Mr. WILLIAM BARRY, Assistant Vice-President, Security Department, Bankers Trust Company, 120 Broadway, New York, New York, stated that on June 5, 1968, in the ambulance taking Senator ROBERT KENNEDY from the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, to the Central Receiving Hospital, were the following people:

In the front seat was the ambulance driver, in the middle was WILLIAM BARRY, and seated near the right door was WARREN ROGERS of "Look" Magazine.

In the back, with Senator KENNEDY, was his wife, ETHEL KENNEDY; his sister, JEAN SMITH; FRED DUTTON; and one ambulance attendant. FRED DUTTON was in the back, up front near the partition in back of the driver which would be at Senator KENNEDY's feet.

BARRY does not recall the exact location of the others in the back other than ETHEL KENNEDY and JEAN SMITH were near Senator KENNEDY.

ReLAair to New York, 8/30/68, requesting New York to interview WILLIAM BARRY as to occupants in ambulance on 6/5/68. Enclosed for Los Angeles are 30 copies of an FD 302 containing results of interview with BARRY which stated that ETHEL KENNEDY, JEAN SMITH, FRED DUTTON, WARREN ROGERS of "Look" Magazine, BARRY and the ambulance driver and attendant were in the ambulance.

ReLAair to the Bureau, 8/6/68, which contained a photograph of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY, WILLIAM BARRY, and others, one of whom may be SIRHAN SIRHAN. The photograph was taken in March, 1968, in the San Francisco Airport by STEVE SCHAPIRO.

On 9/4/68, WILLIAM BARRY stated to SA FRANCIS L. CASHIN that he saw SIRHAN SIRHAN only on the night of 6/4-5/68, but that the photograph does not look like SIRHAN. BARRY stated that the individual in the photograph looks like an autograph seeker as Senator KENNEDY is holding what looks like a pencil and paper

Re Dallas airtel to Director captioned "Students for a Democratic Society; IS - SDS; SEDITION", dated 9/6/68, Bufile 100-439048.

Referenced airtel and letterhead memorandum from Dallas indicate the gathering and departure from Dallas of some 34 persons associated with the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) en route to Mexico City aboard American Airlines Flight 53 on 8/26/68. The group, according to information available, was en route to Cuba. Included in the group was THOMAS GOOD of San Jose, California.

THOMAS DANIEL GOOD, of 22 South Eleventh Street, San Jose, California, was one of the individuals who was located and interviewed in connection with the Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY assassination on 6/5/68, inasmuch as he had been a long-time acquaintance of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, who is currently being held for trial in connection with the murder of Senator KENNEDY. GOOD is also acquainted with WALTER CROWE, a member of the Southern California District Communist Party (SCDCP), who has also been in contact with SIRHAN as a school acquaintance.

The Bureau is requested to have Legat, Mexico, furnish all possible information concerning THOMAS DANIEL GOOD's trip to Mexico City and possibly Cuba. Bureau sources concerning Cuba should also be alerted.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau is a letter dated 9/5/68 from Deputy Chief ROBERT A. HOUGHTON, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), wherein it is requested that the FBI interview some 259 persons who were registered as guests at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, 6/4-5/68, who reside out of the Los Angeles area.

This request has been discussed with Deputy Chief HOUGHTON, who advised that the LAPD, in connection with its investigation of the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, desires that every possible investigative lead be explored. Deputy Chief HOUGHTON advised that the LAPD has no positive information that any of the guests possess any knowledge of the assassination, but that they feel that some possible criticism could arise in later years if this step were not taken at this time. The LAPD is currently locating and interviewing 119 persons who were guests at the hotel and who are readily locatable in the Los Angeles area.

The LAPD has been informed that in view of the substantial number of interviews involved and the nature of the request, it would be referred to our Washington headquarters for consideration.

During the Robert F. Kennedy assassination investigation it has been established that 378 guests were registered at the Ambassador Hotel on June 4/5, 1968. Of this figure 259 reside in 104 various cities throughout the United States. In addition six reside in foreign countries.

