not available, but if they cared to make any request or leave any information, this writer would be sure it was directed to the proper administrative authority.

McCOWAN, acting as spokesman for the two, stated he would like to specifically request the following:

McCOWAN stated they understood the FBI has conducted some 600 plus interviews of persons in attendance at the Ambassador Hotel on the night of the KENNEDY assassination attempt. He said they would like to specifically request a copy of that list of people in attendance who were interviewed.

Secondly, they specifically wanted to know, if, during the course of these interviews, it had been brought out or mentioned by anyone interviewed that they specifically heard of, or observed the accused assassin, SIRHAN SIRHAN, either consuming or being served any alcoholic beverages in the hall that night.

McCOWAN again reiterated this was a specific request and they therefore expected some type of answer.

They were advised their request would be made a matter of official record, at which time they left.

Reference is made to memorandum of IC PHILIP S. ANDRIST, 9/3/68.

U. S. Attorney WILLIAM M. BYRNE was telephonically contacted following the appearance of MICHAEL MC COWAN and RONALD ALLEN and their request for a list of persons interviewed by the FBI in this investigation.

Mr. BYRNE advised that any such request would properly be directed to the prosecuting authorities, which in this instance is not the Federal Government. The prosecution is in the hands of the District Attorney's Office for the County of Los Angeles.

At 5:05 P.M., 9/3/68, the writer telephonically contacted RONALD ALLEN, of R. ALLEN & Associates, and advised Mr. ALLEN that his request for such a list of persons interviewed would properly be directed by Mr. PARSONS to the prosecuting authorities, and that the Federal Government is not prosecuting SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, and, accordingly, his request should be directed to the District Attorney's Office. He was also advised that the FBI operates under the rules and regulations of the Department of Justice, and that if either he or Mr. PARSONS had any request to make concerning any investigation, it should be directed to the U. S. Attorney's Office, and not directed to the FBI.

Mr. ALLEN advised that the reason he had contacted the FBI was that the investigative staff of the Los Angeles Police Department had informed Mr. MC COWAN that if they wanted to know who was interviewed by the FBI, the FBI would be the people to contact.

Mr. ALLEN was again advised that his request should be directed to the prosecuting authorities and not the FBI.

On 8/1/68, PEDRO MARTINEZ CASTRO (protect at his request), 3071 N. W. Flagler Terrace, Miami, Florida, who has furnished insufficient information to determine his reliability, furnished the following information:

MARTINEZ frequents El Marino Restaurant, Flagler Street, Miami, owned by JUAN GARCIA CARDENAS and his family, and he knows GARCIA CARDENAS as "EL NILO." He is also acquainted with OMAR SOTO PUJOL and BRUNO GARCIA CARDENAS.

About six weeks previously, MARTINEZ was visited in Miami by a friend then residing in Los Angeles, CARLOS HURTADO, and at that time HURTADO was introduced to JUAN GARCIA and OMAR SOTO. HURTADO later returned to Los Angeles.

On about 7/27/68, HURTADO returned to Miami and related that he happened upon GARCIA AND SOTO in a Cuban store in Los Angeles the previous week. He stated to MARTINEZ that the following day, 7/19/68, a series of bombings occurred in Los Angeles. On 7/20/68, HURTADO again encountered GARCIA and SOTO at a restaurant in Los Angeles, at which time GARCIA asked his opinion of these bombings. HURTADO indicated that he saw GARCIA alone the following day, at which time he stated that SOTO had left the Los Angeles area.

The above information was furnished confidentially by MARTINEZ, who requested HURTADO not be interviewed, as to do so would possibly reveal MARTINEZ's cooperation with the FBI. He agreed to attempt to obtain more specific information from HURTADO, who is presently a guest at his house.

On 8/2/68, MARTINEZ advised he had further discussed this incident with HURTADO, who stated that on the day before the bombings in Los Angeles, he had met GARCIA and SOTO at the Islamar Jewelry Store, 1806 Sunset Boulevard. On the day after the bombings, HURTADO indicated he met them at El Carmelo Restaurant, located next door to the above jewelry store. On the following night, he saw GARCIA at El Oso Blanco Cafeteria, street address not recalled. He indicated El Oso Blanco is a narcotics hangout.

HURTADO also stated during this conversation that he recalled that GARCIA and SOTO had indicated on the first day he met them in Los Angeles that they were planning to go to New York City from Los Angeles.

MARTINEZ said HURTADO is known to the FBI since he apparently took some photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, suspected assassin of ROBERT F. KENNEDY, to the FBI office in Los Angeles.

The above is being furnished for the information of Los Angeles and any desired action in connection with the possible investigation of the bombings which reportedly occurred in Los Angeles on 7/19/68.

Miami will maintain contact with MARTINEZ for any further information he may develop concerning this matter.

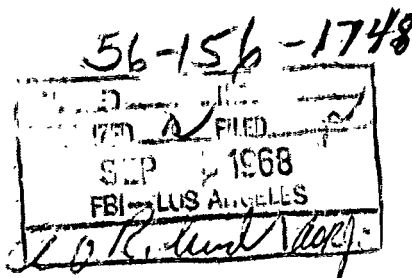

On 9/3/68, HERBERT MC ROY, Administrative Deputy Coroner, Los Angeles County Coroner's Office, 104 Hall of Justice, Los Angeles, California; telephone MA 9-2451 (extension 82480), was telephonically contacted for the purpose of making arrangements to obtain a copy of the autopsy report based on the autopsy of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

MC ROY advised he had previously discussed this with Chief Medical Examiner THOMAS T. NOGUCHI, M.D. On 9/3/68, MC ROY again discussed this matter with NOGUCHI, at which time he was unable to obtain from NOGUCHI an opinion as to whether or not a copy of the autopsy report would be made available to any agency prior to the commencement of the SIRHAN trial. MC ROY further explained that NOGUCHI is well aware that the previously imposed court instructions with respect to release of information in this investigation does not apply to the FBI.