On August 20, 1968, an oral request was made to the FBI Los Angeles Office that the above 259 interviews be conducted by the FBI. Special Agent Roger J. LaJeunesse Jr., was furnished the names, addresses and interview forms of the persons to be interviewed.

On September 3, 1968, this department was telephonically notified that a formal request would be required before any decision could be rendered regarding this matter.

It is requested that agents of the FBI conduct these 259 interviews.

Your early response to this request would be appreciated.

I, SAIDALLAH SIRHAN, AM HERE TO PRESENT MY SIDE OF THE STORY WHICH APPEARED IN THE INDEPENDANT STAR NEWS, MONDAY, JULY 29th.

I AM HERE TO CLARIFY A MISREPRESENTATION OF THE FACTS AS WRITTEN AND PUBLISHED BY ROBERT SMITH, STAFF WRITER FOR THE SAME MENTIONED NEWSPAPER.

ROBERT SMITH PUBLISHED AND ORATED A STORY WHICH DID NOT TAKE PLACE DURING OUR INTERVIEW. SOME OF THE CONVERSATION, AS HE WROTE IT, DID NOT TAKE PLACE IN ACTUALITY. BY ME SAYING THAT I COMPLAINED THAT AN FBI AGENT AND A PASADENA POLICEMAN, BEN HETHERTON, TREATED ME LIKE A MENDICANT, WHICH THEY DID NOT DO, AND ALSO BY ROBERT SMITH SAYING IN THE CAPTION UNDER THE PHOTO ON PAGE 2 THAT I ACCUSED THE PASADENA POLICE OF TRYING TO FORCE ME TO INCRIMINATE MYSELF, ROBERT SMITH PRESENTS A STATEMENT OF HIS OWN INVENTION.

I HERE DECLARE THAT I HOLD NO ANIMOSITY TOWARD THE POLICE OR THE FBI AND I HAVE NO OBJECTIONS TO THEIR LEGAL PROCEDURES AND INVESTIGATIONS. BECAUSE THE POLICE HAVE THEIR OWN WAY OF PERFORMING THEIR JOBS, WHETHER THEY SEE PEOPLE AS MENDICANTS OR NOT.

I OBJECT TO ROBERT SMITH PUBLISHING THINGS THAT WERE NOT SAID OR DISCUSSED IN THE INTERVIEW. ROBERT SMITH DREW HIS OWN CONCLUSIONS FROM MY STATEMENT AND ATTRIBUTED THEM TO ME.

BY ROBERT SMITH PRINTING THE EXREY STORY AS HE DID, I FEEL THAT HE IS INSTIGATING ILL FEELINGS BETWEEN THE POLICE, MYSELF AND THE PEOPLE.

On August 1, 1968, Sergeant MIKE NIELSEN, Los Angeles Police Department, advised that the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) has acquired two wide fiber glass helmets size 7½ and 7 5/8 respectively.

These helmets have been obtained by the LAPD for the use of that agency and the office of the Los Angeles County District Attorney on a loan basis to be returned when they are no longer needed. They were obtained from the B. T. Crump Company, 2651 South Seamen, El Monte, California, and are similar to the helmets used by SIRHAN SIRHAN when he reportedly sustained injury by falling from a horse at the Granda Del Rio Ranch in Corona, California.

On 7/8/68, the following individuals were contacted and advised that they had no record that was identifiable with a JOHN WRIGHT of McVeigh, Kentucky:

On 7/9/68, EUGENE THORN, McVeigh, Kentucky, advised that he was a neighbor of Mrs. KATIE WATTS. He said that at the present time Mrs. WATTS was in the hospital, and that all of the members of the family were attempting to have her put in a mental institution because she was not capable of taking care of herself. He stated that Mrs. WATTS would not be able to answer any questions, because when she did talk to people she would just wander on aimlessly.

On the same date JANET WRIGHT, McVeigh, Kentucky, advised that she was a niece of JOHN WRIGHT, and that neither she nor any members of the family could be of assistance in locating her uncle, because none of them have heard from him in at least ten years. She said that they had attempted to locate him in Los Angeles when his mother got sick about three years ago, but that they were unsuccessful.

Hughes phoned Agent 6-12-68 and said he was going to send something in on the Kensalt matter. He was so speculative and incoherent he was told to put it in writing.

Dear Agent Warren:

I talked to Gene Hagberg shortly after I had spoken to you early in the afternoon this past June 12th. During the conversation I mentioned I had been at the Ambassador Hotel from about 3:20 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. on June 4, 1968. Up to that time Gene did not know I had been at the Hotel on the fourth and so I spoke about some of the things I had seen there that day. The individual who I described as the "ambling-gaited" man, because of the way in which he walked, was of particular interest to Mr. Hagberg who, in view of the topic of our conversation, then told me for the first time that he had submitted a Report to the Los Angeles Police Department which he believed could have some relevance to the tragedy that took place at the Hotel on June 5th. and that he had referred to a swarthy man whose manner of walking could be said to be a "waddle", for the man "waddled" when he walked. After a little more discussion concerning this individual, it seemed quite possible the "ambling-gaited" man and the man who "waddled" could be the same person. As a result of this conversation, I decided to write down as much as I could recall about what I had seen at the Hotel on the fourth and to submit the information to the same Officer who Gene had seen at the Los Angeles Police Department at 150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, Officer T.J. Miller #11152 of the Detective Bureau, Homicide Division, whose Office is located in Room #803; his telephone number is 624-5211, extension 2962.

I saw Officer Miller during the afternoon of July 3rd. at the Los Angeles Police Department and gave him the Report. I was not as particular as usual about the grammar I used because I wanted to get the information to him as quickly as possible so that he could evaluate my observations along with Mr. Hagberg's Report. I also showed Officer Miller a copy of a letter, over the name of an Issa M. Issa, appearing in the "Voice of the People" column of the June 12, 1968 edition of the Citizen News; Officer Miller made several copies of the letter. Gene Hagberg, who had originally called my attention to the Issa letter, told me its writer in all likelihood is Issa Mohammed Issa, the man who "waddles" when he walks and who might possibly be the "ambling-gaited" man I had seen. The photograph shown to me at the L.A.P.D., although two years old, bears a close resemblance to the man I had seen.

I corrected some grammatical errors on pages 20, 27 and 28 of the Report since July 3rd. and mailed the corrections to Officer Miller on August 19, 1968.

You will find enclosed with this letter copies of the Issa M. Issa letter and the Report, pages numbered 680702001 through 680702028, 6806041500-1515 and 680604-1655-1700 which I submitted to Officer Miller. You may keep all of the material. Incidentally, the thirty single sheets of the enclosed Report were reproduced from

the original copies free of charge at Knott's Berry Farm through the authorization of Dr. Fort; the Report was run in my presence by one of his secretaries from the Americanism Center. I appreciate Dr. Fort's cooperation and thoughtfulness here very much because at the rate of fifteen cents per sheet, it saved me some money.

I did not tell Officer Miller I had spoken to you on June 12th.; although in explaining the date-number system I used to set up the pages, I told him I had used this method in numbering the pages of other different Reports I had written in the past.

Since the day I spoke to you and referred to the rude young woman with the deformed nose, I have tried to determine a more accurate approximation of her probable height and have arrived at figures of from five feet to five feet three inches tall instead of the five feet five inches I had mentioned in our telephone conversation. I made this calculation by recalling as closely as possible the angle at which I looked down at the young woman when she very nearly walked into me and then measured the result from a point I noted on the wall. It isn't very scientific and certainly does not guarantee absolute accuracy, but it is better than a guess and is as close as I can come to her probable height considering the sketchy information available.