MC ROY stated he would again contact NOGUCHI and attempt to obtain from him a decision with respect to furnishing a copy of the autopsy report, as well as photographs taken at the time of the autopsy.

On 9/3/68, Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorney DAVID FITTS advised his office has not yet received a copy of the autopsy report on KENNEDY and does not expect that it will be released by Dr. NOGUCHI until the trial commences.

Los Angeles will continue to follow this matter and keep the Bureau appropriately advised.

For the information of the Bureau, Governor RONALD REAGAN of California on 9/3/68 vetoed a bill passed by the 1968 Legislature which had been co-authored by Assembly Speaker JESSE M. UNRUH (Democrat, Inglewood), which bill would have required persons wanting to make use of the official autopsy pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY to obtain a court order. The "Los Angeles Times" of 9/4/68 advised that the restriction had originally been requested by District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER of Los Angeles County, who feared there would be a wide demand for KENNEDY photographs by exploiters and the morbidly curious. The article reflected a statement by the Governor that he vetoed the bill because it is "so badly worded that it would have the unintended effect of impeding the legitimate use of autopsy photographs in medical education and research." The Governor also advised that medical researchers and forensic pathologists had complained that the bill would have had a detrimental effect on scientific advancement.

Regarding the request of the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to SA ROGER LA JEUNESSE that the FBI attempt to locate and interview all guests at the Ambassador Hotel as of 6/4/68, USA WILLIAM M. BYRNE was advised of this request, and it was pointed out that this was a "shotgun" request based upon no information. Mr. BYRNE advised that he would discreetly contact the Department and ascertain whether such a request was based upon some telephonic communication between the LAPD and the Department of which he and the FBI were unaware. He said he would contact the writer on the morning of 9/4/68 and advise him of the results of his inquiry.

It should be noted that the LAPD have been previously advised that the FBI was not seeking to locate and interview guests, at which time the LAPD indicated that they would handle this phase themselves, which they at the present time advise they are not in a position to do.

HOWARD PHILLIP ETHRIDGE was advised of the personal and official identity of Special Agent STEPHEN E. CORUD, Federal Bureau of Investigation, and Lieutenant E. L. LUCAS, Lewiston, Idaho, Police Department. He was advised that he was being interviewed about his participation in the theft of a 1967 Chevrolet, two-door, Washington License #CHX-832, from Colfax, Washington, to Lewiston, Idaho.

ETHRIDGE was warned of his rights and waived them as shown on an executed rights and waiver form.

He furnished the following signed statement:

"Lewiston, Idaho
8/14/68

"I, Howard Phillip Ethridge, furnish the following voluntary Statement to Steinar E. Corud, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the FBI and to Lt. E. L. Lucas, Lewiston Police Dept., Lewiston, Idaho.

"I have voluntarily signed a rights and waiver form.

"I was hitchhiking from Bellingham, Washington to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. I left Bellingham on Monday 8/12/68. I got a ride to Walla Walla, Washington arriving here about 12:30 PM the night of 8/13/68.

"I was hitchhiking north out of Walla Walla headed for Coeur d'Alene when I was picked up by two women traveling in a 1967 red Chevrolet 2 door sedan, on the outskirts of Walla Walla, Wash. They picked me up about 12:30 AM 8/14/68. They said they were headed for Spokane, Wash.

"When we got close to Colfax, Washington, I told the women I had a gun and I told them not to turn around. I ordered the woman who was driving to drive off the main highway onto a side road. This was pretty close to Colfax, Washington. We drove for about 5 or 6 miles and I ordered the driver to stop the car.

"I then ordered both women to get out of the car. I had a gun in my right hand, pointed at the ground.

"I then ordered both women to take all their clothes off. They took their clothes off and placed their clothing on the ground. I then told them to start walking, the same direction the car was headed.

"I picked up their clothing and put them in the back seat of the car. I drove along the road the same direction the women were walking. I must have passed the women because I did not see them after I started driving the car.

"I drove for about 3 miles and got back on the main, blacktop, highway, the highway between Colfax, Washington and Pullman, Washington.

"I drove along the highway, towards Pullman, for about 5 miles where I stopped along the right side (west) of the highway. I got out of the car with the women's clothing, walked across the highway and tossed the clothing along the left side (East) of the highway.

"I then drove through Pullman, Washington and South toward Lewiston, Idaho.

"Just after I left Pullman, police cars started chasing me. I was traveling down a hill near Lewiston, Idaho when I was arrested.

"I stole the gun I used against the women at Monroe, Washington while on my trip from Bellingham, Washington to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.

"I stole a white suit case, clothing, movie camera, clock radio, electric clock and items of jewelry at Bellingham, Washington just before I left here on 8/12/68.

"I wish to state that the only item of clothing I took off, while I was with the two women, was my shirt. I took my shirt off because it was stuffy in the car.

"I have read this statement consisting of this page and two other pages. The statement is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

ETHRIDGE was shown the 7.65 Mauser Automatic Pistol, Serial #817,199, and he admitted that this was the pistol used by him when ordering the two women to disrobe.

Prior to furnishing the above signed statement, ETHRIDGE said that he had stolen the 1967 Chevrolet at Walla Walla, Washington, about 11:30 p.m., on August 13, 1968. He also claimed that he had purchased the items in the suitcase, which was in his possession when arrested.