I mentioned the automobile accidents in the Report, both of which are on record at the L.A.P.D., to give Officer Miller an idea how my memory works and also to clarify what I had said to him earlier. My memory is very good, and in fact, I believe it is well above average but not perfect. Therefore I wanted to bring out the fact that now and then a detail tends to be neutralized in my memory process for some reason as indicated by the first of the two accident reports I cited and is verifiable by checking with the Officer to whom I spoke in regard to that accident. I brought up this subject in reference to the young woman I had seen in the covered walkway at the Ambassador Hotel and had noted in the Report. For in consideration of these factors and what I positively do recall, I believe there is almost a 100% certainty that she was the "polka dot lady" who was sought by the Authorities just after the fatal shooting at the Hotel. I also referred to the 6-27-66 auto accident to let Officer Miller know that that was the rear-end accident I mentioned when I called him on 7-1-68. Otherwise if I had only cited the earlier accident, occurring on 4-2-66, which does offer some proof concerning the point I wished to make in regard to my memory and Officer Miller had decided to check it out, he would have discovered that it was not of the rear-end type at all; and since I am selling accuracy to the best of my ability here, I thought it best, although afield from the subject matter of the Report, to give him the source of my comment.

I dropped by the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, on Monday June 3, 1968 and Tuesday June 4, 1968 at about the same time in the afternoon on both days to make some telephone calls. Parked on West side of Kennmore Ave. North of Wilshire Blvd. each day. Did about the same thing Monday and Tuesday, however have been able to sort out just about everything and place each day's ~~observation~~ under the correct date.

A:

1. Arrived at Kennmore Avenue just North of Wilshire Blvd. shortly after 3:00 P.M. and started to park my automobile. Noticed broken glass from liquor bottles

in the street where I wanted to park, so got out of car and proceeded to kick glass out of the way but there was too much in the street, and I quit. Then backed auto to parking place several spaces down Kenmore and parked on same side of street about mid-way between Wilshire and 6th Street.

2. Sat in car sorting papers I planned to use in making telephone calls at The Hotel and also listened to Election returns on my car radio.

3. While sitting in the automobile, my attention was directed to an apparently disabled two tone white and another light color

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vehicle backed into the curb on  
Wilshire Blvd. Watched two strong  
young men push the "moth-eaten"  
old sedan which probably had quit  
running while East bound on  
Wilshire Blvd. The two young  
men pushed the car from the curb  
across the street through moderately  
heavy traffic, and headed the  
vehicle down Kenmore Avenue.  
I do not recall observing the  
old sedan earlier when I had  
tried to clear the broken glass  
from the parking space near  
Wilshire Blvd. After the car  
had started to roll more easily,  
one young man stopped facing  
the sedan - ran through the traffic  
toward the sidewalk - waved to the  
darker man who continued to push

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The automobile, and hurriedly walked down the sidewalk westward on Wilshire Blvd. and out of my line of sight. Each man had waved to one another; it appeared as though they knew each other.

The person who walked west probably was wearing a t-shirt, had dark curly hair and may have been Italian, Jewish or Mexican. The other strong young man who continued to push the car off of Wilshire Blvd had a darker complexion and appeared to be a Mexican American type. He was probably 5'8" to 5'11" in height, seemed rather strong but not muscular. He had very dark hair which appeared straight and probably was black. He

... was well built and was in his early twenties or perhaps younger. He was not handsome and was dressed much as the man who had initially helped to push the old sedan across Wilshire Blvd.

4. As the darker young man pushed the vehicle down Kenmore, it gained momentum and started to coast rapidly. During this period, a series of interesting things took place. The sedan suddenly rocked sharply from side to side more than once; the car door on the driver's side swung open and the vehicle momentarily veered in the direction of my parked car causing me to observe the near-frantic going - on with far greater

interest than at first.

5. After things settled down somewhat, the darker young man who had been pushing the old sedan, began racing along side the vehicle. And after several attempts was able to jump into the driver's seat. These actions took place opposite my car, and the man who jumped into the rapidly coasting automobile did not close the car door until after the vehicle had passed my vantage point.

6. Therefore I was able to look into the old sedan as it went by just prior to the moment that the young man racing outside jumped into the driver's seat; and I saw a small dark complexioned

young man with dark curly hair moving over toward the passenger side of the front seat from the vicinity of the steering wheel in order to make room for the man racing beside the car.

7. The dark young man (whether Negro or Black), now safely in the driver's seat and steering the automobile down the street, looked over at me where I was seated in my parked car, and he appeared startled or else that may be his usual countenance. At that particular moment, he appeared to me to have large "circular eyes".

They were wide open and a good description would be "owl-like". He then looked ahead to see

where he was steering the car  
and then looked back over  
his shoulder in my direction  
once again as the car coasted  
north down Kenmore Avenue  
beyond my parking space. During  
this time he apparently tried

sound as though it would

I definitely could recognize and

seeing the plate again because for  
some reason, it stands out in

1. I walked to The Ambassador Hotel and noted The Time to be 3:20 P.M. at The Security First National Bank clock inside The Hotel and then calculated I had until 5:15 P.M. to make the telephone calls and get back to my car in The metered parking zone at The very latest.

2. Changed 25¢ at The Ambassador Hotel Coffee Shop. Had to wait for cashier (woman; middle aged or perhaps a little older) to discuss a problem about a key with an apparently confused woman employee (Chamber-maid?; was middle age about 5'5" tall and seemed heavy <sup>was</sup> a white woman). The discussion

which seemed to have had something to do with a closet, pantry or storage room (locked?) held me up for about three or four minutes.

3.2 Then proceeded to long line of quiet and comfortable public pay telephone booths down corridor adjacent to one of the large waiting rooms. Noticed middle age white man of average height and build standing close to and facing an empty phone booth which he did not enter. He appeared to be doing little or nothing and did so for some minutes after I entered a ~~phone~~ booth to place my calls; <sup>perhaps</sup> perhaps. The man was thinking about something. I walked around the man and sat

in a telephone booth beyond where he was standing and putting around.

4. I placed a number of telephone calls from numbers I had gotten from contacts and through the Yellow Pages in the Telephone Directory in regard to Vending Machine Companies, especially coffee. Have been attempting to find a company whose Vending Machines will accept and properly dispense the new Freeze Dry Coffee (an instant ~~Coffee~~ Crystal-type dry coffee); and also if the occasion presents itself have mentioned the liquid Coffee Extract which is an excellent product and is the first major stage in the making of the Freeze-Dry Coffee.

# N.B. I have used these public pay telephones a number of times since I attended the 1968 NAMA Convention (National Automatic Merchandising Association) at The Ambassador Hotel last March (1968) when I first discovered the Hotel had excellent public telephone facilities and never encountered the poor connections that occurred on

One Vending Company switchboard operator asked for my pay phone number in case my call was disconnected while I waited for a particular extension line to clear, however this was not necessary because the line cleared almost immediately after she had asked me the question.

Some Telephone Company personnel were working in the area on the fourth, and I assumed the difficulties were being caused by them. I didn't think very much about the poor connections at the time, although they were annoying.

5. I left the telephone booth at about 4:45 P.M. To 4:50 P.M. and started walking to my car parked on Kenmore Ave. earlier than I had planned because no more business calls were possible at that hour, and I had had enough of the telephone for that day. On my way out of the Hotel I debated whether or not to go into the Coffee Shop for coffee but decided it would be playing the meter time too close and did not bother <sup>because</sup> I felt I undoubtedly would have a meter violation and possible ticket if I spent the time there that I usually take when drinking coffee.

1. At about 4:55 P.M. to 5:00 P.M., I left The Hotel Building by the front, side door which is adjacent to the Security First National Bank Office at the Ambassador. As I headed west down the outside corridor, I noted a Security Officer or Guard (was in a Blue uniform) also walking west and walked a few paces ahead of him. As I neared the junction of this corridor and the covered walkway to Wilshire Boulevard, I then noted a Doorman (in uniform) moving toward the main front Entrance area. Perhaps these two people made some observation which would tend to corroborate
